- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Bihar during 21st-26th July; Jharkhand and Odisha during 21st-24th July.

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- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 21st-26th July; Gangetic West Bengal during 21st-24th July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Jharkhand and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 21st July; Bihar and during 21st-23rd July; Gangetic West Bengal on 22nd & 23rd July, Odisha during 21st-22nd July; isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Bihar on 21st July.

- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 21st-24th July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 21st July and during 25th-26th July; Assam & Meghalaya during 22nd-26th July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 22nd-24th July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Assam & Meghalaya on 21st July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 21st July.

West India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 21st July and during 24th-26th July; Marathwada and Saurashtra & Kutch during 21st-26th July; Gujarat Region during 21st-24th July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra during 23rd-25th July; Gujarat Region during 21st-22nd July and during 25th-26th July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra during 21st-22nd July.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 21st-26th July; Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 21st-23rd July; South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 21st-26th July.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 24th-26th July; Coastal Karnataka during 21st-26th July;

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, East Madhya Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, West Madhya Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Konkan & Goa, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Vidarbha, East Uttar Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Madhya Maharashtra, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka and North Interior Karnataka; **at many places** over Punjab, Arunachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe, Saurashtra & Kutch, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal and South Interior Karnataka; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Heavy to very heavy rain** at most places over Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal **Heavy rain** at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh and Chhattisgarh.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 20-07-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over West Rajasthan; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Himachal Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Lakshadweep; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and Rayalaseema. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan and East Rajasthan. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.8°C was reported at BOUDH (ODISHA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 20-07-2026): appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Vidarbha; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over Lakshadweep; at few places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Rayalaseema and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and North Interior Karnataka; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and Madhya Maharashtra; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 42.9°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN).

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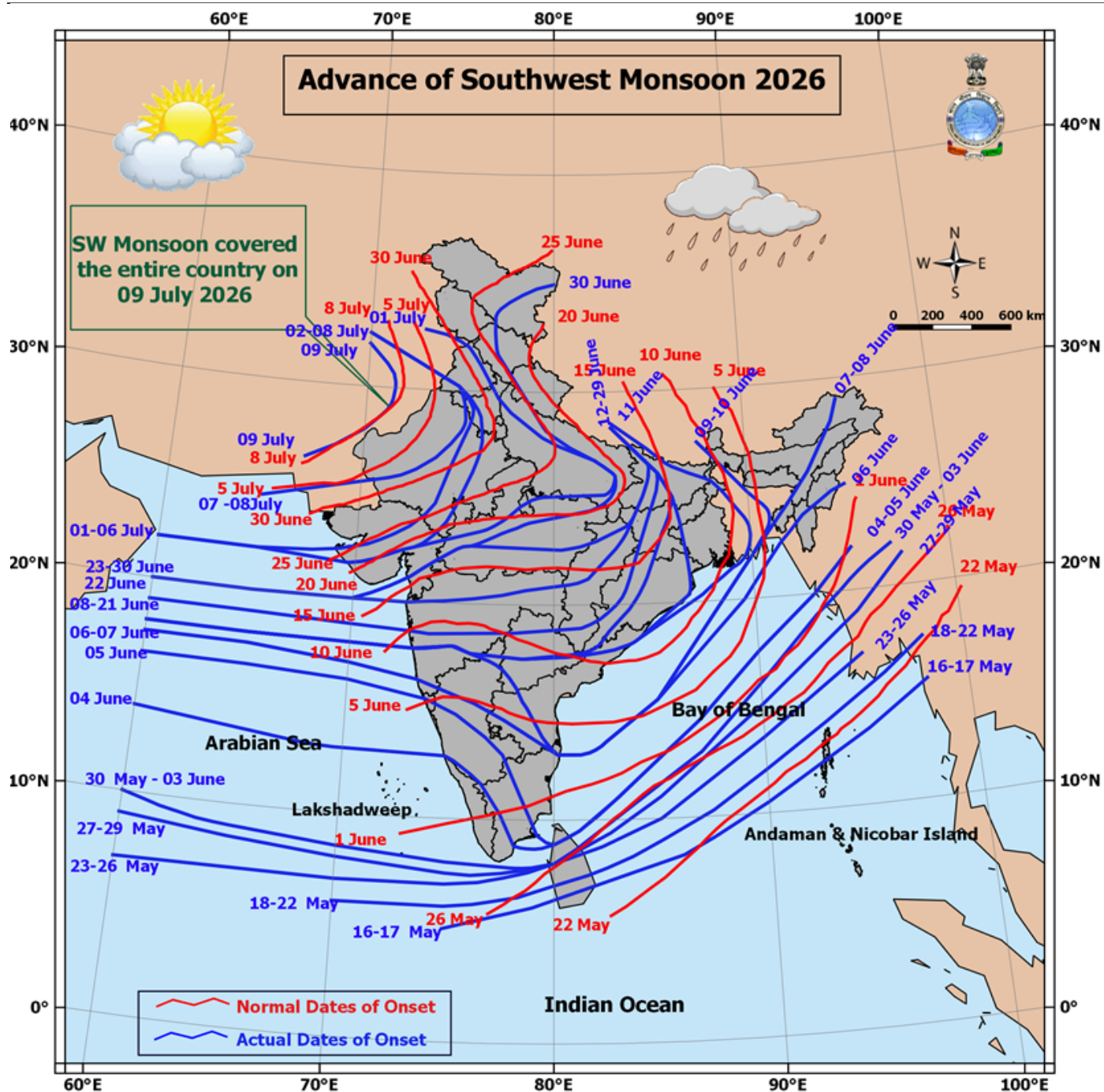
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level continue to pass through Sri Ganganagar, Rohtak, Hardoi, Sultanpur, Ranchi, Baleshwar and thence southeastwards towards Northwest Bay of Bengal and extends upto 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Punjab & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central parts of south Uttar Pradesh at 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over North Jharkhand and adjoining Bihar extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from the above **upper air cyclonic circulation** over North Jharkhand and adjoining Bihar to Tripura now runs from West Uttar Pradesh to North Gangetic West Bengal across East Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Odisha and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Westcentral Bay of Bengal & adjoining north Coastal Andhra Pradesh between 5.8 & 7.6 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from the above **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Westcentral Bay of Bengal & adjoining north Coastal Andhra Pradesh to Northeast Arabian sea across south Odisha, south Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Marathwada, Madhya Maharashtra and south Gujarat Region at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Central Assam & adjoining Nagaland between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.

