ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Advance of Southwest Monsoon 2026:

- **The Northern Limit of Monsoon** continues to pass through 6°N/70°E, 6°N/75°E, 7°N/80°E, 9°N/85°E, 12°N/90°E, 14°N/93°E, 16°N/96°E and 17.5°N/98°E.
- Conditions are favourable for further advance of southwest monsoon into some more parts of southeast Arabian Sea, Comorin Area, southwest and southeast Bay of Bengal, remaining parts of Andaman Sea, and some more parts of eastcentral Bay of Bengal during next 3-4 days.

Weather Forecast & warnings

Northeast India:

- **Scattered to Fairly widespread** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph)** likely over Assam & Meghalaya during 23rd - 25th May.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya on 22nd, 26th & 27th; Tripura on 21st and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 23rd - 25th May; with **isolated very heavy rainfall** over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya during 23rd - 25th May.
- **Thunderstorm with light to moderate lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 22nd; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 22nd - 25th May.

South Peninsular India:

- **Fairly widespread to widespread** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 22nd - 26th, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep on 22nd - 25th; Telangana on 22nd May.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 22nd - 25th, Rayalaseema, Interior Karnataka during 22nd - 25th May.
- **Isolated Heavy rainfall** also likely over Tamil Nadu during 22nd - 27th; Kerala & Mahe during 24th - 27th; South Interior Karnataka during 22nd - 25th May.

East India:

- **Fairly widespread to widespread** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 22nd - 27th; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 22nd - 24rd May.
- **Isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph)** likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 23rd, 26th & 27th; Bihar on 22nd and during 24th - 27th; Jharkhand, Odisha during 22nd - 27th May.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 22nd; Bihar on 23rd; Jharkhand on 23rd & 24th May.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 22nd; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 25th - 27th May; with **very heavy rainfall** at a few places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 23rd May; with **isolated very heavy rainfall** over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 22nd & 24th; Bihar on 24th May.

Northwest India:

- **Isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph)** likely over Jammu-Kashmir during 23rd; Himachal Pradesh on 22nd; Uttarakhand on 22nd & 23rd May.
- **Isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching**

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40-50 kmph) likely over Punjab & West Rajasthan on 22nd May.

- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Jammu-Kashmir on 22nd May.
- **Hailstorm activity likely** at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh on 22nd May.
- **Dust storm activity likely** at isolated places over Punjab & West Rajasthan on 22nd May.

Forecast of maximum/day temperatures:

- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over the whole country till 27th May 2026.

- **Warm Night conditions** very likely to prevail in isolated pockets over Odisha during 22nd – 25th; Uttar Pradesh, Vidarbha during 22nd -23rd; Bihar on 22nd; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi on 22nd May.
- **Hot and humid weather conditions** likely to prevail over Gangetic West Bengal during 22nd -26th; Odisha 22nd – 27th Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 23rd – 27th May.

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Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Kerala & Mahe, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; **at many places** over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, Punjab, Assam & Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Rayalaseema, Konkan & Goa and Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Kerala & Mahe:** Kozhikode (calicut) (dist Kozhikode) 7, Cannanore (kannur) (dist Kannur) 2; **Rayalaseema:** Anantapur (dist Anantapuramu) 7.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Heavy rain** at a few places over Rayalaseema and Kerala & Mahe.

Yesterday, Heat wave to severe heat wave conditions prevailed in many pockets of Vidarbha, a few pockets of East Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and isolated pockets over Uttarakhand and Chhattisgarh. **Heat wave conditions** in many pockets of Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, few pockets of Punjab, West Uttar Pradesh, and in isolated pockets of Odisha.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 21-05-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Himachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and Vidarbha; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema; at most places over Marathwada; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and South Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, West Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Bihar, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Madhya Pradesh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.5°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

