Significant Weather Features

Weather Warning and Forecast

Northwest India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over rest parts of northwest India.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over East Rajasthan on 18th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over East Rajasthan on 18th September.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 18th-24th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 18th-19th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 18th-20th September and on 23rd & 24th September; Odisha during 21st-24th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 20th-24th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 21st-22nd September; Bihar and Jharkhand during 18th-24th September; Odisha during 18th-20th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 18th-20th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Bihar on 18th September; Odisha on 18th, 23rd & 24th September.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 19th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 18th-24th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 18th September and during 20th-24th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 18th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 18th-21st September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 18th-19th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Assam & Meghalaya during 19th-21st September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 19th September.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 20th-24th September; Madhya Maharashtra during 21st-22nd September; Marathawada on 22nd September; Gujarat Region during 18th-19th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 18th-19th September; Madhya Maharashtra during 18th-20th September and on 23rd & 24th September; Marathawada during 18th-21st September and on

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23rd & 24th September; Gujarat Region during 20th-24th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 18th-24th September.

- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch on 18th; with **gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Konkan & Goa on 18th September; Madhya Maharashtra during 20th-22nd September; Marathwada during 20th-22nd September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Gujarat Region on 18th September; Madhya Maharashtra during 21st-22nd September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 18th-24th September; Coastal Karnataka and Telangana during 18th-19th September; North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 18th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 18th-24th September; Coastal Karnataka and Telangana during 20th-24th September; North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 19th-24th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 18th-24th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 19th-21st September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over North Interior Karnataka during 19th-21st September; South Interior Karnataka during 19th-22nd September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema on 18th September; Telangana during 18th-21st September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 18th-20th September; Lakshadweep, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 18th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 18th-24th September; Kerala & Mahe during 18th-20th September; Lakshadweep on 18th September and on 21st September; Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 20th-21st September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 19th-21st September and on 23rd & 24th September; Rayalaseema during 19th-21st September; Telangana during 20th-24th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 18th-21st September.

Hot & Humid weather warning:

- **Hot and humid** weather conditions likely to prevail over Kerala & Mahe on 18th September.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over East Rajasthan, West Uttar Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, Arunachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Chhattisgarh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Gujarat Region; **at many places** over Jharkhand, Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, West Rajasthan, East Uttar Pradesh, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **East Rajasthan**: Jaipur (dist Jaipur) 6; **Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal**: Tiruchirapalli AP (dist Tiruchirappalli) 6; **Gangetic West Bengal**: Diamond Harbour (dist South 24 Parganas) 5.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 17-09-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Bihar; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Madhya Maharashtra. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Marathwada and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Chhattisgarh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Coastal Karnataka; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Rayalaseema. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.0°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 17-09-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Marathwada and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Vidarbha and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha and Chhattisgarh. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa; at most places over Coastal Karnataka; at few places over Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan and West Madhya Pradesh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, West Rajasthan and Gujarat Region; at most places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Saurashtra & Kutch. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.9°C was reported at NELLORE (ANDHRA PRADESH).

