

ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Systems, Forecast and Warnings

- **Isolated light** rainfall/snowfall likely over Jammu-Kashmir during 04th-07th March.
- **Strong surface winds (speed reaching 20-30 kmph)** very likely over Haryana, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh during 02nd -03rd March.

Hot & Humid weather Warnings:

- **Hot & humid conditions** very likely to prevail in isolated pockets over Konkan & Goa on 04th & 05th and Gujarat State during 04th-07th March.

Forecast of maximum temperatures:

- Gradual rise in maximum temperature by 3-5°C likely over Northwest India except East Uttar Pradesh where it is likely to rise by about 2°C) during next 5 days and no significant change thereafter. Hence, maximum temperatures are likely to appreciable to markedly above normal by 4-7°C over many parts of Northwest India during next 5 days.
- Gradual rise in maximum temperature by 2-4°C likely over Central India during next 5 days and no significant change during subsequent 2 days.
- No significant change in maximum temperature likely over East India during next 4-5 days and gradual rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 2-3 days.
- No significant change in maximum temperature likely over Maharashtra during next 2 days and gradual rise by 3-4°C during subsequent 3 days.
- Gradual rise in maximum temperature by 3-5°C likely over Gujarat State during next 4 days and no significant change during subsequent 3 days.
- Gradual rise in maximum temperature by 2-3°C likely over Northeast India during next 4 days and no significant change during subsequent 3 days.
- No significant change in maximum temperature likely over north Peninsular India during next 3 days and gradual rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 4 days.

Main Weather Observations:

- ❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at many places** over Assam & Meghalaya; **at Few places** over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura **Dry** over rest of the country.
- ❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Arunachal Pradesh:** Itanagar (dist Papum Pare) 1; **Assam & Meghalaya:** Tezpur (dist Sonitpur) 1.
- ❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 01-03-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan; at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Bihar and Chhattisgarh; at few places over West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Gujarat Region and Vidarbha; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra and Telangana. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Jharkhand; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Marathwada, Rayalaseema and South Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Coastal Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands. **The lowest minimum temperature of 10.5°C** was observed at **Amritsar (Punjab)** over the Plains of India.
- ❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 01-03-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at most places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at few places over Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and West Rajasthan; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and East Rajasthan. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at isolated places over Jharkhand, Bihar, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region and Chhattisgarh. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Vidarbha; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Coastal Karnataka; at most places over Marathwada, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **The highest maximum temperature of 38.4°C** is reported at ANANTAPUR (ANDHRA PRADESH).