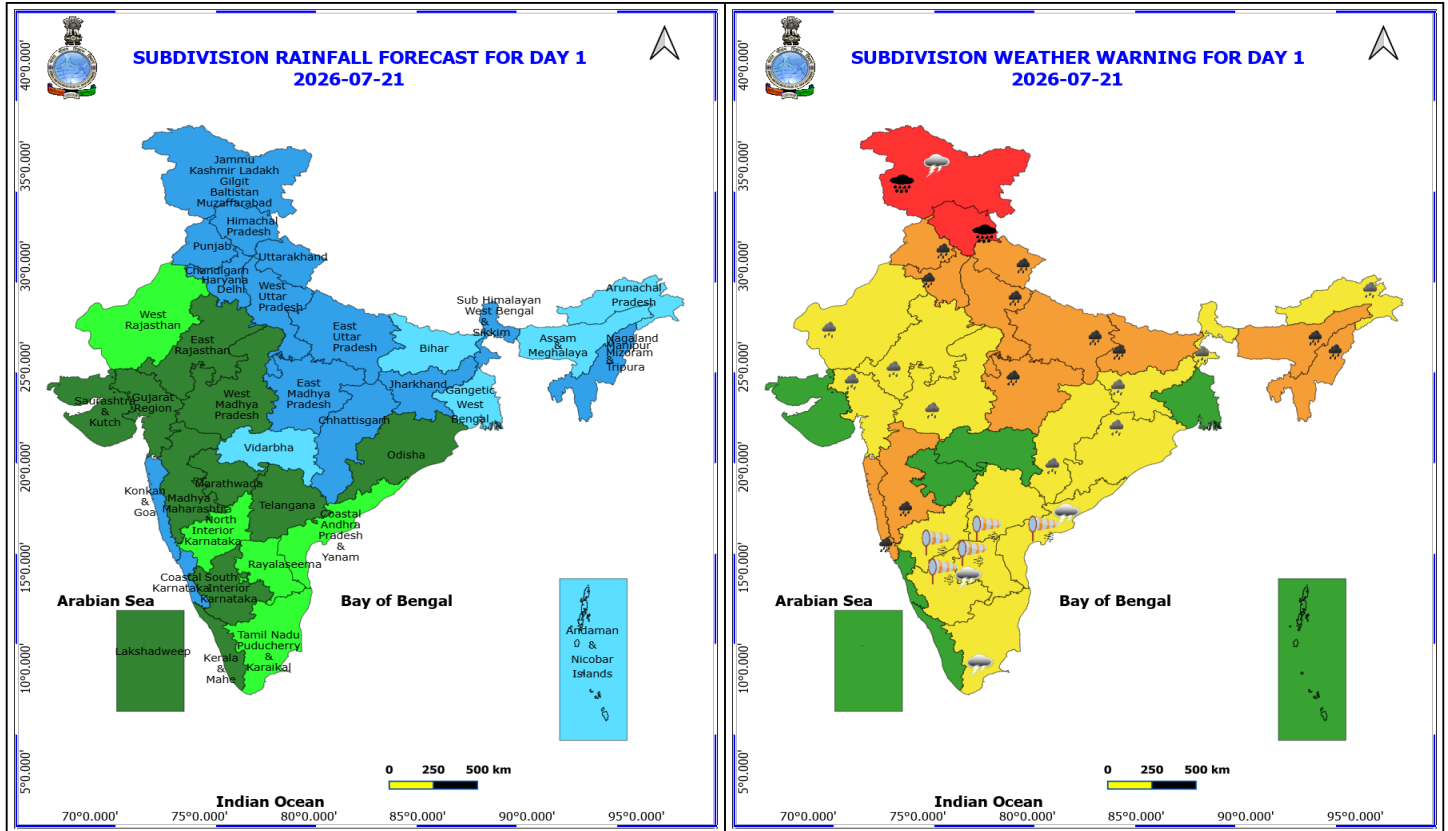


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21 July (Day 1)

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with isolated Extremely Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh and Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.
- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat Region, Jharkhand, Odisha, Rajasthan, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, Interior Karnataka, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Rajasthan and Telangana.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Vidarbha and West Bengal & Sikkim.