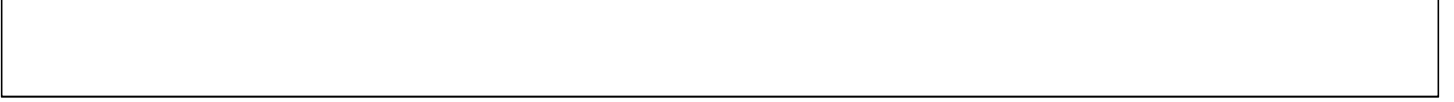
❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 21-05-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, East Madhya Pradesh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at isolated places over Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Punjab; at most places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha and Himachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Rayalaseema and North Interior Karnataka. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Marathwada; at few places over South Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim; at most places over Coastal Karnataka and Lakshadweep. **The highest maximum temperature** of 47.6°C was reported at BANDA (UTTAR PRADESH).

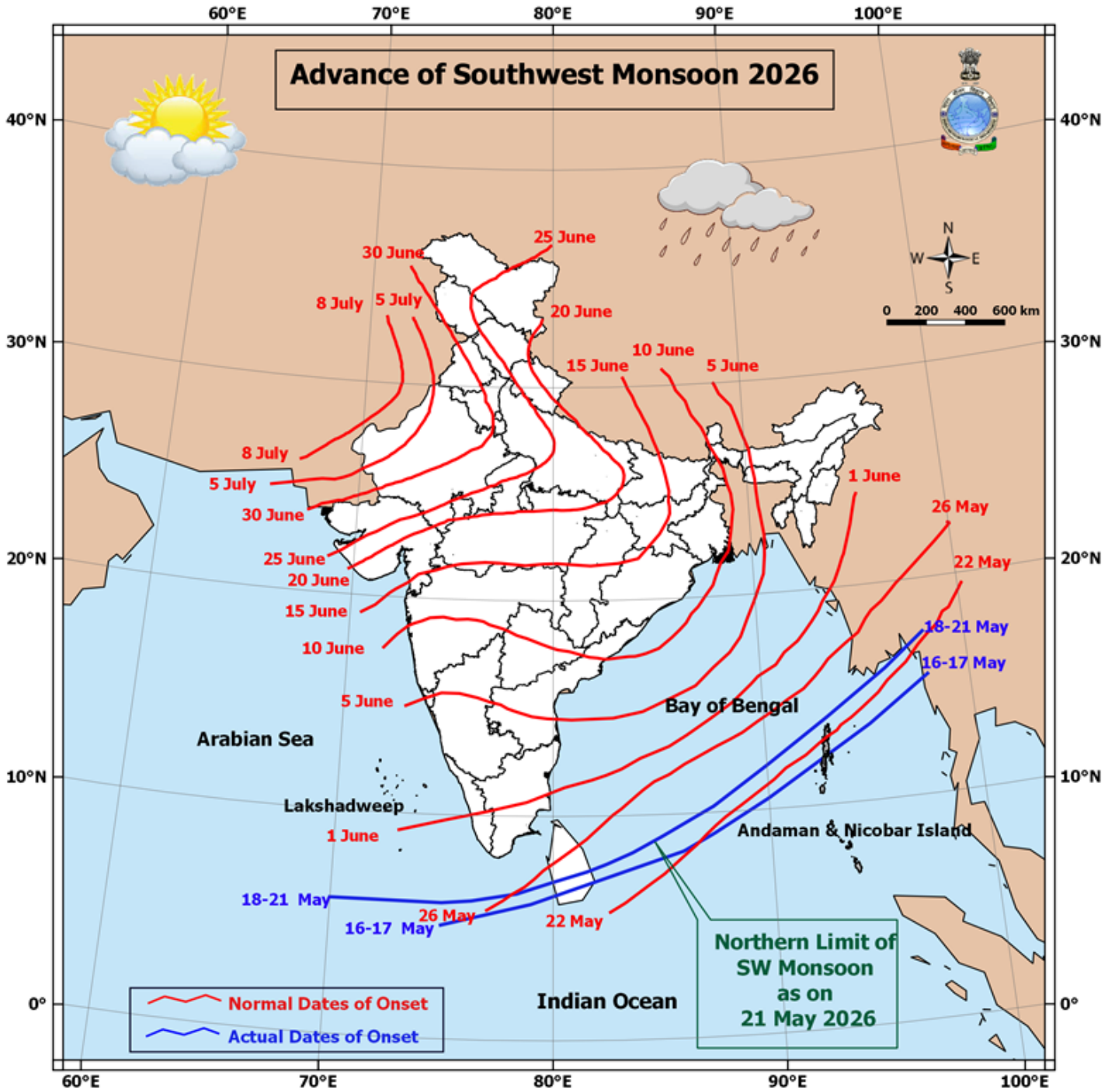

- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 68°E to the north of Lat. 28°N.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Punjab & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Haryana & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The east-west **trough** from