ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Systems, Forecast and Warnings

Heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over south Tamil Nadu and Kerala & Mahe on 21st & 22nd February.

Isolated to Scattered light/moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-40 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Kerala & Mahe on 21st & 22nd; with **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Uttarakhand on 22nd; Vidarbha on 23rd, Chhattisgarh & Odisha on 23rd & 24th; Kerala & Mahe on 23rd; South Interior Karnataka during 21st-24th and Coastal & North Interior Karnataka during 22nd-24th February.

Isolated rainfall/snowfall likely over Jammu-Kashmir & Himachal Pradesh on 22nd & 23rd and Uttarakhand during 22nd-24th February.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

No significant change in minimum temperature likely over Maharashtra during next 4 days and gradual fall by 2-4°C during subsequent 3 days.

No significant change in minimum temperature likely over Gujarat State during next 2 days and gradual fall by 2-3°C during subsequent 5 days.

No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

Forecast of maximum temperatures:

Gradual rise in maximum temperature by 2-4°C likely over Northwest India during next 7 days.

Gradual rise in maximum temperature by 2-3°C likely over Central India during next 2 days and no significant change during subsequent 5 days.

Gradual rise in maximum temperature by 2-3°C likely over Gujarat State and Maharashtra during next 2-3 days and gradual fall by 2-3 °C during subsequent 4-5 days.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at many places** over Madhya Pradesh and Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 20-02-2026): below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** at few places over Odisha; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **appreciably below normal (-5.0°C to -3.1°C)** at few places over Rayalaseema and South Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **markedly below normal (< -5.0°C)** at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, West Madhya Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and South Interior Karnataka. **The lowest minimum temperature of 8.5°C** was reported at **NARNAUL (HARYANA)** over the Plains of India.

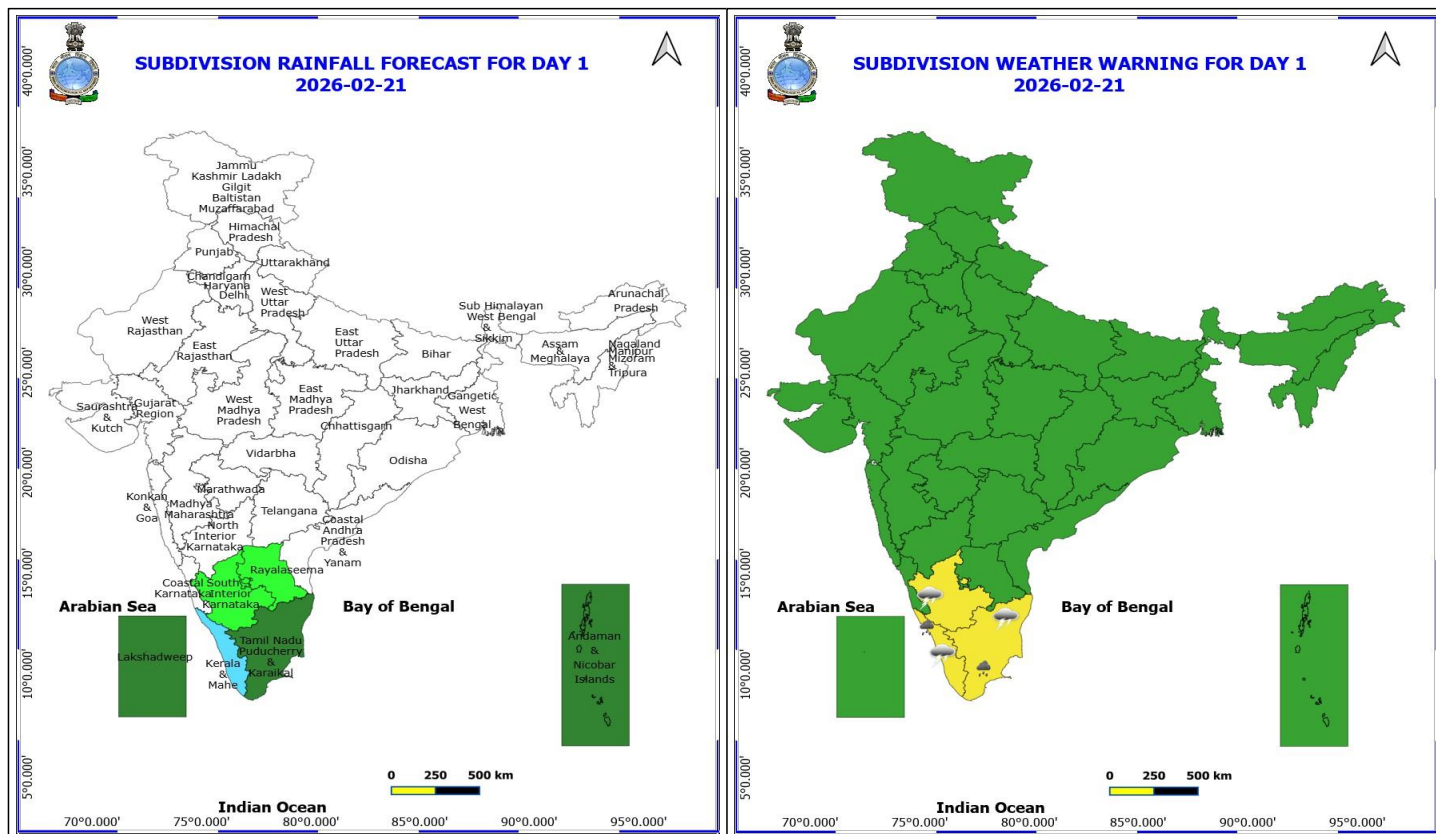
❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 20-02-2026):** The highest maximum temperature of 37.5°C was reported at KOTTAYAM (KERALA).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- ❖ Under the influence of the **upper air cyclonic circulation** over the Equatorial Indian Ocean & adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal, a **low pressure area** has formed over the same region at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 21st February, 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 5.8 km above mean sea level. It is likely to move west-northwestwards & become more marked over southwest Bay of Bengal & adjoining Equatorial Indian Ocean during next 24 hrs.
- ❖ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over the Equatorial Indian Ocean & adjoining southwest Bay of Bengal extending upto 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- ❖ The **Western Disturbance** as trough now runs from northwest Bihar to southwest Madhya Pradesh across East Uttar Pradesh at 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- ❖ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Haryana and adjoining Punjab at 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- ❖ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam persists and now extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- ❖ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Bangladesh & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- ❖ The **trough** from the cyclonic circulation over Equatorial Indian Ocean & adjoining southwest Bay of Bengal to the Lakshadweep area across south Tamil Nadu and south Kerala between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- ❖ **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 100 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level prevails over North India.
- ❖ A feeble **Western Disturbance** is likely to affect Western Himalayan region from 22nd February.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- ♦ Isolated to Scattered rainfall activity likely over Western Himalayan region, Kerala & Mahe, Arunachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep.

