Significant Weather Features

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 26th-27th August; East Madhya Pradesh on 27th August; Vidarbha on 22nd August and during 26th-27th August.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh during 22nd-25th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 22nd-25th August; East Madhya Pradesh during 23rd-26th August; Chhattisgarh during 22nd-27th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over East Madhya Pradesh on 22nd August.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 22nd-27th August; Jharkhand and Odisha during 22nd-27th August; Bihar during 22nd-24th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Bihar during 25th-27th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 22nd-26th August; Gangetic West Bengal during 24th-25th August; Jharkhand on 23rd August; Bihar during 22nd-25th August; Odisha during 22nd-23rd August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Odisha during 24th-27th August.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 26th-27th August; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 22nd-23rd August and during 25th-27th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 22nd-25th August; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 24th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 23rd-27th August; Assam & Meghalaya during 22nd-27th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 22nd-24th August.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 22nd-27th August; Madhya

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Maharashtra on 26th August.

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Madhya Maharashtra during 22nd-25th August and on 27th August; Gujarat Region, Marathawada and Saurashtra & Kutch during 22nd-27th August.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 22nd-27th August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 22nd-27th August.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 22nd-23rd August; North Interior Karnataka during 22nd-24th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 22nd-25th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 22nd-25th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 24th-25th August; Kerala & Mahe during 23rd-25th August; Coastal Karnataka and North Interior Karnataka during 23rd-24th August.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka, Rayalaseema and South Interior Karnataka during 22nd-25th August; North Interior Karnataka during 22nd-24th August.