Northwest Uttar Pradesh to Manipur across cyclonic circulation over East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, north Gangetic West Bengal, and north Bangladesh at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from East Uttar Pradesh to south coastal Odisha across Jharkhand and north Chhattisgarh and interior Odisha at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** in westerlies roughly along Long. 89°E to the north of Lat. 20°N at 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over coastal Bangladesh and neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south coastal Odisha and neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Tamilnadu & neighbourhood persists and now seen at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** from central Bay of Bengal to Tamil Nadu across southwest Bay of Bengal between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over eastcentral Arabian Sea & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.

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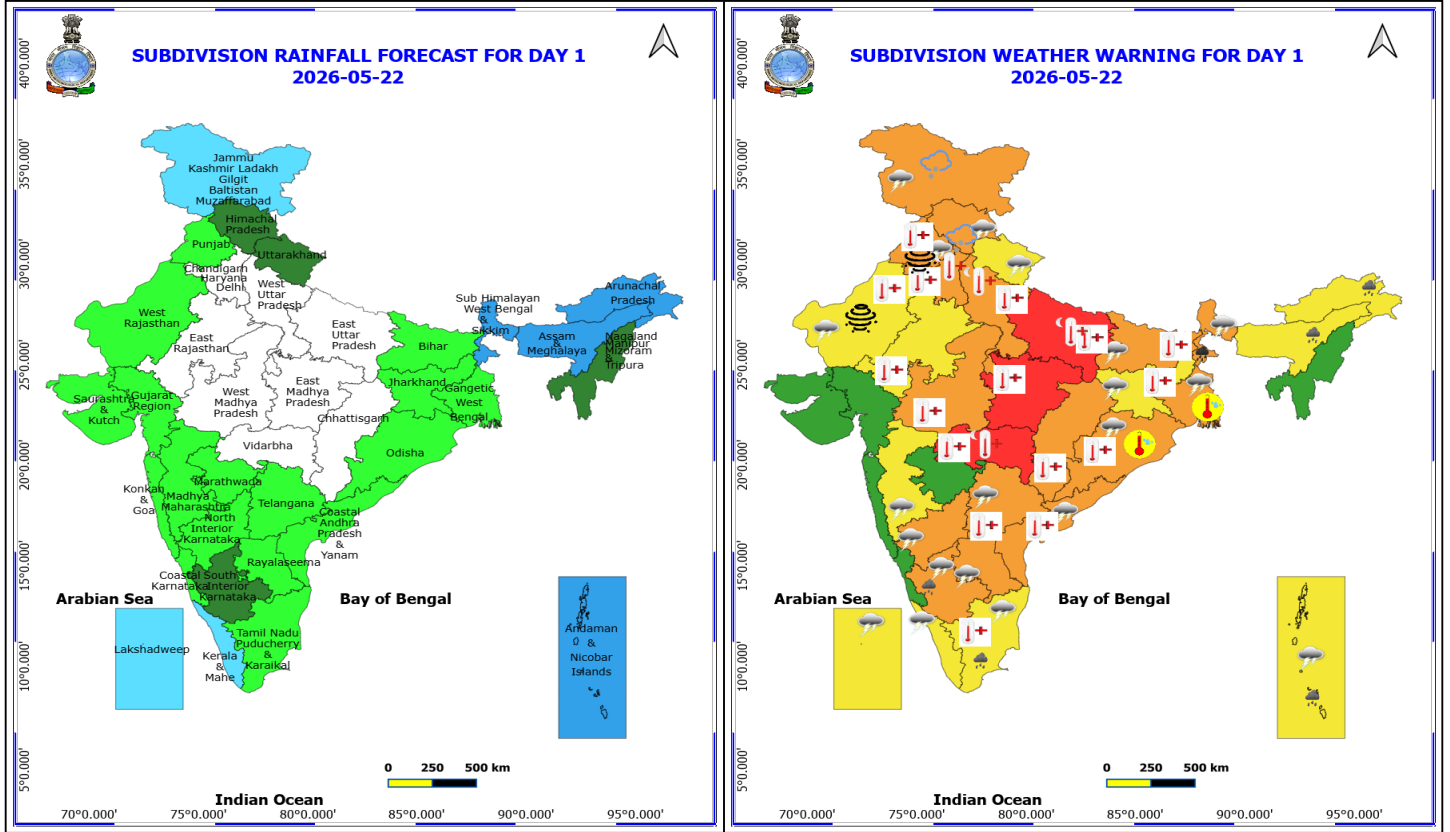

Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-05-21

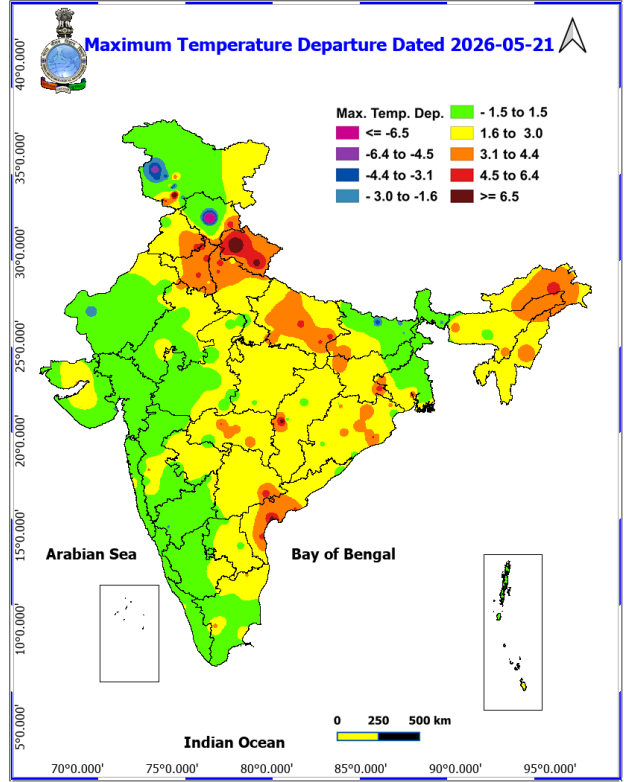
