East India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Jharkhand and Odisha during 3rd-5th September; Bihar 3rd-5th September.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 31st August-5th September; Gangetic West Bengal on 31st August; Odisha during 31st August-1st September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 31st August-2nd September; Gangetic West Bengal on 1st September; Jharkhand during 31st August-3rd September; Bihar during 31st August-5th September.

Northeast India:

- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 31st August-3rd September.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 1st-5th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 31st August-5th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 1st-5th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 31st August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 31st August.

- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 4th September; Marathwada on 31st August and on 3rd September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 31st August-5th September; Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 4th-5th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 31st August-3rd September; Coastal Karnataka during 31st August-5th September.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 31st August-2nd September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 31st August-3rd September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep and Telangana on 31st August; Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 31st August-1st September.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Uttarakhand, Chhattisgarh and Coastal Karnataka; **at many places** over Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Rayalaseema, Kerala & Mahe, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; **Dry** over rest of the country.

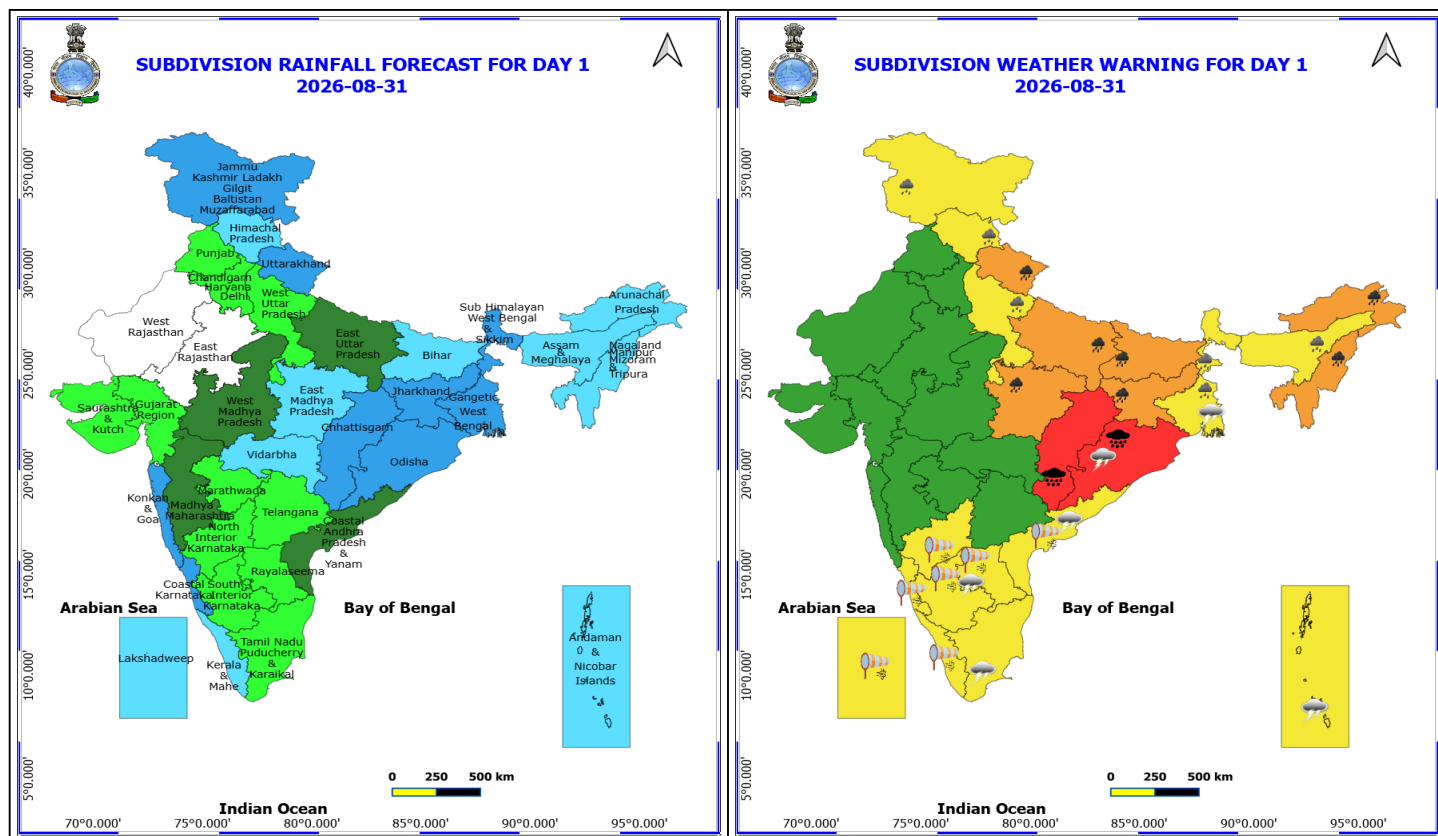

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 30-08-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Assam & Meghalaya; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Punjab and Himachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Himachal Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Lakshadweep; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region and Konkan & Goa; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Vidarbha; at most places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Rayalaseema and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.5°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 30-08-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Arunachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Himachal Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa; at most places over Punjab; at few places over Bihar, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Coastal Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Vidarbha and South Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand; at most places over North Interior Karnataka; at few places over Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Madhya Pradesh and Telangana; at isolated places over East Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.0°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN), and MADURAI (A) (TAMIL NADU).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Well-Marked Low Pressure Area** over Gangetic West Bengal and adjoining areas of north coastal Odisha & northwest Bay of Bengal persisted over the same region at 0530 IST of today 31st August, 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level. It is likely to move west-northwestwards across north Odisha-Gangetic West Bengal during next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Amritsar, Patiala, Bareilly, Sultanpur, Gaya, centre of **Well Marked Low Pressure Area** over Gangetic West Bengal and adjoining areas of north coastal Odisha & northwest Bay of Bengal and thence southeastwards to Eastcentral Bay of Bengal.
- The **trough** from the cyclonic circulation associated with **Well Marked Low Pressure Area** over Gangetic West Bengal and adjoining areas of north Odisha & northwest Bay of Bengal to East Uttar Pradesh across Jharkhand and Bihar and extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Saurashtra & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over north Pakistan & adjoining Jammu Division at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** likely at isolated places over Bihar.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Uttarakhand.