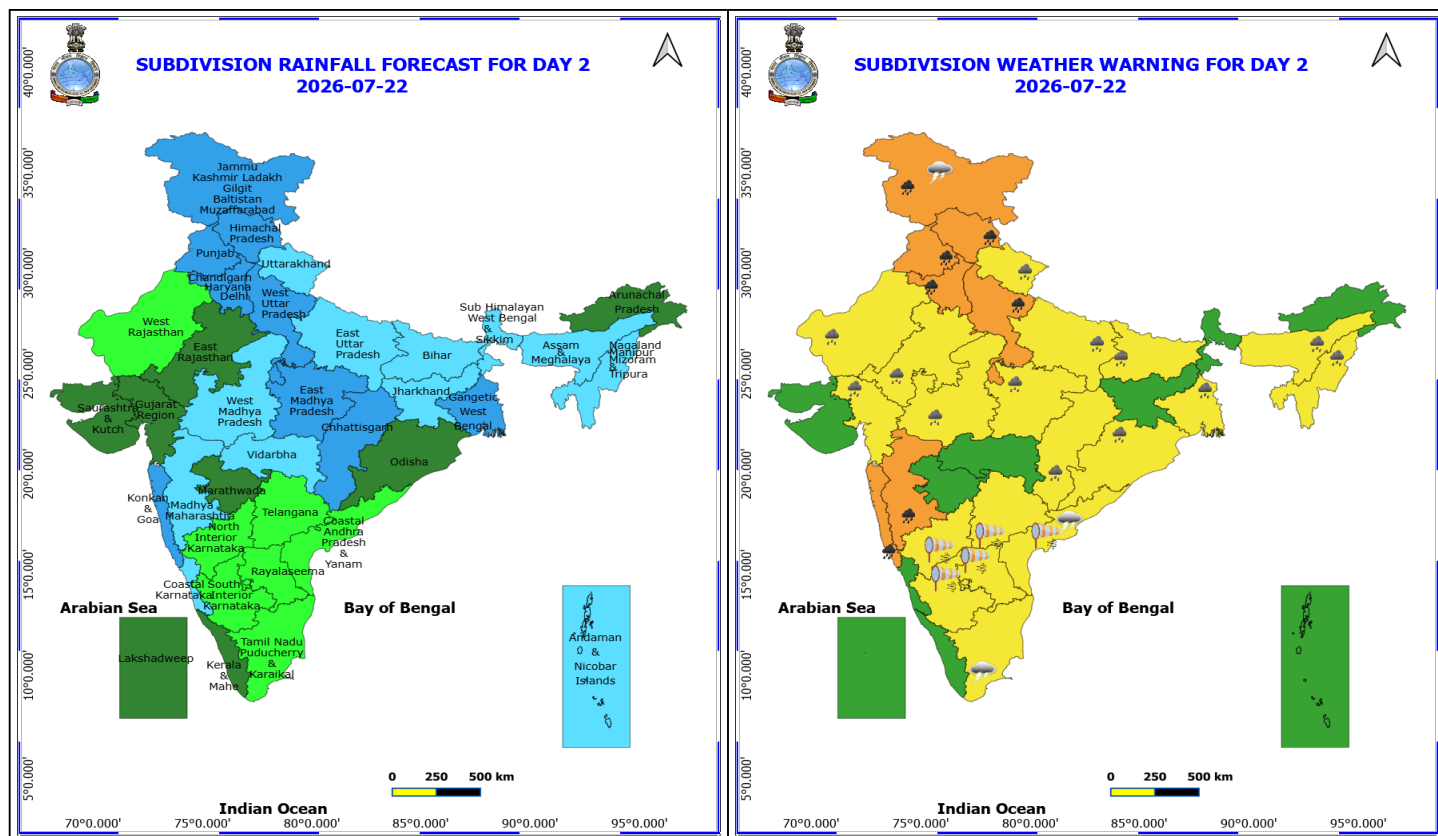

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, East Uttar Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Gujarat Region, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, Interior Karnataka, Jharkhand, Odisha, Rajasthan, Rayalaseema, Telangana and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttarakhand, Vidarbha, West Bengal & Sikkim and West Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Interior Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over most parts of west central adjoining some parts of east central, north and some parts of southwest Arabian Sea and along and off Somalia, Oman, Gujarat Coasts.

