- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 11th September and on 13th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 11th-12th September; Vidarbha during 11th-12th September; Chhattisgarh on 12th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 12th September; Chhattisgarh on 11th September.

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 11th-16th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 10th-13th September; Jharkhand and Odisha during 11th-12th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Gangetic West Bengal during 14th-16th September; Jharkhand and Odisha during 13th-16th September; Bihar during 11th-16th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 12th-13th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 11th-13th September; Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand on 11th September; Odisha on 12th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Odisha on 11th September.

Northeast India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 11th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 13th-14th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 14th-16th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 12th-16th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 11th-12th September and during 15th-16th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 11th-13th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 11th-14th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 11th-13th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 11th-15th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 12th-15th September.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 11th-16th September; Madhya

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Maharashtra during 13th-16th September; Marathawada during 12th-13th September; Gujarat Region during 12th-15th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 13th-14th September.

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Madhya Maharashtra during 11th-12th September; Marathawada on 11th September and during 14th-16th September; Gujarat Region on 11th September and on 16th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 11th-12th September and during 15th-16th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra and Saurashtra & Kutch during 12th-14th September; Marathawada during 11th-13th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa on 13th September; Gujarat Region and Madhya Maharashtra on 12th September; Marathawada during 12th-13th September; Saurashtra & Kutch on 13th September and on 15th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 13th September; Gujarat Region during 13th-14th September; Saurashtra & Kutch on 14th September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 11th-16th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Kerala & Mahe during 13th-16th September; Lakshadweep during 12th-13th September; Telangana during 12th-16th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Kerala & Mahe during 11th-12th September; Lakshadweep on 11th September and during 14th-16th September; Telangana on 11th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 11th-12th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 12th-14th September; Rayalaseema during 11th-14th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over South Interior Karnataka during 13th-14th September; Telangana during 11th-12th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over South Interior Karnataka on 12th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 15th September; Kerala & Mahe during 11th-12th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 12th September; Telangana on 11th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 11th September.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 11th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over South Interior Karnataka during 13th-14th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 11th-14th September; Rayalaseema during 11th-14th September.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Gangetic West Bengal, East Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Chhattisgarh and Lakshadweep ; **at many places** over West Madhya Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Konkan & Goa , Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Telangana and Rayalaseema; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim:** Malda (dist Malda) 7; **Bihar:** Dehri (dist Rohtas) 5; **Odisha:** Balasore (dist Balasore), Gopalpur (dist Ganjam) 5 Each, Chandbali (dist Bhadrak) 4; **Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam:** Kalingapatnam (dist Srikakulam) 4; **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura:** Agartala AP (dist West Tripura) 4.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 10-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Madhya Pradesh, Rayalaseema and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Uttarakhand, Punjab and Lakshadweep; at most places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada and North Interior Karnataka; at most places over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over Punjab, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.0°C was reported at YEOTMAL (MAHARASHTRA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 10-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Arunachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, Telangana and South Interior Karnataka. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Himachal Pradesh and Rayalaseema; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Uttarakhand, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Chhattisgarh; at most places over Coastal Karnataka; at few places over West Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Konkan & Goa; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar and East Uttar Pradesh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Jharkhand. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.0°C was reported at PILANI (RAJASTHAN).

