East India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Bihar during 27th-31st August; Odisha during 26th-27th August.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 26th-29th August; Bihar during 26th-31st August; Odisha during 27th-29th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 26th-28th August; Gangetic West Bengal during 28th-30th August; Jharkhand during 26th-29th August; Bihar during 26th-27th August; Odisha on 27th August and on 31st August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Odisha during 28th-30th August.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 26th August and during 30th-31st August; Assam & Meghalaya during 28th-31st August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 26th-31st August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 27th-29th August; Assam & Meghalaya during 26th-27th August.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 26th-27th August; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 26th-29th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 26th-31st August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 27th-28th August and on 31st August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 29th-30th August.

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West India:

- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 26th August.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 26th-31st August; Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 29th-31st August; South Interior Karnataka during 26th-31st August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 26th-28th August; Coastal Karnataka during 26th-31st August.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 26th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 26th-29th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep on 26th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Kerala & Mahe on 26th August.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 26th-29th August.

Fishermen Warning:

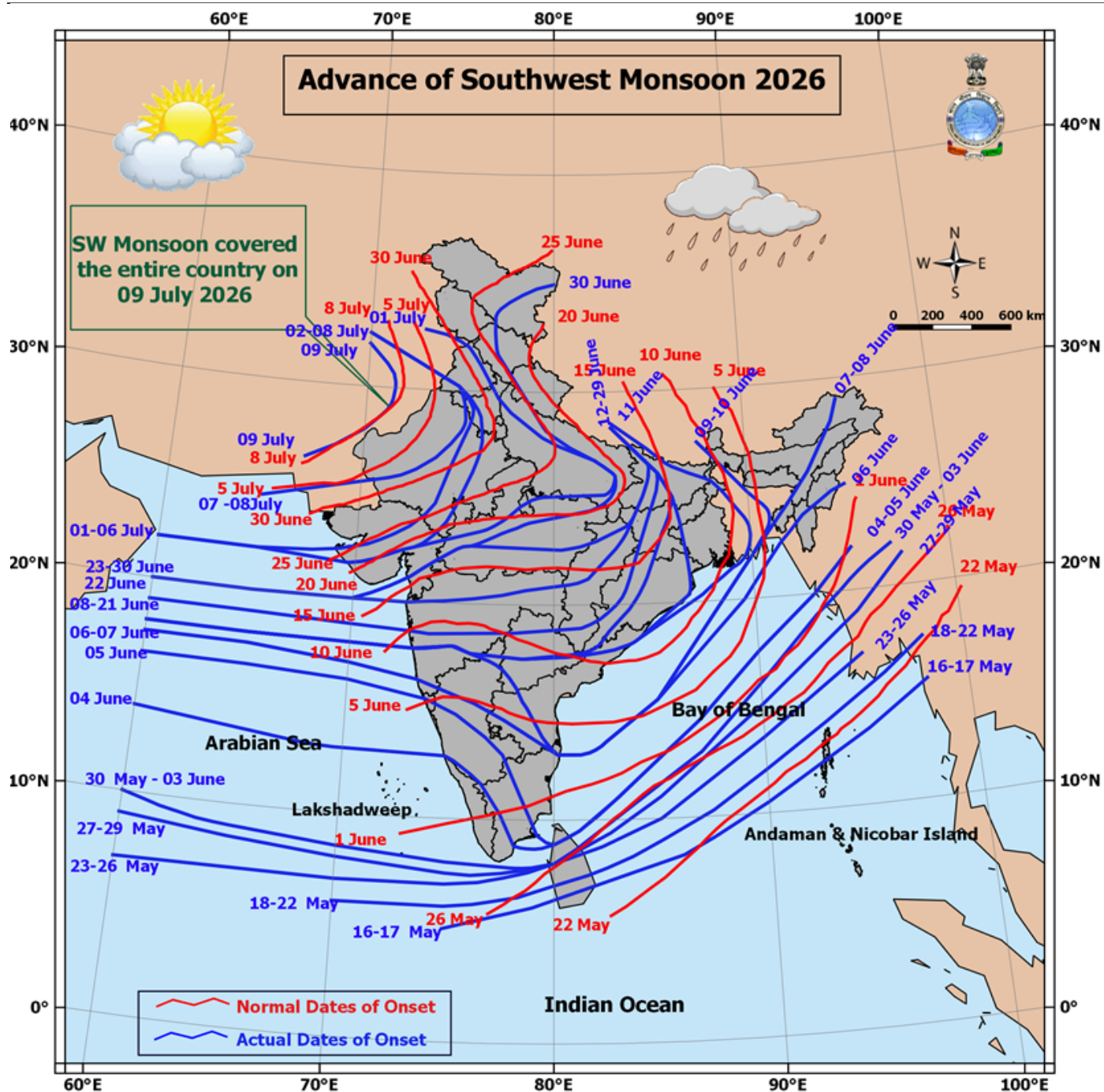

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 25-08-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Assam & Meghalaya; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh and Madhya Maharashtra. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Uttarakhand; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, East Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, East Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Uttarakhand. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.5°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 25-08-2026):** **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Punjab, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Rayalaseema and Coastal Karnataka; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Telangana and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Jharkhand; at most places over Marathwada, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over East Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Kerala & Mahe. **The highest maximum temperature** of 41.0°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low-Pressure Area** over West Jharkhand & neighbourhood lay over Northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood at 0530 Hrs IST of today, the 26th August 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 5.8 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height. The system is likely to move nearly west-northwestwards during the next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Jammu, Pathankot, Muzaffarnagar, Bareilly, Lucknow, centre of **Low Pressure Area** over Northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood and Daltonganj, Digha & thence southeastwards to Northwest Bay of Bengal and extends upto 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northeast Assam & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 76°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.