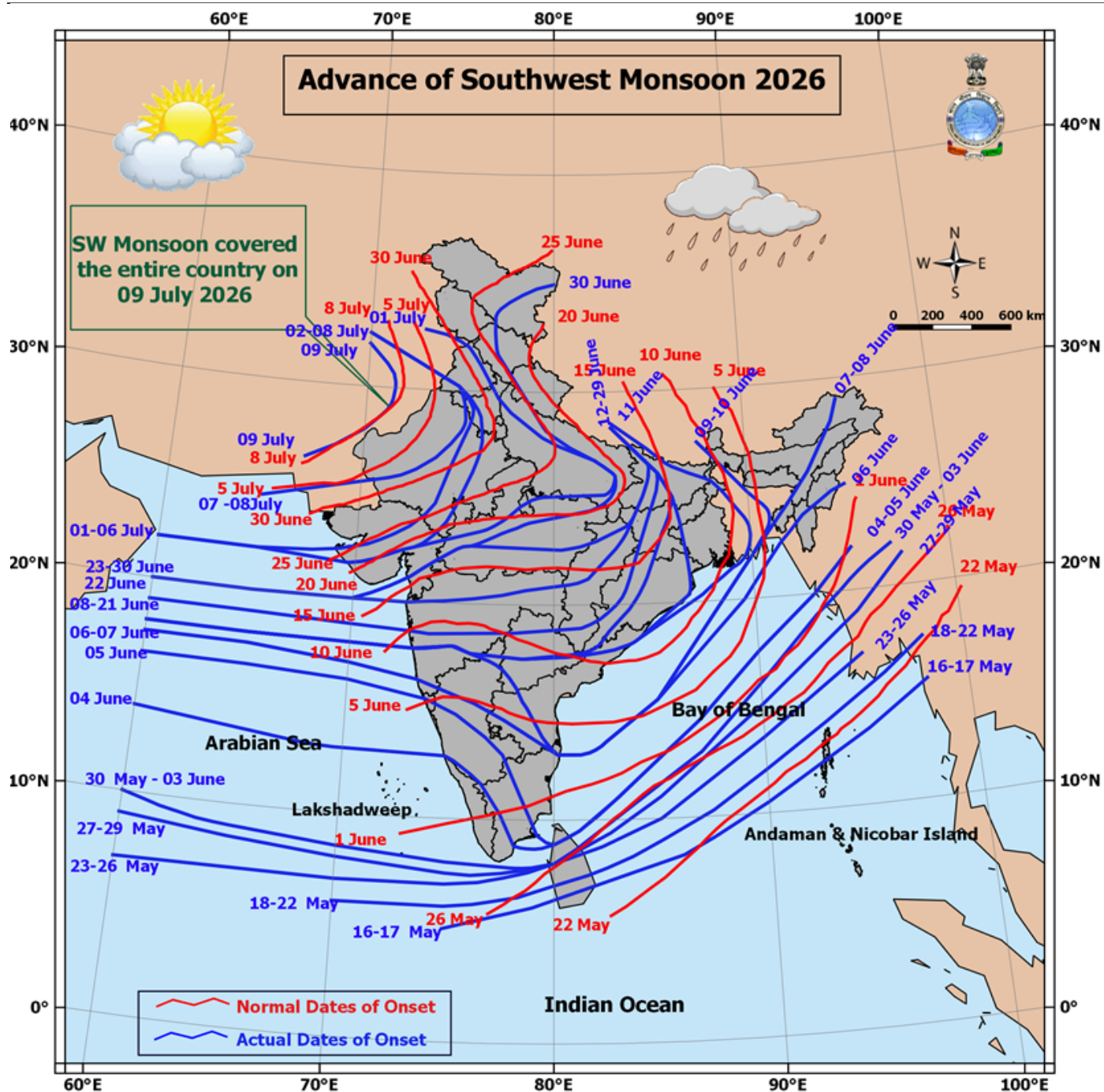

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 21-08-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Telangana; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Vidarbha, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Bihar and Coastal Karnataka; at most places over Marathwada; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and South Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Punjab and Gujarat Region; at most places over Saurashtra & Kutch; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and West Madhya Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.9°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low Pressure Area** over northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood persisted over the same region at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 22nd August, 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Amritsar, Dehradun, Lucknow, centre of Low Pressure Area over northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood, Ranchi, Digha and thence southeastwards to Northeast Bay of Bengal.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central Myanmar & neighbourhood extending upto 3.1km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Haryana & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining Jharkhand at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southwest Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Bay of Bengal & adjoining Bangladesh at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Westcentral & adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal and north Andhra Pradesh – South Odisha coasts at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.