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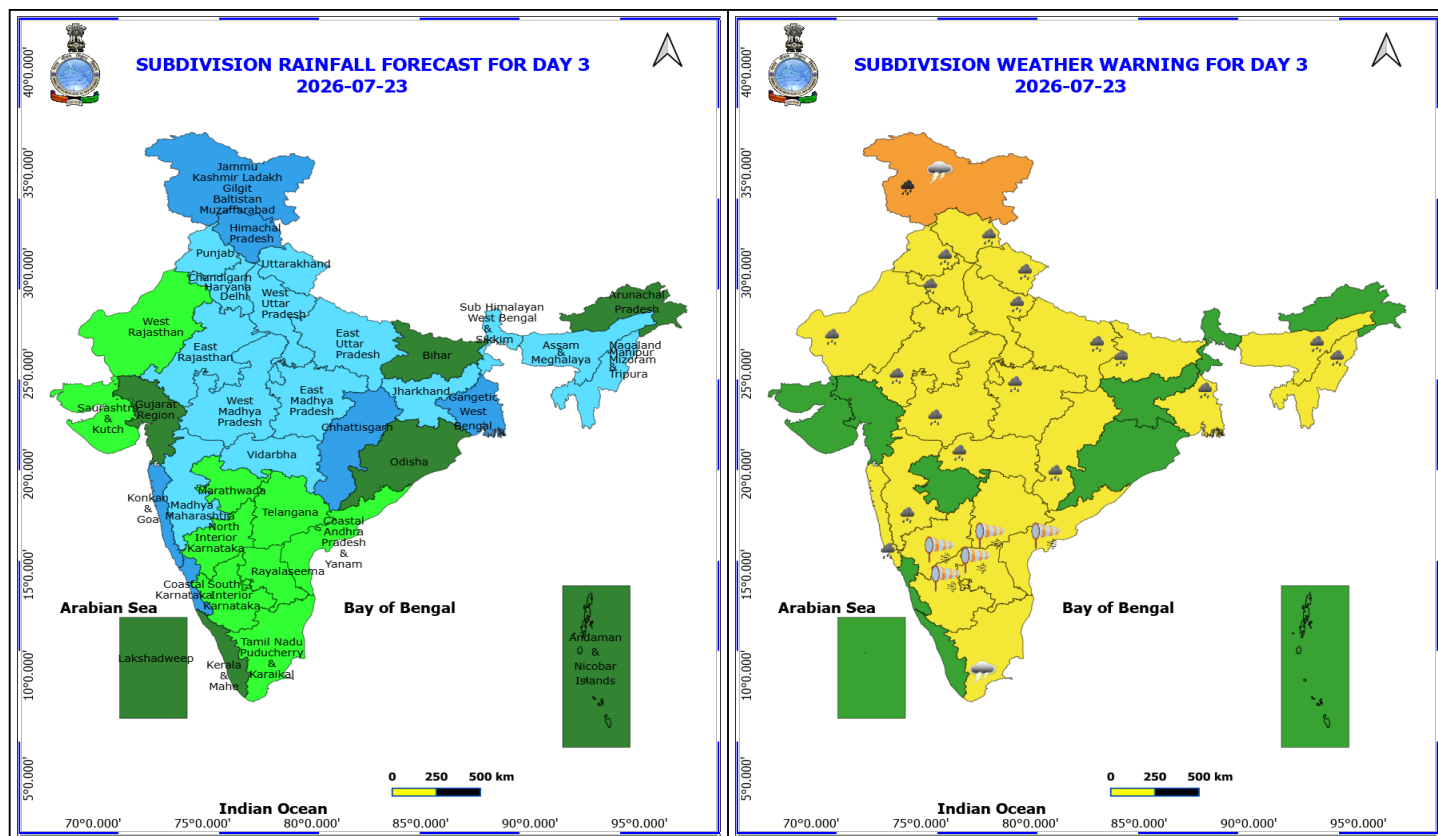

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Interior Karnataka, Jharkhand, Odisha, Rajasthan, Telangana and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttarakhand and West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Interior Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over most parts of west central adjoining some parts of east central, north and south west Arabian Sea and, along and off Somalia, Oman.
- ❖ **Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off Gujarat, north Maharashtra coasts.

