ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather System:

The **Depression** over east Vidarbha and adjoining westcentral Chhattisgarh moved nearly westwards with a speed of 15 kmph during past 6 hours, and lay centred at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 31st July 2026, over central Vidarbha and adjoining south Madhya Pradesh near latitude 20.9°N and longitude 78.6°E, 30 km north of Wardha (Maharashtra), 60 km west-southwest of Nagpur (Maharashtra), 90 km east of Amravati (Maharashtra), 130 km south-southeast of Betul (Madhya Pradesh) and 160 km east of Akola (Maharashtra). It is likely to move west-northwestwards across Vidarbha & adjoining south Madhya Pradesh during next 24 hours.

Weather forecast and Warnings:

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Uttarakhand during 31st July-5th August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over East Rajasthan, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab during 31st July-4th August; West Uttar Pradesh during 3rd-5th August; East Uttar Pradesh during 2nd-5th August; West Rajasthan during 1st-3rd August.
- **Isolated to Scattered rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over remaining parts of northwest India.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 31st July-5th August; Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand during 31st July-5th August; Punjab during 1st-3rd August; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 31st July-3rd August; West Uttar Pradesh during 3rd-5th August; East Uttar Pradesh during 3rd-5th August; West Rajasthan during 31st July-3rd August; East Rajasthan during 1st-5th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over East Rajasthan and Punjab on 31st July.

Central India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 31st July-1st August; East Madhya Pradesh during 31st July-5th August; Vidarbha during 31st July-1st August and on 5th August; Chhattisgarh on 31st July and during 2nd-5th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over remaining parts of central India.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 1st August; East Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha on 31st July; Chhattisgarh on 30th July and during 2nd-5th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 31st July.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 31st July-5th August; Gangetic West Bengal on 31st July and during 2nd-5th August; Jharkhand during 1st-5th August; Bihar during 31st July-5th August; Odisha during 2nd-5th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over remaining parts of East India.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 1st-5th August; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 31st July-1st August and on 5th August; Gangetic West Bengal during 4th-5th August; Bihar during 31st July-5th August; Odisha during 2nd-5th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely

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over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 2nd-4th August.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 31st July-2nd August; Assam & Meghalaya during 31st July-4th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 31st July and during 3rd-5th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over remaining parts of northeast India.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 1st-5th August; Assam & Meghalaya during 31st July-5th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 31st July-5th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 31st July.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Konkan & Goa during 31st July-5th August; Madhya Maharashtra during 30th July-1st August; Marathawada on 31st July; Gujarat Region during 31st July-2nd August; Saurashtra & Kutch during 31st July-2nd August.
- **Isolated to Scattered rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over remaining parts of West India.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa during 1st-3rd August; Madhya Maharashtra during 31st July-3rd August; Marathawada on 31st July; Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 31st July-2nd August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Konkan & Goa on 31st July.
- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra on 31st July; Gujarat Region on 31st July & 01st August.**

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 31st July-5th August; North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 1st-5th August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 31st July-5th August; North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana on 31st July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Lakshadweep and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 31st July-1st August; Kerala & Mahe on 2nd August; North Interior Karnataka on 1st August; Telangana on 31st July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and South Interior Karnataka during 31st July-1st August; North Interior Karnataka on 31st July.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 31st July-2nd August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 31st July-3rd August.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Telangana, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Vidarbha, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; **at many places** over East Rajasthan, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, West Rajasthan, Arunachal Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, West Madhya Pradesh, Rayalaseema, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe, Gujarat Region and Lakshadweep; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Telangana:** Ramgundam (dist Peddapalli) 8, Nizamabad (dist Nizamabad) 7; **Vidarbha:** Akola (dist Akola) 7; Marathwada: Aurangabad (chikalthana) AP (dist Aurangabad) 6.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Heavy rain** at many places over Telangana, at a few places over Vidarbha

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 30-07-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Madhya Maharashtra. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Uttarakhand, West Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa and Lakshadweep; at few places over West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Punjab, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over East Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Uttarakhand, West Madhya Pradesh and Konkan & Goa. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.8°C was reported at BOUDH (ORISSA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 30-07-2026):** **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Konkan & Goa. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, Bihar, Madhya Maharashtra and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Punjab, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Uttarakhand, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh and North Interior Karnataka. **The highest maximum temperature** of 41.5°C was reported at JAISALMER (RAJASTHAN).