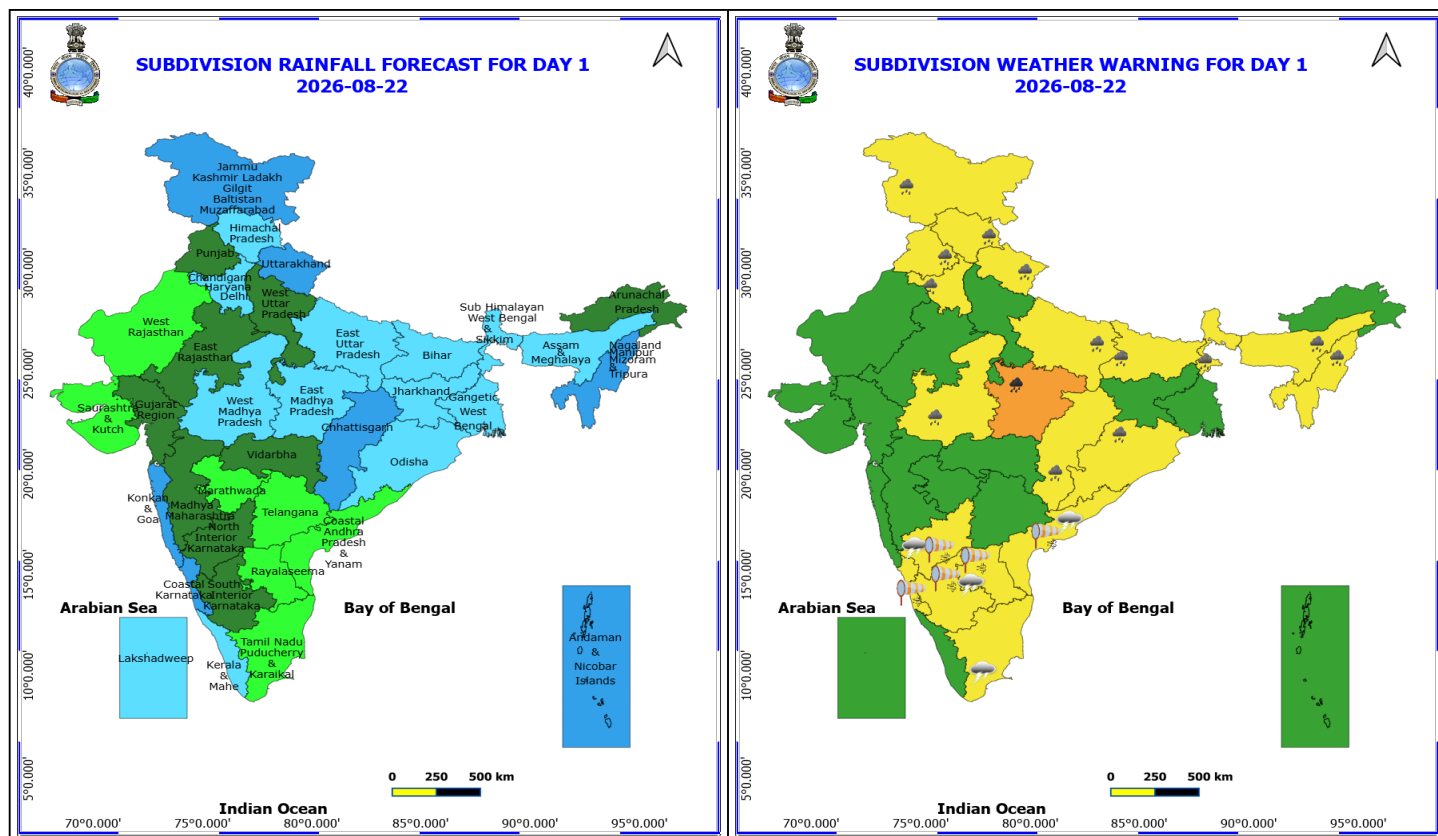

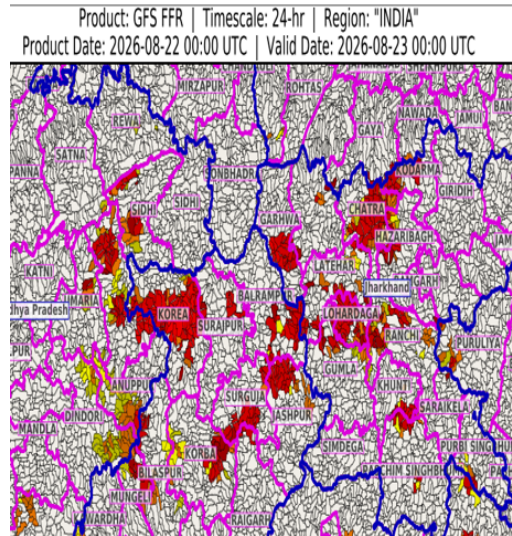

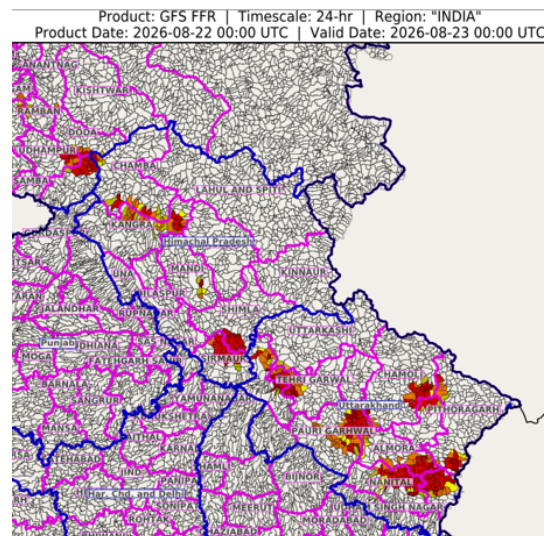

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-21

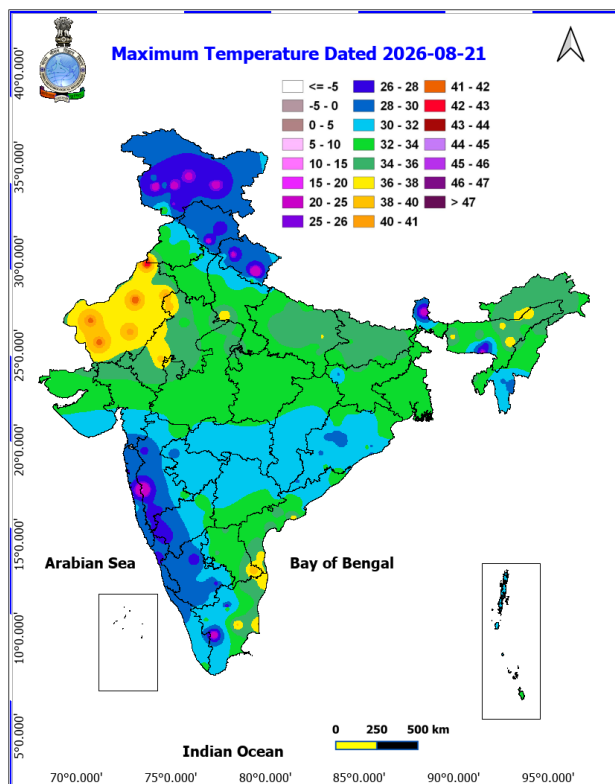