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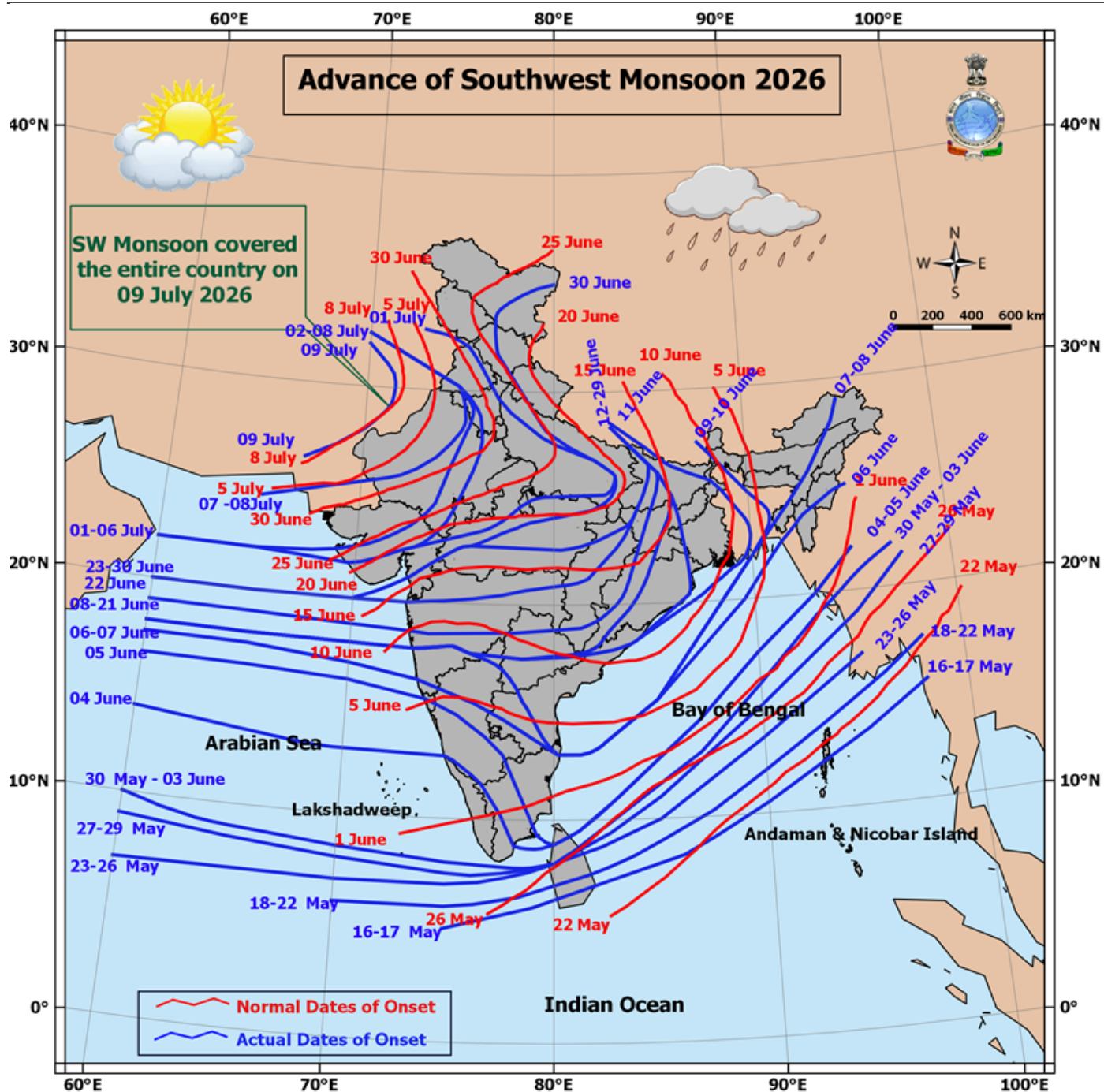
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low Pressure Area** over Northwest Bay of Bengal & neighbourhood now lies over Northwest-Westcentral Bay of Bengal & adjoining south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh coasts at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 11 September 2026. The associated **cyclonic circulation** extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northwest Uttar Pradesh now lies over southwest Uttar Pradesh and adjoining north Madhya Pradesh between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** now runs from north Rajasthan to **cyclonic circulation** associated with the **Low Pressure Area** over Northwest-Westcentral Bay of Bengal & adjoining south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh coasts across Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh and extends upto 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Sri Ganganagar, Guna, Jabalpur, Bilaspur to the centre of **Low Pressure Area** over Northwest-Westcentral Bay of Bengal & adjoining south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh coasts and thence east southeastwards to Eastcentral Bay of Bengal.
- The **trough** from South Interior Karnataka to Gulf of Mannar across Tamil Nadu at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Gujarat & neighbourhood between 4.5 & 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over north Pakistan and adjoining Jammu at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.