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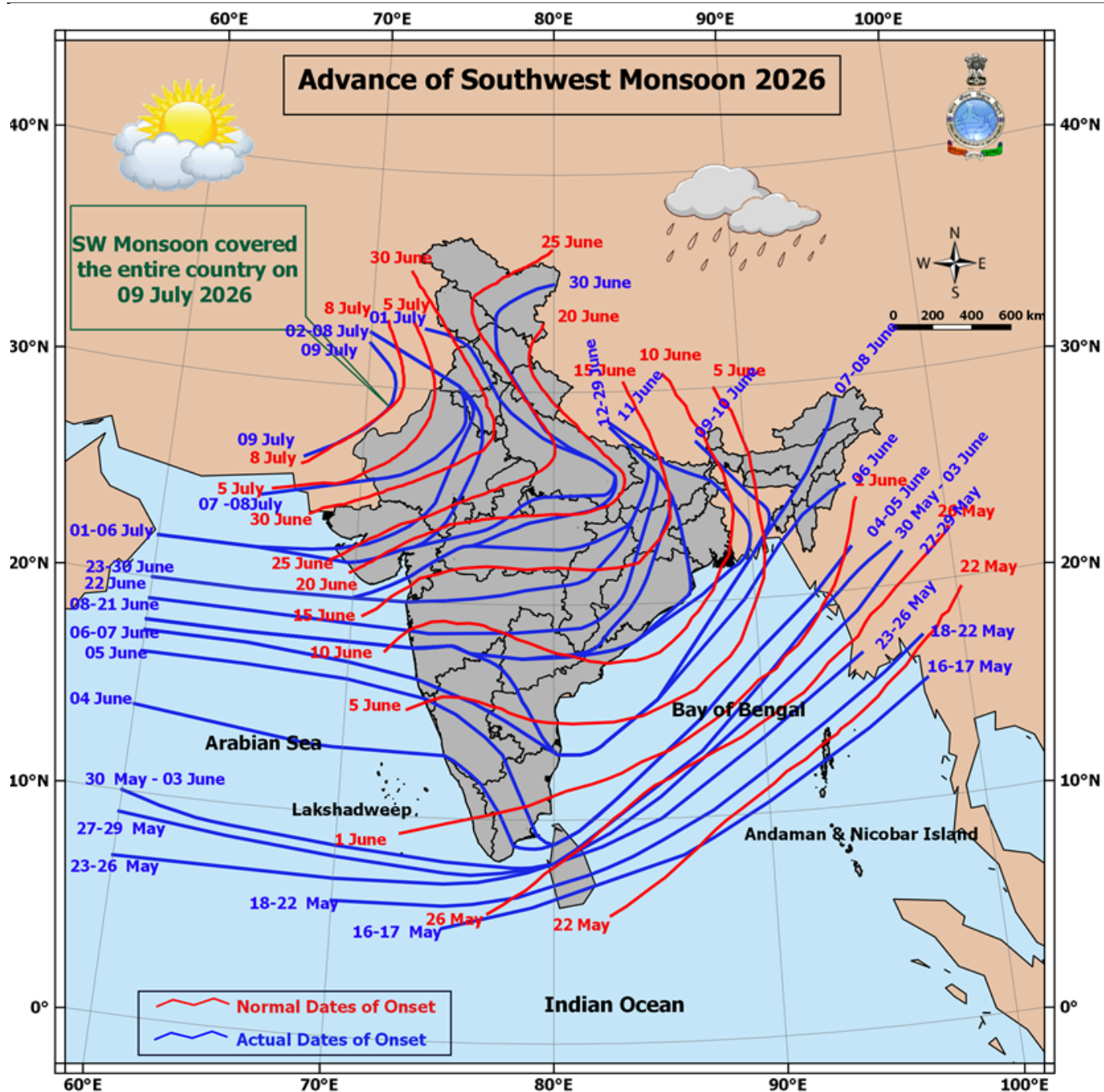
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Depression** over east Vidarbha and adjoining westcentral Chhattisgarh moved nearly westwards with a speed of 15 kmph during past 6 hours, and lay centred at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 31st July 2026, over central Vidarbha and adjoining south Madhya Pradesh near latitude 20.9°N and longitude 78.6°E, 30 km north of Wardha (Maharashtra), 60 km west-southwest of Nagpur (Maharashtra), 90 km east of Amravati (Maharashtra), 130 km south-southeast of Betul (Madhya Pradesh) and 160 km east of Akola (Maharashtra). It is likely to move west-northwestwards across Vidarbha & adjoining south Madhya Pradesh during next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Jaisalmer, Udaipur, Betul, centre of Depression over central Vidarbha and adjoining south Madhya Pradesh & Puri thence southeastwards towards Central parts of Bay of Bengal and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **east-west shear** zone roughly along latitude 21°N across central & adjoining north peninsular India between 3.1 & 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over north Haryana & neighbourhood persists and now lies at 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central Assam persists and now extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **off-Shore trough** at mean sea level from South Gujarat to North Kerala persists.