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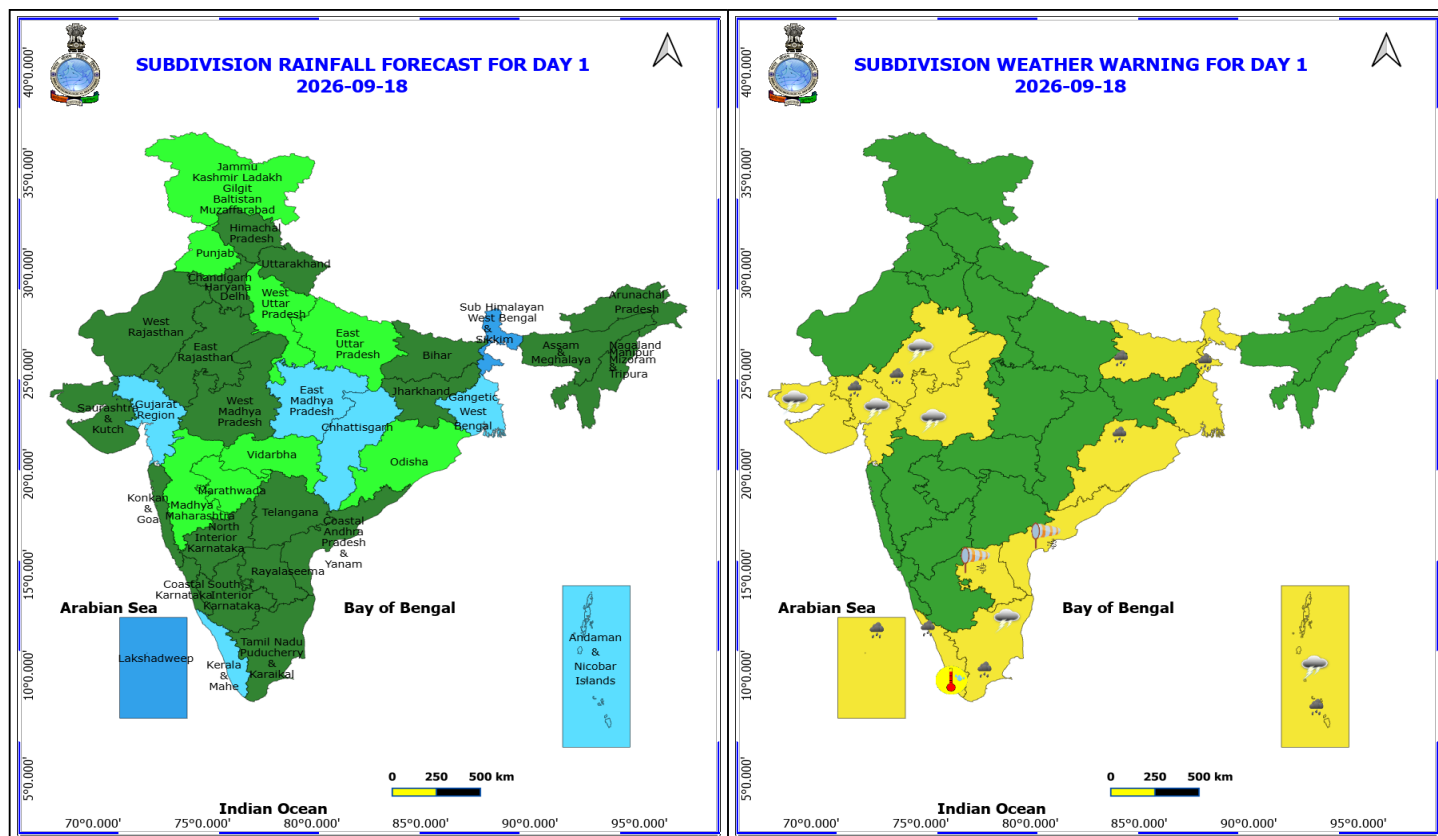
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- Conditions are becoming favourable for **withdrawal of Southwest Monsoon** from some parts of West Rajasthan around 19th September, 2026.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood between 1.5 & 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Phalodi, Ajmer, Guna, Satna, Jamshedpur, Digha and thence southeastwards to Northeast Bay of Bengal.
- The **upper-air cyclonic circulation** over north Thailand persisted over the same region at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 18th September, 2026 and extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea levels. It is likely to emerge over the north Andaman Sea around 18th September evening and under its influence **a low pressure area** is likely to form over the same region around the evening of 19th September, 2026. Thereafter, it is likely to intensify gradually and move west-northwestwards towards south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh coasts during subsequent 3-4 days.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over west Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood and extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a **cyclonic circulation** over Jammu & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level with a trough aloft in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 28°N persists.
- The **trough** from Sikkim to North Odisha across Gangetic West Bengal between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Marathwada & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from the cyclonic circulation over Marathwada & neighbourhood to Gulf of Mannar across Interior Karnataka and Tamil Nadu at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- A **trough** runs from Eastcentral Arabian Sea to southwest Uttar Pradesh across Gujarat and East Rajasthan between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over North Interior Tamil Nadu & neighbourhood at 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- The associated cyclonic circulation over Saurashtra & adjoining Northeast Arabian Sea extending up to 5.8 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height has become less marked.



18 September (Day 1)

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, East Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, Odisha, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, East Rajasthan, Gujarat State, Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Konkan & Goa, Odisha, Telangana, West Bengal & Sikkim and West Rajasthan.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Interior Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off north Somalia coasts adjoining southwest & westcentral Arabian Sea.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over some parts of southeast adjoining southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining south Sri Lanka coasts and over some parts of south Andaman Sea.