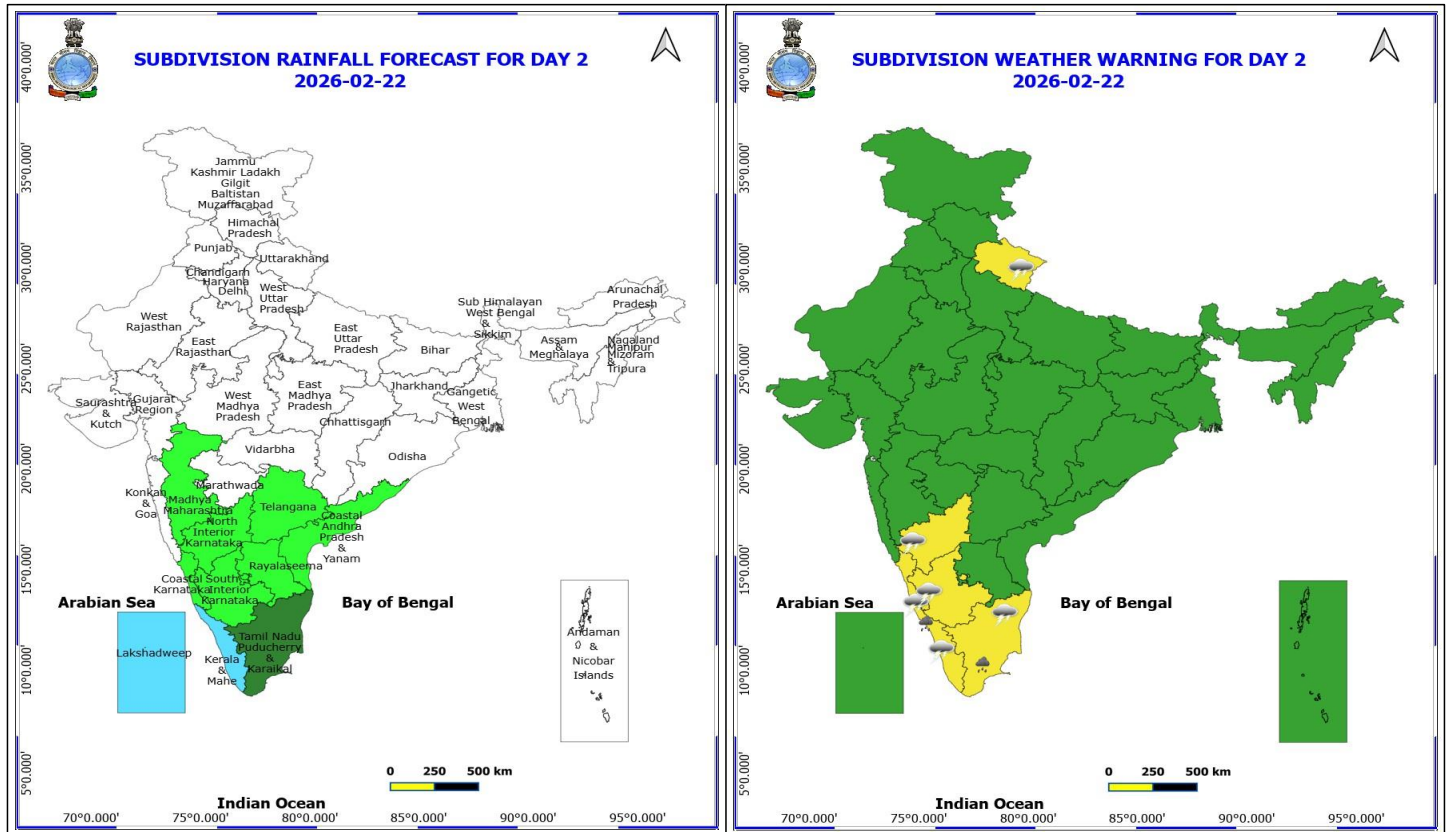
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over South Interior Karnataka.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 40 to 50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** likely to prevail over Gulf of Mannar and Comorin area, adjoining Equatorial Indian Ocean, along and off west Sri Lanka coast, over some parts of southeast Bay of Bengal and adjoining Equatorial Indian Ocean, many parts of south Andaman Sea

