Significant Weather Features

Weather Warning and Forecast

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Uttarakhand on 7th September and during 10th-12th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over East Uttar Pradesh during 7th-8th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over rest parts of northwest India.

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 8th-12th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 9th-10th September; Vidarbha during 7th-9th September; Chhattisgarh on 7th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 11th-12th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 7th-12th September; Vidarbha on 11th September; Chhattisgarh during 9th-12th September.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 7th-12th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 7th-10th September; Jharkhand during 8th-11th September; Bihar on 7th September; Odisha during 10th-12th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Gangetic West Bengal during 11th-12th September; Jharkhand on 7th September and on 12th September; Bihar during 8th-12th September; Odisha during 7th-9th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 7th-8th September and during 11th-12th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 7th-9th September; Jharkhand on 9th September; Bihar during 7th-8th September; Odisha during 9th-12th September.
- **Moderate to severe lightning activity likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 07th September.**

Northeast India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Assam & Meghalaya during 9th-10th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 7th-12th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 7th-8th September and during 11th-12th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 7th-12th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 7th-8th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 7th-10th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 7th-12th September.

West India:

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- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 7th-12th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathawada and Saurashtra & Kutch during 7th-12th September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 7th-12th September; Lakshadweep during 7th-8th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Lakshadweep during 9th-12th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema on 7th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 7th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 8th-10th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 7th-10th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 6th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 11th-12th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 7th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 7th-10th September.

Hot & Humid weather warning:

- **Hot and humid** weather conditions likely to prevail over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Kerala & Mahe during 7th-8th September.

Fishermen Warning:

- **Arabian Sea:** Along and off Somalia coast adjoining few parts of southwest & westcentral Arabian Sea few parts of Oman coast adjoining few parts of northwest Arabian Sea till 11th September.
- **Bay of Bengal:** few parts of Comorin adjoining Gulf of Mannar off south Tamil Nadu coasts and few parts of southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining southeast Sri Lanka coasts during 08th to 11th September.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over West Uttar Pradesh, East Uttar Pradesh, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Madhya Pradesh and Konkan & Goa ; **at many places** over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, East Madhya Pradesh, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, East Rajasthan, Bihar, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, West Rajasthan, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep ; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **West Uttar Pradesh:** Bareilly (dist Bareilly) 32; **Andaman & Nicobar Islands:** Long Island (dist North And Middle Andaman) 8; **West Madhya Pradesh:** Gwalior (dist Gwalior) 4; **West Rajasthan:** Churu (dist Churu) 4; **Konkan & Goa :** Ratnagiri (dist Ratnagiri) 4.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Extremely heavy rain** at isolated places over West Uttar Pradesh; **Heavy rain** at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 06-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Lakshadweep; at most places over Rayalaseema; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, East Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Uttarakhand, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Lakshadweep. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 15.6°C was reported at YEOTMAL (MAHARASHTRA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 06-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Odisha, Marathwada, Telangana, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Madhya Maharashtra and Vidarbha. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over Coastal Karnataka; at few places over Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan and Konkan & Goa; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch and Chhattisgarh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh and Punjab; at most places over East Rajasthan; at few places over Bihar, Uttarakhand and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over West Uttar Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.9°C was reported at VELLORE-OBS (TAMIL NADU).