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-21

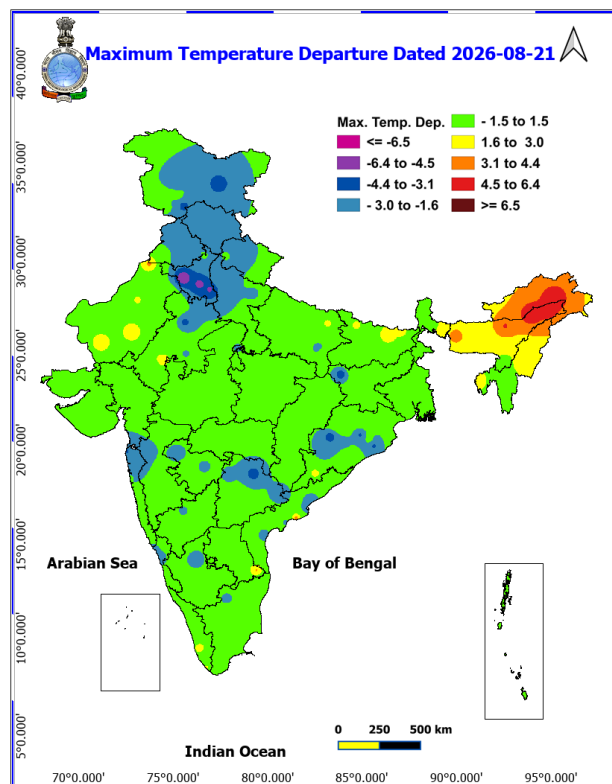


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-21

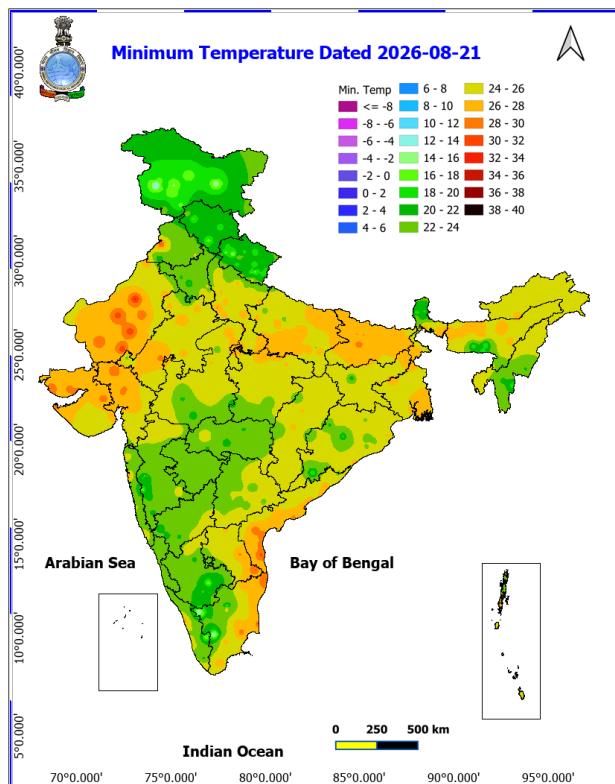
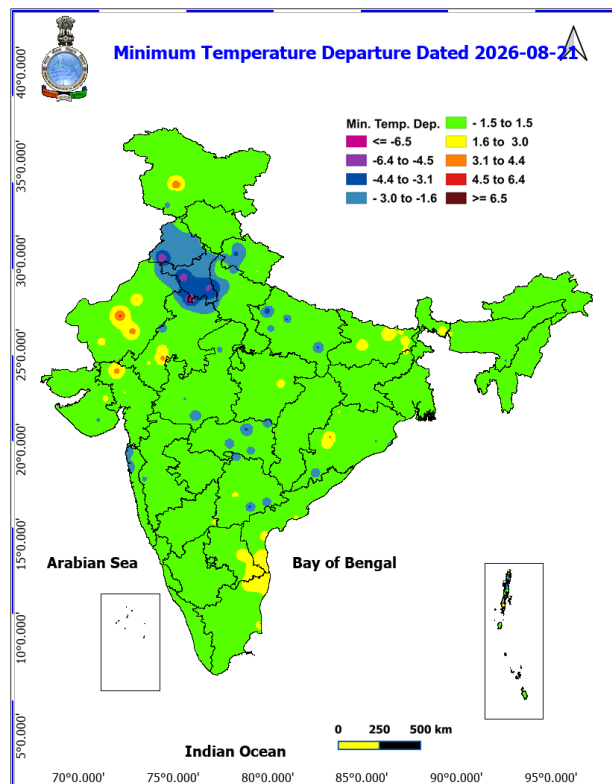