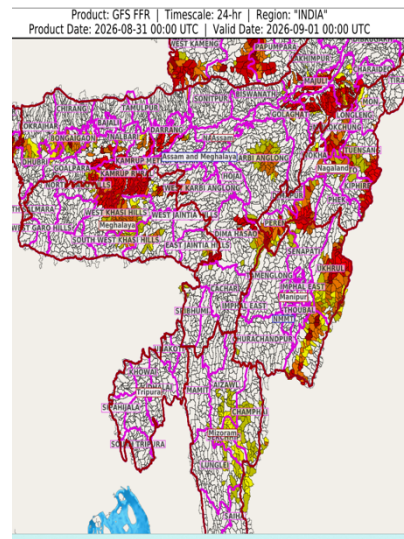

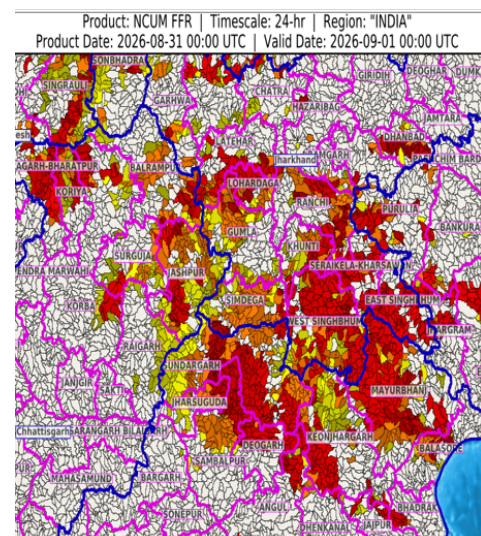

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-30

