ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Forecast and Warnings:

A wet spell with Isolated to Scattered rainfall/snowfall likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand on 10th-11th and isolated rainfall/snowfall likely over same region on 14th & 15th February with **Scattered to fairly widespread** rainfall/snowfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-40 kmph)** likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and isolated to scattered over Himachal Pradesh on 10th February.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

Gradual rise in minimum temperature likely over many parts of Northwest India by about 2-4°C during next 24 hours and no significant change thereafter.

Gradual rise in minimum temperature likely over of Central India by about 2-3°C during next 24 hours and no significant change thereafter.

No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over East India during next 24 hours and gradual rise by 2-3°C for subsequent 2 days and no significant change thereafter.

Gradual fall in minimum temperature likely over Maharashtra by about 2-3°C during next 24 hours and no significant change thereafter.

No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

Dense Fog, Cold day Warnings:

Dense to very dense conditions likely during morning/night hours at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh till 10th February.

Dense fog conditions likely during morning hours at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Bihar and Assam & Meghalaya till 10th February.

Main Weather Observations:

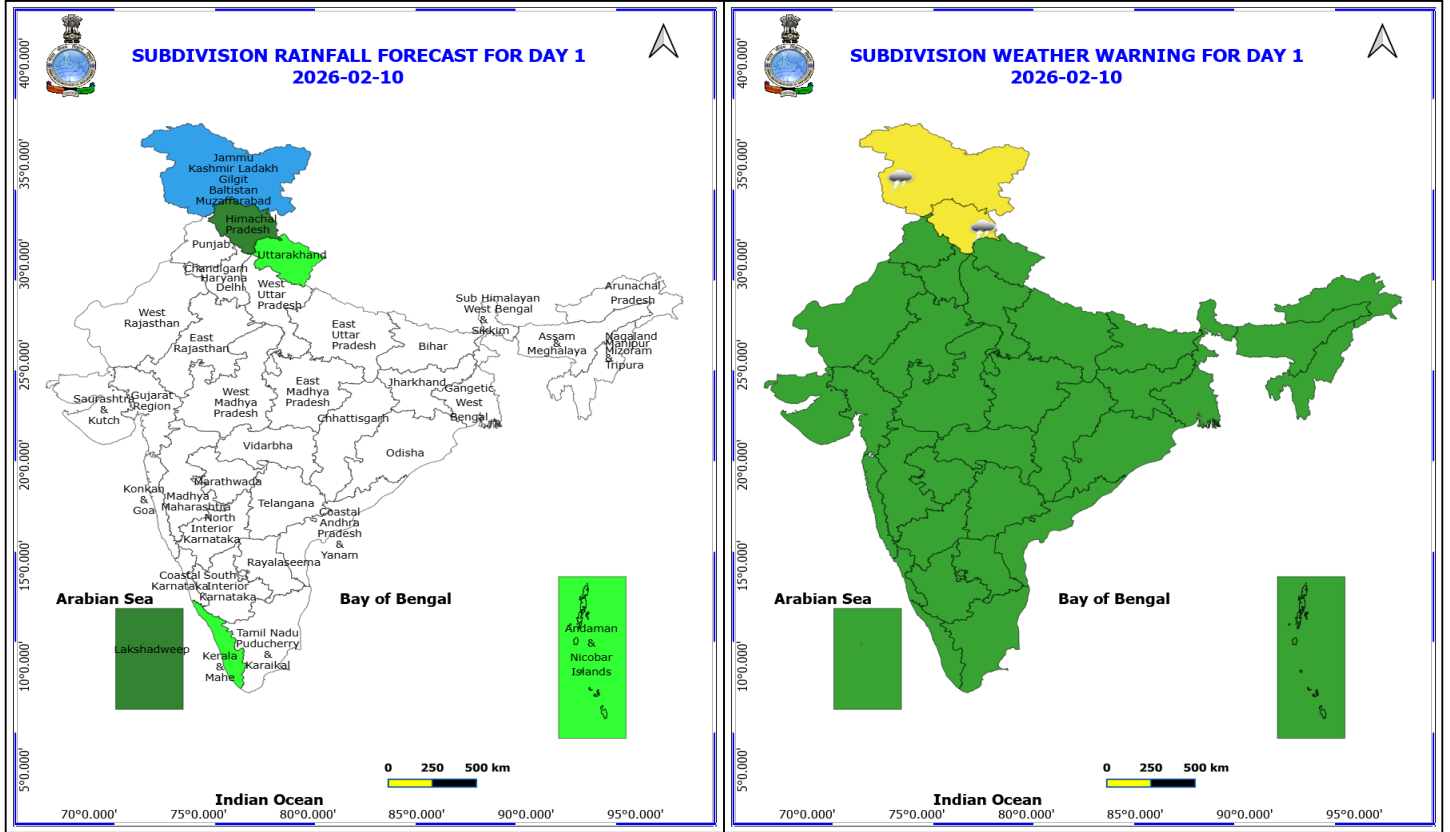
- ❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at isolated places** over Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh; **Dry** over rest of the country.
- ❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 09-02-2026): below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** at many places over Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Telangana; at a few places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Jharkhand, Gangetic West Bengal, Vidarbha, Marathwada, Interior Karnataka, Mizoram and **above normal (1.6°C to 3.1°C)** at many places over Gujarat, North Konkan adjoining Madhya Maharashtra, West Rajasthan and at a few places over Jammu and Arunachal Pradesh and **near normal** over rest parts of the country. The **lowest minimum** temperature of **6.6°C** was observed at **Shahjahanpur (West Uttar Pradesh)** over the plains of India.
- ❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 09-02-2026): The highest maximum temperature** of 35.7°C is reported at KOCHI (CIAL) (KERALA).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over north Pakistan adjoining Jammu now lies over Punjab adjoining north Pakistan at 3.1 km above mean sea level with a trough aloft in middle & upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 68°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.
- The **Induced cyclonic circulation** over Southwest Rajasthan and adjoining south Pakistan now lies over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 125 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level prevails over Northeast India.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southeast Bangladesh & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Central Kerala & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