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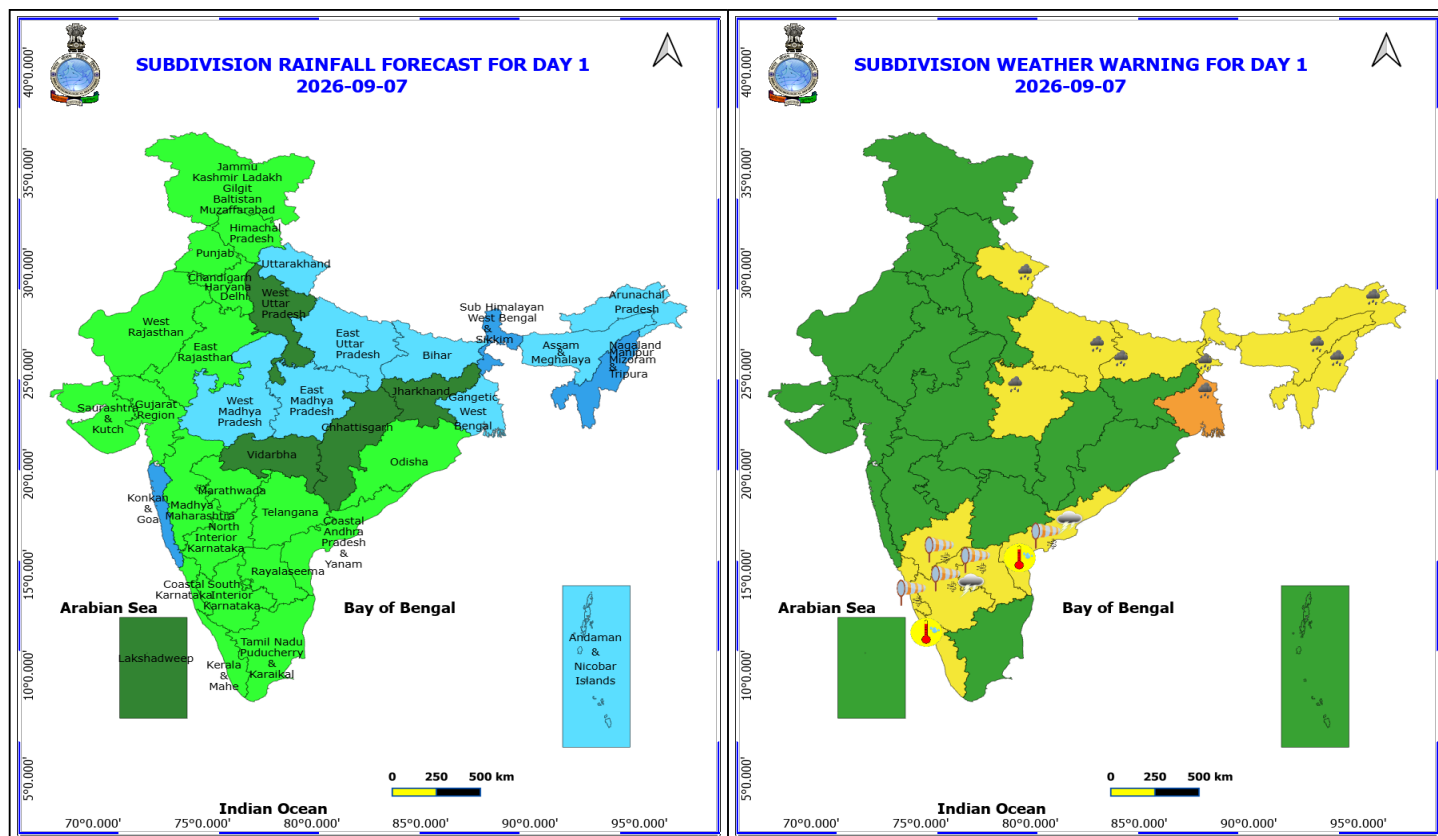
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low Pressure area** over Southwest Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood lay over central parts of Uttar Pradesh at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 07th September 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 5.8 km above mean sea level. It is likely to move east-northeastwards during next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Bikaner, centre of **Low Pressure area** over central parts of Uttar Pradesh, Daltonganj, Ranchi, Bankura and thence eastwards towards Tripura and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** from south Gujarat to north Bangladesh across cyclonic circulation associated with **Low Pressure area** over central parts of Uttar Pradesh, north Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and West Bengal between 3.1 & 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over Kashmir & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The another **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle and upper tropospheric with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 28°N persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from south Telangana to Gulf of Mannar across Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Saurashtra & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.