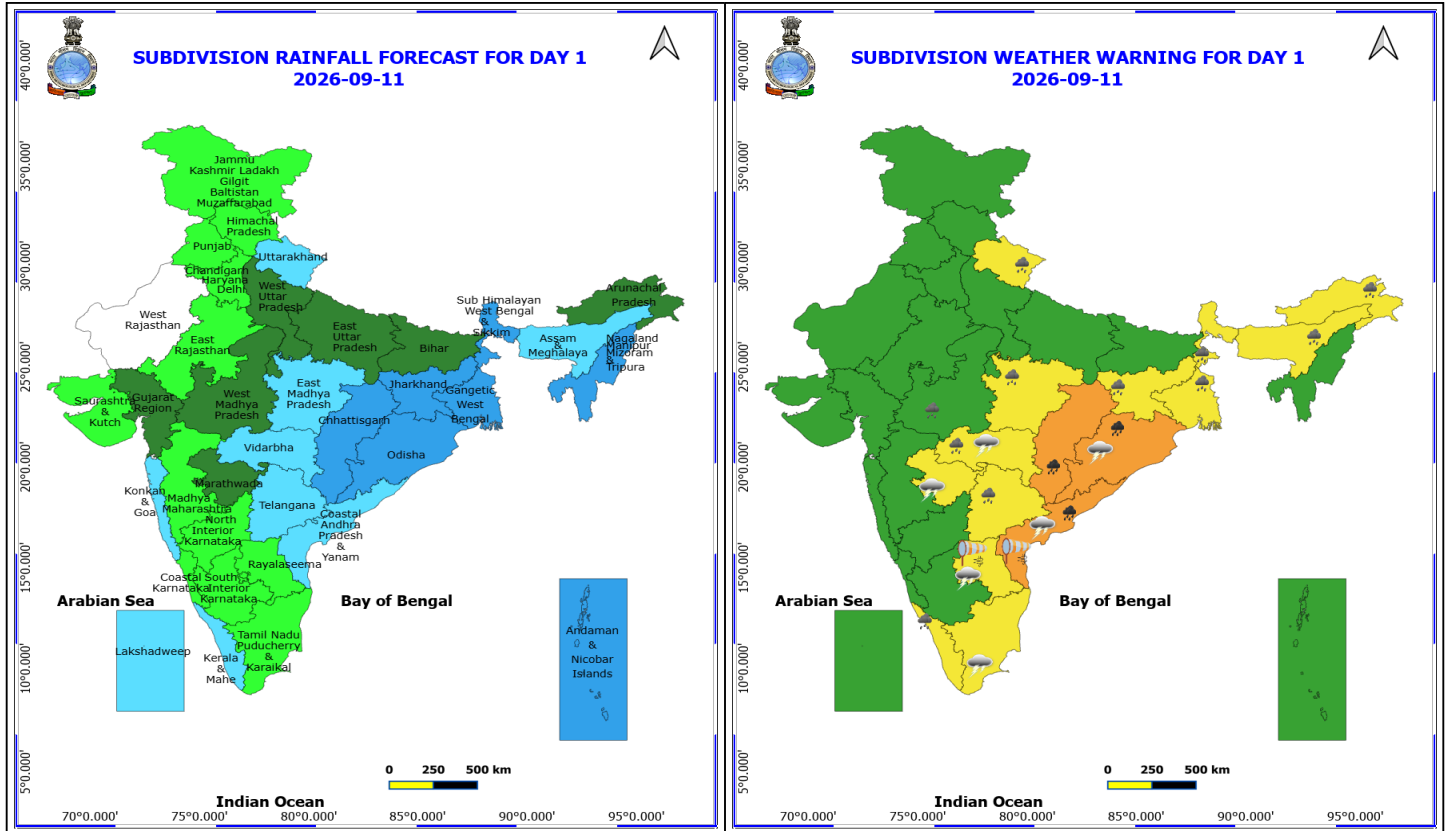

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-10

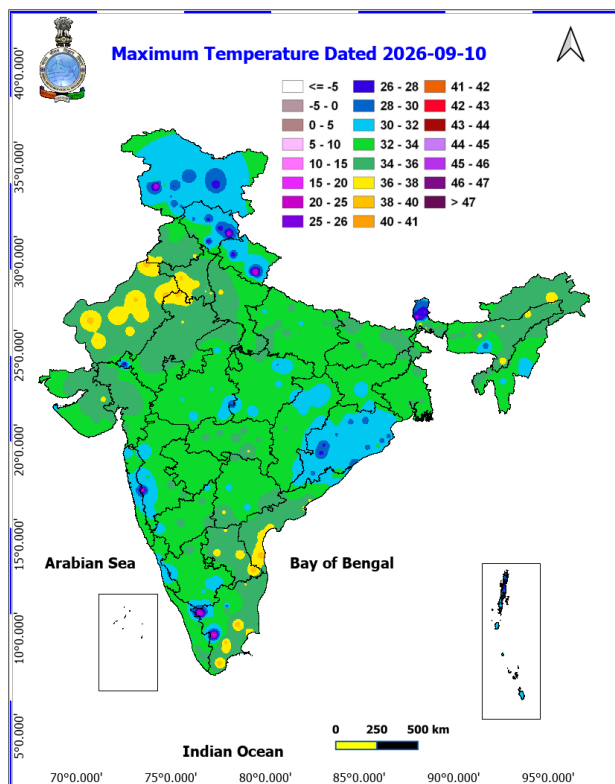