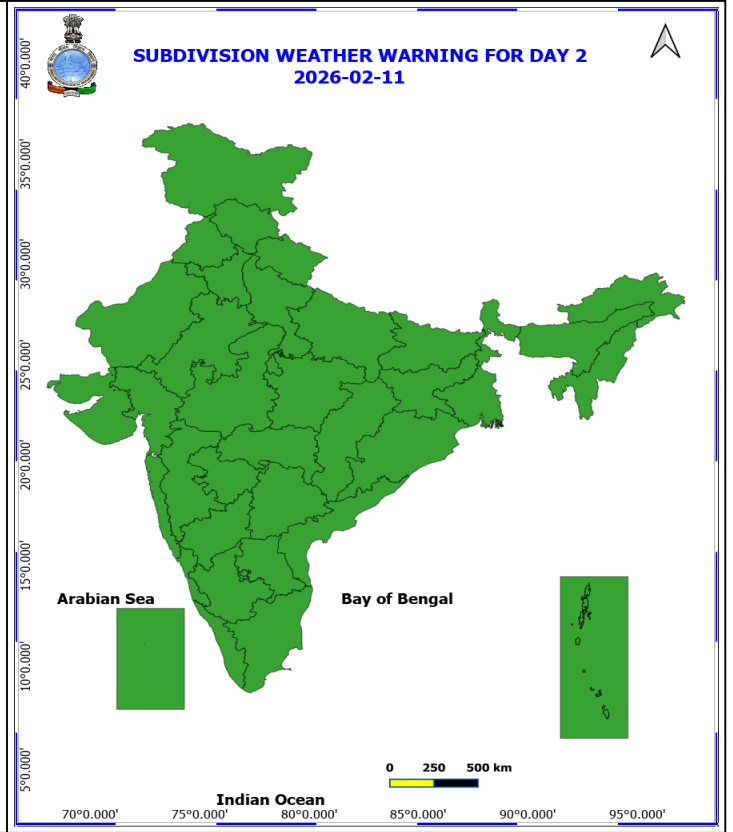
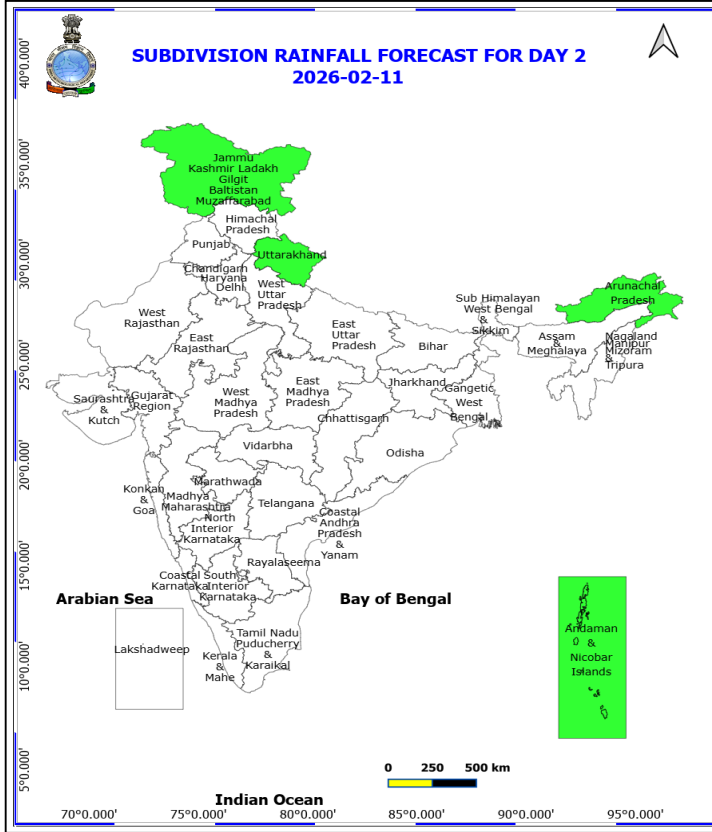
- Isolated/Scattered rainfall/snowfall activity likely over Western Himalayan Region.
- Isolated/Scattered rainfall activity likely over Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh, Rajasthan, West Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Lakshadweep and Nicobar islands.

❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh and Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.

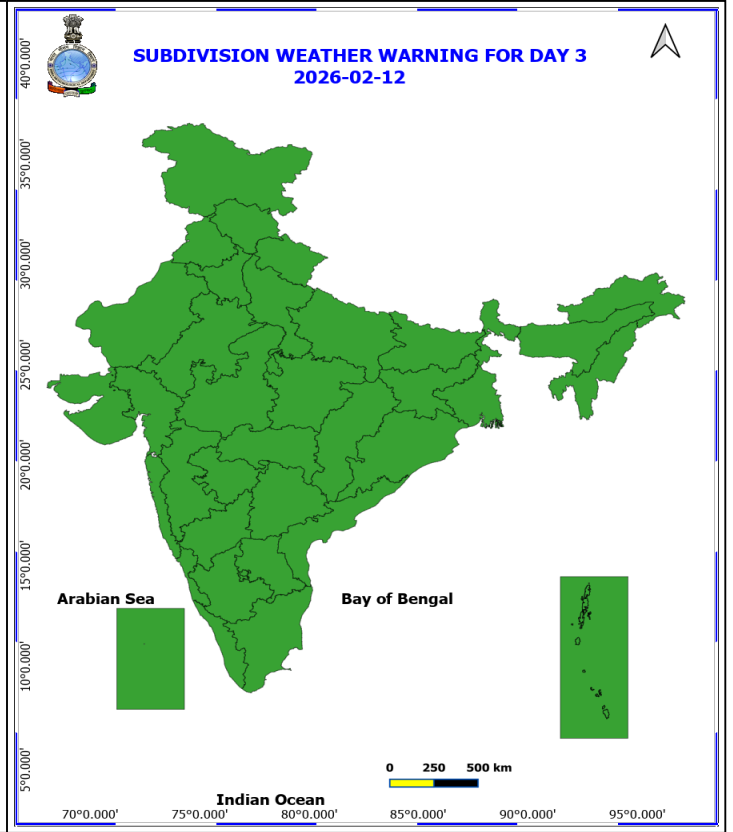
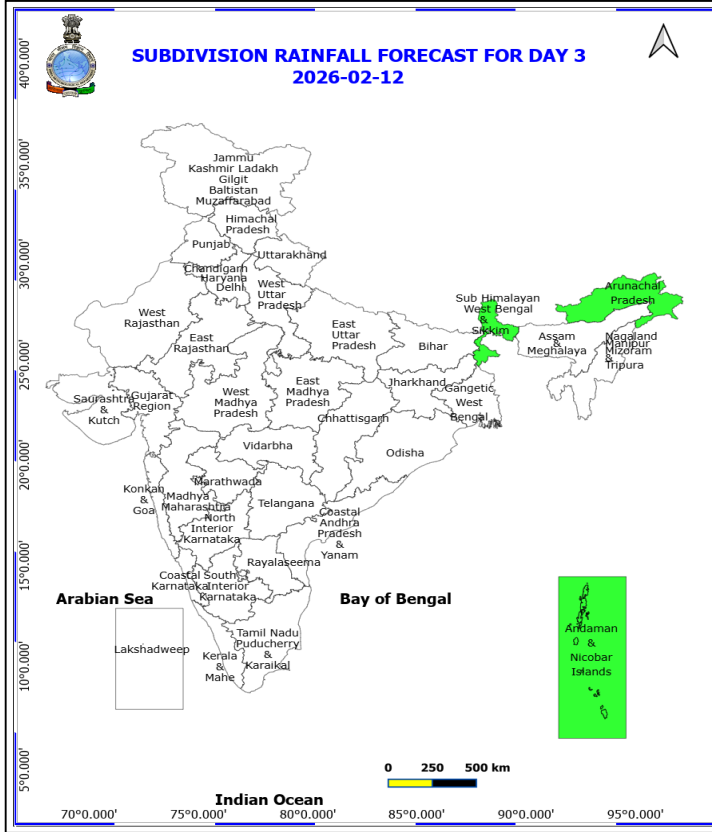

Impact expected due to dense fog in the morning/night hours:

- **Dense to very dense conditions** likely during morning/night hours at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh till 10th February.
- **Dense fog conditions** likely during morning hours at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Bihar and Assam & Meghalaya till 10th February.

Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

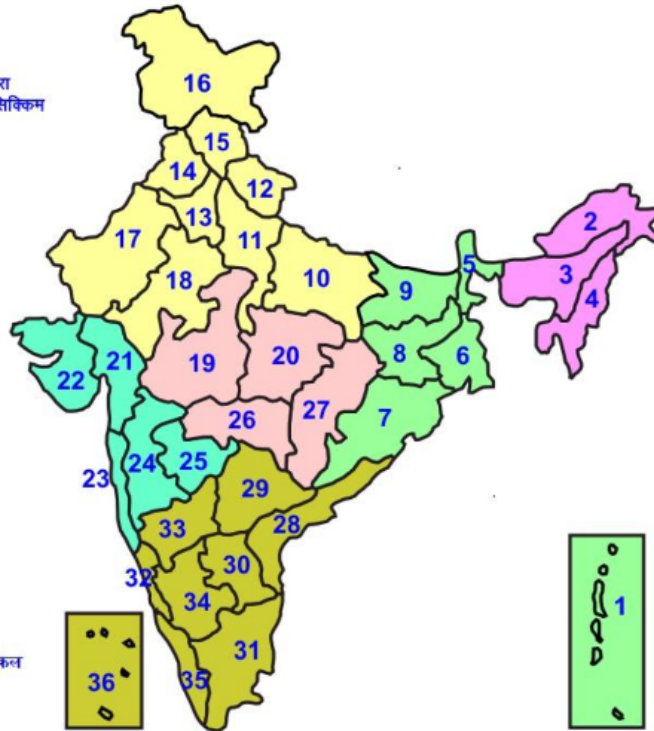

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave : When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .

Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)
Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