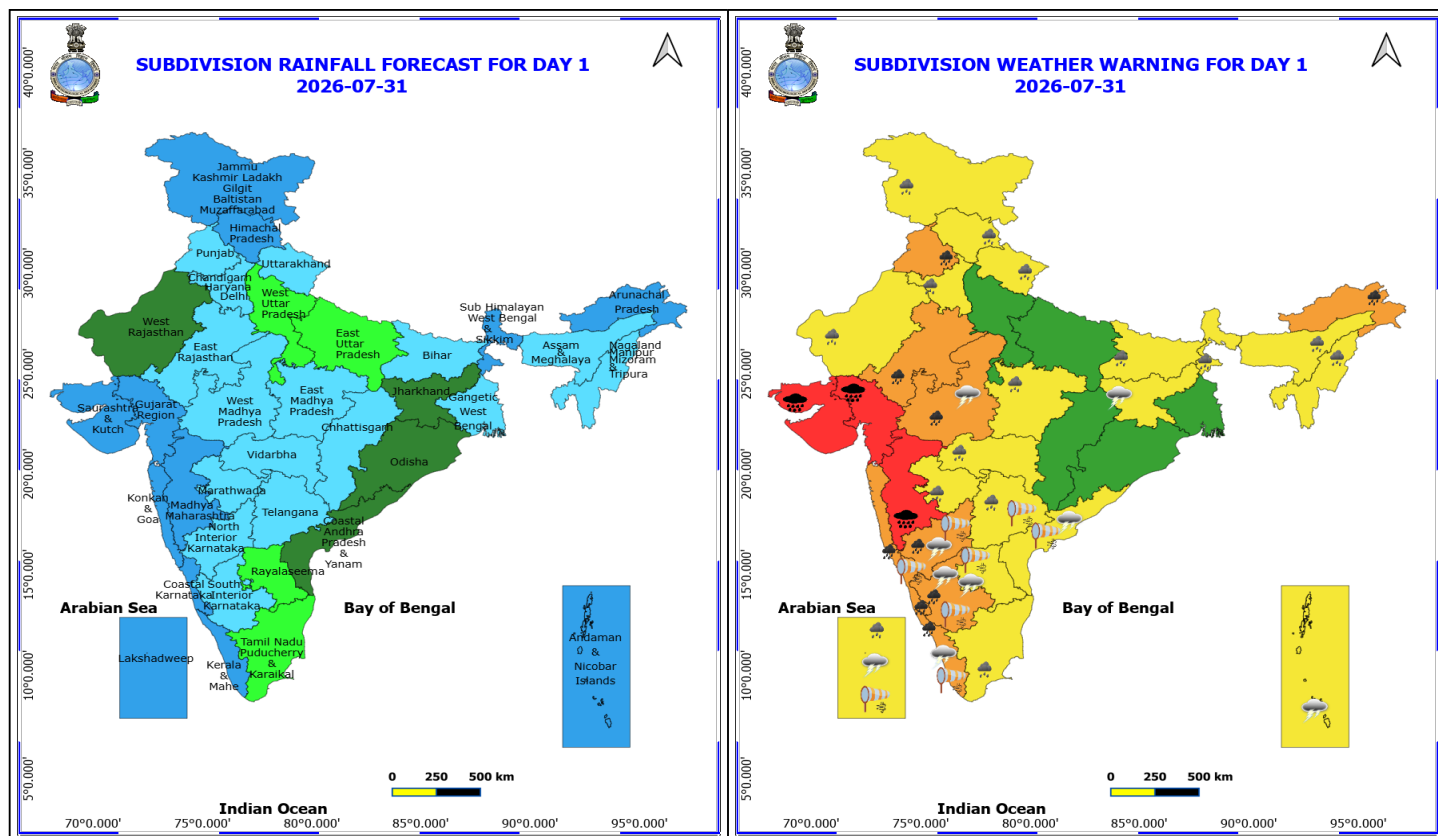


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31 July (Day 1)

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with isolated Extremely Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Gujarat State and Madhya Maharashtra.
- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Konkan & Goa, Punjab and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Lakshadweep, Marathwada, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Telangana, Uttarakhand, Vidarbha and West Rajasthan.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Interior Karnataka, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Coastal