Significant Weather Features

WEATHER FORECAST AND WARNING:

Northwest India:

- **Scattered to fairly widespread** light to moderate rainfall/snowfall with isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (40-50 kmph) likely over western Himalayan region on 31st March.
- **Isolated to Scattered** light to moderate rainfall with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph) likely over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and East Rajasthan on 31st March.
- Another fresh wet spell with **Scattered to fairly widespread** light to moderate rainfall/snowfall with isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (40-50 kmph) likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Himachal Pradesh on 03rd & 04th April; Uttarakhand during 03rd -05th April with **isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall with isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph reaching 60 kmph) likely over Punjab and Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 03rd -05th and West Rajasthan during 02nd – 04th; East Rajasthan on 03rd & 04th; West Uttar Pradesh on 04th & 05th April.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly widespread to widespread** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph)** likely over northeast India during 31st March- 03rd April.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh 31st March & 01st April; Assam & Meghalaya on 31st March & 01st April and Tripura on 31st March.

East India:

- **Fairly widespread to widespread** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph)** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 31st March- 02nd April.
- **Isolated to Scattered** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (40-50 gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Jharkhand on 31st March and 02nd & 03rd April; Odisha during 31st March -03rd April.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph) likely** over Gangetic West Bengal on 31st March.
- **Isolated Hailstorm activity** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, Jharkhand and Odisha on 31st March.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 31st March.

Central India:

- **Isolated** light to moderate rainfall **with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph)** likely over Central India during next 5 days.
- **Isolated hailstorm activity** likely over Vidarbha on 31st March & 01st April & Chhattisgarh on 31st March & 01st April.

West India:

- **Isolated** light to moderate rainfall **with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 31st March – 03rd April; Gujarat State on 02nd & 03rd April with lightning over Konkan & Goa during 31st March – 02nd April.
- **Isolated hailstorm activity** likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada on 31st March.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated** light to moderate rainfall **with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe on 31st March; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana and Interior Karnataka during 31st March – 03rd April; Rayalaseema on 31st March & 01st April with **lightning** over Tamil Nadu on 31st March; Kerala & Mahe during 01st -03rd April and Coastal Karnataka 31st March -03rd April.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Kerala & Mahe on 31st March.

Forecast of maximum/day temperatures:

- Gradual fall in maximum temperatures by 2-4°C likely over Northwest India except Uttar Pradesh till 30th March; gradual rise by 3-5°C during 31st March-03rd April; gradual fall by 3-5°C on 04th & 05th April.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over Central India till 01st April and gradual fall by 2-3°C during 02nd -05th April.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over East India till 01st April and gradual rise by 2-4°C during 02nd -05th April.
- Gradual fall in maximum temperatures by 2-3°C likely over Gujarat State till 01st April and no significant change during 02nd -05th April.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over Maharashtra till 30th March and gradual fall by 2-3°C during 31st March -05th April.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at a few places** over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, West Madhya Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Vidarbha, Gangetic West Bengal, East Rajasthan, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and Marathwada; **at isolated places** over East Madhya Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, West Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Assam & Meghalaya, Kerala & Mahe and Telangana; **Dry** over rest of the country.

Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 30-03-2026): **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan; at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh and Madhya Maharashtra. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan and Gujarat Region; at few places over East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Chhattisgarh; at few places over Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at few places over Odisha, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh and Telangana; at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch. **The lowest minimum temperature of 15.0 °C** was observed **at Gurdaspur (Punjab)** over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 30-03-2026):** **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh and Vidarbha. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over Chhattisgarh; at few places over Punjab, Rayalaseema, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Gujarat Region; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, East Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and West Rajasthan; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya. **The highest maximum temperature of 41.8°C** was reported at TITLAGARH (ORISSA).



Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Western Disturbance** as an **upper air cyclonic circulation** over North Iran & adjoining Caspian sea between 3.1 & 9.4 km above mean sea level persists with an associated trough in lower to upper tropospheric levels now runs roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 20°N at 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **induced upper air cyclonic circulation** over Punjab and adjoining Haryana extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from an upper air cyclonic circulation over Punjab and adjoining Haryana to northeast Arabian Sea across West Rajasthan at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northwest Uttar Pradesh at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from an upper air cyclonic circulation over northwest Uttar Pradesh to interior Odisha across Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **East-West trough** from northeast Bihar to Manipur across North Bangladesh, Meghalaya and southeast Assam at 0.9 above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough/Wind discontinuity** from west Vidarbha to south Tamil Nadu across Marathwada and Interior Karnataka at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** in easterlies from Comorin area to North Interior Karnataka across Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and South Interior Karnataka at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 95 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level prevails over Northeast India.
- A fresh **Western Disturbance** is likely to affect Northwest India from 02nd April, 2026.
- The **trough** from Bihar to Gangetic West Bengal across Jharkhand at 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- Widespread rainfall activity likely over Northeast India, Jammu & Kashmir adjoining Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Isolated rainfall activity over Uttarakhand & adjoining plains of western himalayan region, Central India, Odisha & adjoining Coastal Andhra Pradesh.





Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-03-30








Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-03-30

Impact and Actions

Impact & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh 31st March & 01st April; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Kerala & Mahe on 31st March.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC).

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Impact expected and action suggested due to

- **Isolated hailstorm activity also likely** over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, Jharkhand and Odisha on 31st March; Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh on 31st March & 01st April; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada on 31st March.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of large avenue trees. Large dead limbs blown from trees. Damage to Standing crops.
- Minor to Major damage to banana and papaya trees.
- Minor to major damage to power and communication lines due to breaking of branches.
- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.
- Unplug electrical/ electronic appliances.
- Immediately get out of water bodies.
- Keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Hailstorms

- Use hail nets or hail caps in fruit orchards and vegetable plants to protect them from mechanical damage in **Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, East Rajasthan, West Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, West Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada Vidarbha, North Interior Karnataka and Telangana.**
- Undertake harvesting of matured crops and fruits immediately and shift them to safer places.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Jammu & Kashmir**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess rain water from wheat, gram, mustard and vegetable fields.
- In **Sub Himalayan West Bengal**, ensure proper drainage channel, and drain out excess water from fields of rice, maize, other standing crops, vegetables and orchard. Shift the harvested produce to safe places. Cover the nursery of cucurbits and Dalle khorsani with polyethylene sheets or agro-nets.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, undertake harvesting of cabbage, pea, mustard and late-maturing paddy varieties and digging of potatoes. Shift the harvested produce to safe places. Maintain proper drainage channels in the fields of rice, maize, other standing crops, vegetables and orchards.
- In **Assam**, drain out excess rainwater from the standing crop fields.
- In **Meghalaya**, ensure proper drainage in summer vegetable crops. Carry out staking and propping of plantation crops and protect young seedlings from heavy rainfall. Keep the harvested pods of garden peas in safer place immediately.
- In **Tripura**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess water from the low-lying areas to prevent water logging.
- In **Kerala**, drain out excess water from the standing crops fields and orchards.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops properly and cover them to minimise the risk of displacement due to strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry

- Keep the animals inside the shed during Heavy Rainfall/Hailstorm period and provide them balanced feed. Store feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

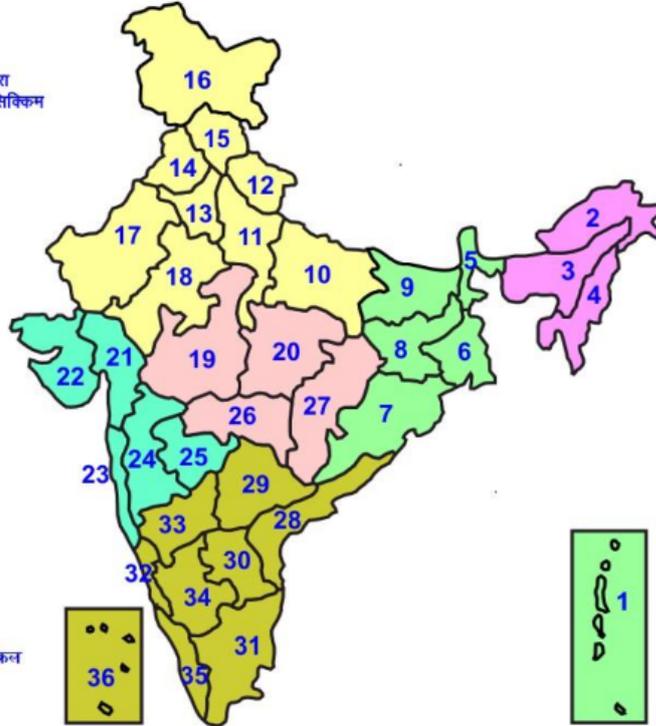

When maximum temperature of a station reaches $\geq 40^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\geq 30^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
(a) Based on Departure from normal

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



Warm Night

When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



Cold Wave

When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave : When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$



Cold Day

When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Fog

Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Thunderstorm

Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



Dust/Sand Storm

An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Frost

Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



Squall

A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Sea State

Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclone

Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)
Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)
Super Cyclone Strom: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