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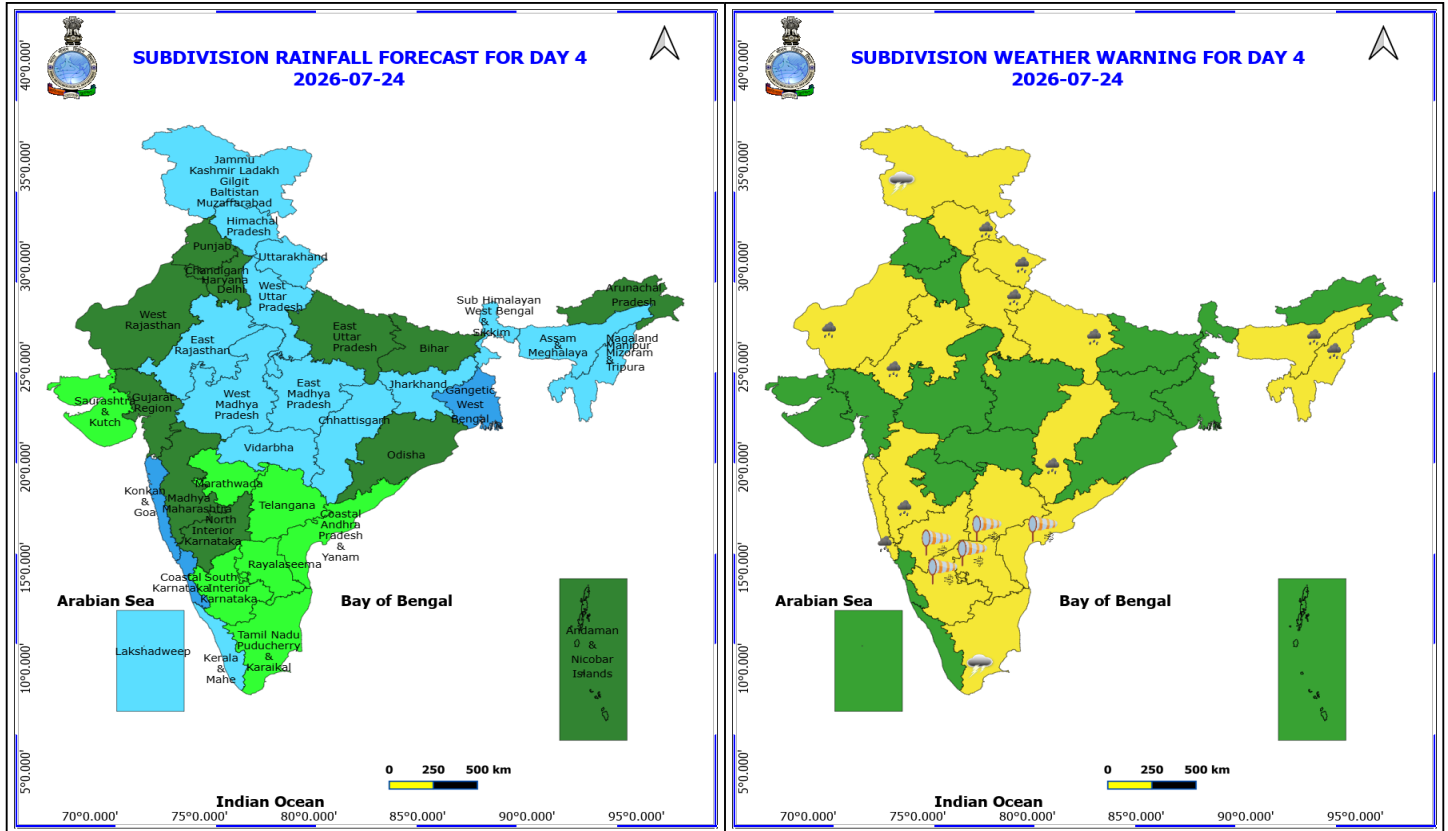

