- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Chhattisgarh during 20th-22nd September.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Gangetic West Bengal during 17th-22nd September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 17th-18th September and on 22nd September; Odisha during 19th-22nd September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 19th-21st September; Bihar and Jharkhand during 17th-22nd September; Odisha during 17th-18th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 17th-22nd September; Jharkhand on 17th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 17th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Bihar during 17th-18th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 17th September and during 19th-22nd September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 17th September; Bihar during 17th-18th September; Odisha during 18th-20th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 18th September.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 17th September.

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- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 18th-22nd September; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 17th-22nd September.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Assam & Meghalaya during 17th-20th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 17th-18th September.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 17th September; Assam & Meghalaya on 17th September and on 19th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 19th September.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region during 17th-19th September; Saurashtra & Kutch on 17th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 17th-22nd September; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada during 17th-22nd September; Gujarat Region during 20th-22nd September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 18th-22nd September.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Gujarat Region during 17th-18th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 17th-18th September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 17th-22nd September; Kerala & Mahe during 19th-22nd September; Lakshadweep during 19th-22nd September; Coastal Karnataka during 17th-19th September; North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 17th-18th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe during 17th-18th September; Lakshadweep during 17th-18th September; Coastal Karnataka during 20th-22nd September; North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 19th-22nd September.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 17th-20th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 19th-20th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 18th-19th September; North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 17th-20th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 17th-18th September.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Lakshadweep during 17th-18th September; Rayalaseema during 19th-20th September.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 17th-20th September; Kerala & Mahe during 17th-20th September; South Interior Karnataka during 19th-22nd September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 19th-21st September; Telangana during 19th-22nd September.
- **Strong Surface Winds** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema and South Interior Karnataka during 17th-20th September.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Konkan & Goa, Assam & Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep; **at many places** over East Madhya Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Rajasthan, Punjab, West Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal, Gujarat Region, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, East Uttar Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Kerala & Mahe, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Maharashtra; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): Jammu & Kashmir And Ladakh: Jammu (dist Jammu) 11, Katra (dist Reasi) 4; **Konkan & Goa**: Ratnagiri (dist Ratnagiri) 8; **Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal**: Salem (dist Salem) 4; **Assam & Meghalaya**: Dhubri (dist Dhubri) 4, North Lakhimpur (dist Lakhimpur), Cherrapunji (dist East Khasi Hills) 3 Each; **Arunachal Pradesh**: Pasighat (dist East Siang) 3; **Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam**: Tuni (dist Kakinada) 3; **East Uttar Pradesh**: Allahabad (dist Prayagraj) 3.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 16-09-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over West Rajasthan; at few places over Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha and Rayalaseema. **The lowest minimum temperature of 17.0°C** was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 16-09-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, East Rajasthan, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Marathwada and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Chhattisgarh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Punjab; at most places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan and Konkan & Goa; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, West Madhya Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Uttar Pradesh and Gujarat Region; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **The highest maximum temperature of 40.2°C** was reported at PILANI (RAJASTHAN).