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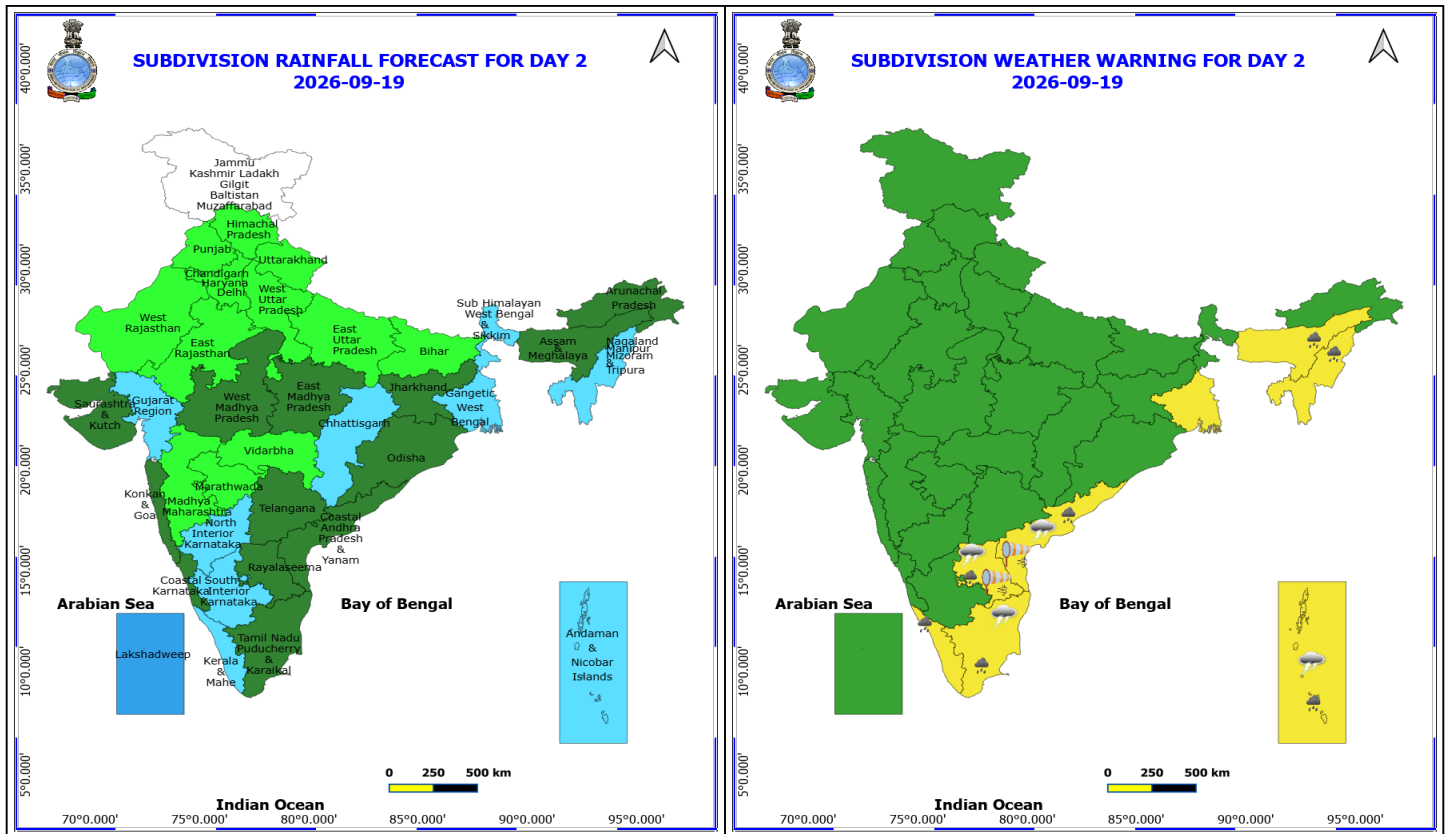