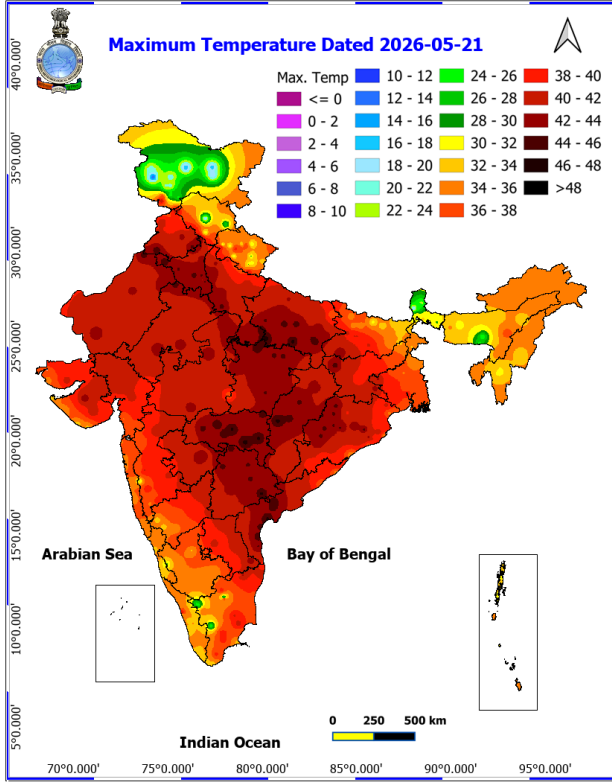
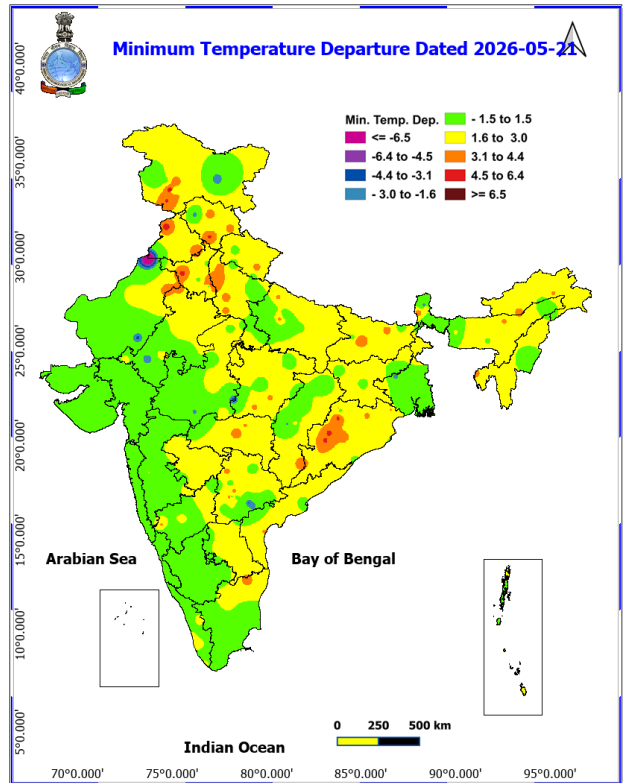