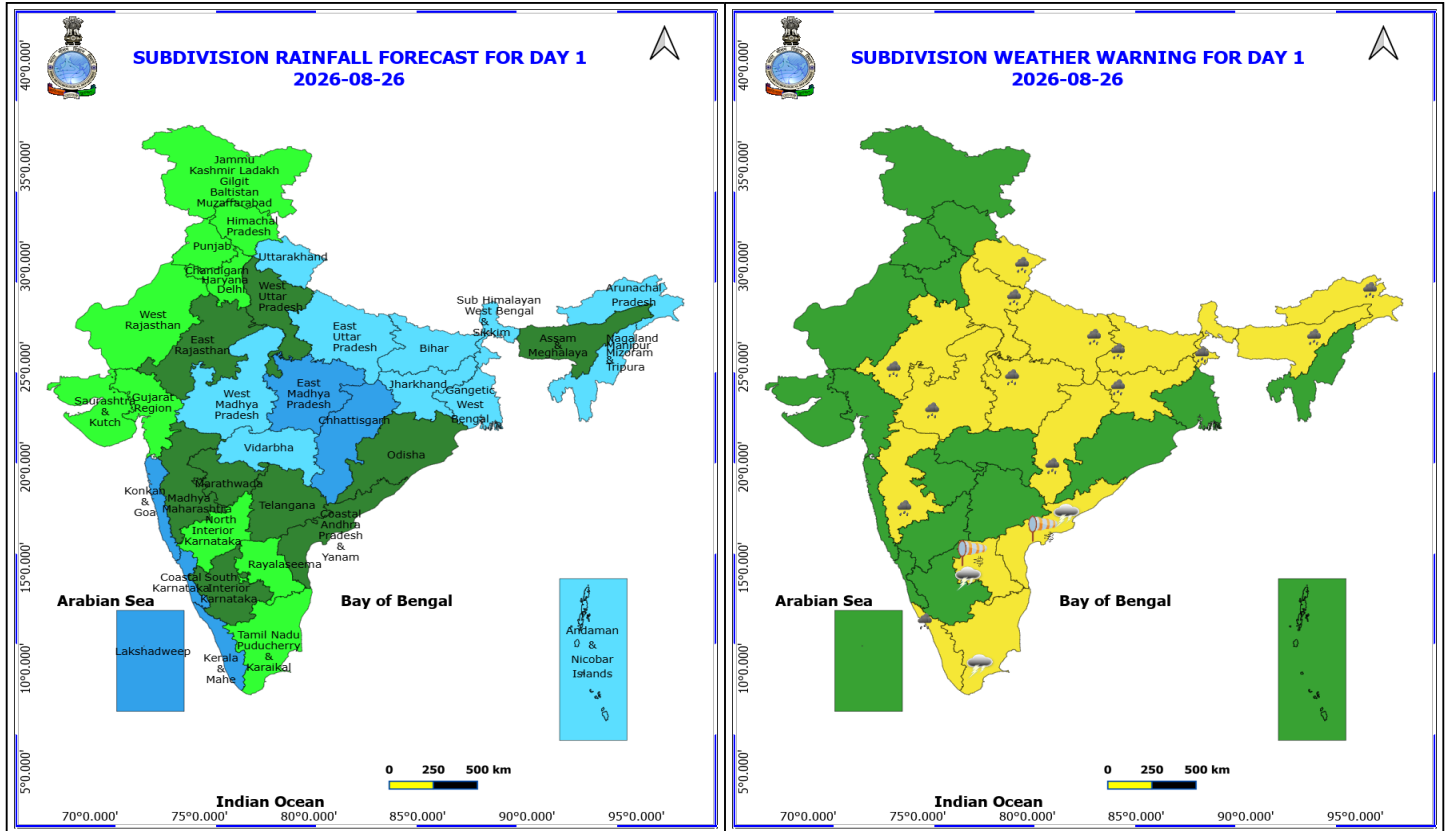

- ❖ **Squally Weather** with wind speed 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Karnataka, Kerala coasts, over Lakshadweep Area adjoining sea areas.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over Gulf of Mannar adjoining Comorin area and some parts of southwest adjoining off Sri Lanka coast, some parts of westcentral and southeast Bay of Bengal.