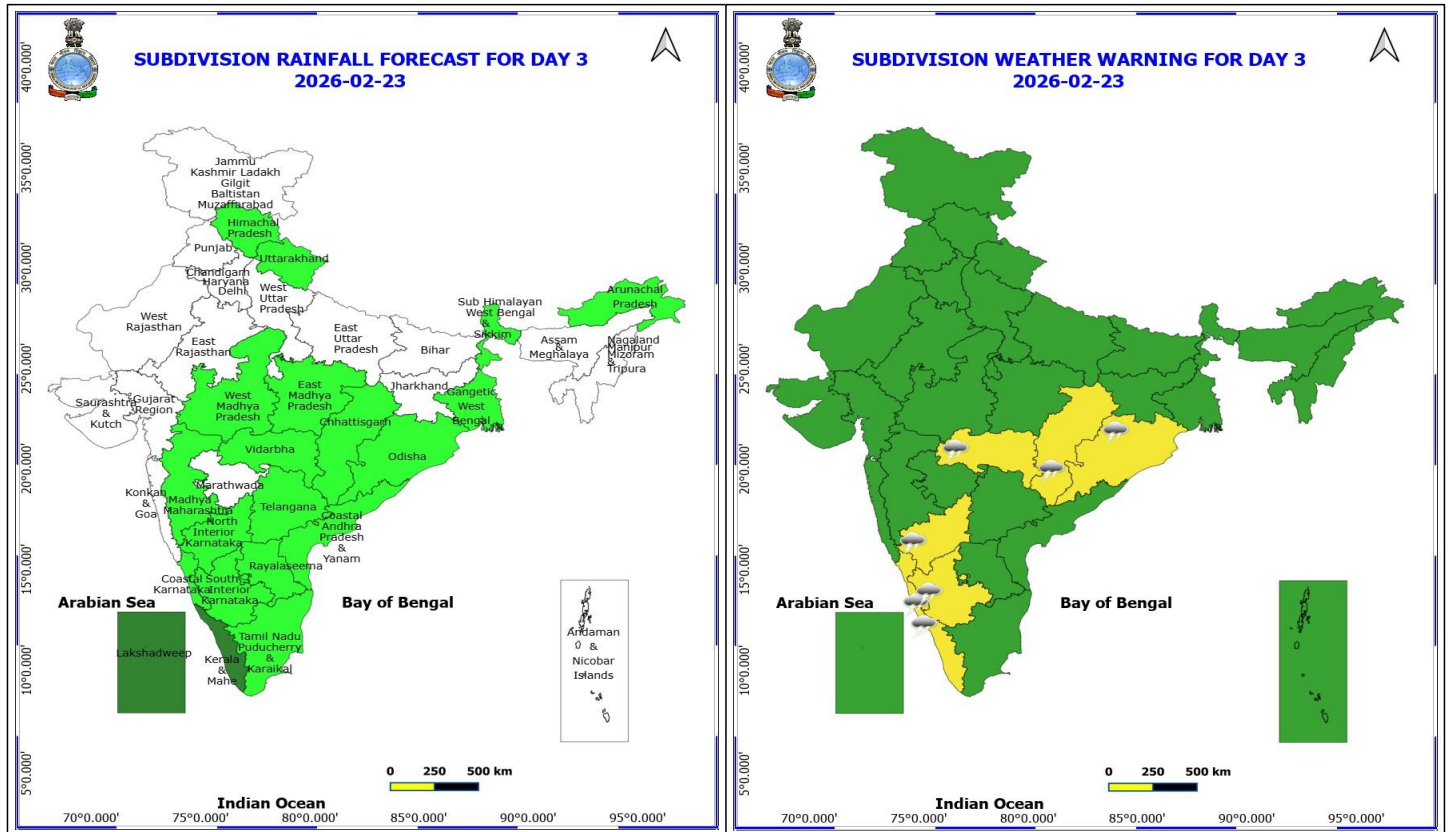
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Karnataka and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 40 to 50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** likely to prevail over some parts of southwest Bay of Bengal, some parts of southeast Bay of Bengal adjoining to southwest Bay of Bengal & EIO and over some parts of Comorin area.