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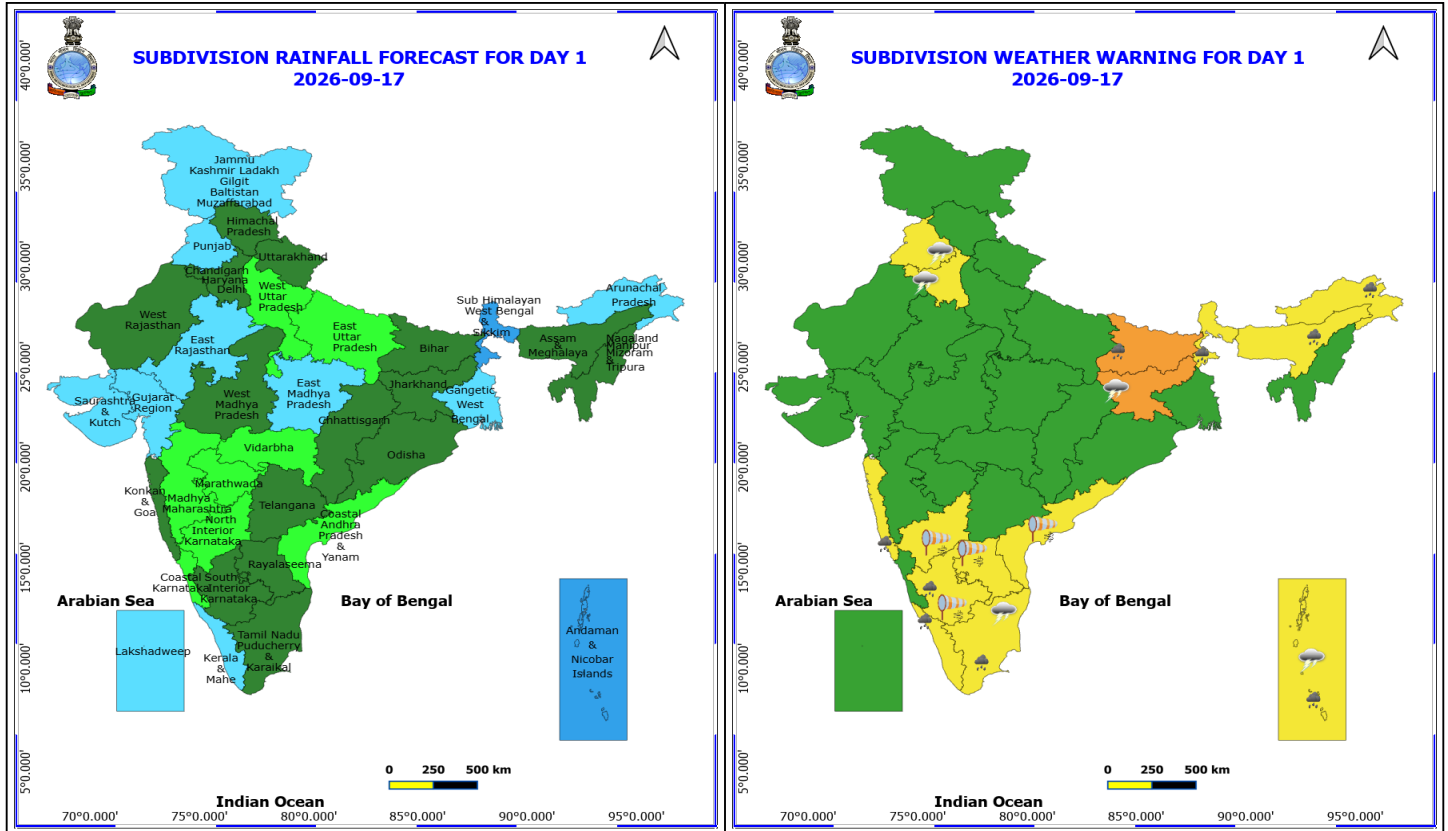
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- Conditions are becoming favourable for **withdrawal of Southwest Monsoon** from some parts of West Rajasthan around 19th September, 2026.
- The **Low Pressure Area** over Saurashtra & adjoining Northeast Arabian Sea persisted over the same region at 0530 hrs IST of today 17th September, 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends up to 5.8 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through centre of **Low Pressure Area** over Saurashtra & adjoining Northeast Arabian Sea, Bikaner, Bareilly, Gorakhpur, Patna, Bankura, Digha and thence southeastwards to Northeast Bay of Bengal.
- The **upper-air cyclonic circulation** over north Thailand persisted over the same region at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 17th September, 2026 and extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level. It is likely to emerge over the north Andaman Sea around 18th September evening and under its influence **a low pressure area** is likely to form over the same region around the evening of 19th September, 2026. Thereafter, it is likely to intensify gradually and move west-northwestwards towards south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh coasts during subsequent 3-4 days.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Haryana & neighbourhood persists and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- A fresh **Western Disturbance** seen as a trough in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level runs roughly along Long. 64°E to the north of Lat. 28°N.
- The **trough** from Northern parts of Gangetic West Bengal to North Odisha between 1.5 to 3.1 km above mean level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central Assam & neighbourhood now lies over northeast Assam & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Coastal Andhra Pradesh & neighbourhood and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Marathwada & neighbourhood and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** now runs from the cyclonic circulation over Marathwada & neighbourhood to Gulf of Mannar across Interior Karnataka and Tamil Nadu at 0.9 km above mean sea level.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Jharkhand, Punjab and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Gangetic West Bengal, Interior Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Lakshadweep, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttarakhand and West Rajasthan.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh and Interior Karnataka.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off north Somalia coasts, few parts of southwest adjoining westcentral Arabian Sea.
- ❖ **Squally weather** with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off north Gujarat coasts adjoining northeast Arabian Sea.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over some parts of southeast adjoining southwest Bay of Bengal and over south Andaman Sea.