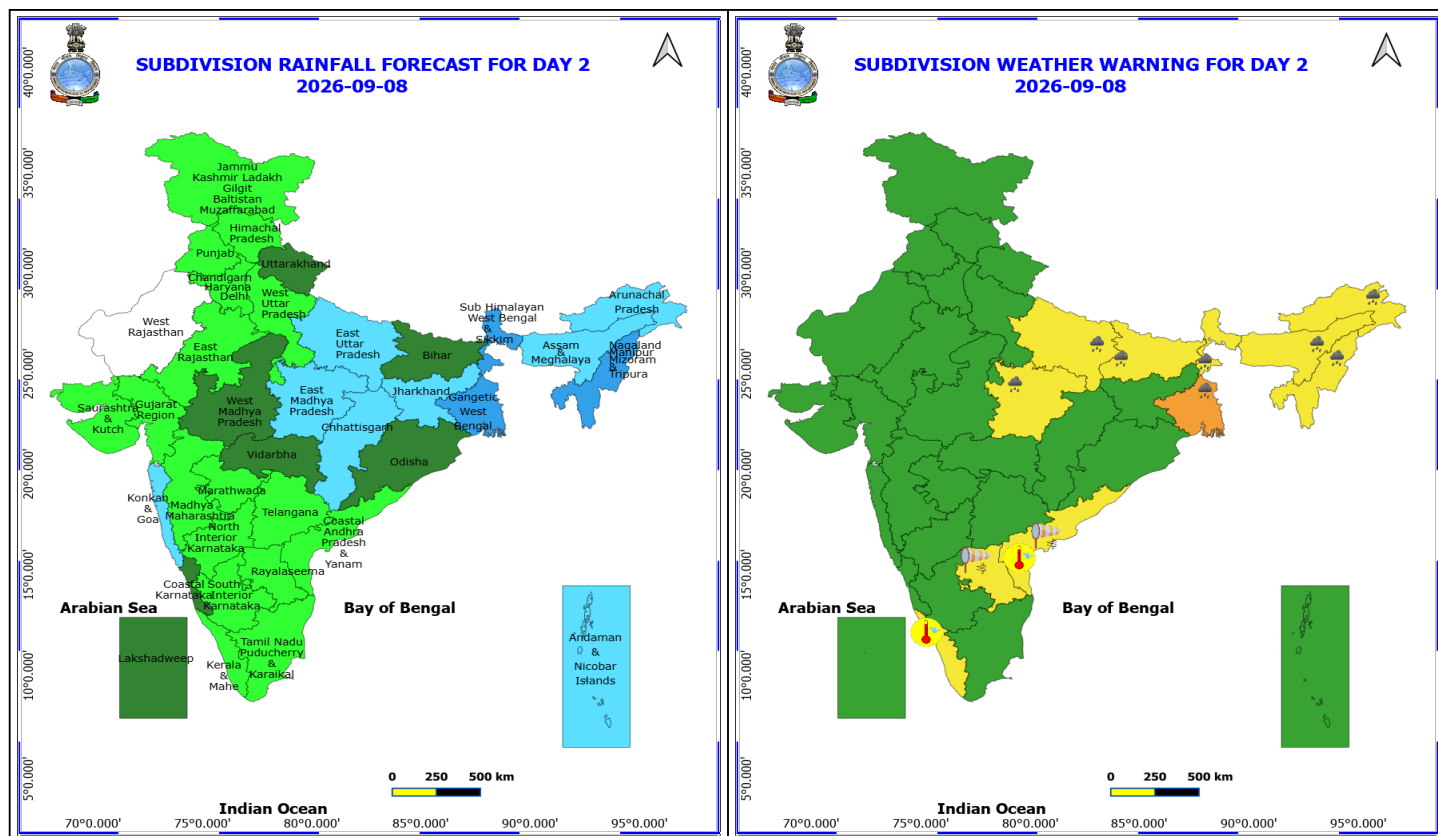

- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia, few parts of Oman coasts adjoining few parts of westcentral, southwest & northwest Arabian Sea..