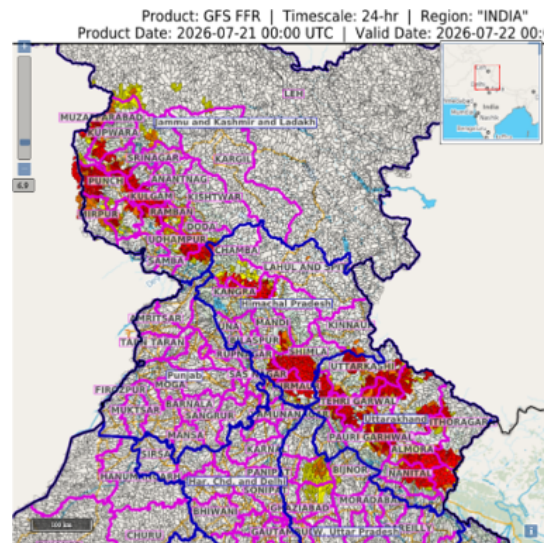

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-20

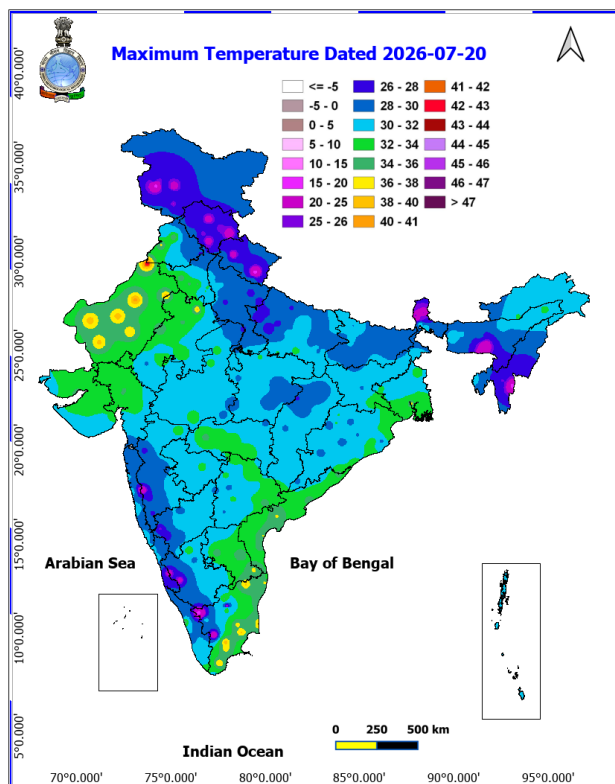


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-20