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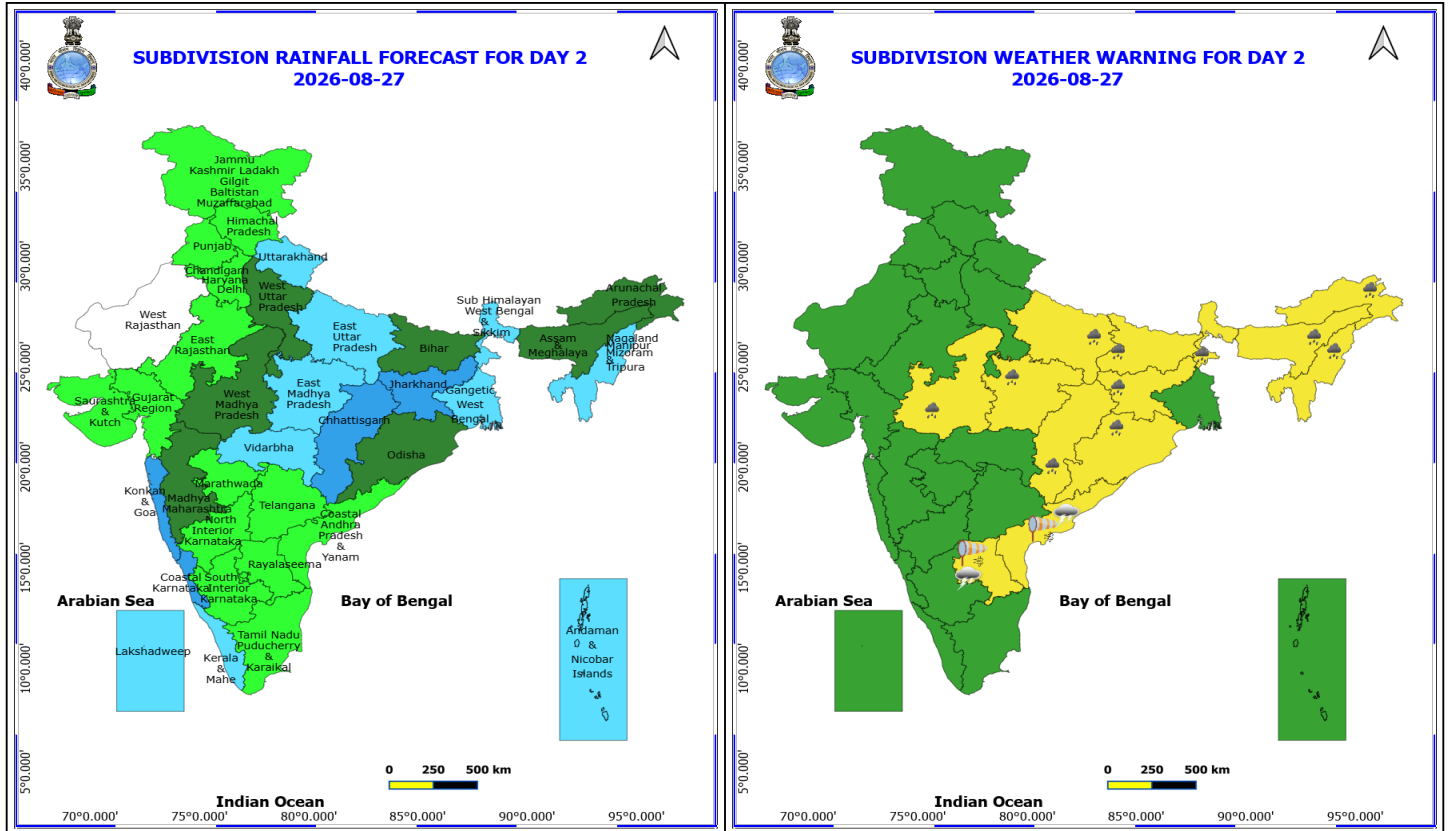

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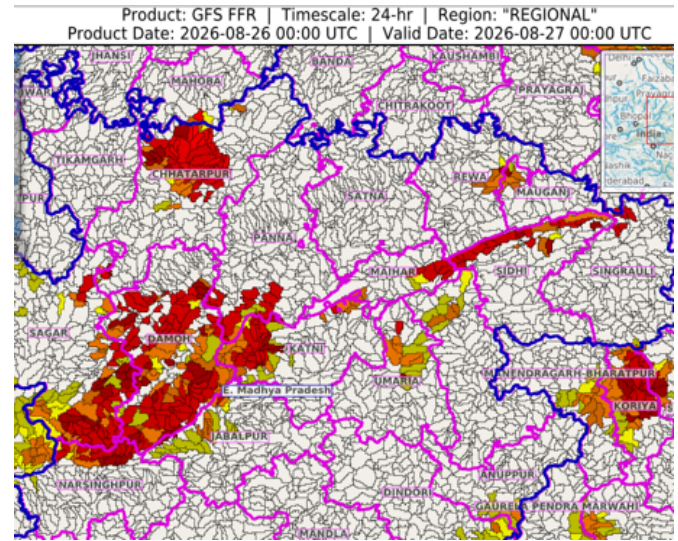
Flash Flood Warnings