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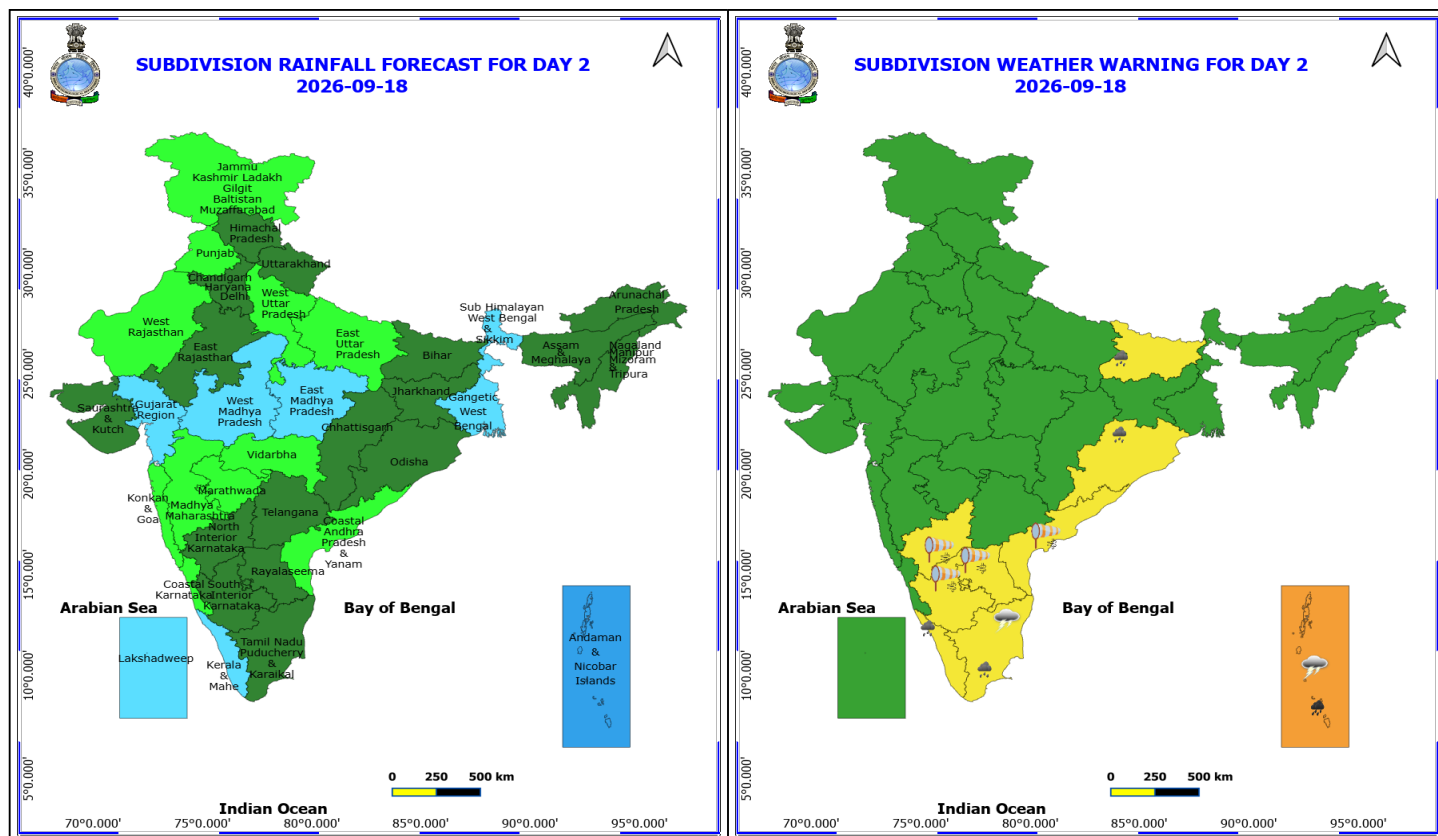