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-21

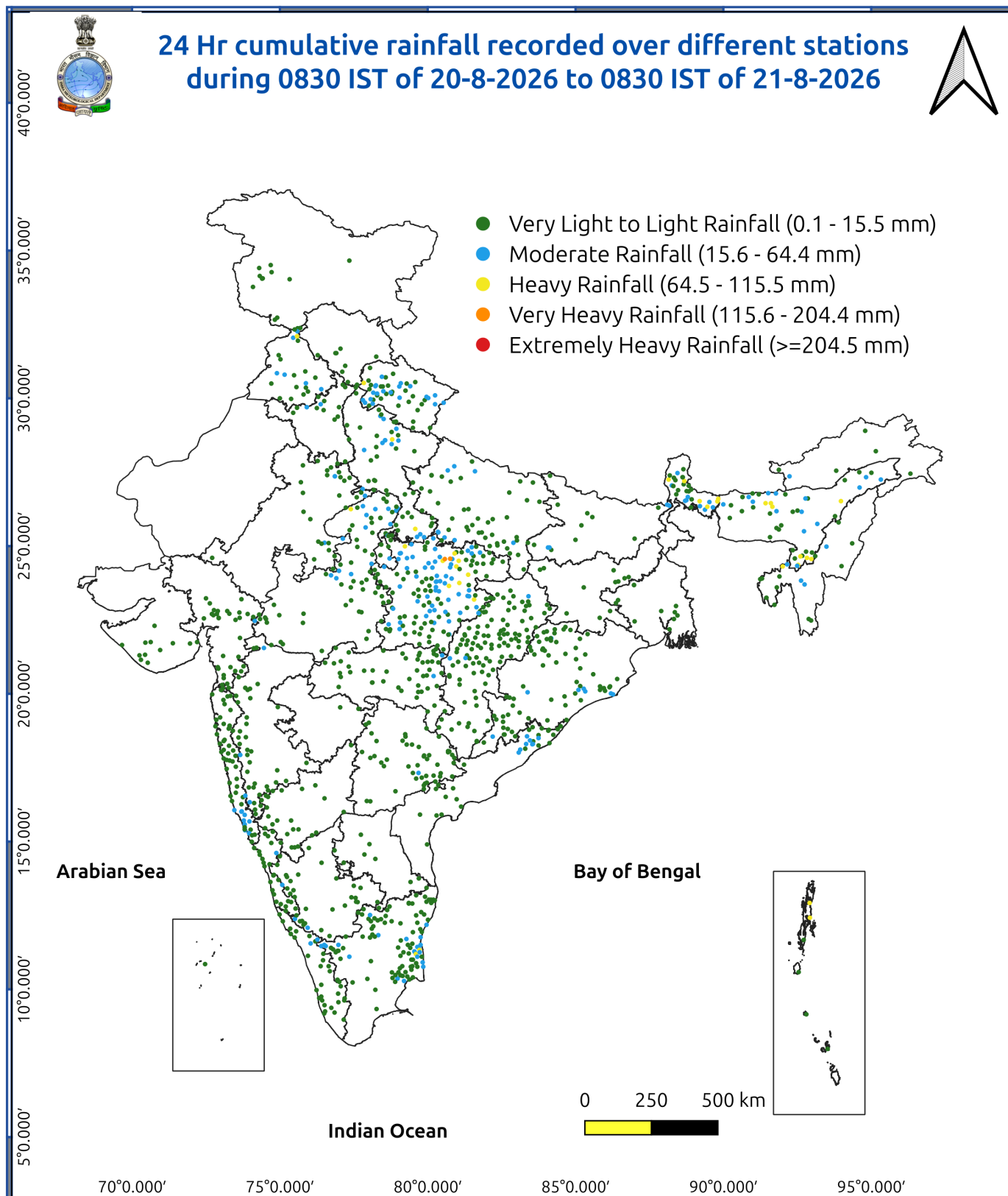


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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- Isolated very heavy rainfall likely over East Madhya Pradesh on 22nd; Odisha during 24th -27th August.