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23 February (Day 3)

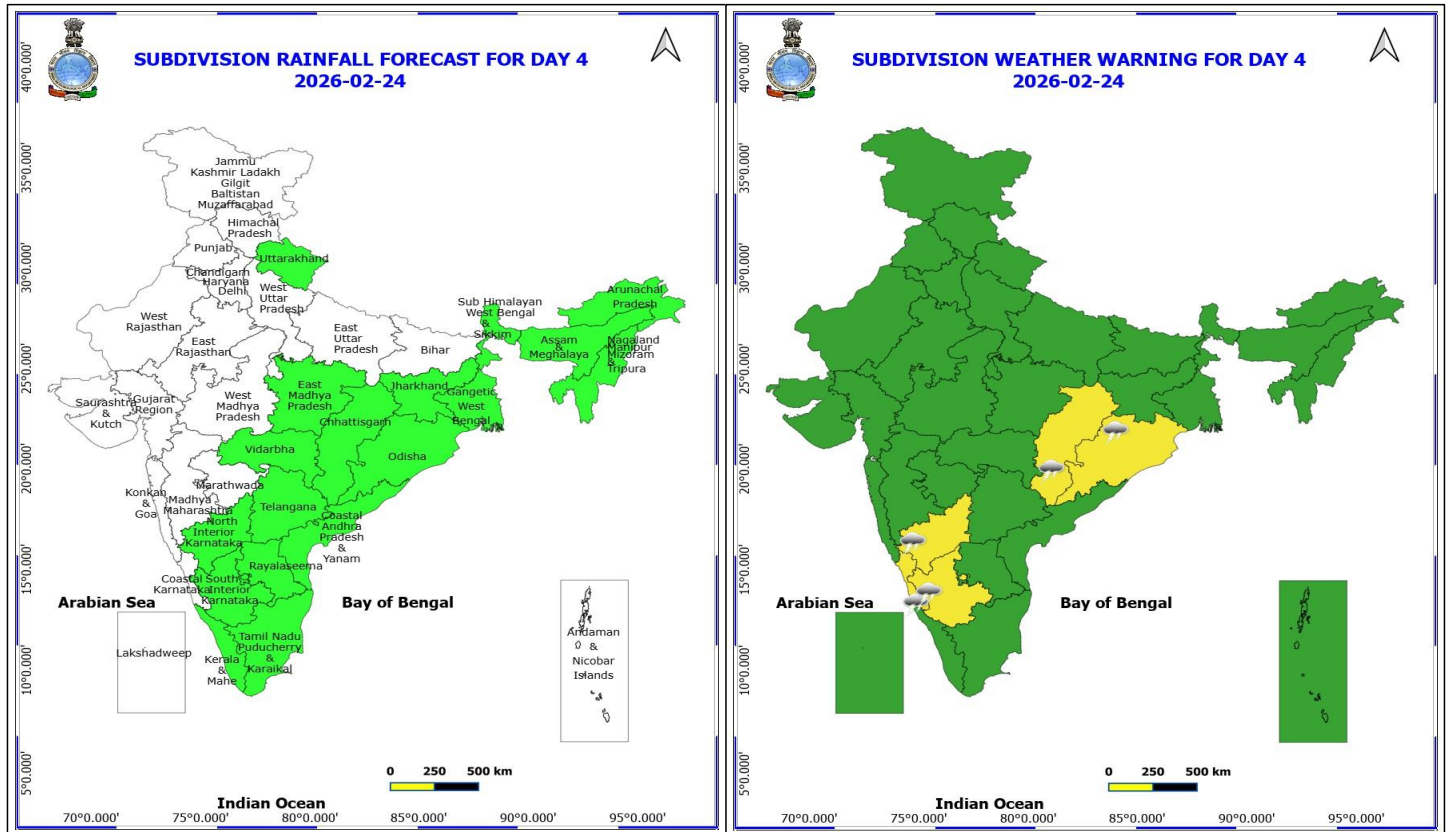
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Odisha and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 40 to 50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** likely to prevail over some parts of southwest Bay of Bengal and off north Sri Lanka coast.

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24 February (Day 4)