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-17

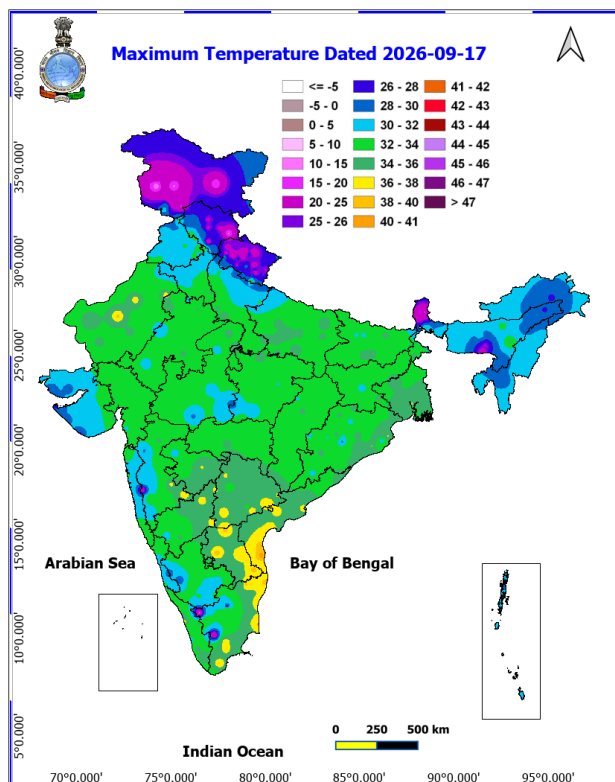


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-17

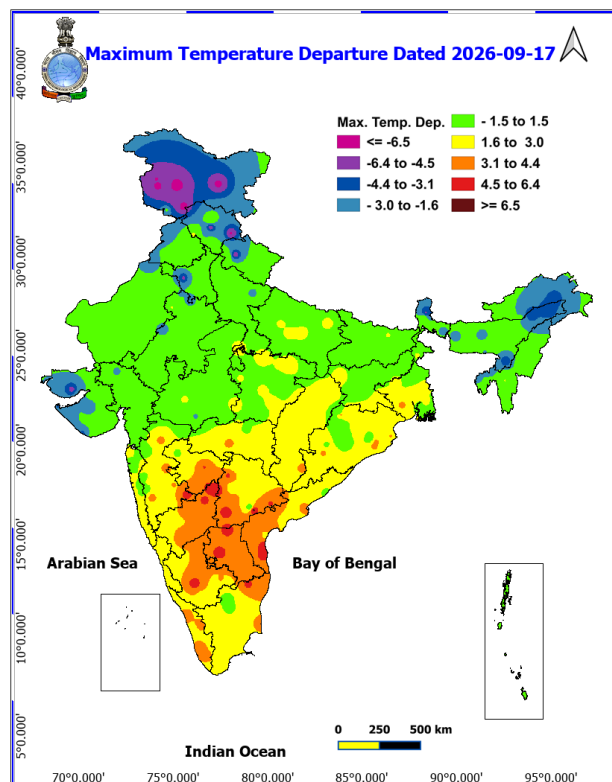