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-10

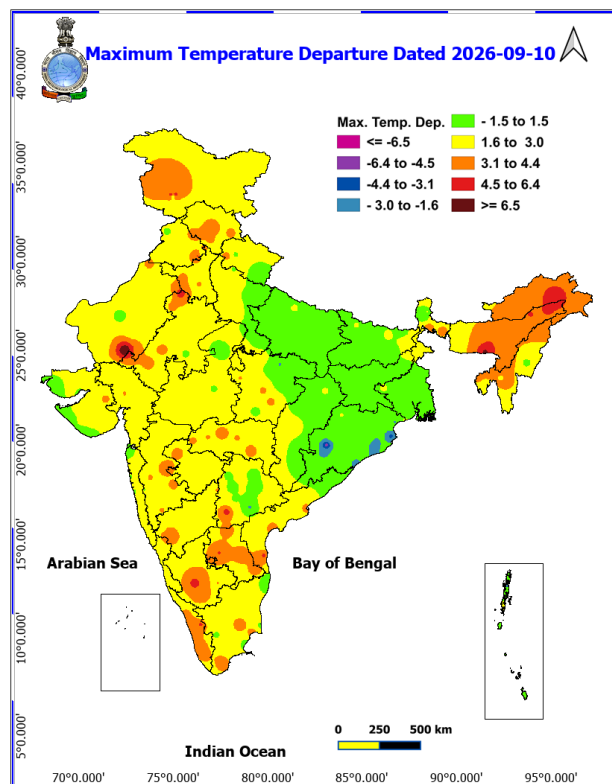


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-10