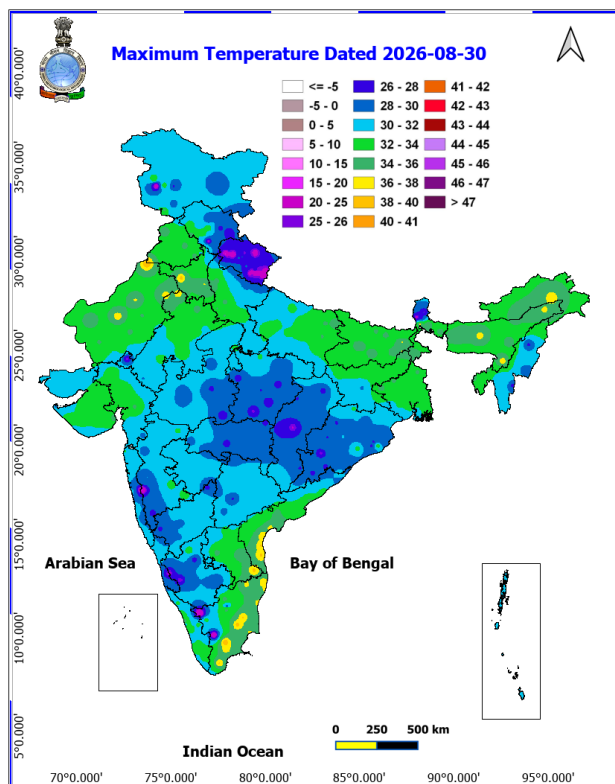


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-30

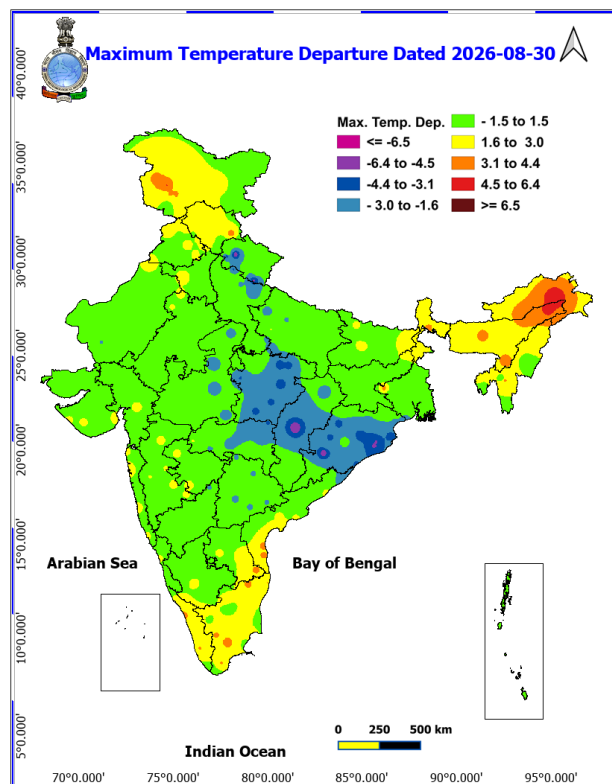


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