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-16

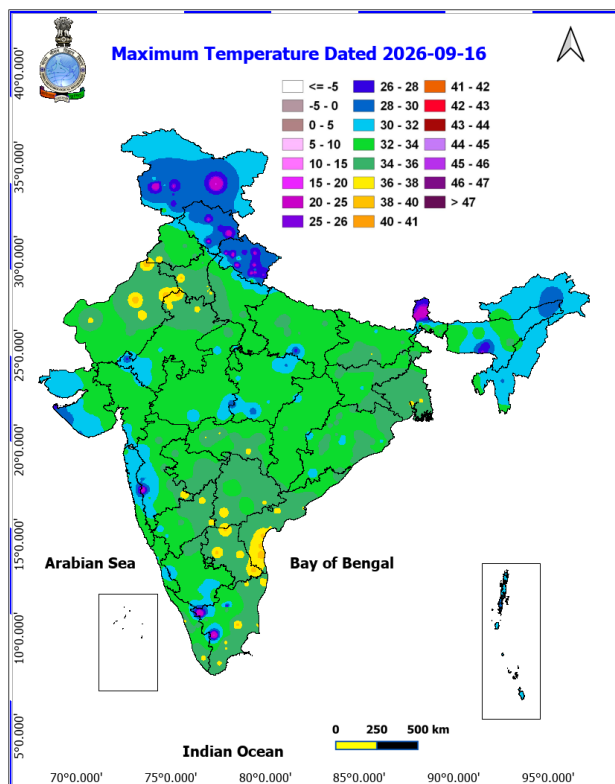


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