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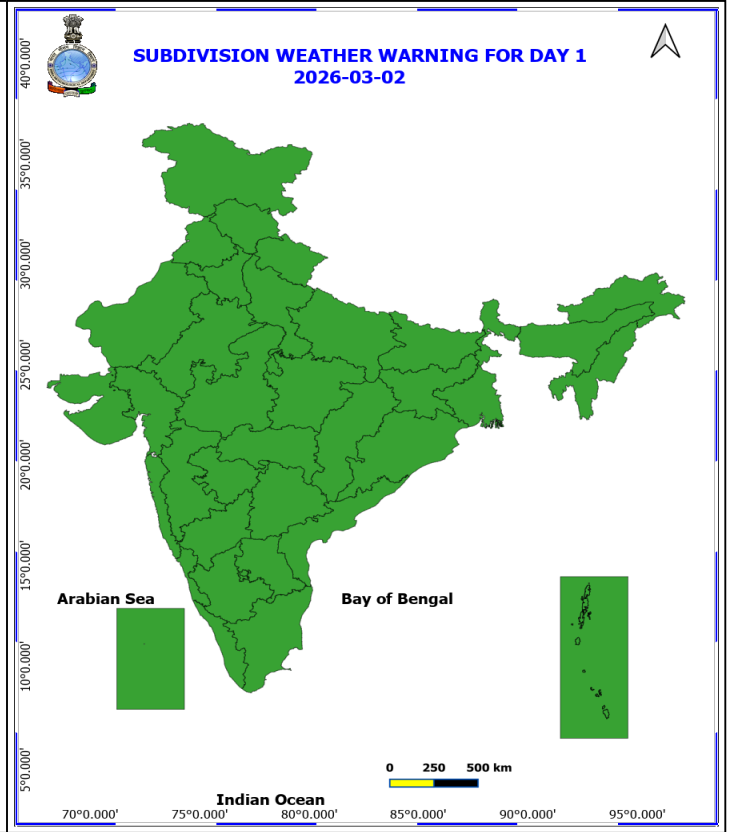
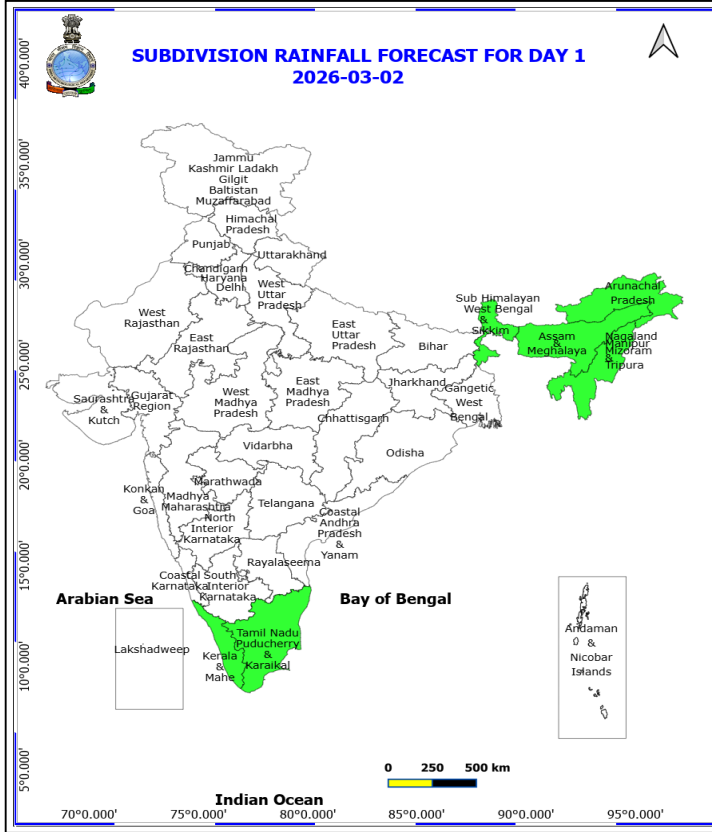
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over northeast Bangladesh & adjoining Meghalaya at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- A **trough** runs from above **cyclonic circulation** over northeast Bangladesh & adjoining Meghalaya to Vidarbha across Gangetic West Bengal, interior Odisha, south Chhattisgarh at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- The **cyclonic circulation** over Comorin area & neighbourhood now lies over Comorin area & adjoining Maldives area at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** now runs from above **cyclonic circulation** over Comorin area & adjoining Maldives area to South Interior Karnataka across Kerala at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper cyclonic circulation** over northeast Arabian Sea & adjoining Gujarat coast at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central Assam & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** in westerlies with its axis at 3.1 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 94°E to the north of Lat. 23°N persists.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 120 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level continues to prevail over Northwest India.
- The **cyclonic circulation** over southeast Bay of Bengal & neighbourhood extending upto 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- A fresh **Western Disturbance** is likely to affect Western Himalayan region from the night of 04th March, 2026.
- The **trough** from Comorin area to Lakshadweep area at 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- Isolated to Scattered rainfall activity likely over Western Himalayan region, Kerala & Mahe and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall activity likely over Northeast India.