-30

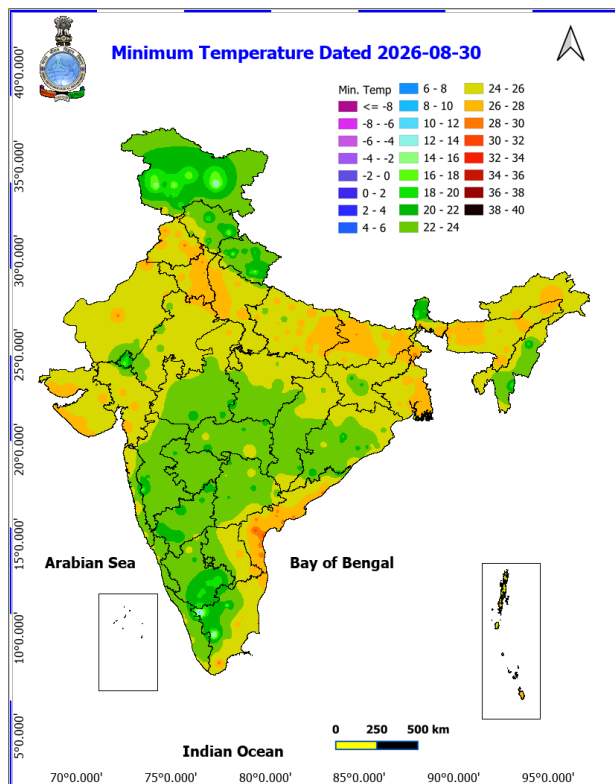
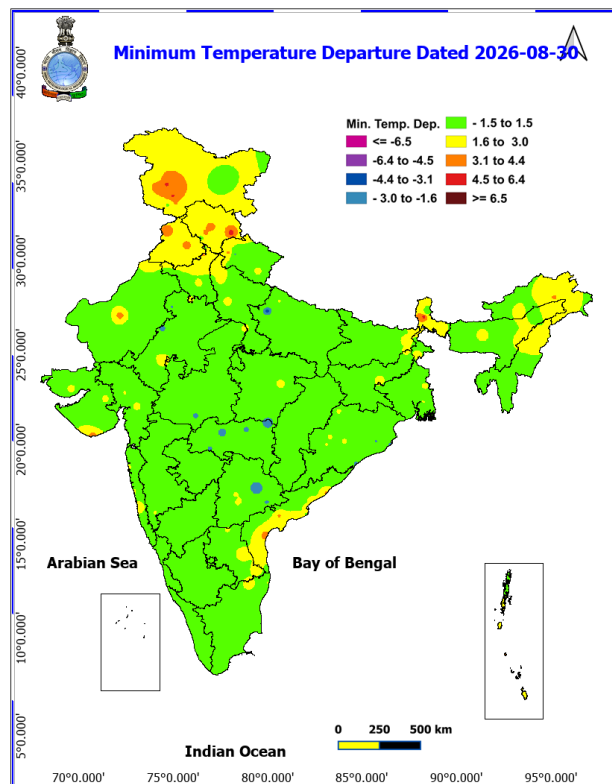
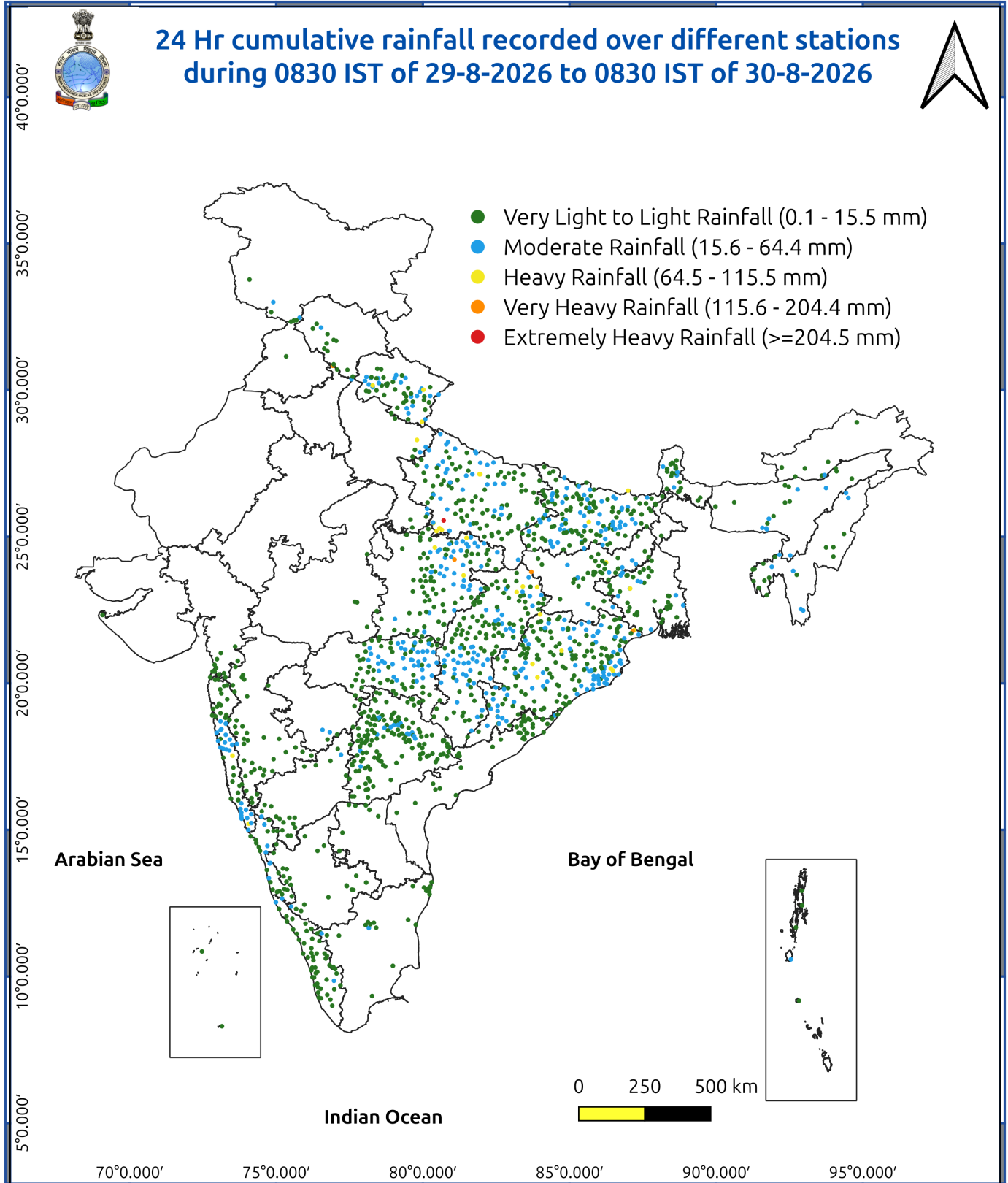