-16

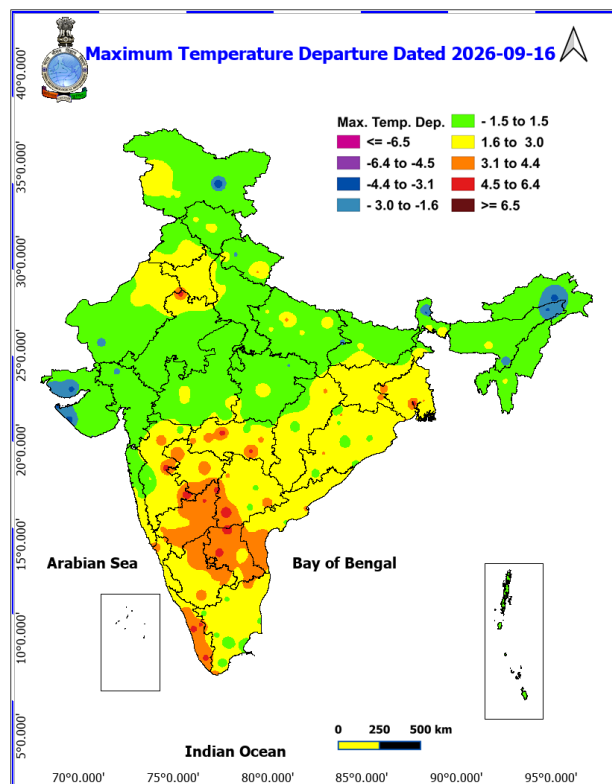


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-16