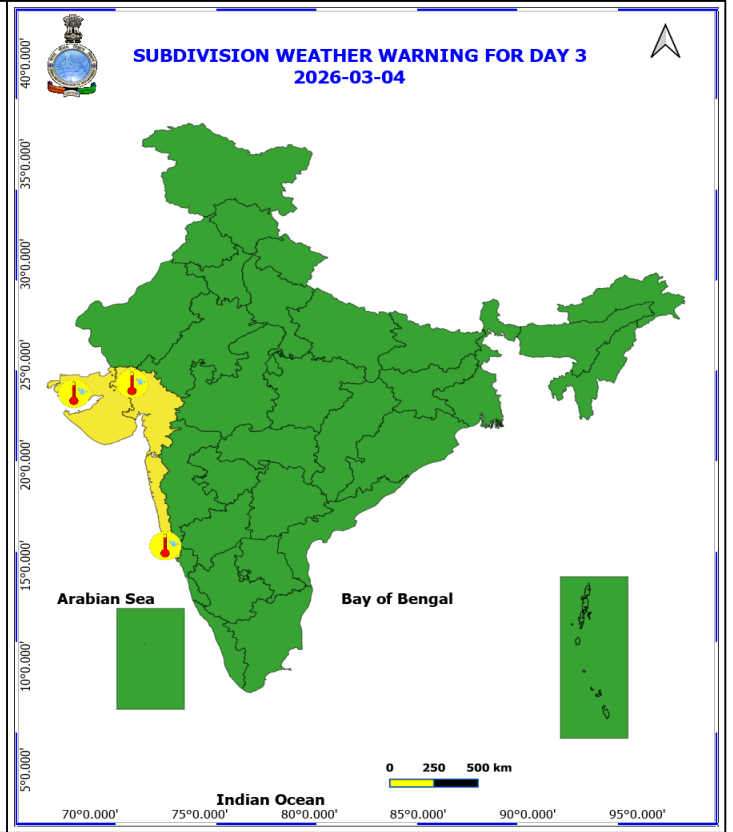
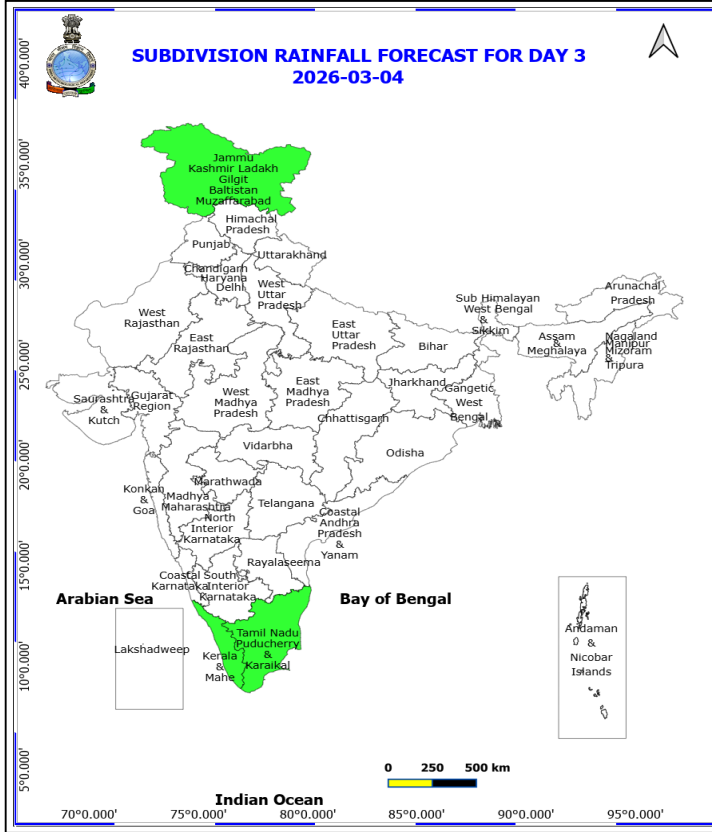