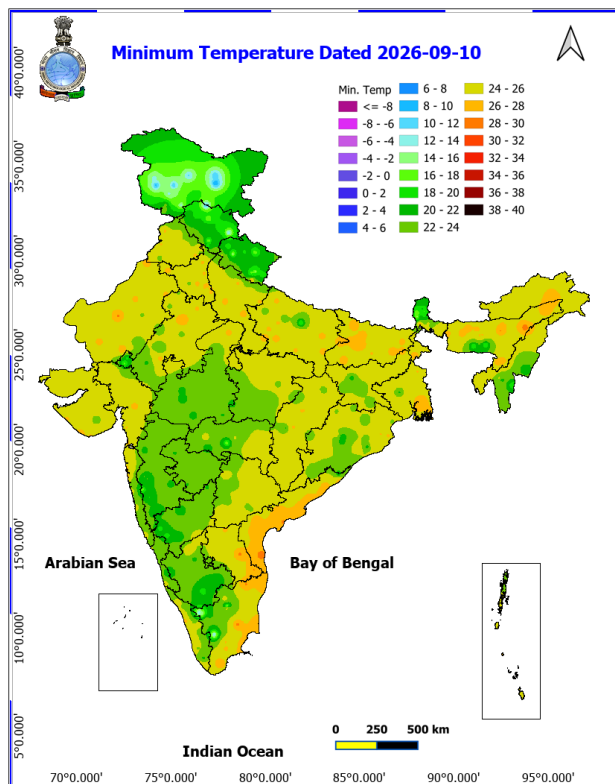
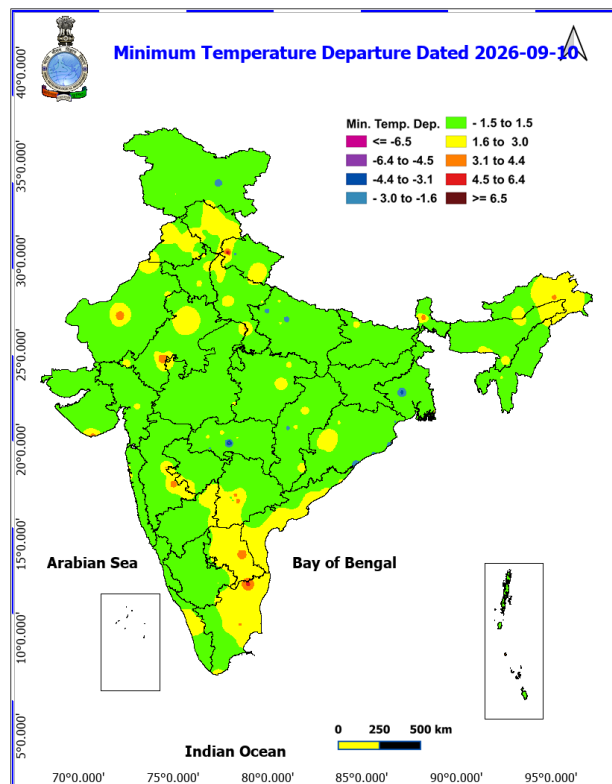
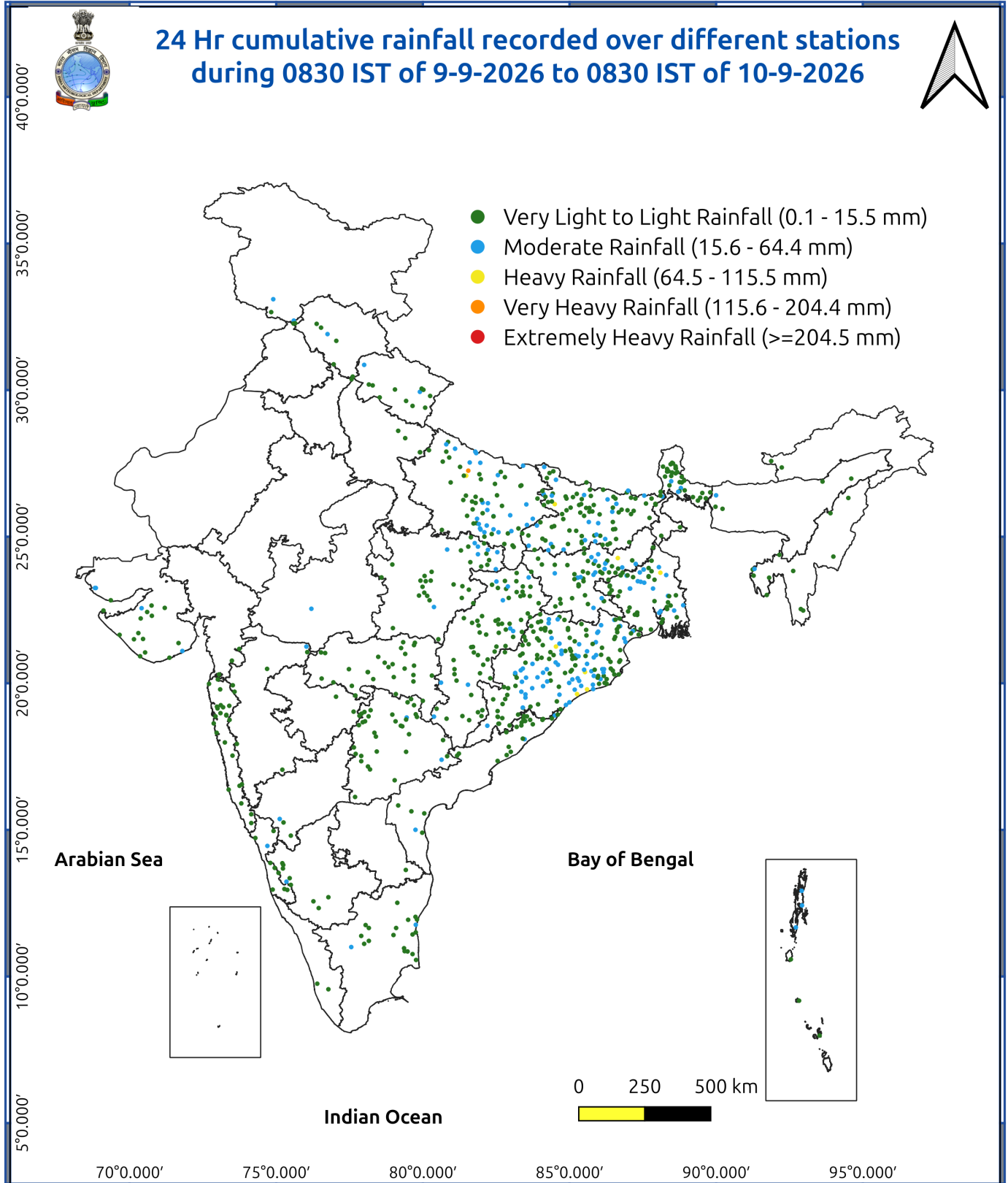