Karnataka, East Madhya Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Rajasthan and Telangana.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Konkan & Goa, Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia

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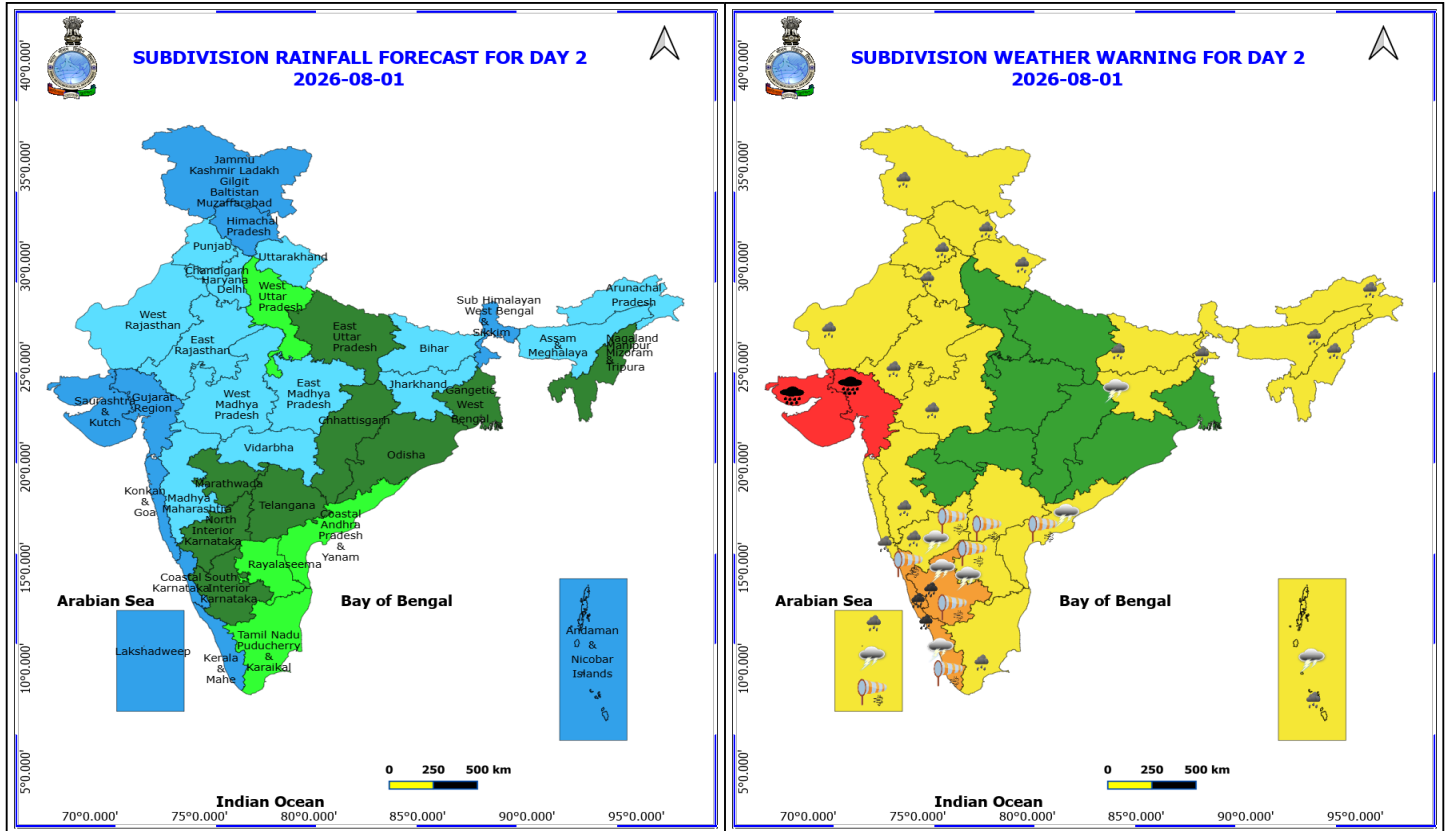
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and Oman Coasts, over most parts of central adjoining some parts of southwest and few parts of southeast & north Arabian Sea. Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off South Gujarat, Konkan & Goa, Karnataka, Kerala coasts, Lakshadweep area and adjoining sea areas.

❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over few parts of Gulf of Mannar, southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining north & south Sri Lanka coasts. Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off south Odisha coasts adjoining northwest Bay of Bengal.



1 August (Day 2)

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with isolated Extremely Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Gujarat State.
- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and South Interior Karnataka.
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Konkan & Goa, Lakshadweep, Madhya Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, North Interior Karnataka, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Uttarakhand and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Interior Karnataka, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Coastal Karnataka, Odisha, Rajasthan, Telangana and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally weather with wind speed 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph is likely to prevail along and off

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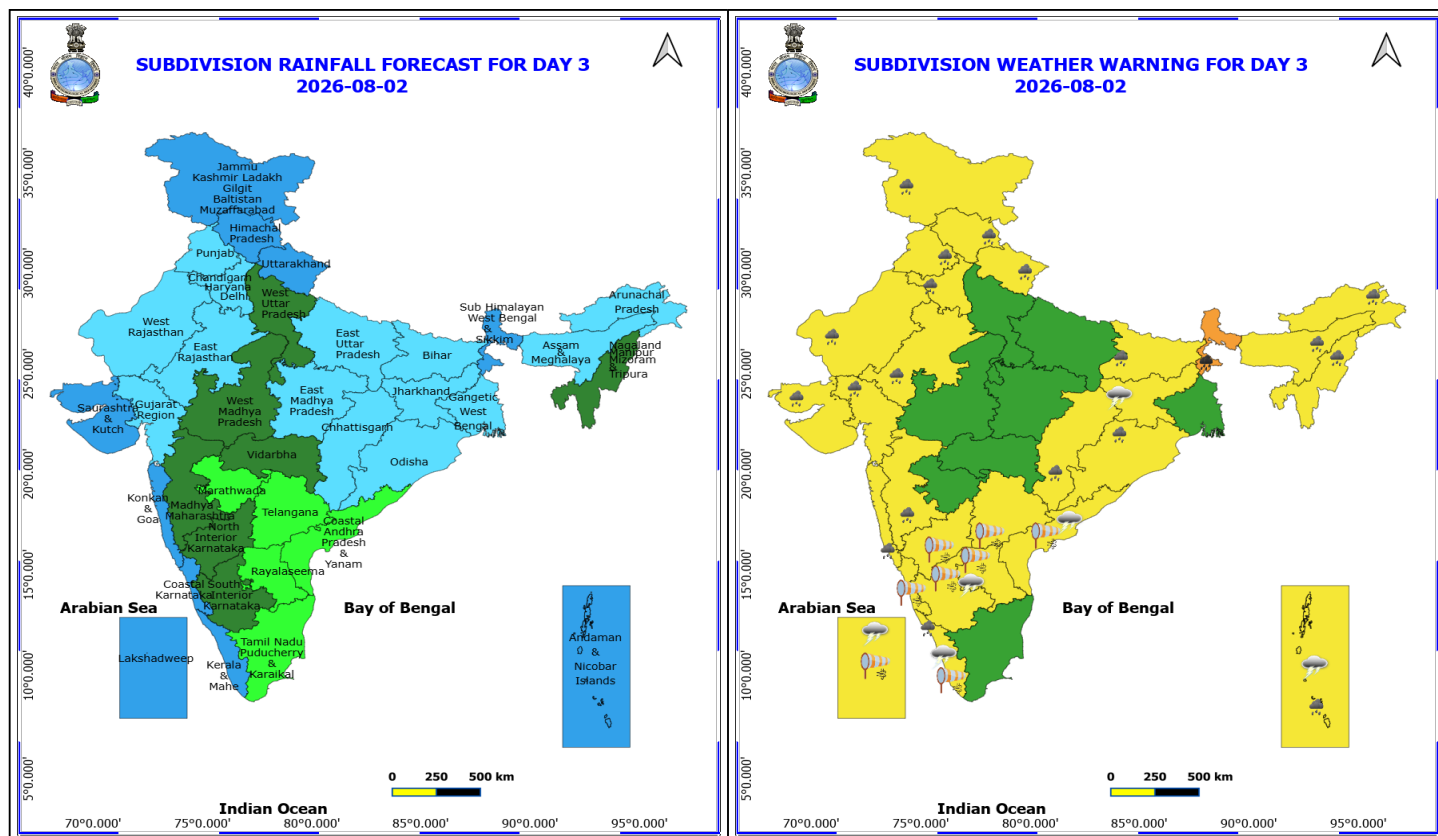
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south Gujarat, north Maharashtra and adjoining northeast & eastcentral Arabian Sea, some parts of southwest & westcentral Arabian Sea adjoining Somalia coasts. Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coasts, over most parts of central adjoining some parts of southwest, few parts of southeast & northwest Arabian Sea. Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off south Maharashtra & Goa, Karnataka, Kerala coasts, Lakshadweep area & adjoining sea areas.

❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over few parts of Gulf of Mannar, southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining south Sri Lanka coasts.



2 August (Day 3)

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Kerala & Mahe, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Karnataka, Rajasthan, Telangana and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat State, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coasts, over most parts of central adjoining some parts of southwest and few parts of north Arabian Sea and Squally weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over Comorin area and south Sri Lanka coasts adjoining sea areas. Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala coasts, Lakshadweep area, Comorin area and adjoining sea areas.

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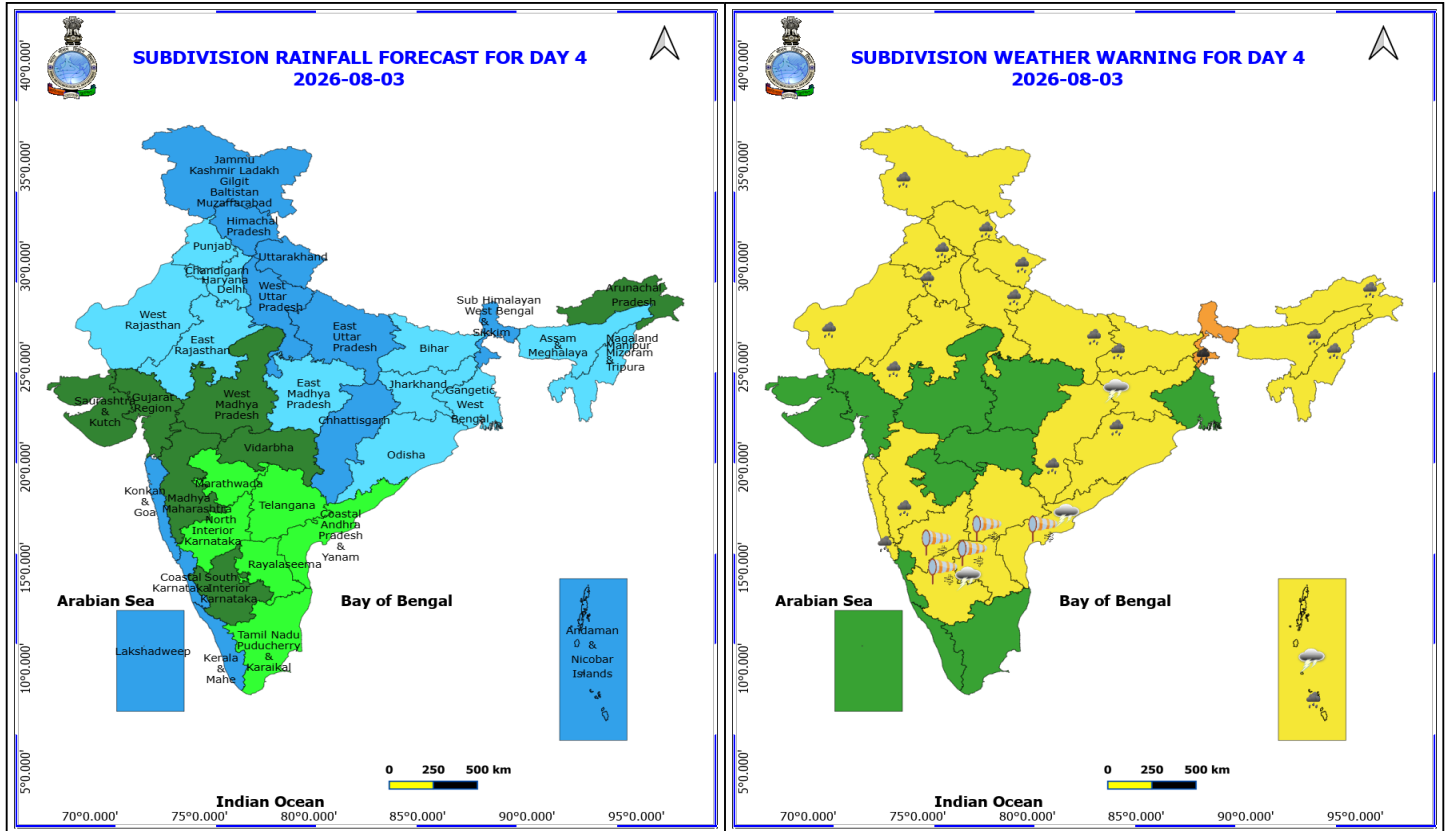
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❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along & off south Sri Lanka coast adjoining few parts of southwest Bay of Bengal and over Gulf of Mannar.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Interior Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coasts, over most parts of westcentral adjoining some parts of eastcentral, southwest & north Arabian Sea. Squally weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Gujarat coasts adjoining northeast Arabian Sea, Comorin area. 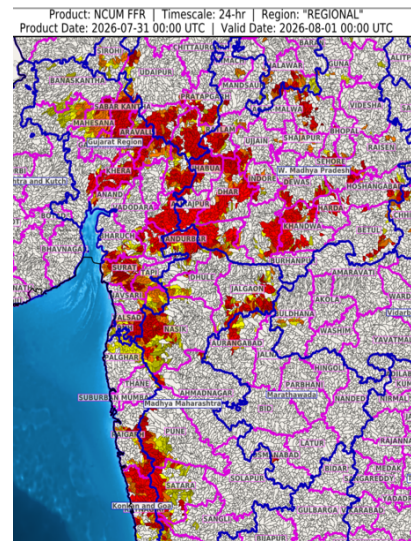