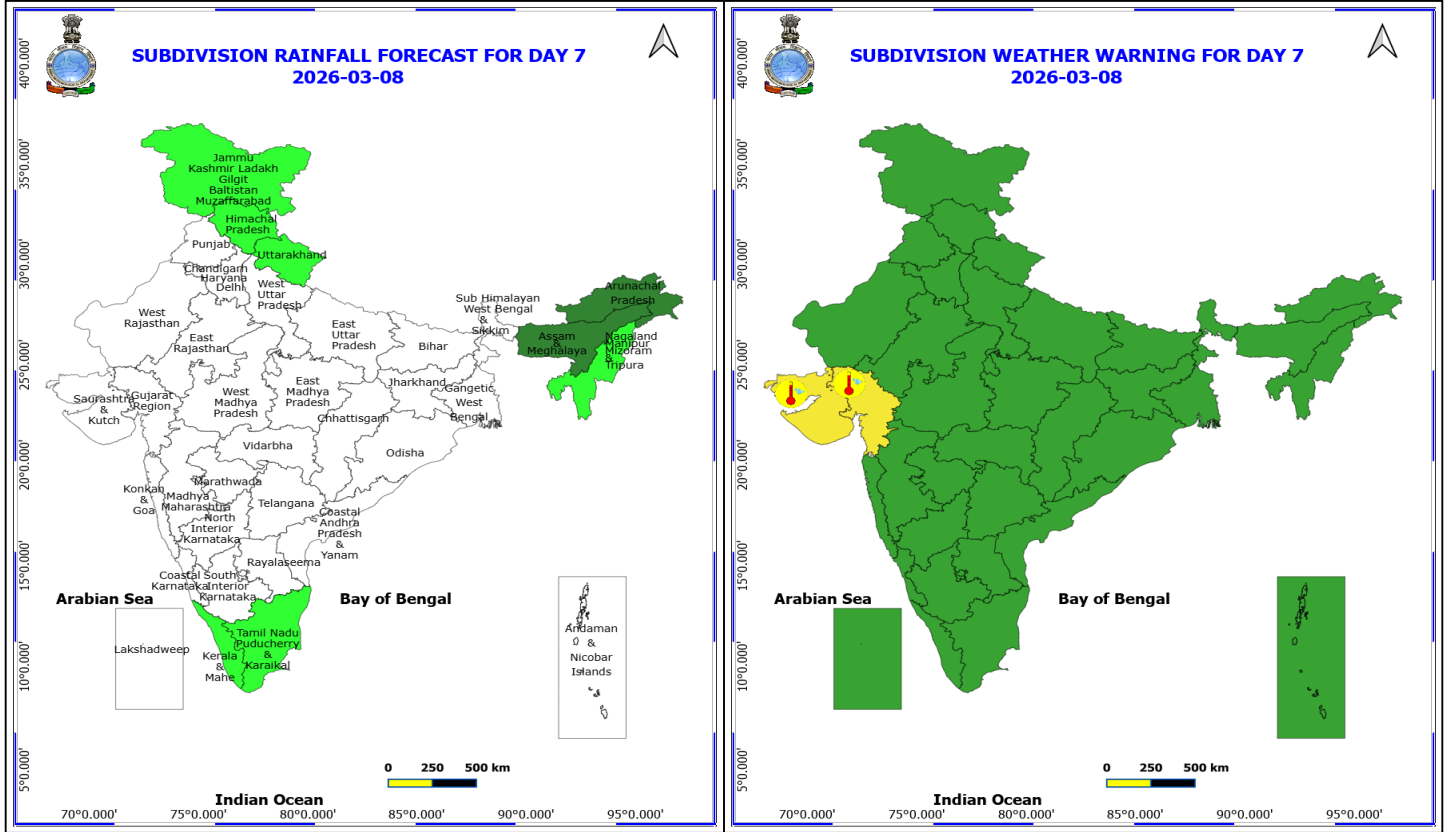

Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-03-01