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-06

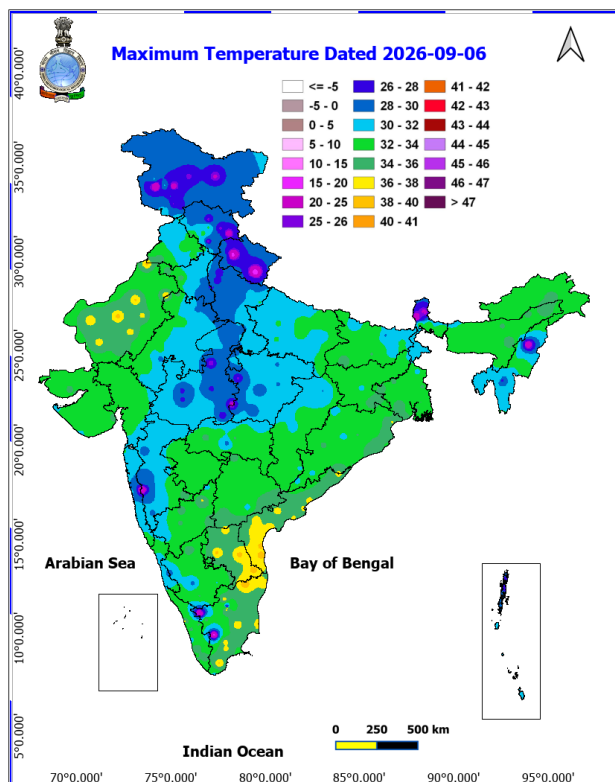


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-06

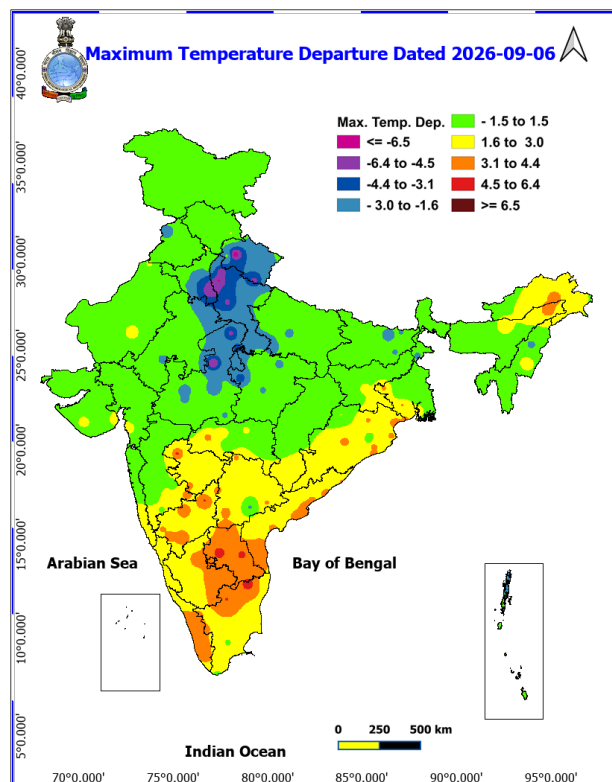