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-30





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely over** Odisha and Chhattisgarh on 31st August;
- **Isolated very heavy rainfall likely over** Uttarakhand during 31st August-1st September; East Uttar Pradesh on 31st August; over West Madhya Pradesh during 3rd-5th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 1st-3rd September; Chhattisgarh on 1st September; Jharkhand and Bihar on 31st August; Odisha on 1st September; over Arunachal Pradesh on 31st August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 31st August.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Odisha**, drain out excess water from rice, maize, pulses, cotton, pigeon pea, vegetables and nursery beds; keep drainage channels and outlets clear. Postpone sowing, fertilizer application and intercultural operations in waterlogged fields until the soil becomes workable.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in all crops and protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rainfall. Keep harvested produce in safe and dry places.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, drain out excess rain water and ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Clean drainage channels in low-lying maize, ginger, turmeric and vegetable fields and provide staking/support to cucurbits, tomato and capsicum.
- In **Bihar**, maintain proper drainage in standing crops and avoid field operations under excessively wet conditions. Maintain appropriate standing water in transplanted rice while avoiding prolonged stagnation.
- In **West Bengal**, keep drainage channels clear in rice, groundnut, vegetable fields and orchards. Protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rain, improve drainage around cucurbits and avoid nitrogen application during wet conditions.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain proper drainage in the field of sugarcane, soybean, kidney bean, green gram, black gram, other standing crop fields and vegetables. Keep drainage channels clear and provide support to tall crops and vegetables to prevent lodging.

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- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetables and orchards to remove excess water. Keep millet fields well drained during panicle initiation and flowering and monitor crops for pest and disease incidence.
- In **Assam** and **Meghalaya**, maintain proper drainage in crop fields and postpone fertilizer and plant-protection applications during rainfall. Continue sowing of pigeon pea, green gram and sesame only where field conditions are suitable and harvest jute at the small-pod stage.
- In **Nagaland**, maintain 3-5 cm water level in wet rice fields and harvest mature maize cobs during suitable weather.
- In **Manipur**, harvest colocasia and mature ginger during rain-free periods and ensure proper drainage in ginger fields.
- In **Mizoram**, prepare fields for sowing black gram, green gram, soybean, sesame and lentil after maize harvest. Ensure drainage in ginger fields and prevent water stagnation to minimise soft-rot and rhizome-rot incidence.
- In **Tripura**, maintain adequate soil moisture in *Aus* rice during panicle initiation and booting, while ensuring drainage in low-lying groundnut fields to prevent stagnation.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer and plant-protection applications during wet conditions. Provide staking/support to young plants, vegetables and horticultural crops.
- In **East Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging; postpone vegetable transplanting and provide support to young fruit plants. Undertake propping in sugarcane to minimise lodging.
- In **Madhya Maharashtra**, in *Ghat areas*, maintain effective drainage from rice, finger millet and vegetable fields.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

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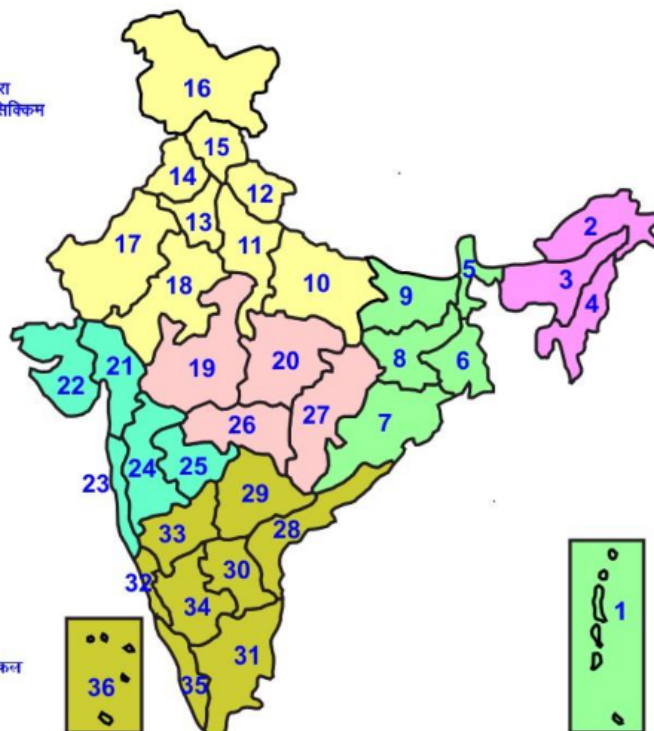