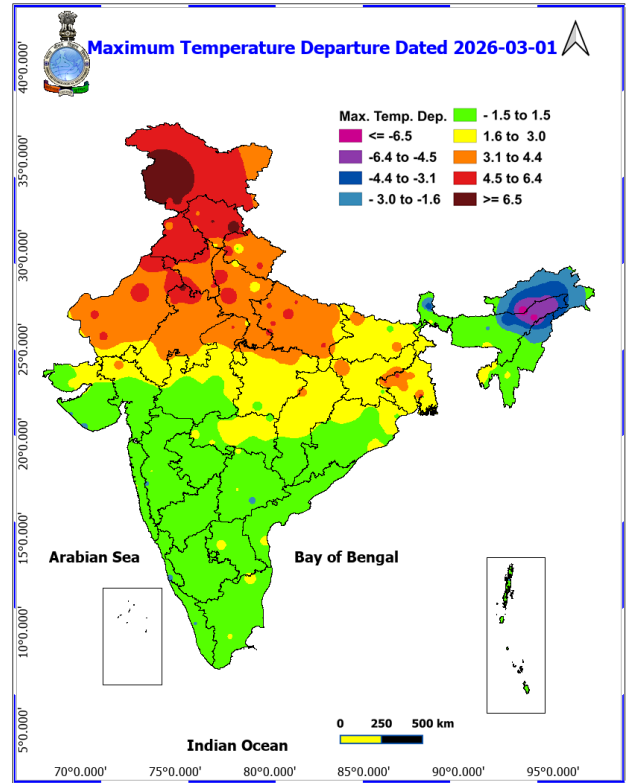
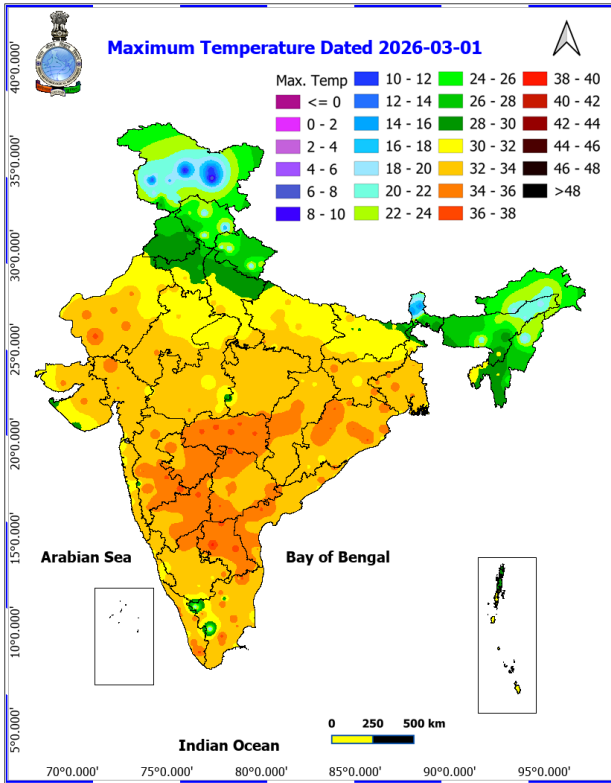
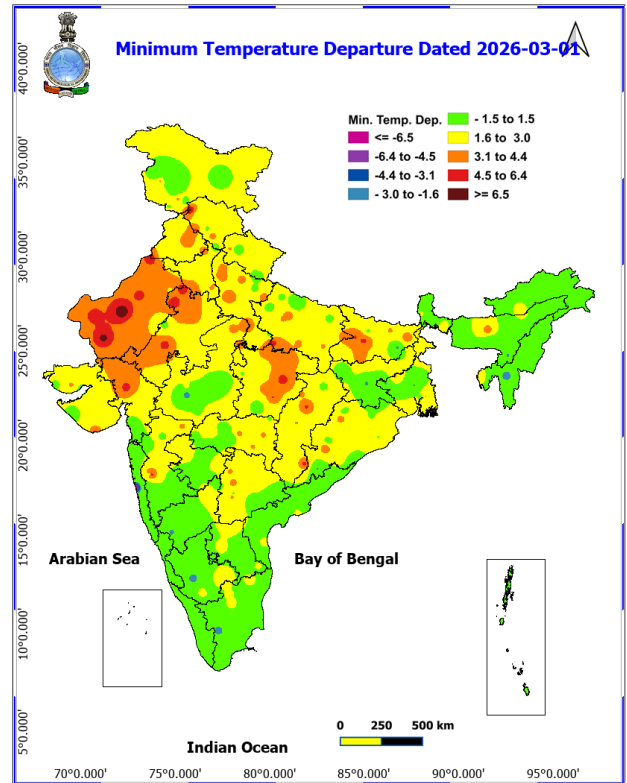