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-30

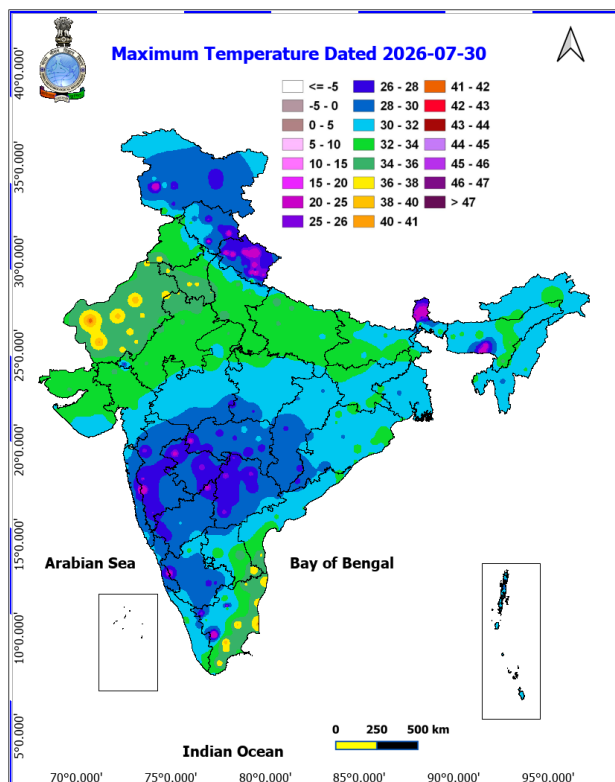


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-30

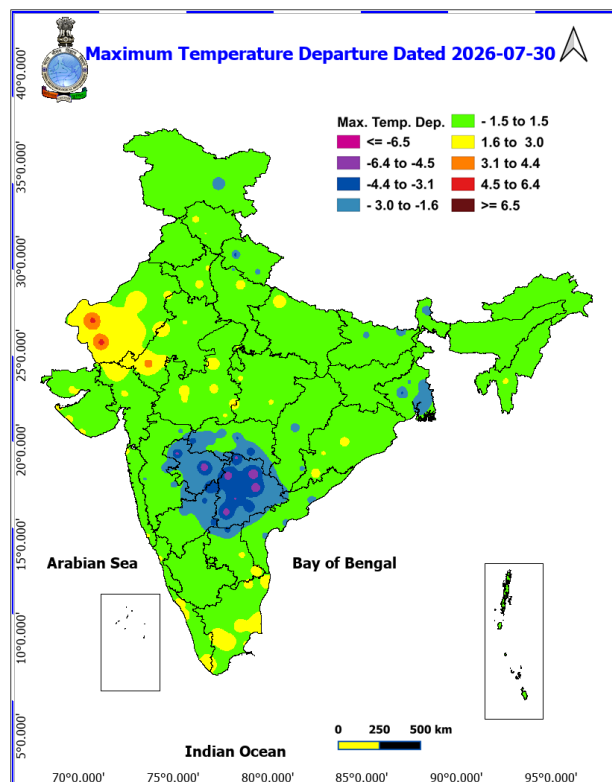


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-30

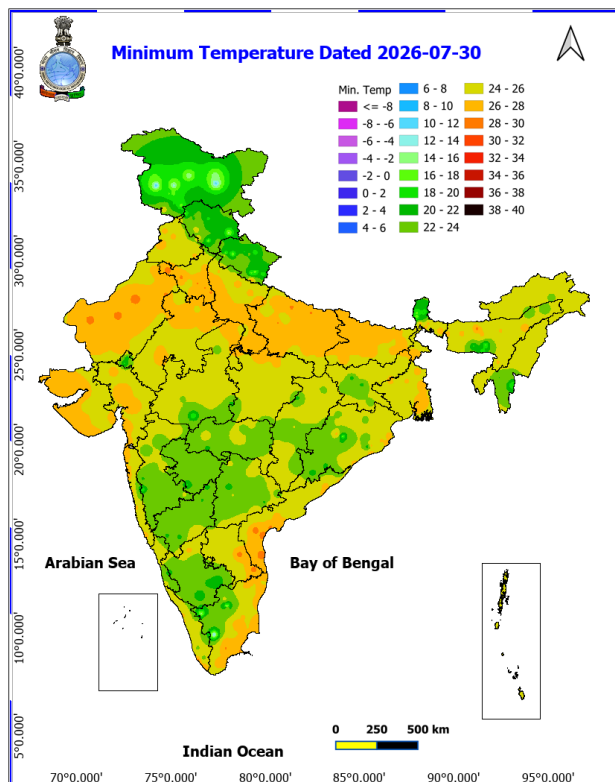
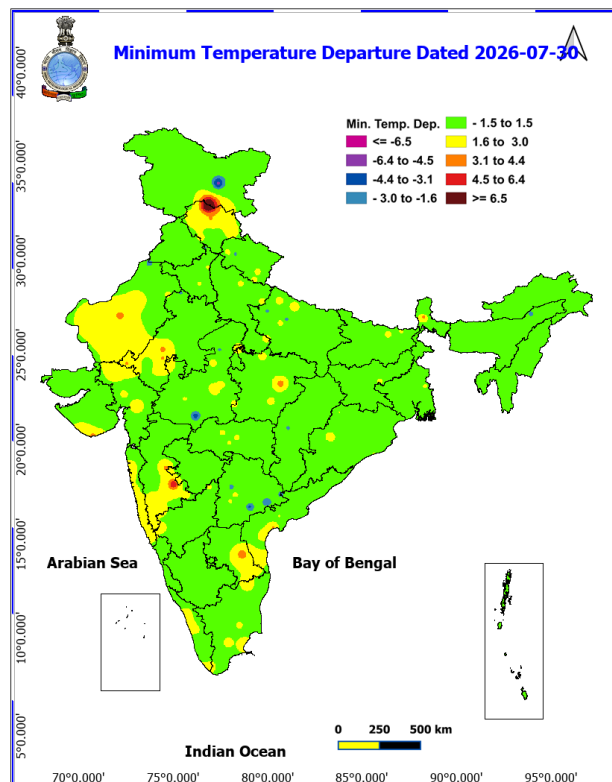