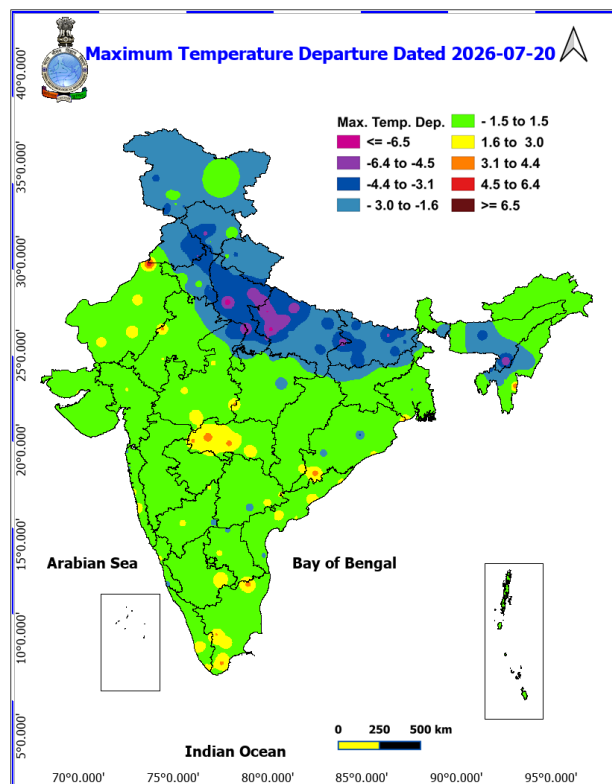


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-20

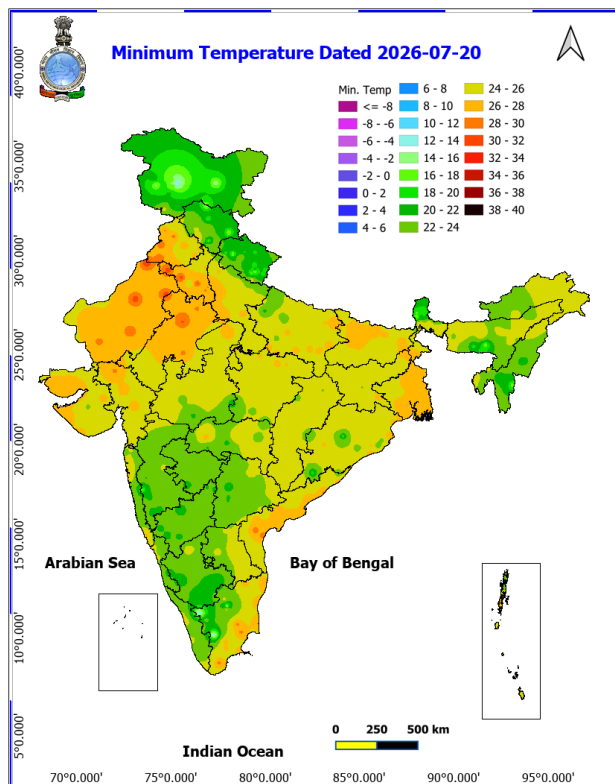
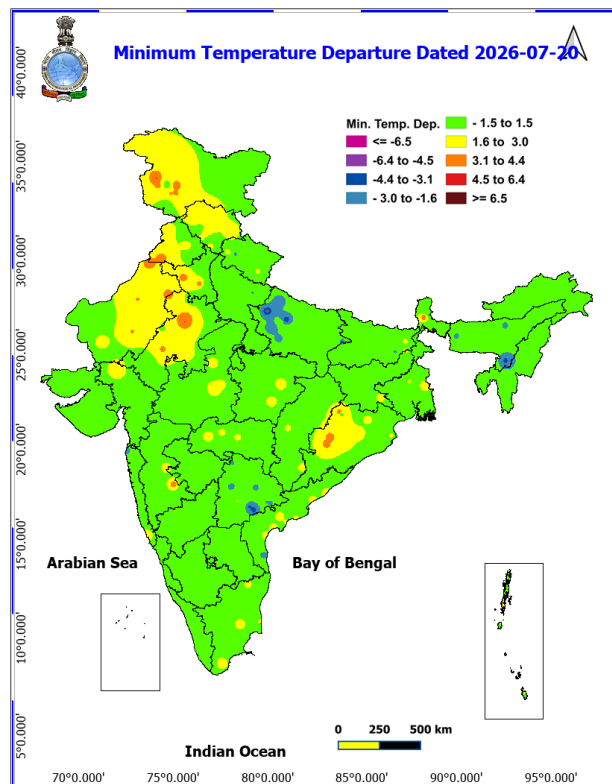
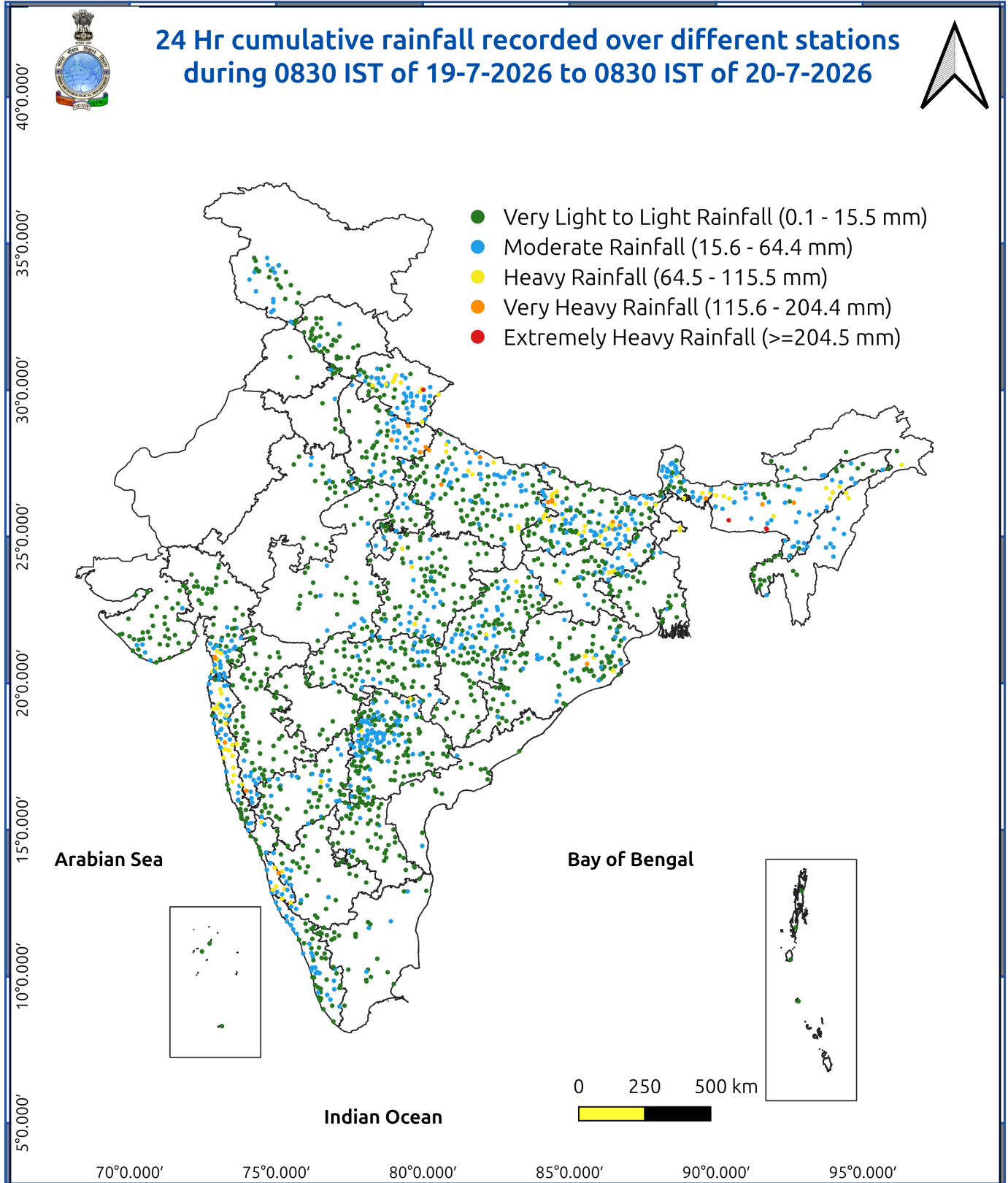