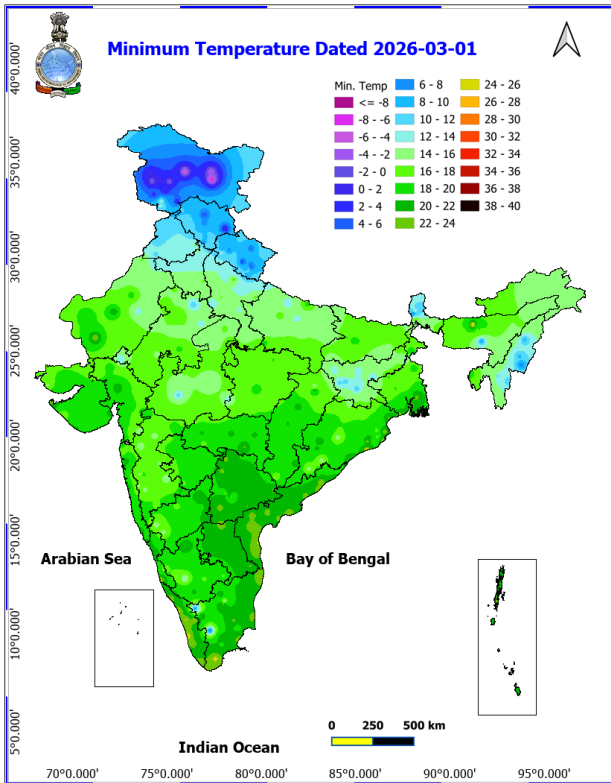
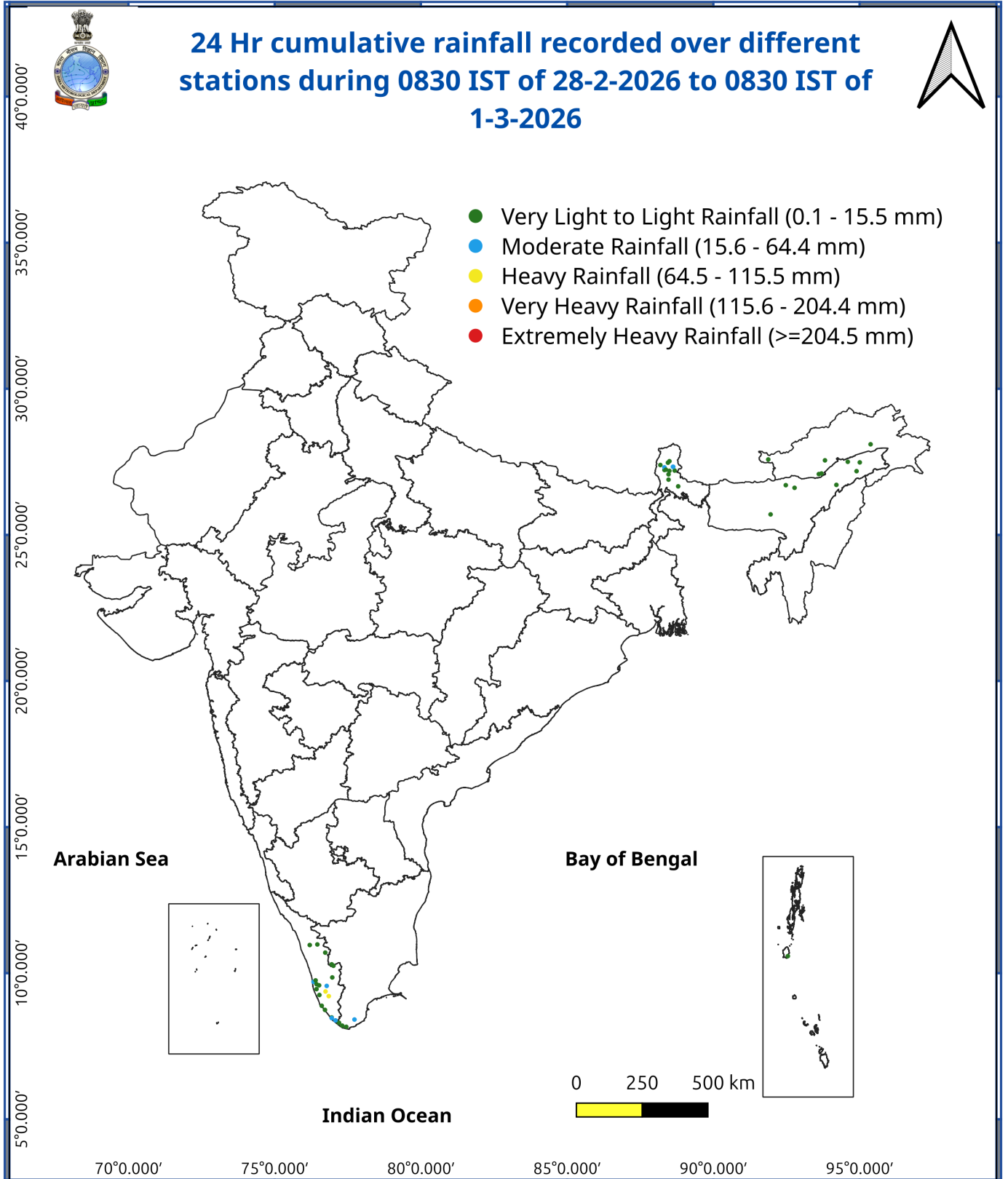