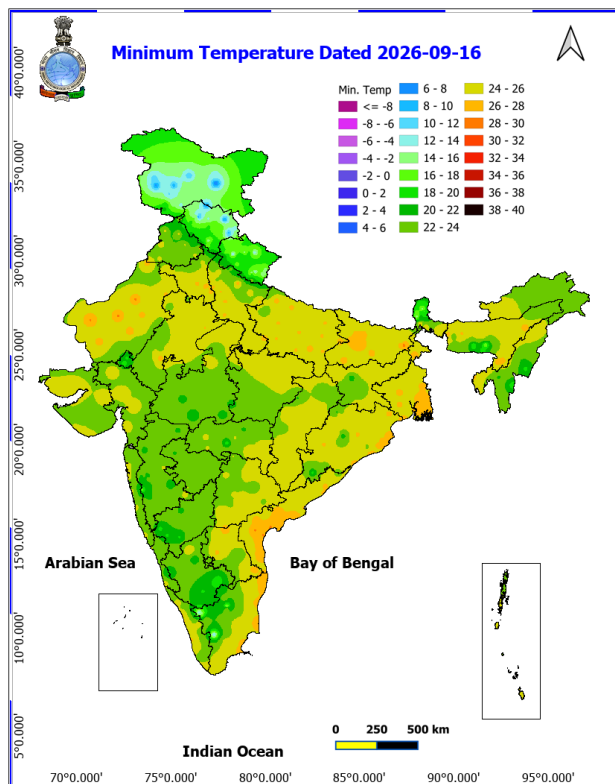
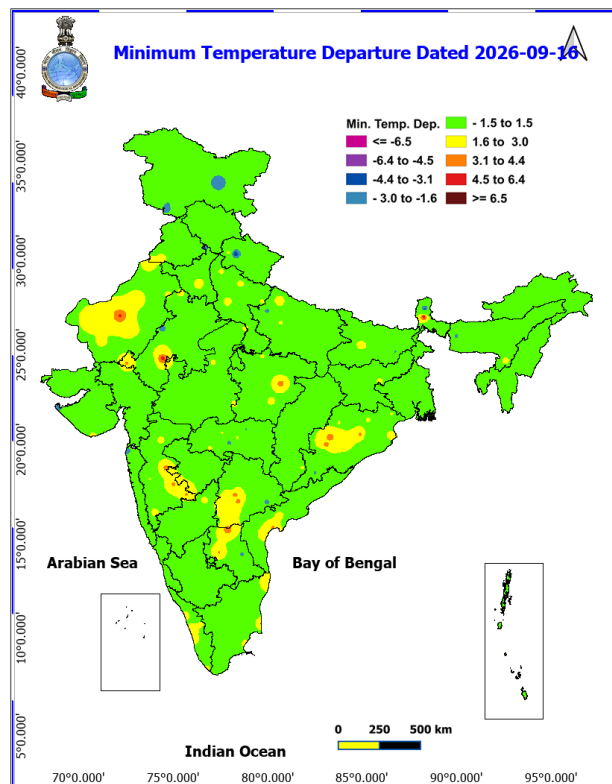
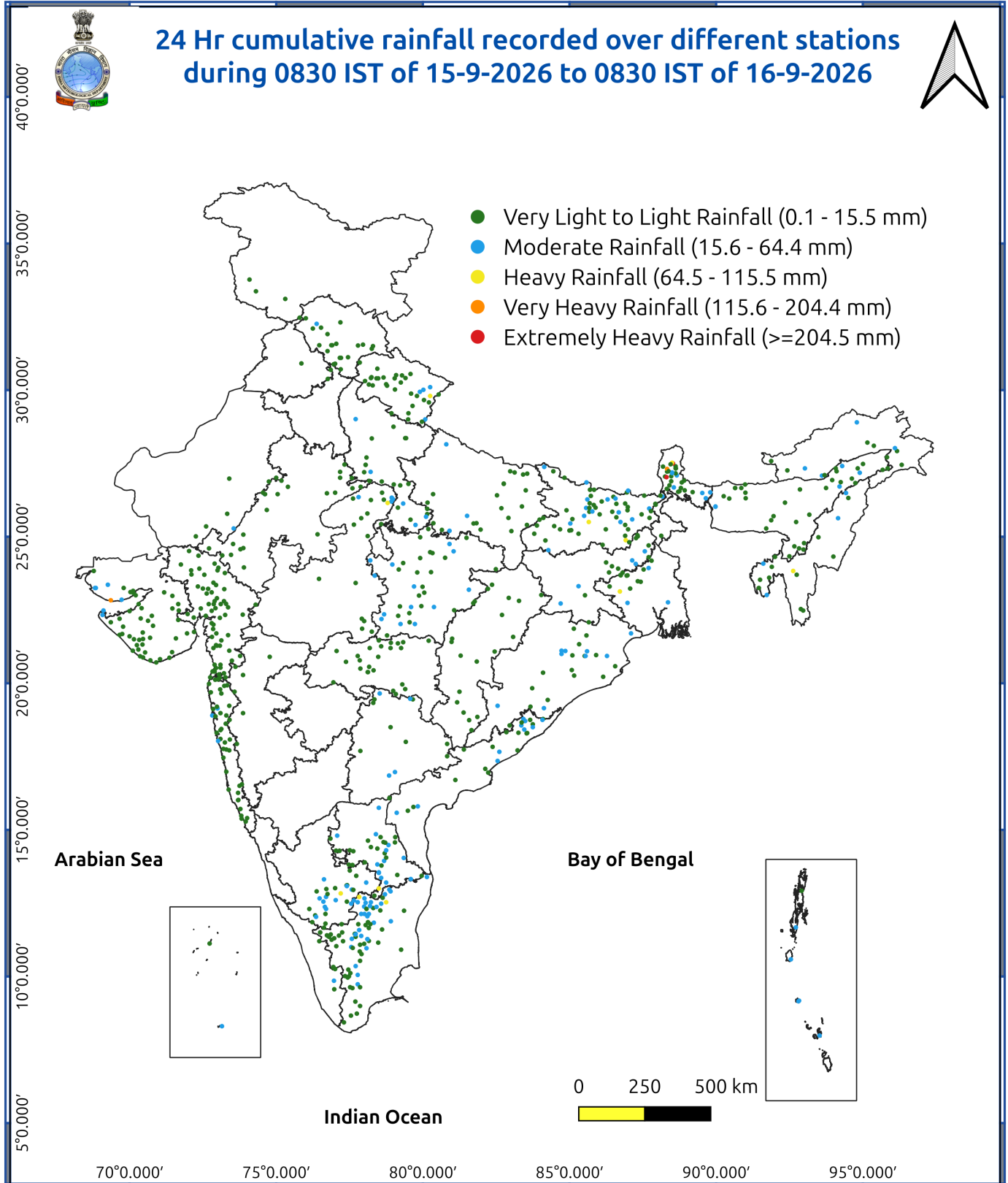


