Significant Weather Features

Weather Systems and Warnings:

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad on 28th September; Uttarakhand during 26th-28th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over East Uttar Pradesh during 25th-27th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over rest parts of northwest India.

- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 25th September and on 27th September; East Madhya Pradesh on 24th September and on 27th September; Vidarbha on 23rd September and on 26th September; Chhattisgarh during 23rd-24th September and on 27th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 26th September; Chhattisgarh and East Madhya Pradesh during 25th-26th September; Vidarbha during 24th-25th September.
- **Isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely over Chhattisgarh on 23rd & 24th September.**

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 28th September; Gangetic West Bengal and Odisha during 27th-28th September; Jharkhand on 28th September; Bihar on 23rd September and on 28th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 23rd-24th September; Gangetic West Bengal on 23rd September and on 25th September; Jharkhand on 23rd September and during 25th-26th September; Bihar on 23rd September and during 26th-27th September; Odisha during 23rd-24th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Odisha and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 25th September; Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand on 24th September; Bihar during 24th-25th September.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Odisha during 23rd-24th September.
- **Isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely over Odisha during 23rd-24th September.**

Northeast India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 23rd-28th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 24th-28th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Assam & Meghalaya on 23rd September.

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- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 23rd-28th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya on 23rd September.

West India:

- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Konkan & Goa during 23rd-24th September; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 23rd-25th September.

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 23rd-25th September; Coastal Karnataka during 23rd-25th September; North Interior Karnataka during 23rd-24th September; Telangana during 23rd-26th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Telangana during 25th-26th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 23rd September; Kerala & Mahe during 23rd-25th September; Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 23rd-24th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 25th-26th September; Rayalaseema during 24th-26th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Rayalaseema on 23rd September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 23rd-25th September; Coastal Karnataka on 24th September; North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 22nd-24th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 23rd September and on 25th September; Telangana during 23rd-24th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 24th September; Telangana during 25th-26th September.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana during 23rd-24th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 23rd-24th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 23rd-25th September; Rayalaseema during 22nd-26th September; Telangana during 23rd-24th September.
- **Isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 23rd and Telangana on 23rd & 24th September.**

Wind warning:

- Squally weather with wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is prevailing over Westcentral and adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal.
- It is very likely to increase reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph over Westcentral & adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal from 22nd September evening.
- Increasing further is likely to become 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph over Westcentral and adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal from 23rd September to 24th September evening.
- Squally wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely over adjoining areas of North and South Bay of Bengal from morning of today and becoming 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph on 23rd September.

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- Squally weather with wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph commenced along and off south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts in the early morning of today, the 22nd September. It is likely to increase gradually becoming squally wind with speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph from evening of today, the 22nd September and 55-65 kmph gusting to 65 kmph from early morning of 23rd till evening of 24th September. It is likely to decrease gradually thereafter.
- Squally wind with speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely along & off West Bengal and south Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts from 23rd to 24th September.

- Rough to very rough sea condition likely over westcentral Bay of Bengal from 23rd to 24th September.
- Rough to very rough sea condition is likely over Northwest Bay of Bengal from 23rd to 24th September.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Odisha, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Konkan & Goa, Rayalaseema and North Interior Karnataka; **at many places** over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Assam & Meghalaya, Jharkhand, Bihar, Arunachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, East Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana, East Madhya Pradesh, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 22-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Jharkhand, West Rajasthan and Madhya Maharashtra; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha and Telangana; at isolated places over Jharkhand and Uttarakhand. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.0°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 22-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Vidarbha; at most places over Assam & Meghalaya; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, West Rajasthan, Marathwada and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Coastal Karnataka; at few places over Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, West Madhya Pradesh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and East Madhya Pradesh; at few places over Rayalaseema. **The highest maximum temperature** of 41.5°C was reported at JAISALMER (RAJASTHAN).