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-03-01

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Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Above normal Temperatures

- In Jammu and Kashmir, apply light irrigation to wheat, mustard and vegetables.
- In Himachal Pradesh, provide protective irrigation to wheat and early vegetables. Maintain ventilation in polyhouses for capsicum and tomato.
- In Punjab, maintain optimum soil moisture through irrigation in mustard, gobhi sarson and potato.
- In Haryana, provide light irrigation to mustard and gram at flowering and pod formation stages.
- In Uttarakhand, provide light and frequent irrigation in wheat, lentil, chickpea and mustard during critical growth stages (flowering and grain filling in wheat, pod formation in mustard and gram etc.).
- In Western Uttar Pradesh, provide light and frequent irrigation in wheat, mustard and chickpea, potato and early planted sugarcane.
- In Rajasthan, provide protective irrigation in cumin, isabgol, mustard and gram.
- Take appropriate action for conservation of soil moisture through mulching, proper field bunding, and avoiding unnecessary intercultivation.

Livestock / Poultry

- Provide clean, hygienic and plenty of drinking water to animals.
- To reduce the effect of heat wave/high temperature, cover the roof of poultry sheds with grass.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

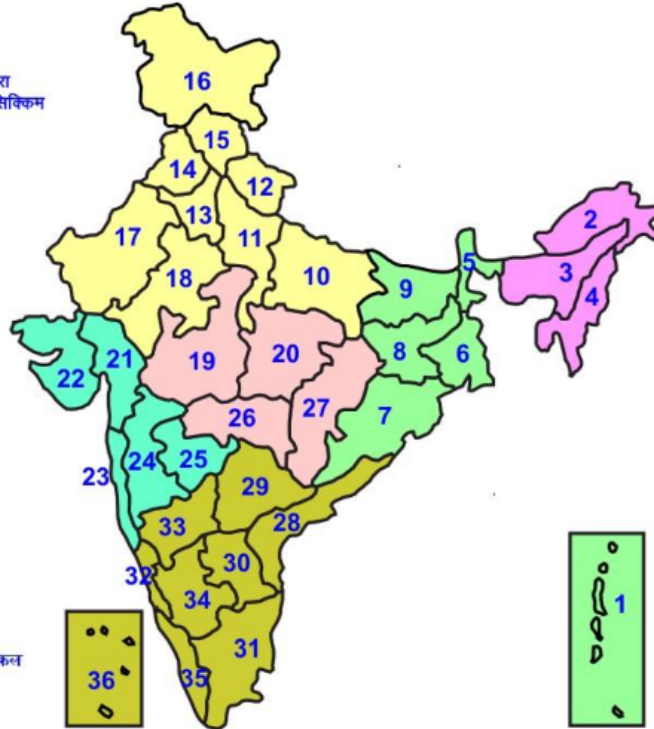

When maximum temperature of a station reaches $\geq 40^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\geq 30^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
(a) Based on Departure from normal

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave : When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)
Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