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-30

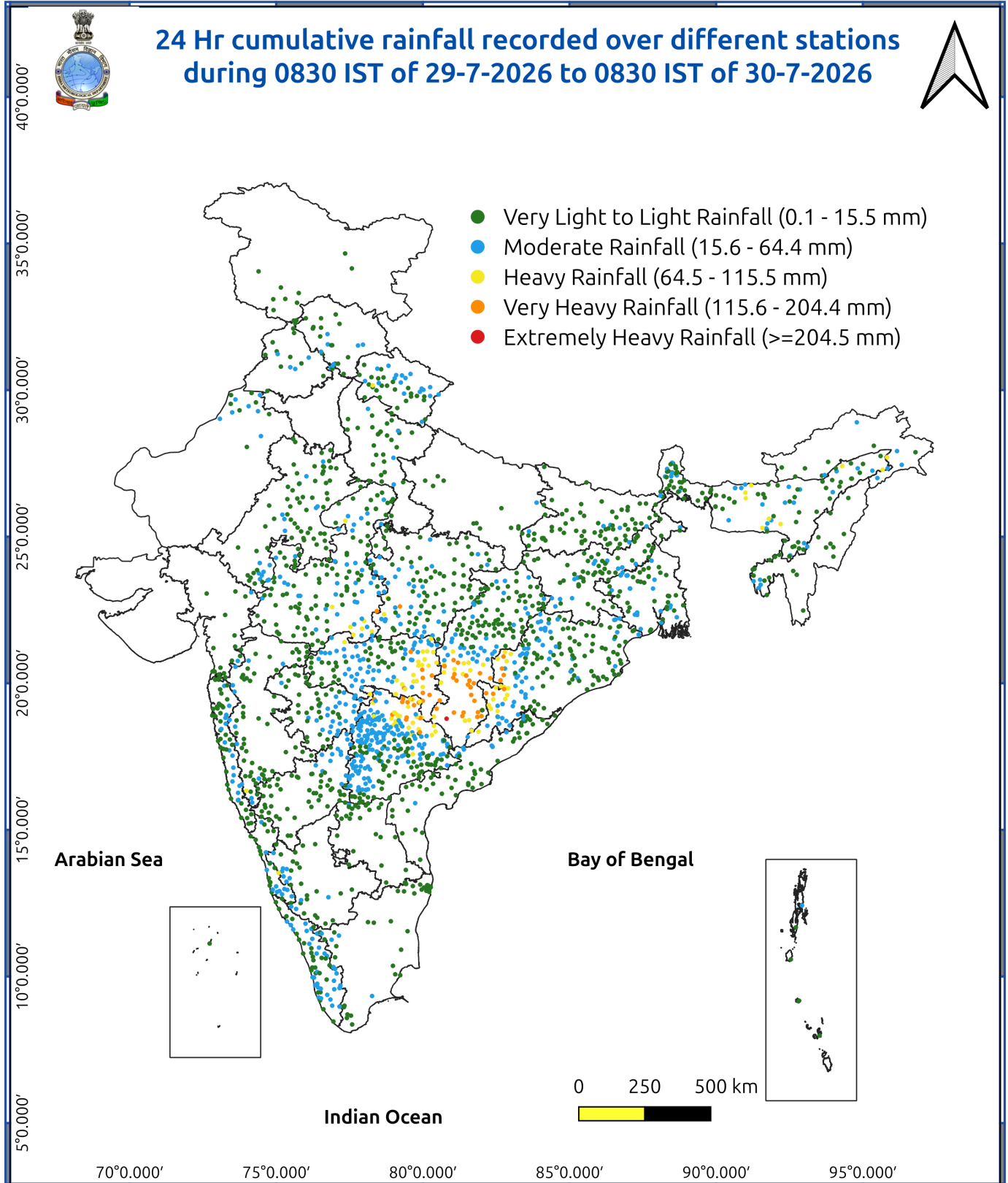


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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra on 31st July; Gujarat Region on 31st July & 01st August.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslides/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Konkan**, maintain proper drainage in turmeric, groundnut, transplanted rice and finger millet, porso millet, vegetable fields and orchards. Remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **ghat** areas of **Madhya Maharashtra**, drain out excess water from rice nurseries and *kharif* crops like maize, cotton, pigeon pea, groundnut, green gram and black gram.
- In **Marathwada**, drain out excess water from *kharif* crops like cotton, pigeon pea, green gram, black gram and groundnut. Postpone fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Vidarbha**, drain out excess water from *kharif* crops like maize, cotton, pigeon pea, soybean, orchards and vegetable nurseries.
- In **Gujarat**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess rainwater from the field of rice, cotton, pearl millet, soybean, maize, groundnut and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide strong bamboo staking to tall crops (banana, papaya, sugarcane).
- In **Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, maize, black gram, green gram, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone sowing, irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, drain out excess water from nursery beds and fields of rice, groundnut, green gram, pigeon pea and vegetables to avoid flooding or submergence of seedlings.
- In **Jammu and Kashmir**, ensure proper drainage in fields of maize, green gram, black gram and vegetables to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation in transplanted rice.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, tomato, brinjal, capsicum, chilli and cucumber fields and apple and pear orchards for quick removal of excess rainwater. Harvest mature fruits wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain effective drainage in rice, black gram, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and chilli fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Punjab and Haryana**, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, cotton, soybean, pigeon pea and groundnut

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fields and fruit orchards to prevent waterlogging.

- In **East Rajasthan**, maintain proper drainage and remove excess rainwater from low-lying soybean, maize, groundnut, cotton and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Keralam**, maintain proper drainage in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Karnataka**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage in paddy fields, orchards and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Telangana**, drain out excess rainwater from rice, maize, cotton, red gram, soybean and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields, orchards and low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Assam**, keep field drainage channels clear and ensure proper drainage in rice nurseries, jute, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide staking or support to banana, vegetables and other vulnerable crops against strong winds.
- In **Meghalaya**, drain out excess rain water from rice nurseries and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Strengthen nursery bunds and keep drainage channels free from obstruction.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, ensure proper drainage from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal**, ensure proper drainage in the fields of rice, jute, ginger and vegetable to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Odisha**, drain out excess water from nursery beds, fields of *kharif* crops such as maize, pulses (green gram, black gram, pigeon pea etc.), oilseeds (groundnut, sesame etc.), cotton, vegetables and fruit orchards to prevent waterlogging. Remove damaged fruits and leaves / plants from vegetable fields to prevent fungal diseases.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

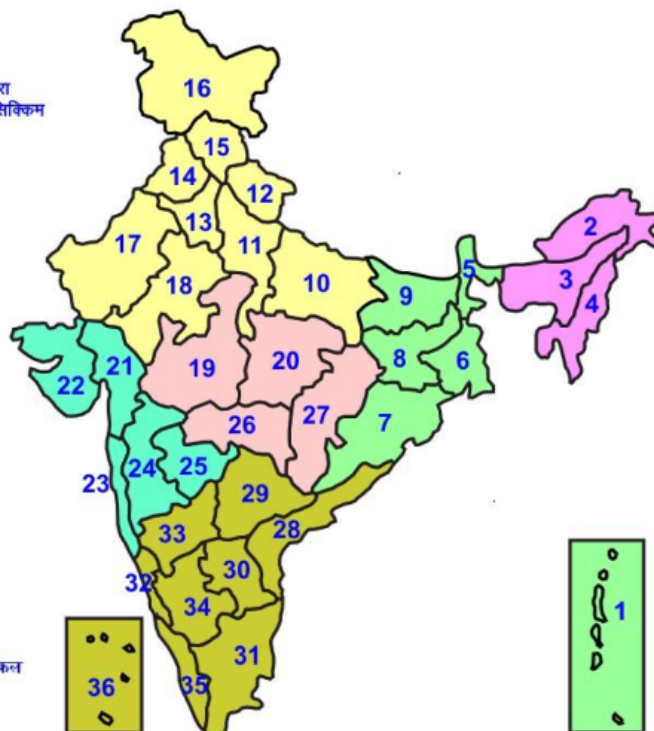
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