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-17

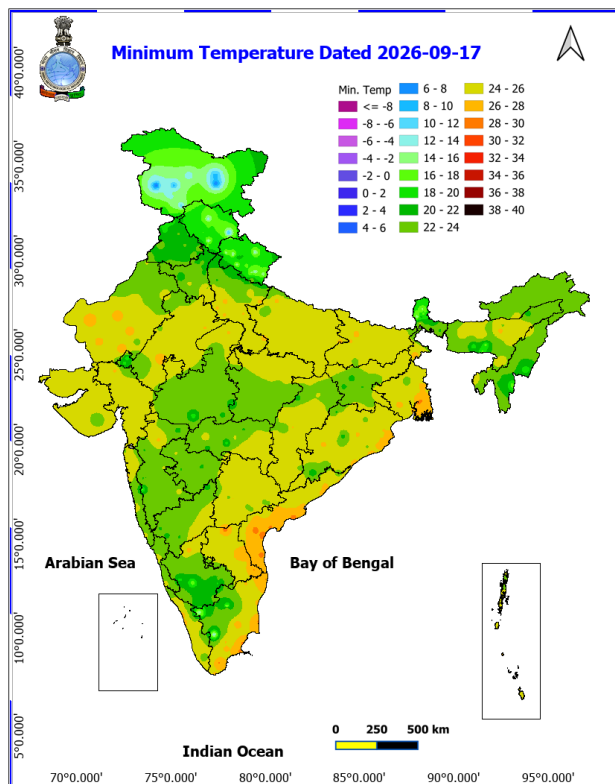
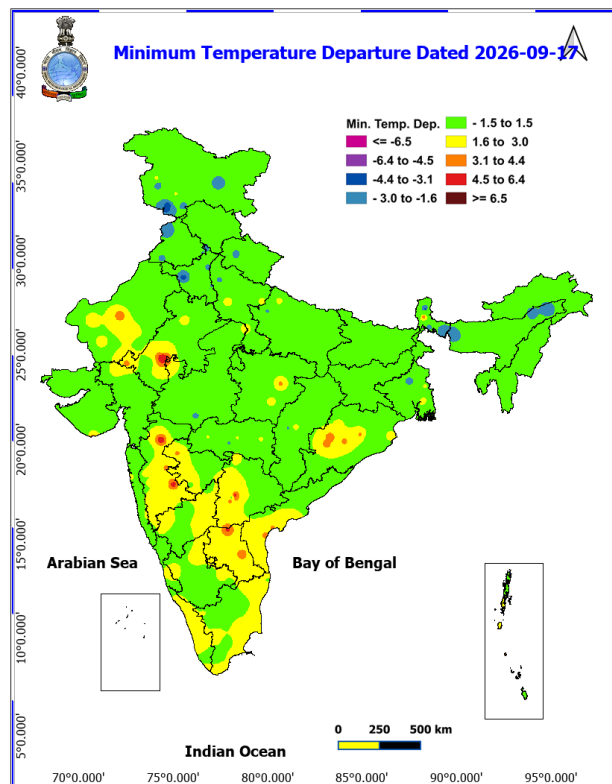
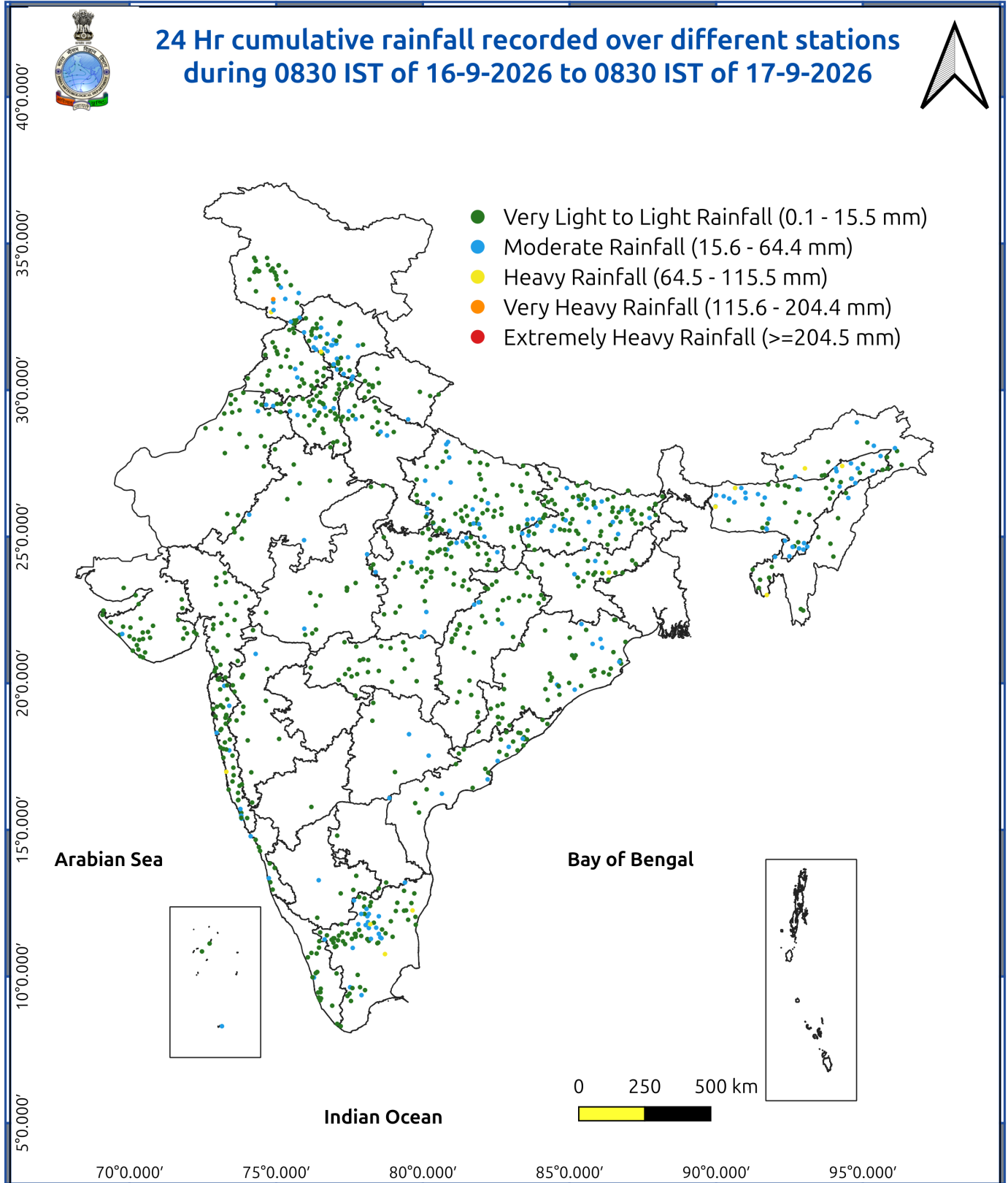