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-06

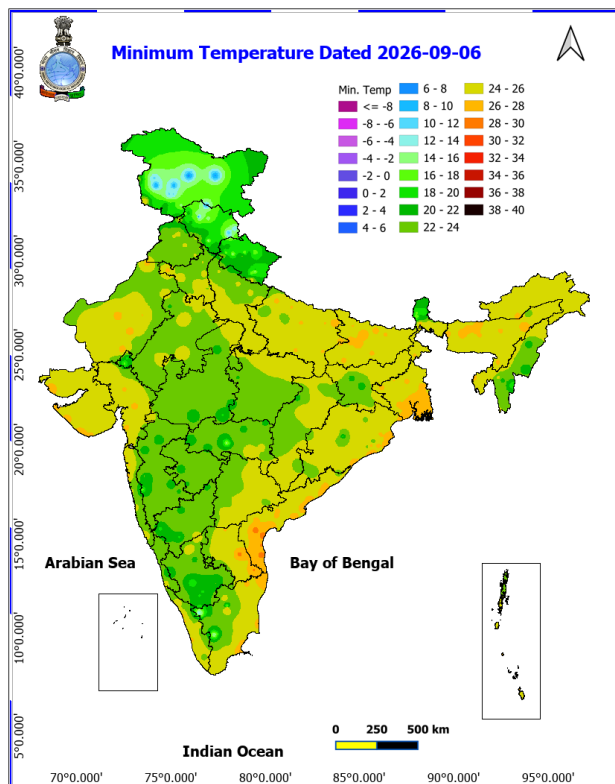
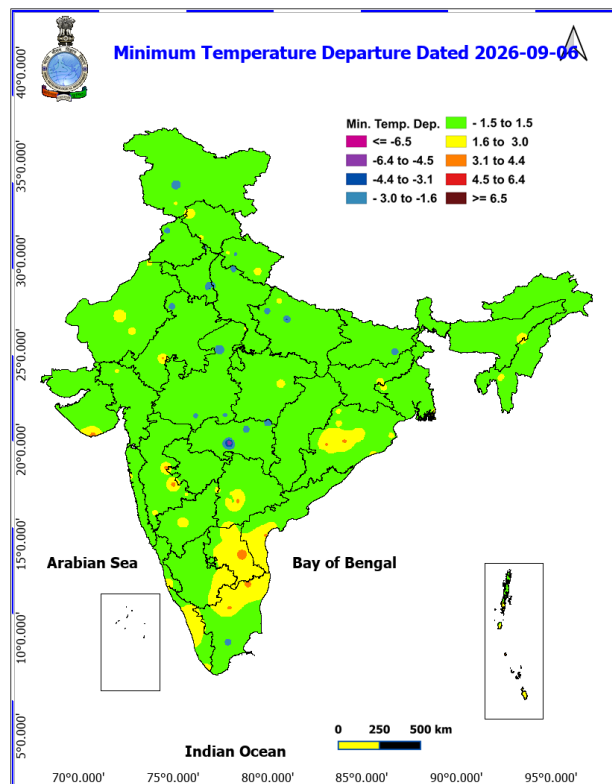
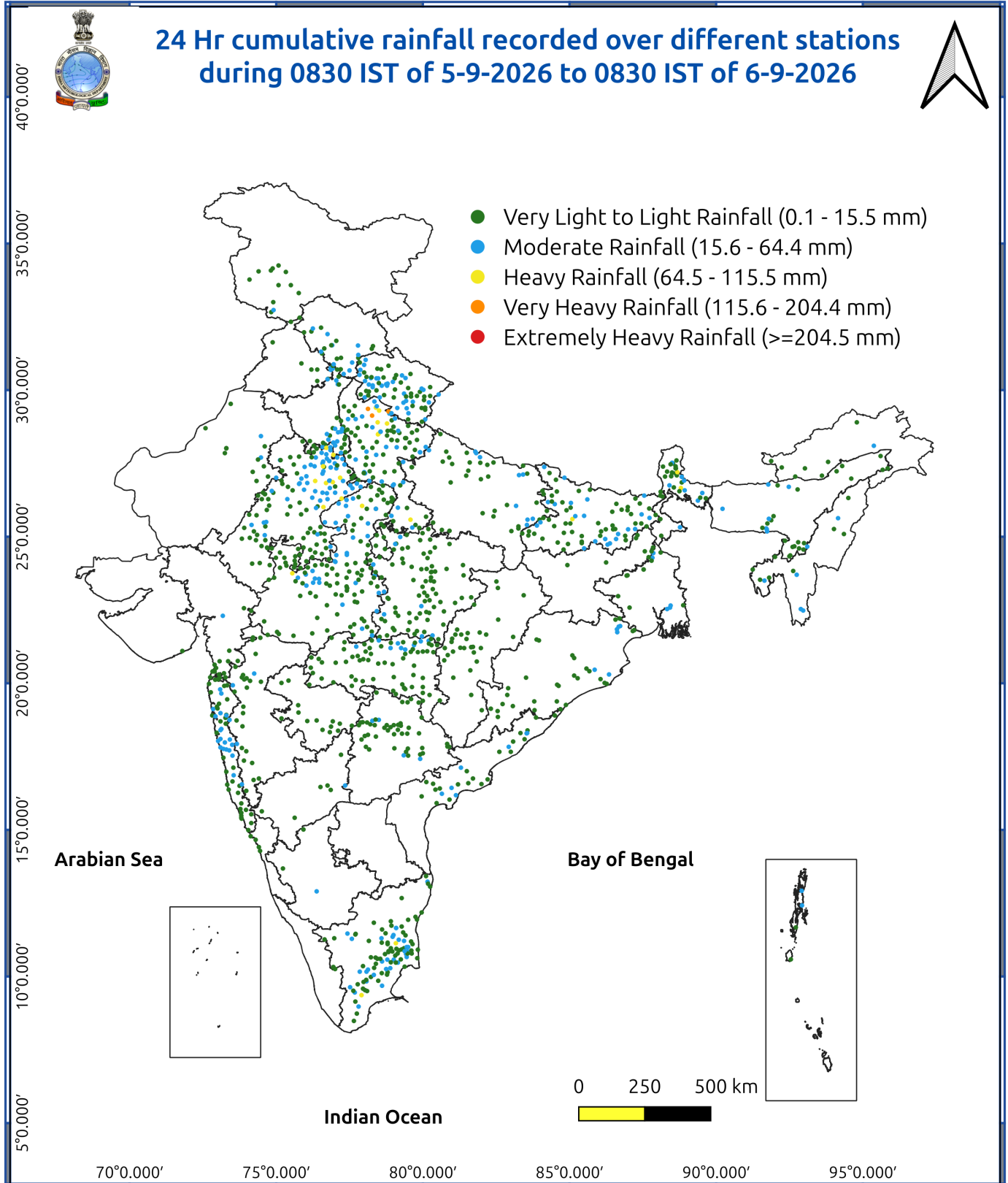