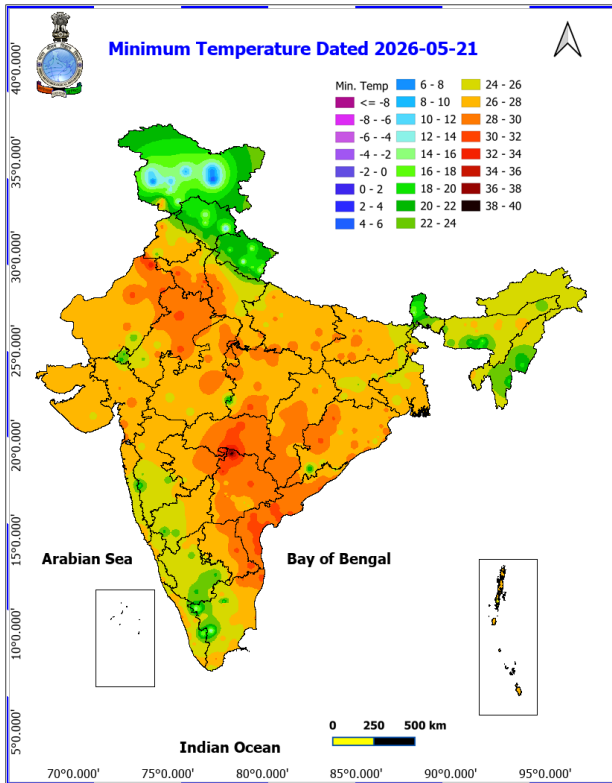
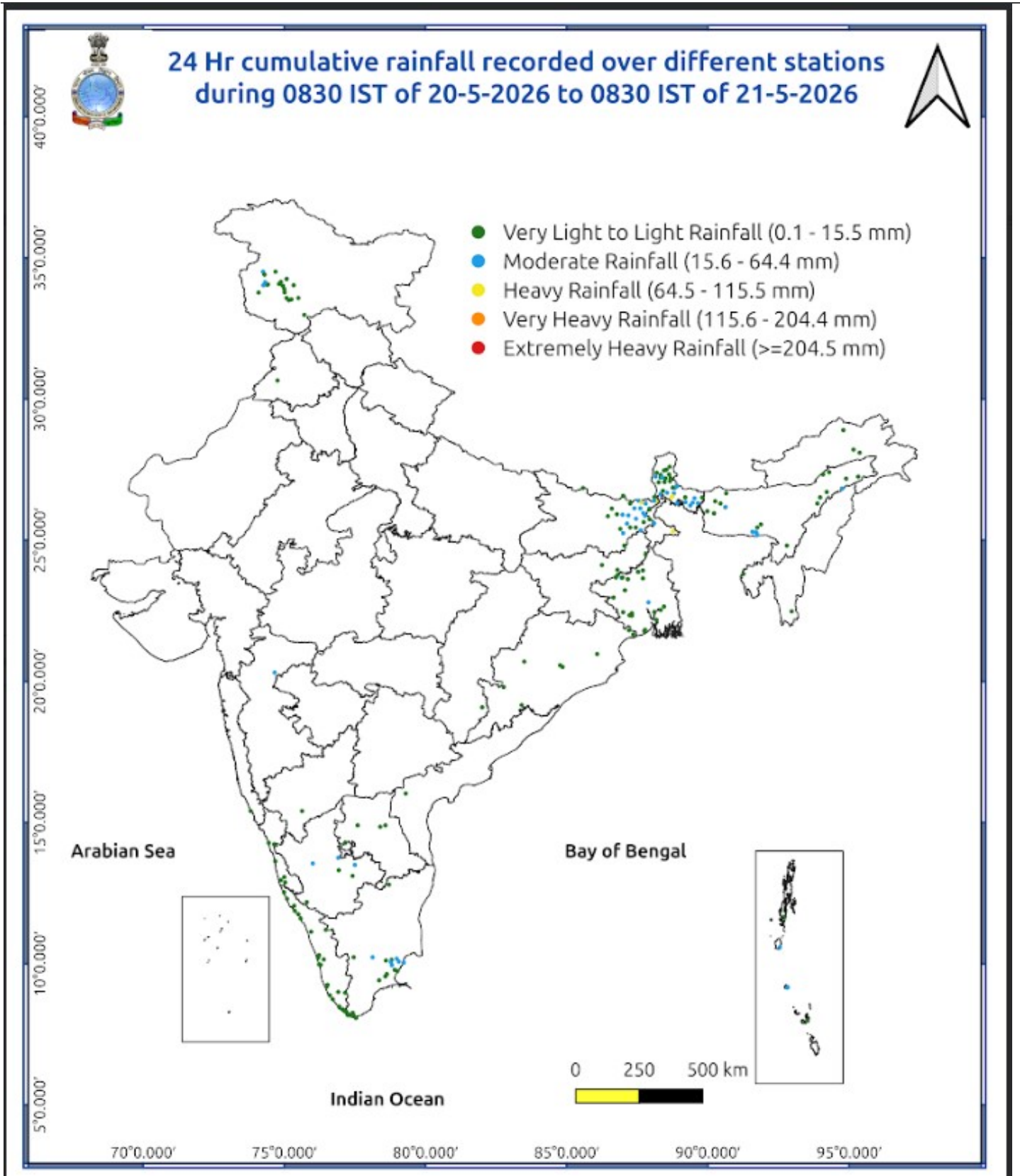