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-20





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall

- **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with isolated Extremely Heavy Rainfall very likely at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh and Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad. on 21st July.**

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslides/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Assam**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage of excess rainwater from sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame fields and fruit orchards to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Meghalaya**, keep drainage channels around rice nurseries and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger free from obstruction. Strengthen nursery bunds and maintain continuous drainage to prevent runoff, seedling washout and prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Jammu & Kashmir** withhold irrigation in standing crops, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in maize, finger millet, cucurbit, tomato and capsicum fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure continuous and effective drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.
- In **Uttarakhand**, postpone sowing of groundnut, soybean and maize. Ensure proper drainage in rice, tomato and chilli fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato only during rain-free periods.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.
- **Punjab, Haryana Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra** withhold irrigation in standing crops, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.
- In **Sikkim**, ensure proper drainage in rice nurseries and standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure continuous drainage of excess rainwater from rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation,

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fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

- In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Odisha**, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear to prevent prolonged waterlogging in rice, maize, pulses, oilseed and vegetable fields. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions become suitable.
- In **Keralam**, provide adequate drainage facilities in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetables.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries and standing fields of maize, soybean, pigeon pea and minor millets to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In the regions expecting heavy rainfall, including **Karnataka, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Rayalaseema** withhold irrigation in standing crops, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

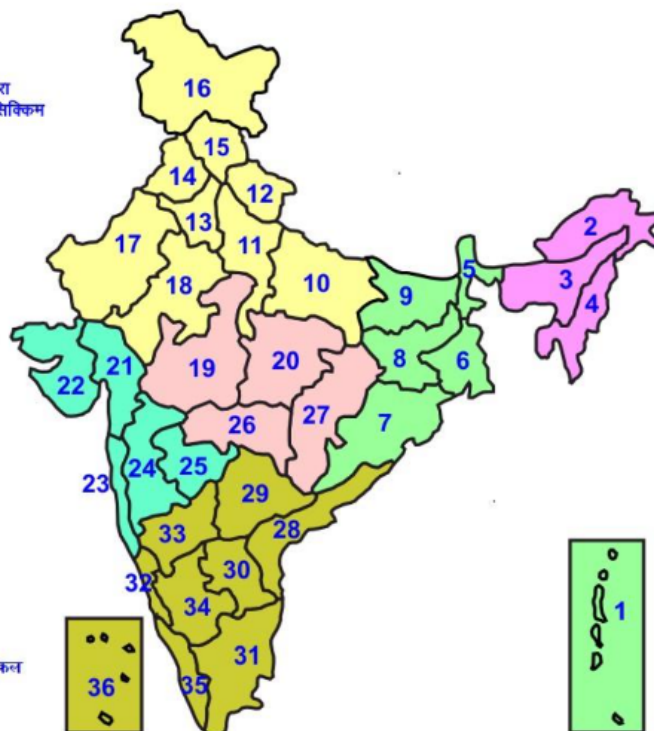