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-17





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Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall:

- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim**, maintain safe water levels in rice and clear drainage channels in rice and green gram fields. Drain out excess water from rice fields, pointed gourd and other standing crop and vegetables.
- In **Odisha**, ensure proper drainage to drain excess water from rice, maize, millets, ginger, turmeric, vegetables, pulses and orchards. Protect vegetable nurseries, provide staking to vegetables and undertake earthing-up around newly planted banana saplings; postpone field operations until rainfall ceases and soil conditions become suitable.
- In **Bihar**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, sesame, pigeon pea and other standing crop fields and avoid prolonged water stagnation.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in millet fields to prevent water stagnation and strengthen trellises and supports for cucumber and other gourds. Harvest mature upland/Jhum rice, soybean and vegetables and immediately shift the produce to safe, covered shelters.
- In **Assam & Meghalaya**, drain excess water from maize, black gram, green gram and sesame fields and keep drainage channels clear. Maintain suitable water levels in rice, support papaya, banana and weak-stemmed crops, and harvest pumpkins and bottle gourd before the rains wherever possible.
- In **Punjab**, maintain adequate drainage in standing crop fields and withhold irrigation and field operations during wet conditions. Harvest mature pearl millet wherever conditions permit.
- In **Haryana**, ensure proper drainage in paddy, cotton and vegetable fields and withhold irrigation during the wet spell. Harvest mature vegetables during rain-free periods and avoid entering muddy fields.
- In **East Rajasthan**, harvest the matured pearl millet crops, fully matured pods of mung bean, moth bean and cowpea and keep in safe place.
- In **Tamil Nadu**, drain out excess rain water from standing crop fields and avoid fertilizer and pesticide applications during rainfall, particularly where heavy rainfall was received yesterday. Provide support to banana plants and prop sugarcane against lodging.
- In **Keralam**, ensure effective drainage in banana, black pepper, coconut, ginger and turmeric fields following the recent rainfall and provide strong support to banana plants and trellis-grown crops. Postpone all field operations until rainfall ceases and soil conditions become suitable.
- In **South Interior Karnataka**, protect harvested produce by keeping it in safe, covered storage, and secure farm structures and equipment. Ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- In **Andaman & Nicobar**, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging. Provide mechanical support to banana & papaya plantations and staking to young plants and vegetables.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

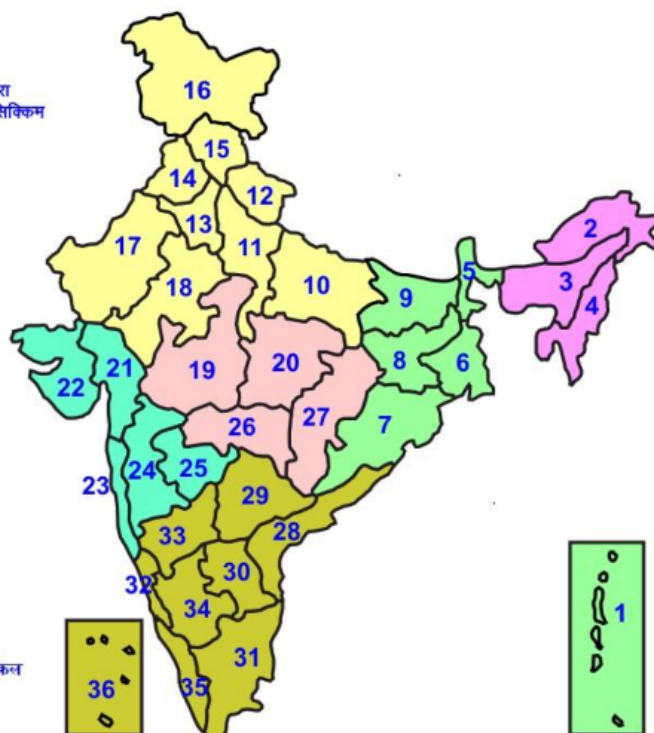
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall for Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)

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