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-25

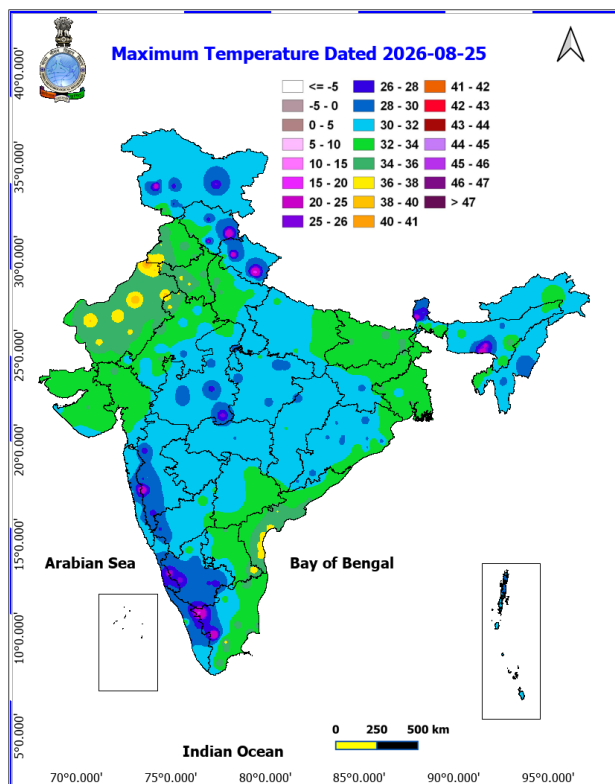


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