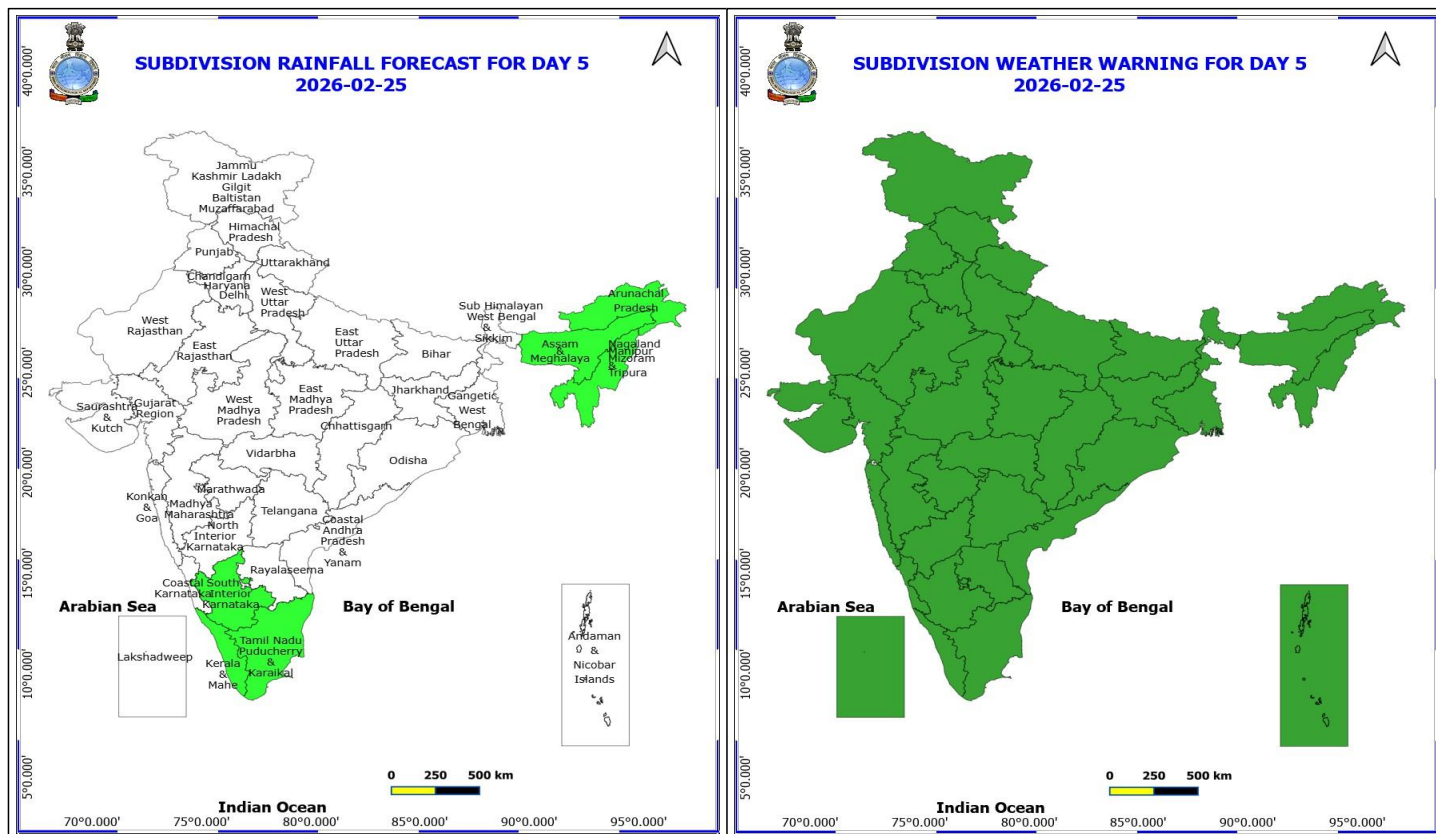
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Karnataka and Odisha.