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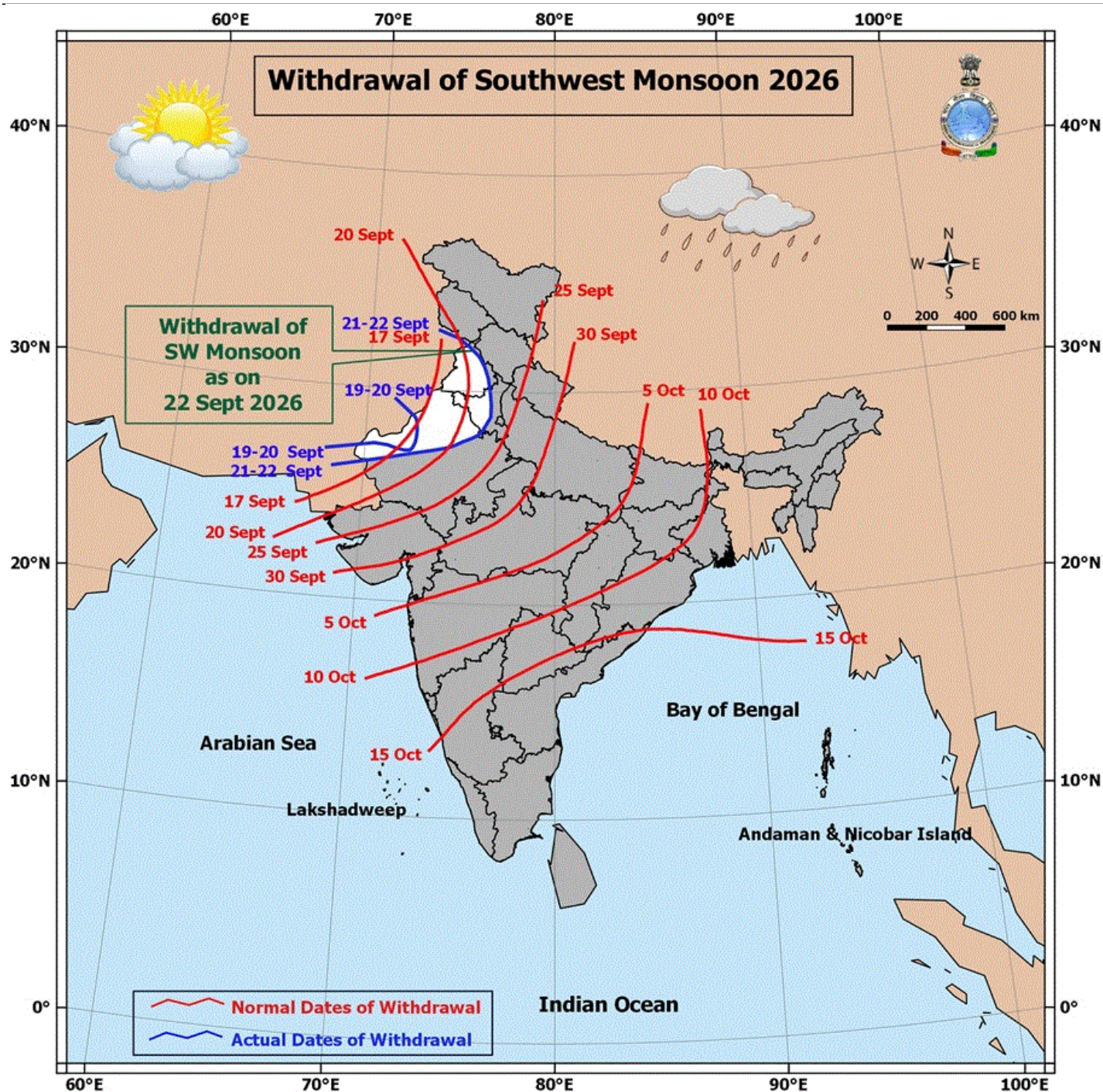
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **line of withdrawal of Southwest Monsoon** continue to pass through 26.2°N/68.4°E, Jaisalmer, Nagaur, Sikar, Rohtak, Patiala, Gurdaspur and 32.8°N/73.7°E.
- **Conditions are favourable** for further withdrawal from remaining parts of Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, some more parts of Rajasthan and some parts of Saurashtra & Kutch, Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and West Uttar Pradesh during next 2 days.
- The **Deep Depression** over Westcentral & adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal, moved westwards with a speed of 12 kmph during past 06 hours, and lay centred at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 23rd September, 2026, over the same region near latitude 18.0°N and longitude 84.7°E, about 70 km east-southeast of Kalingapatnam (Andhra Pradesh), 150 km south of Gopalpur (Odisha), 230 km south-southwest of Puri (Odisha), and 150 km east-northeast of Visakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh). It is very likely to move west-northwestwards, and cross North Andhra Pradesh - South Odisha coasts between Vishakhapatnam & Gopalpur, close to Kalingapatnam as a Deep Depression by night of 23rd September 2026.
- The **trough** now runs from centre of the **Deep Depression** over Westcentral & adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal to southeast Arabian sea across Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Rayalaseema and Karnataka between 3.1 & 7.6 km above mean sea level.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle level tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 81°E to the north of Lat. 29°N.