-25

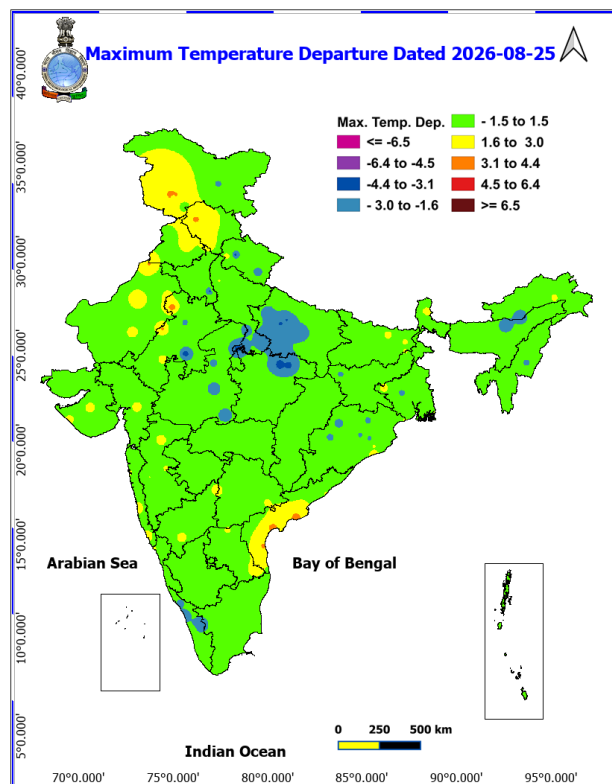


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-25