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-05-21

Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy rainfall over

- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya on 22nd, 26th & 27th; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 23rd – 25th May Tamil Nadu during 22nd -27th; Kerala & Mahe during 24th – 27th; South Interior Karnataka during 22nd – 25th Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 22nd; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 25th – 27th; **with very heavy rainfall** at a few places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 23rd May ;with **isolated very heavy rainfall** over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya during 23rd -25th ; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 22nd & 24th; Bihar on 24th May.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Impact expected and action suggested due to isolated thunderstorm with lightning/squally winds over

- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 22nd– 25th, Rayalaseema, Interior Karnataka during 22nd -25th; Gangetic West Bengal on 22nd; Bihar on 23rd; Jharkhand on 23rd & 24th; Jammu-Kashmir on 22nd May.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of large avenue trees. Large dead limbs blown from trees. Damage to Standing crops.
- Minor to Major damage to banana and papaya trees.
- Minor to major damage to power and communication lines due to breaking of branches.
- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.

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- Unplug electrical/ electronic appliances.
- Immediately get out of water bodies.
- Keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

Impact expected and action suggested due to Heat wave conditions:

- **Heat wave to severe heat wave conditions** very likely in many/some pockets over Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 22nd – 27th May; with **Heat wave conditions over** Punjab during 22nd – 27th May.
- **Heat wave to severe heat wave conditions** in a few/isolated pockets over East Uttar Pradesh during 22nd – 27th; West Rajasthan during 25th – 27th May; with **Heat wave conditions over** West Uttar Pradesh during 22nd – 27th May.
- **Heat wave to severe heat wave conditions** very likely in isolated/some pockets over East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 22nd – 25th; **Heat wave conditions** in isolated pockets over East Madhya Pradesh on 26th & 27th, West Rajasthan during 22nd – 24th; East Rajasthan during 22nd – 27th; , Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 22nd Bihar , Telangana during 22nd – 24th; Jharkhand on 22nd & 23rd; Odisha during 22nd – 25th May.

- **Warm Night conditions** very likely to prevail in isolated pockets over Odisha during 22nd – 25th; Uttar Pradesh, Vidarbha during 22nd -23rd; Bihar on 22nd; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi on 22nd May.
- **Hot and humid weather conditions** likely to prevail over Gangetic West Bengal during 22nd -26th; Odisha 22nd – 27th Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 23rd – 27th May.

Red alert Areas (Uttar Pradesh)

- Very high likelihood of developing heat illness and heat stroke in all ages.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.

Orange alert Areas (many parts of Northwest & Central India)

- High temperature & increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are either exposed to sun for a prolonged period or doing heavy work.
- High health concern for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- Avoid heat exposure– keep cool. Avoid dehydration.
- Drink sufficient water- even if not thirsty.
- Use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. to keep yourself hydrated.

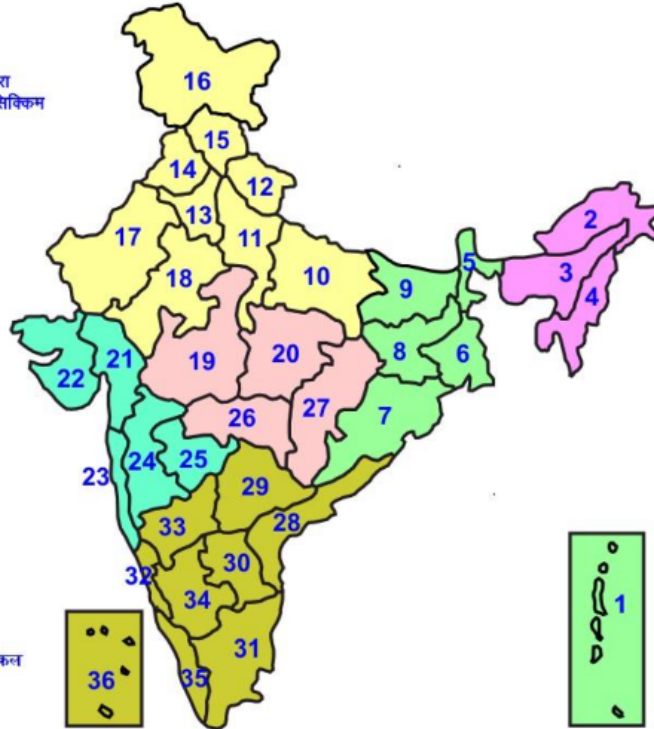
Yellow alert Areas (some parts of north Peninsular India)

- Avoid heat exposure.