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-06





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- **Moderate to severe lightning activity** likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 07th September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetables and orchards to remove excess water. Keep millet fields well drained during panicle initiation and flowering and monitor crops for pest and disease incidence.
- In **Assam** and **Meghalaya**, maintain proper drainage in crop fields and postpone fertilizer and plant-protection applications during rainfall. Continue sowing of pigeon pea, green gram and sesame only where field conditions are suitable and harvest jute at the small-pod stage.
- In **Nagaland**, maintain 3-5 cm water level in wet rice fields and harvest mature maize cobs during suitable weather.
- In **Manipur**, harvest colocasia and mature ginger during rain-free periods and ensure proper drainage in ginger fields.
- In **Mizoram**, prepare fields for sowing black gram, green gram, soybean, sesame and lentil after maize harvest. Ensure drainage in ginger fields and prevent water stagnation to minimise soft-rot and rhizome-rot incidence.
- In **Tripura**, maintain adequate soil moisture in Aus rice during panicle initiation and booting, while ensuring drainage in low-lying groundnut fields to prevent stagnation.
- In **Bihar**, maintain proper drainage in standing crops and avoid field operations under excessively wet conditions. Maintain appropriate standing water in transplanted rice while avoiding prolonged stagnation.
- In **Gangetic West Bengal**, keep drainage channels clear in rice, vegetable fields, orchards and nurseries. Protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rain, improve drainage around cucurbits and avoid nitrogen application during wet conditions.
- In **Jammu & Kashmir**, prevent water stagnation in pulses and vegetable fields and provide proper support to

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cucurbit plants. Ensure effective drainage in maize fields and promptly remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas.

- In **Punjab** and **Haryana**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and promptly remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas.
- In **Uttarakhand**, avoid irrigation in rice where rainfall is adequate and maintain proper drainage in sugarcane and maize fields. Keep drainage channels clear and provide support to tall crops and vegetables to prevent lodging.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer and plant-protection applications during wet conditions. Provide staking/support to young plants, vegetables and horticultural crops.
- In **East Rajasthan**, Maintain proper drainage in the field to avoid water-logging. Do not spray pesticides during rain. Harvest ripe and marketable fruits of tomato, chilli and brinjal regularly and maintain proper drainage in fields to avoid water logging. To control downy mildew and blast disease in bajra, spray Mancozeb (0.2%) or Metalaxyl especially in Flood Prone Zone.
- In **Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging; postpone vegetable transplanting and provide support to young fruit plants. Undertake propping in sugarcane to minimise lodging.
- In **Tamil Nadu**, provide support to banana, papaya and moringa and undertake propping in sugarcane to minimise lodging. Continue maize sowing and tomato transplanting only where field conditions permit, preferably using ridge-and-furrow systems for effective drainage.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

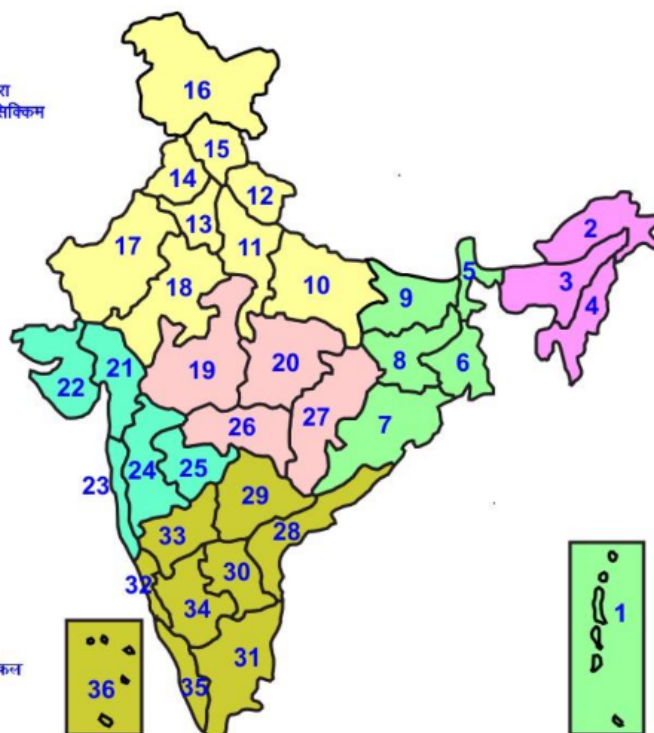
- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