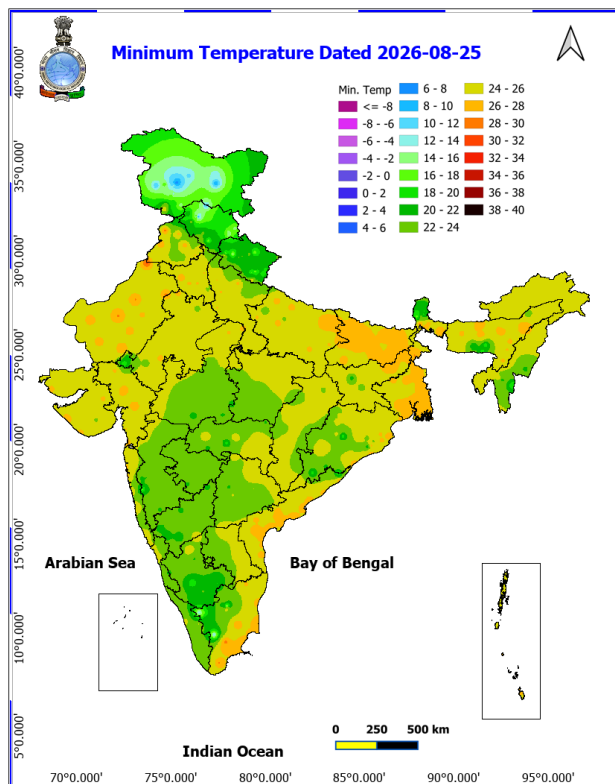
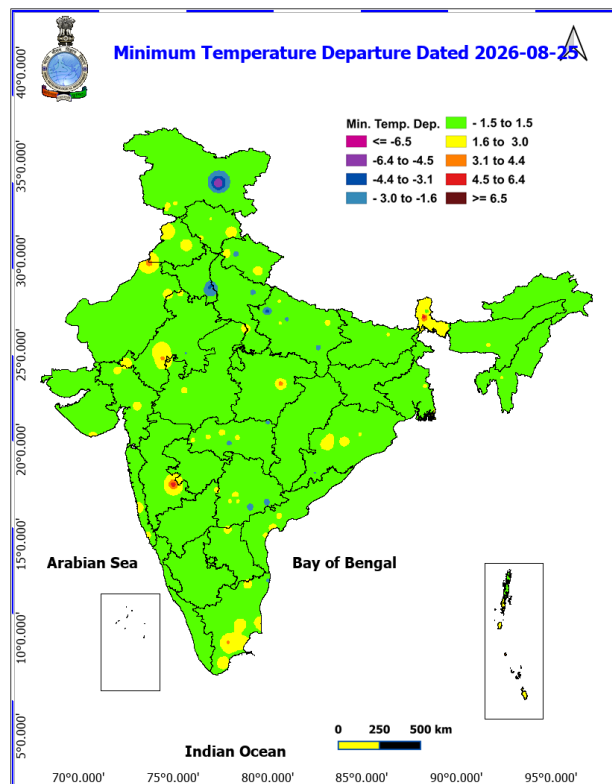
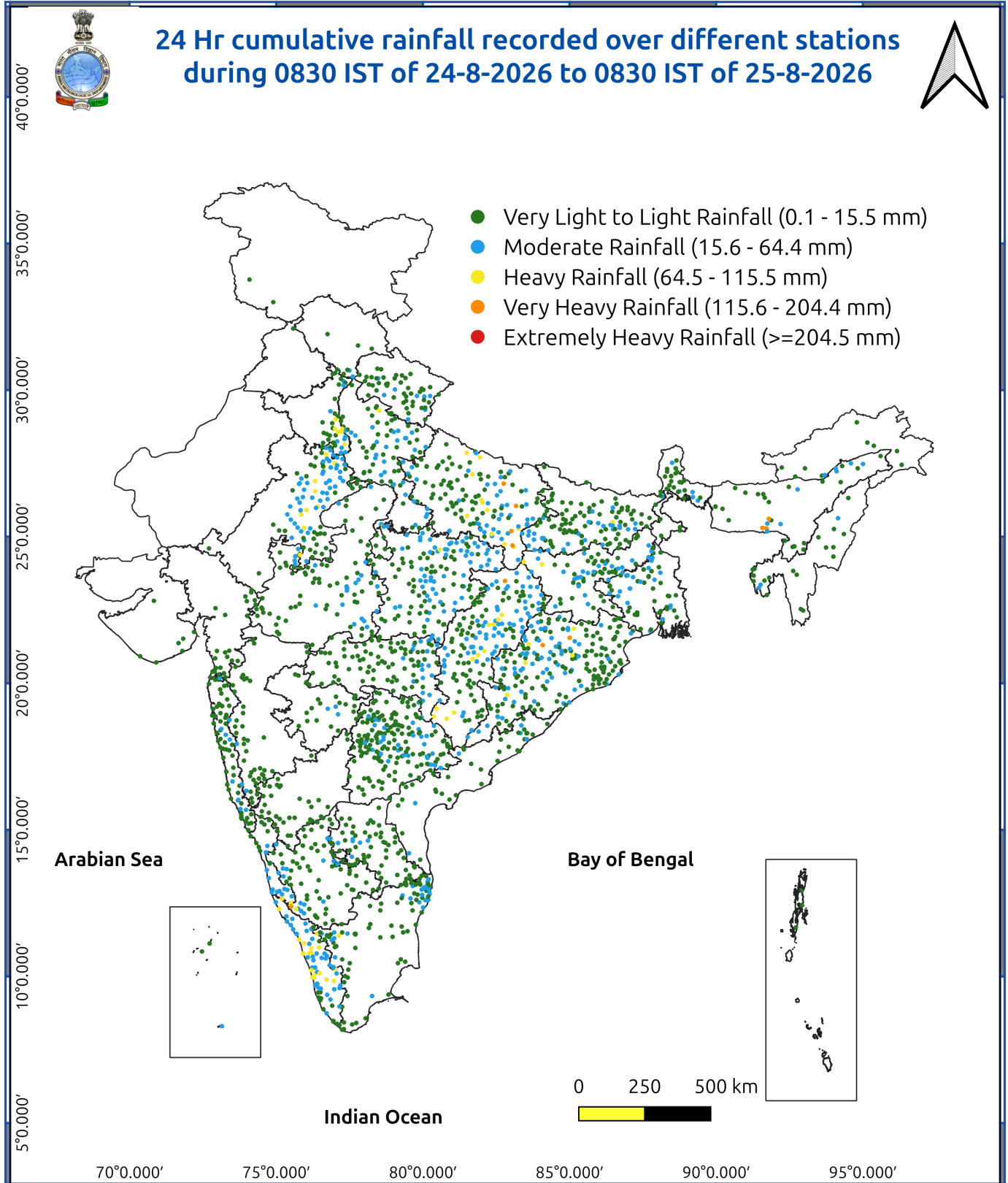