Impact expected:

Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.

Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.

Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.

Loose objects may fly.

Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.

Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.

There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.

Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.

Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.

Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.

In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.

Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.

Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall:

- In **East Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage of excess water from soybean, maize, paddy and vegetable fields and keep field channels clear. Postpone field operations, fertilizer application and plant protection measures in waterlogged fields and provide staking/support to vegetables and tall crops to minimize lodging.
- In **West Madhya Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in soybean, maize, cotton, sugarcane and vegetable fields and remove excess rainwater promptly. Provide staking/support to vegetables and tall crops to minimize lodging.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetable fields and orchards to prevent waterlogging.

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- In **Assam**, maintain proper drainage and keep field channels clear in rice, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame and vegetable fields and orchards. Remove excess water promptly from low-lying fields and prevent water stagnation in sugarcane.
- In **Meghalaya**, maintain continuous drainage in maize, cowpea, okra and ginger and keep drainage channels free from obstruction. Provide staking or trellising to cowpea and support other vulnerable horticultural crops to prevent lodging.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops and vegetable fields and prevent water stagnation.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal**, clear drainage channels in vegetable fields, orchards, rice and finger millet nurseries to prevent waterlogging. Protect chilli seedlings with plastic cover from heavy rain and maintain proper drainage in rice and vegetable fields.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, keep drainage channels in ginger and turmeric fields clear and functional and ensure prompt removal of excess rainwater from maize fields. Harvest mature vegetables such as cucumber, bottle gourd, bitter melon, snake melon, ridge melon, sponge melon and keep harvested produce in a safe place.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain proper and effective drainage in rice, soybean, maize, red gram, ginger, garlic, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and other standing crop fields. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato and keep the produce in a safe, dry place.
- In **Punjab and Haryana**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and promptly remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, maintain effective drainage in paddy, pigeon pea, pulses, oilseeds and vegetable fields, particularly in low-lying areas, and promptly remove excess rainwater.
- In **Odisha**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess water from *kharif* rice, maize, pulses, cotton, pigeon pea, banana, vegetable fields and nursery beds. Keep field drains, outlets and bunds clear and functional.
- In **Bihar**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess rainwater from rice, maize, pulses and other standing crop fields, particularly in low-lying areas.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain effective drainage from rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets and pulses fields.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.

Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

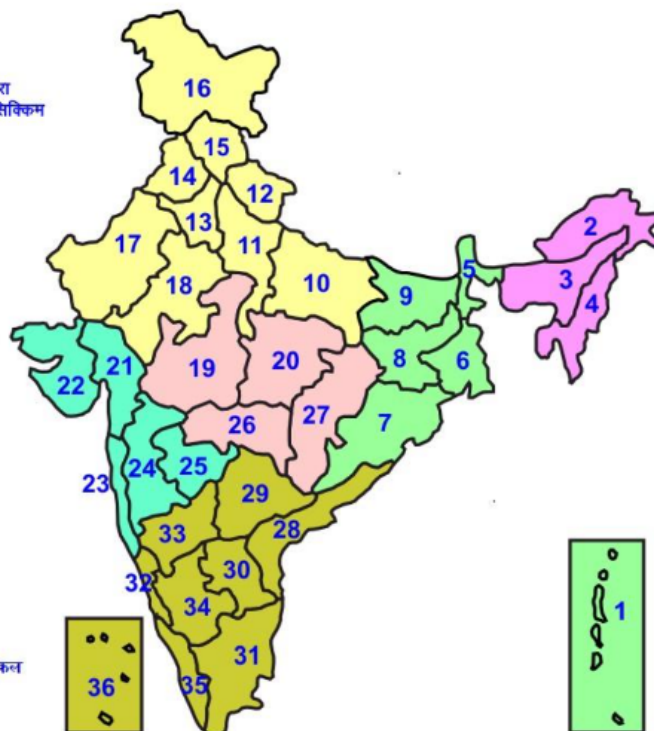