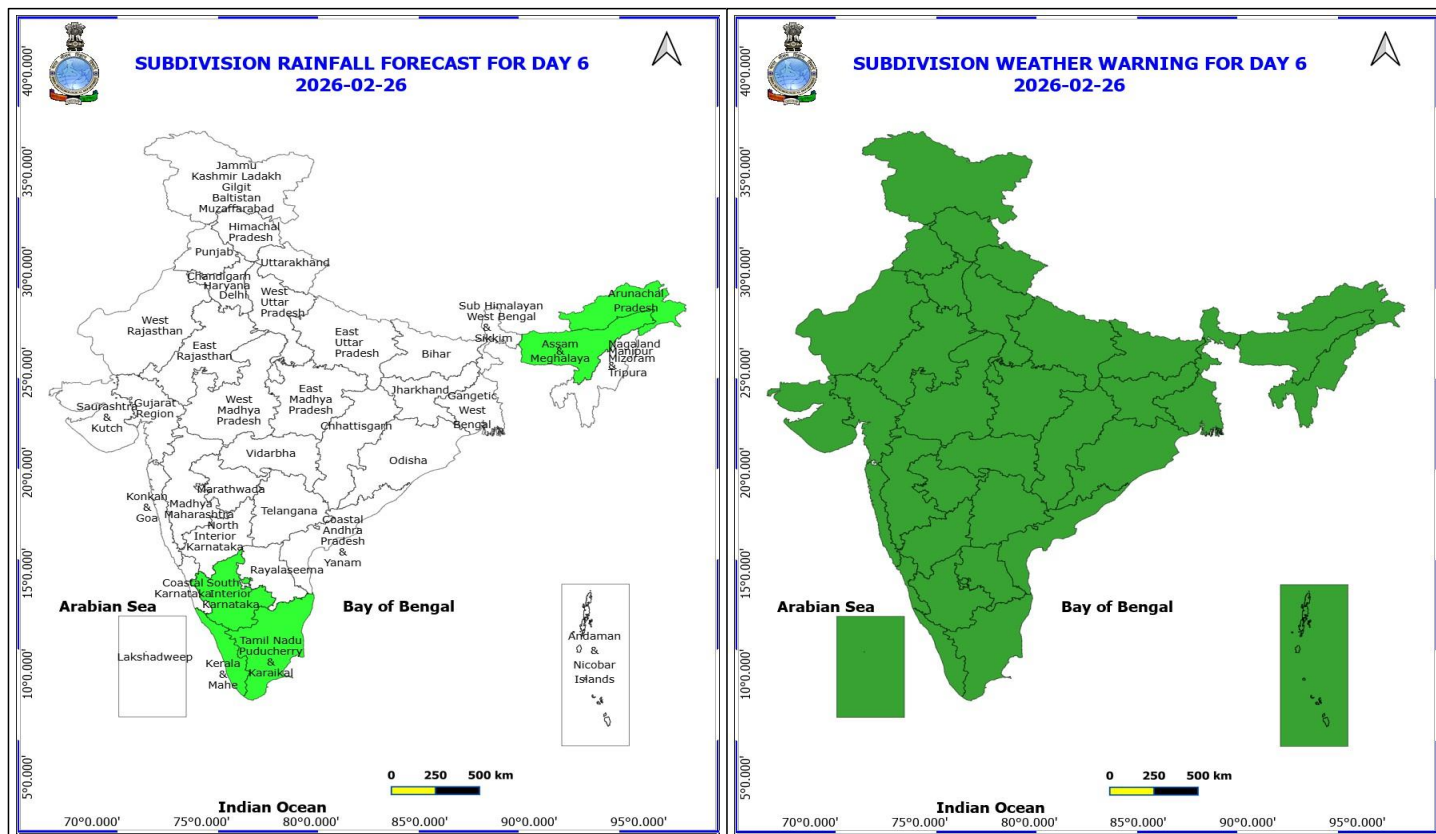

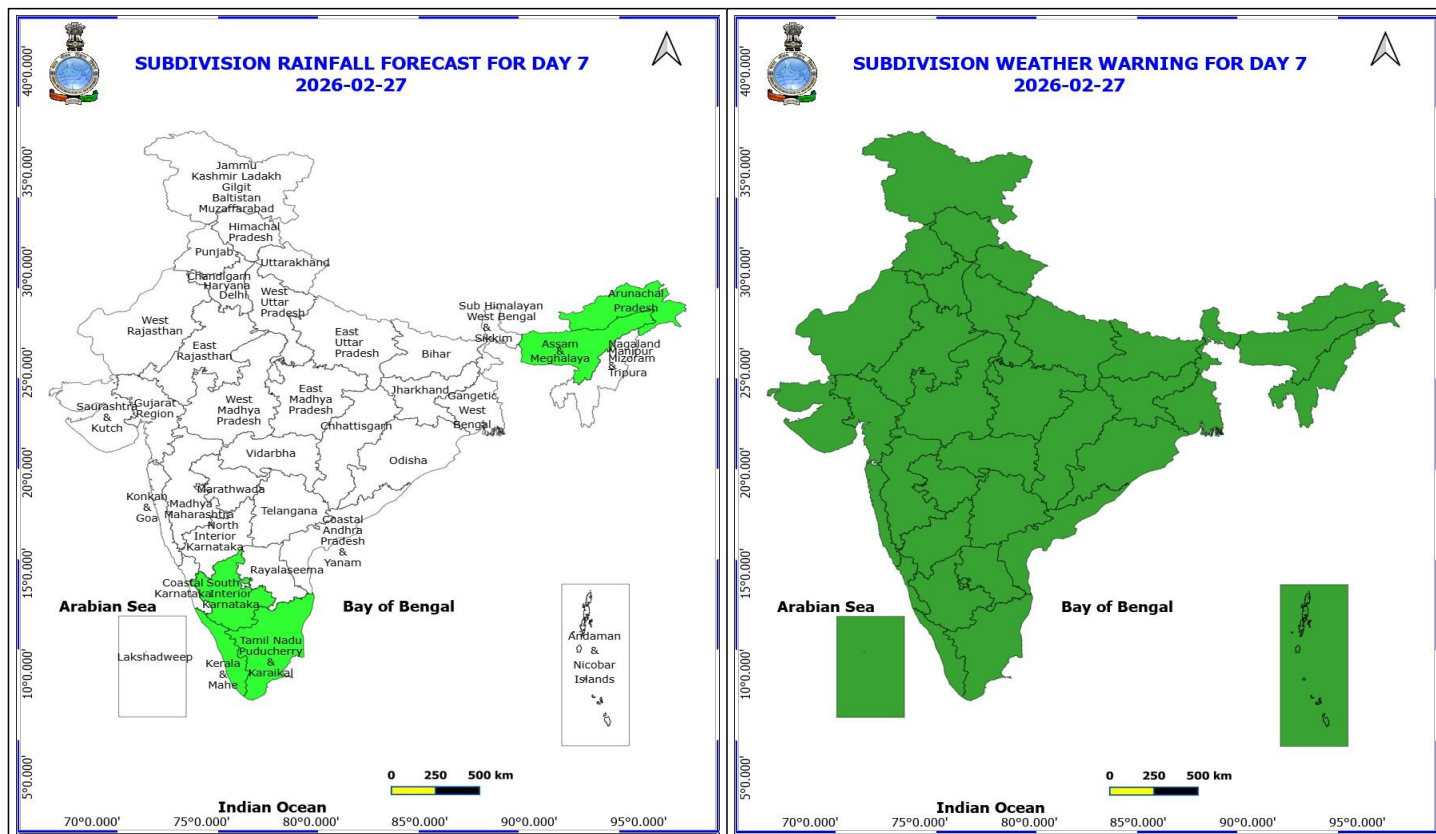

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-02-20

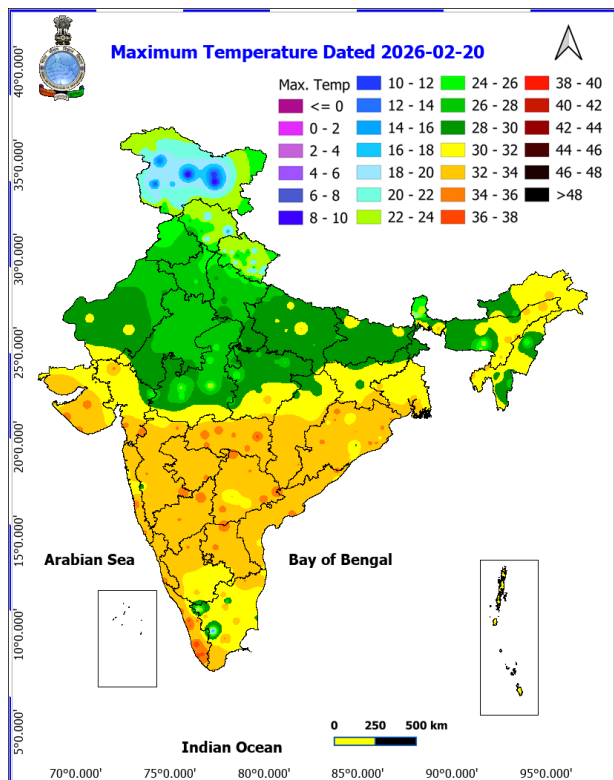


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-02-20

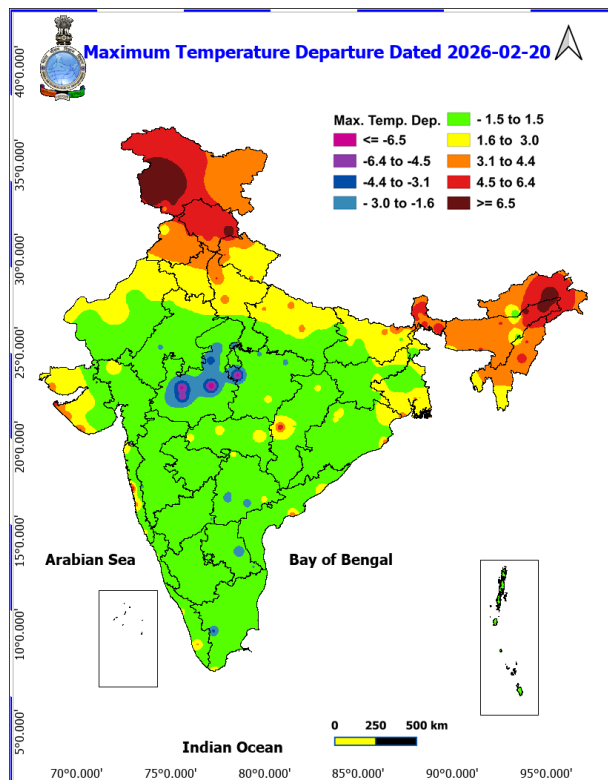


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-02-20

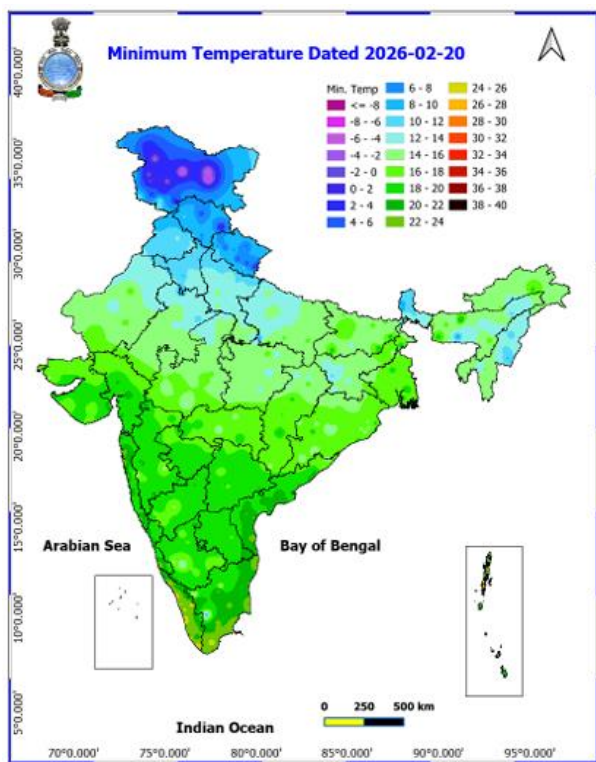
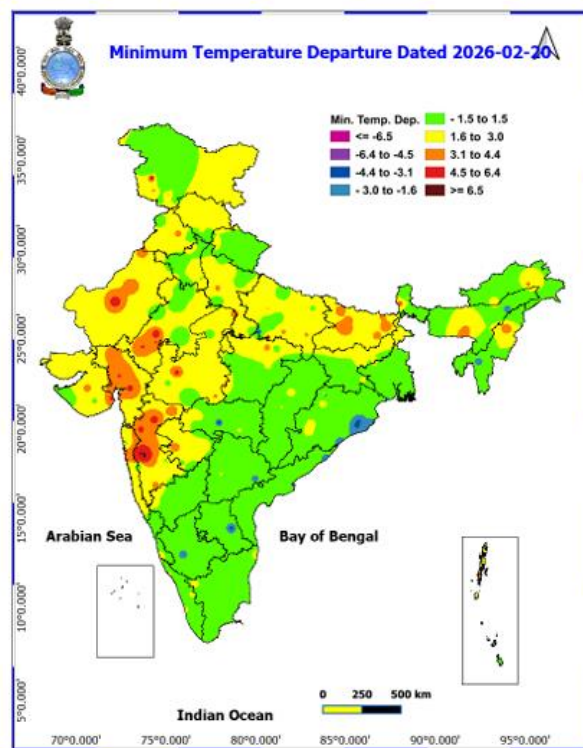
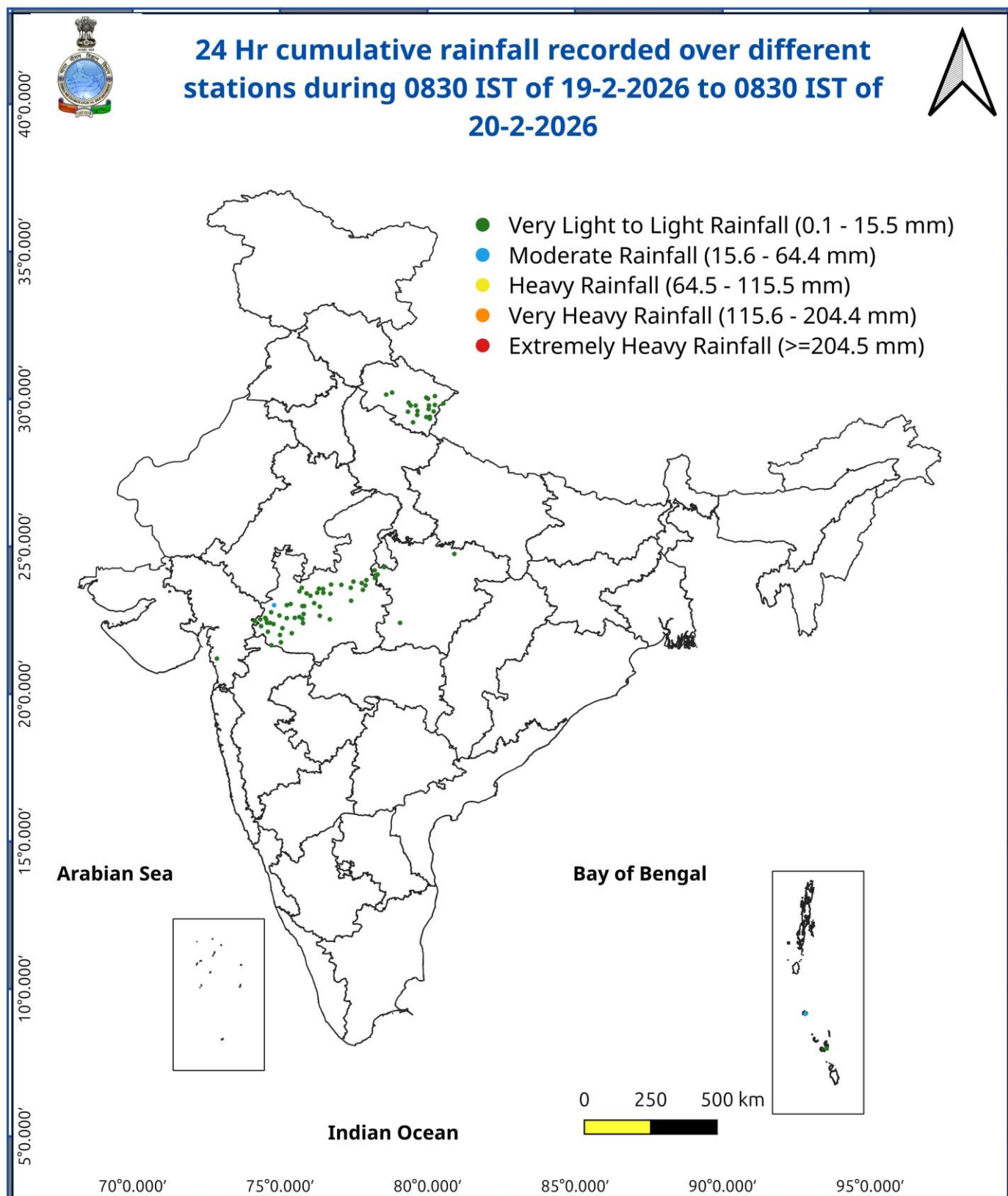


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-02-20





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Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

In **Tamilnadu** and **Kerala**, undertake harvesting of matured paddy and shift the harvested produce to safer places. Clean and open drainage channels and strengthen field bunds in paddy and low-lying vegetable fields to avoid water stagnation. Provide staking in banana and support to vegetables in pandals

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.
(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .

Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .

Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50-200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)

Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)

Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)

Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