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-25





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated Heavy Rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, East Rajasthan, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe, Madhya Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand on 26th August.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Madhya Pradesh**, maintain effective drainage in maize, soybean, sugarcane, cotton, vegetable, pulse and oilseed fields and promptly remove excess water. Postpone fertilizer application and intercultural operations until the soil becomes workable. Provide staking/support to young vegetable plants and propping to sugarcane to minimize lodging.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Clean drainage channels in low-lying maize, ginger, turmeric and vegetable fields and provide staking/support to cucurbits, tomato and capsicum.
- In **Vidarbha**, maintain proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and other standing crop fields and remove excess rainwater promptly. Postpone fertilizer, plant protection and intercultural operations until the soil becomes workable and provide support to young vegetables and other vulnerable crops against lodging.
- In **Uttarakhand**, ensure proper drainage of excess rainwater from rice, sugarcane, maize, barnyard millet, kidney bean, finger millet, ginger and tomato fields. Clear terrace outlets and strengthen bunds to reduce erosion, waterlogging and lodging, and secure stakes and trellises in tomato and other vegetables.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage to remove excess rainwater from pigeon pea, maize, groundnut, sesame, rice, vegetable and other standing crop fields, particularly from low-lying areas prone to waterlogging.
- In **East Rajasthan**, make arrangements for drainage from the fields of already sown pearl millet, green gram, sesame, moth bean, cluster bean, other standing crops and vegetables.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetable

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fields and orchards to remove excess water and prevent waterlogging. Keep millet fields well-drained during panicle initiation and flowering stages and maintain proper spacing and field sanitation.