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-16





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated very heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 18th September.
- **Moderate to severe lightning** activity likely over Jharkhand on 17th September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Andaman & Nicobar**, provide mechanical support to banana & papaya plantations and staking to young plants and vegetables. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in millet fields to prevent water stagnation and strengthen trellises and supports for cucumber and other gourds. Harvest mature upland/Jhum rice, soybean and vegetables and immediately shift the produce to safe, covered shelters.
- In **Assam & Meghalaya**, drain excess water from maize, black gram, green gram and sesame fields and keep drainage channels clear. Maintain suitable water levels in rice, support papaya, banana and weak-stemmed crops, and harvest pumpkins and bottle gourd before the rains wherever possible.
- In **Nagaland**, maintain 3-5 cm water level in wet rice fields and harvest mature maize cobs during suitable weather.
- In **Manipur**, harvest colocasia and mature ginger during rain-free periods and ensure proper drainage in ginger fields.
- In **Mizoram**, prepare fields for sowing black gram, green gram, soybean, sesame and lentil after maize harvest. Ensure drainage in ginger fields and prevent water stagnation to minimise soft-rot and rhizome-rot incidence.
- In **Tripura**, maintain adequate soil moisture in Aus rice during panicle initiation and booting, while ensuring drainage in low-lying groundnut fields to prevent stagnation
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim**, maintain safe water levels in rice and clear drainage channels in rice and green gram fields. Drain excess water from rice fields, protect pointed gourd.
- In **Odisha**, make immediate arrangements to drain excess water from rice, maize, millets, ginger, turmeric,

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vegetables, pulses and orchards. Protect vegetable nurseries, provide staking to vegetables and undertake earthing-up around newly planted banana saplings; postpone field operations until rainfall ceases and soil conditions become suitable.

- In **South Interior Karnataka**, Protect harvested produce by keeping it in safe, covered storage, and secure farm structures and equipment. Postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and application of plant protection measures & fertilizers to the standing crops. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- In **Tamil Nadu**, drain excess water from standing crop fields and avoid fertilizer and pesticide applications during rainfall, particularly where heavy rainfall was received yesterday. Provide support to banana plants and prop sugarcane against lodging.
- In **Kerala**, ensure effective drainage in banana, black pepper, coconut, ginger and turmeric fields following the recent rainfall and provide strong support to banana plants and trellis-grown crops. Postpone all field operations until rainfall ceases and soil conditions become suitable.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

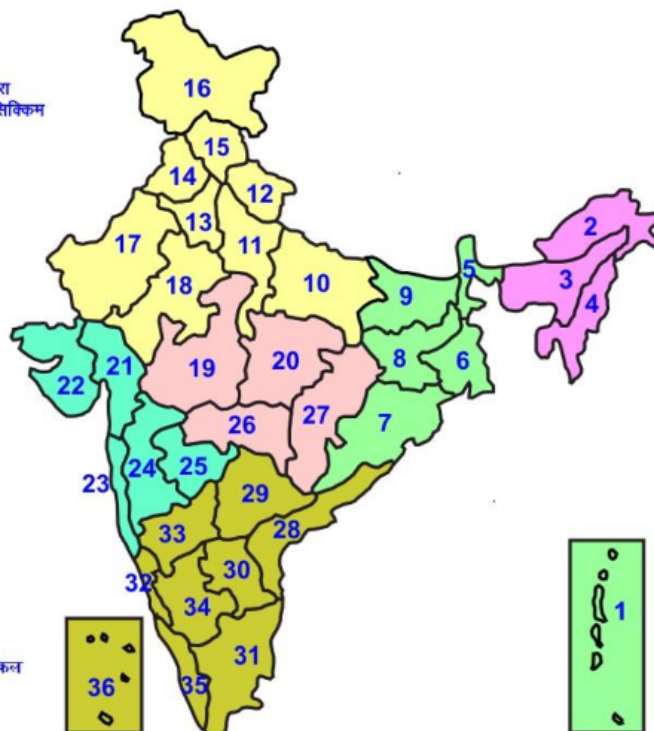
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)

Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)

Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)

Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)

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