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-10





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Odisha on 11th September.

Impact expected:

Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.

Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.

Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.

Loose objects may fly.

Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.

Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.

There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.

Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.

Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.

Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.

In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.

Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.

Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall:

In **Odisha**, ensure continuous and effective drainage of excess rainwater from rice and groundnut fields and keep drainage channels clear. Do not allow water to stagnate in ginger beds and provide mechanical support or staking to vulnerable crops to minimise lodging. Continue intercultural operations only after rainfall stops and the soil becomes workable.

In **Chhattisgarh**, ensure continuous and effective drainage of excess rainwater from rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Keep drainage channels clear, particularly in

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low-lying maize, ginger and turmeric fields, and remove excess water promptly.

In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal** and **Sikkim**, maintain proper drainage in rice, vegetable fields and orchards to prevent water stagnation. Keep drainage channels clear and protect standing vegetables and horticultural crops from excess rain wherever required.

In **Gangetic West Bengal**, maintain proper drainage in rice and vegetable fields and keep drainage channels clear to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit and shift harvested produce to safe and dry places.

In **Jharkhand**, ensure effective drainage in standing crop fields and promptly remove excess rainwater. Protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rainfall and keep harvested produce in safe and dry places.

In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetables and orchards and remove excess water promptly. Provide support to vulnerable standing crops wherever required to minimise lodging.

In **Assam** and **Meghalaya**, ensure effective drainage in rice, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame and vegetable fields and keep drainage channels clear. Harvest jute at the small-pod stage wherever field conditions permit.

In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram** and **Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Harvest mature maize, colocasia and ginger wherever field conditions permit and keep harvested produce in safe and dry places.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

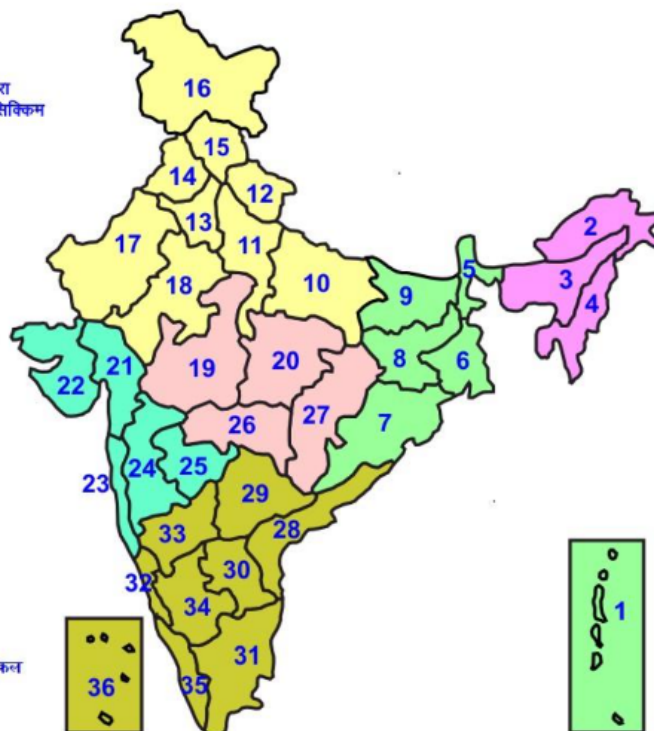
Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.

Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)

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