- In **Assam and Meghalaya**, maintain proper drainage in rice, sugarcane, pigeon pea, green gram, sesame, jute and vegetable fields and keep field channels clear. Harvest jute at the appropriate stage wherever field conditions permit and postpone fertilizer and plant protection operations during rainfall. In Meghalaya, remove excess water from maize, cowpea, okra and ginger fields and maintain rice bunds properly.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops, vegetables and groundnut fields to prevent water stagnation. Harvest mature maize cobs and ginger wherever field conditions permit and postpone plant protection operations until a suitable rain-free period.
- In **Odisha**, ensure continuous and effective drainage of excess water from kharif rice, maize, pulses, cotton, red gram, banana, vegetable fields and nursery beds. Keep field drains, outlets and bunds clear and functional. In waterlogged areas, postpone sowing/re-sowing of maize and green gram and prevent water stagnation in pearl millet. Protect vegetable nurseries with polythene sheets and Provide staking to vegetables, propping to banana, papaya and young horticultural plants. Maintain emergency outlets in transplanted rice fields to prevent prolonged submergence of seedlings.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal and Sikkim**, clear drainage channels in vegetable fields, orchards, rice and finger millet nurseries to prevent waterlogging. Maintain proper drainage in rice and vegetable fields, protect chilli seedlings from heavy rain and support okra and bitter gourd plants against lodging and water stagnation.
- In **Bihar**, make proper arrangements for drainage of excess rainwater from crop fields and postpone the application of fertilizers and pesticides.
- In **Jharkhand**, maintain proper drainage and prevent waterlogging in all standing crops, particularly maize and red gram. Keep harvested produce in safe, dry places and protect vegetable seedlings. Postpone fertilizer and plant protection operations until rainfall subsides and field conditions become suitable.
- In **Madhya Maharashtra**, in *Ghat* areas, drain out excess rainwater from rice, finger millet and vegetable fields. Postpone intercultural operations, fertilizer application and plant protection measures until field conditions become suitable.
- In **Tamil Nadu**, provide proper drainage to rice nurseries and standing rice fields and continue rice transplanting only where field conditions permit. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations during wet conditions and provide support to vulnerable young plants and vegetables.
- In **Coastal and South interior Karnataka**, ensure proper drainage in maize and ginger fields and remove excess water promptly. In coastal areas, provide drainage to black pepper, arecanut and coconut plantations and provide support to banana, papaya and young plants; undertake paddy transplanting only where suitable field conditions permit.
- In **Keralam**, ensure drainage around paddy, nutmeg, coconut and other plantation crops and promptly remove excess water from areas prone to waterlogging. Maintain good drainage around palms and ginger fields and avoid excessive nitrogen application in paddy during wet conditions.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

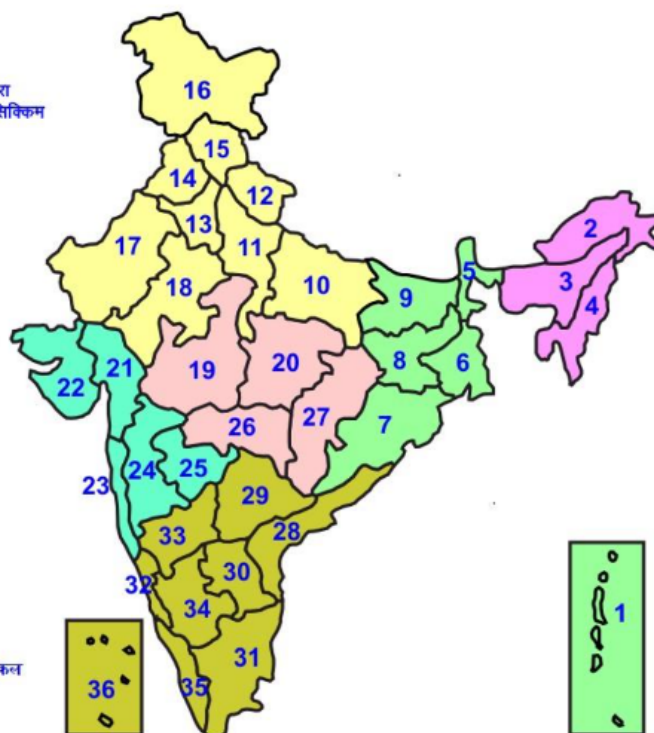
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