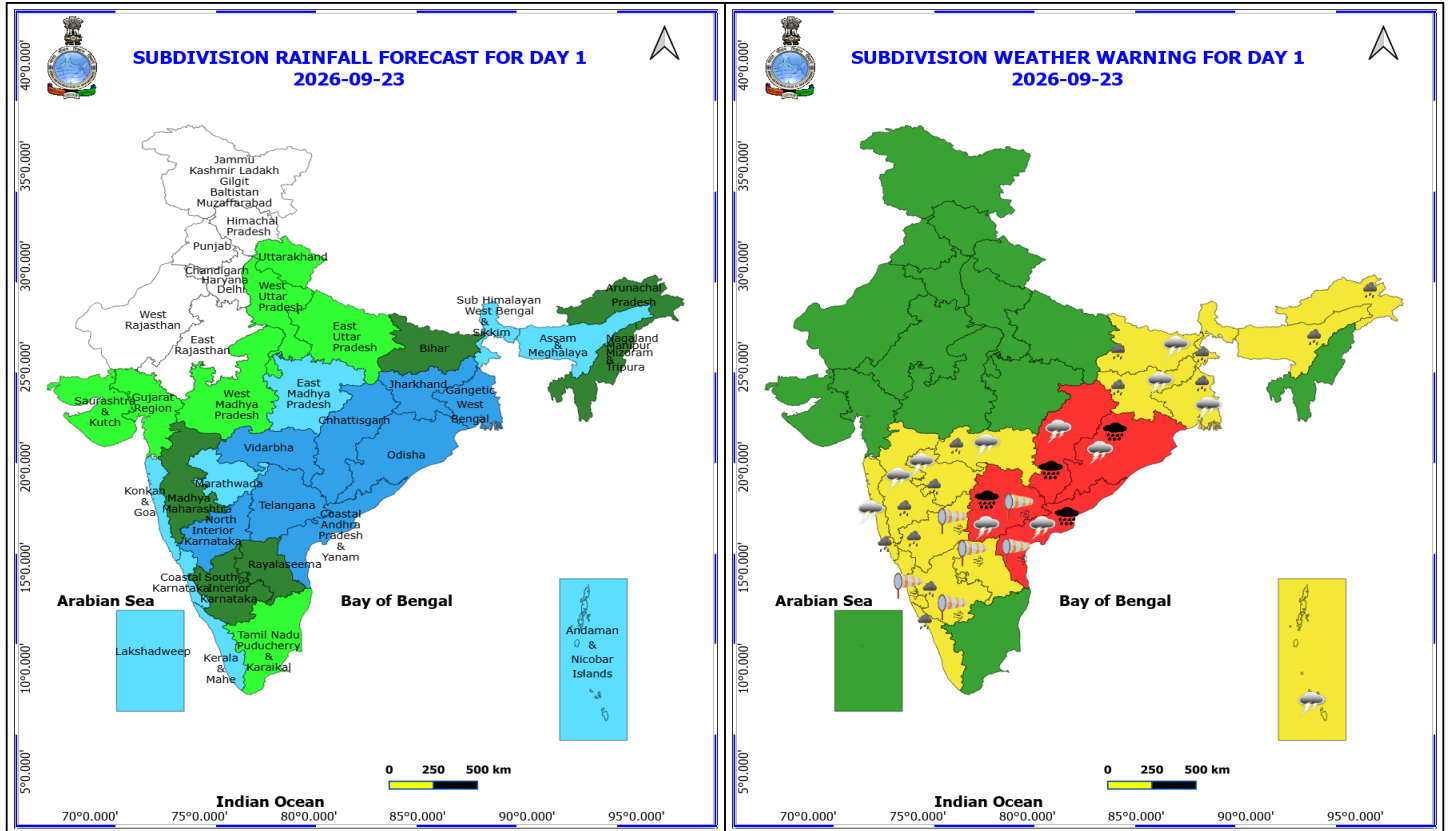

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with isolated Extremely Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Odisha and Telangana.
 - ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Interior Karnataka, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe, Konkan & Goa, Maharashtra and West Bengal & Sikkim.
 - ❖ **Thundersquall with wind speed reaching(50-60kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Odisha and Telangana.

 - ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana.

- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia coasts adjoining southwest Arabian Sea and Gulf of Mannar. Squally wind with speed 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph likely over Karnataka, Kerala and Lakshadweep coast.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally weather with wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is prevailing over

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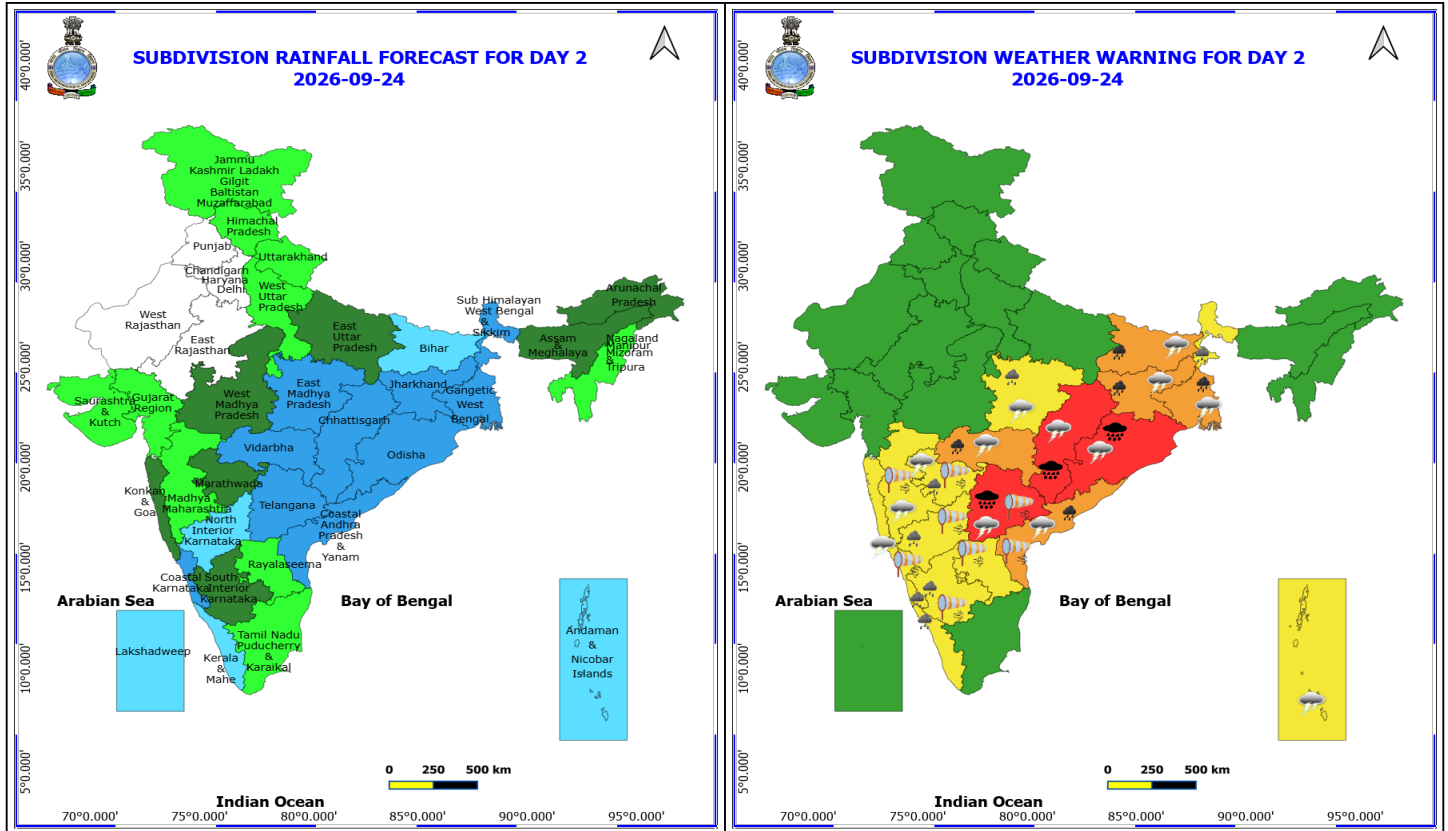
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Westcentral and adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal. It is very likely to increase reaching 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph over Westcentral & adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal.

❖ Squally wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely over adjoining areas of North and South Bay of Bengal, along & off West Bengal and south Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts.

❖ Squally weather with wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph commenced along and off south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts. It is likely to increase gradually becoming squally wind with speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph.

- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia

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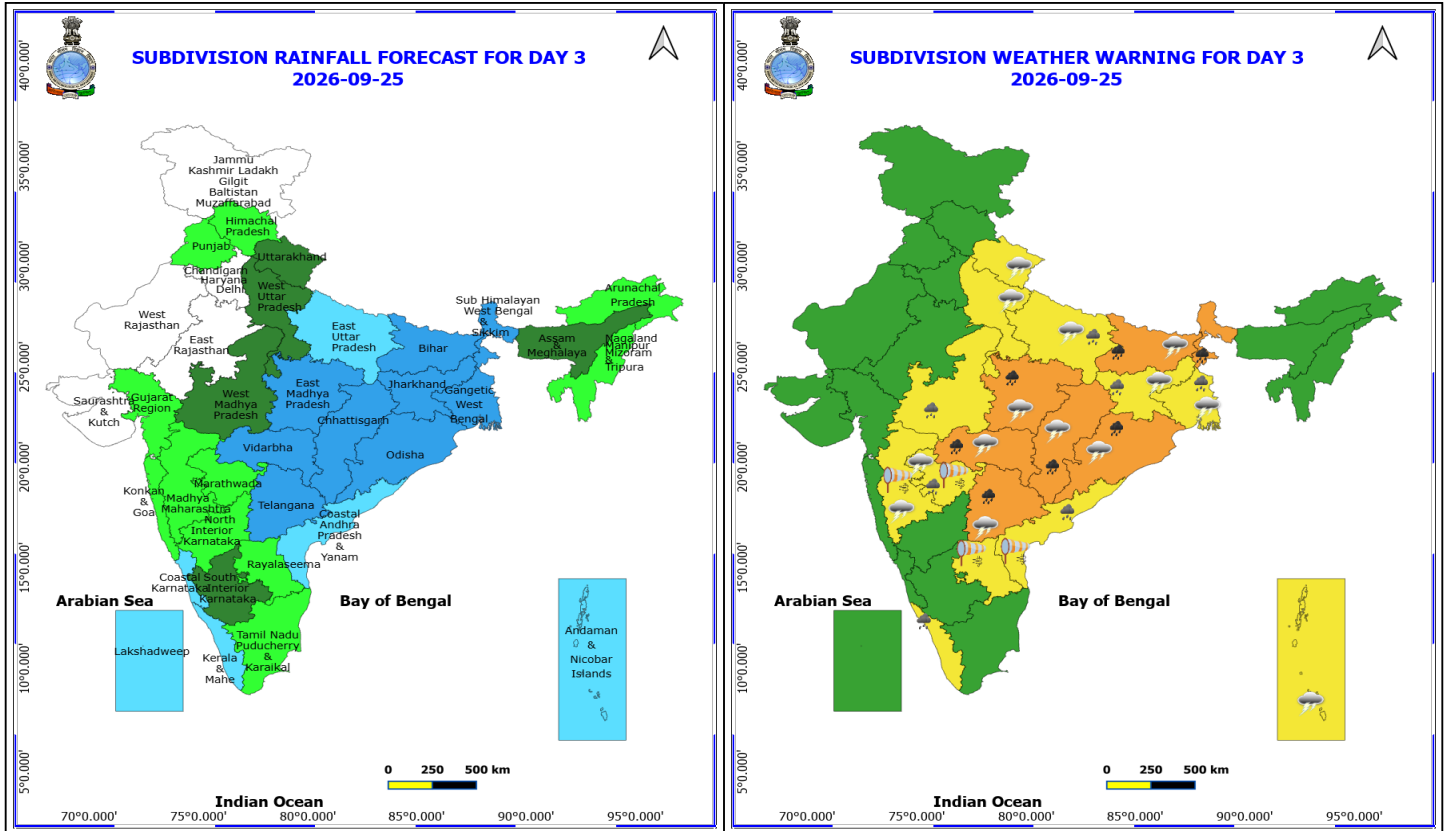
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coasts adjoining southwest Arabian Sea and Gulf of Mannar. Squally wind with speed 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph likely over Karanataka, Kerala and Lakshadweep coast.

- ❖ Bay of Bengal: Squally weather with wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is prevailing over Westcentral and adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal. It is very likely to increase reaching 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph over Westcentral & adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal.
- ❖ Squally wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph is likely over adjoining areas of North and South Bay of Bengal, along & off West Bengal and south Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts
- ❖ Squally weather with wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph commenced along and off south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts. It is likely to increase gradually becoming squally wind with speed reaching 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph..

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, East Uttar Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe, Marathwada and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Odisha, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Kerala & Mahe and Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia coasts adjoining southwest Arabian Sea and Gulf of Mannar.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally weather with wind speed 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Odisha and north Andhra Pradesh coasts, over some parts of westcentral & northwest Bay of Bengal
- ❖ Squally weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off West Bengal,

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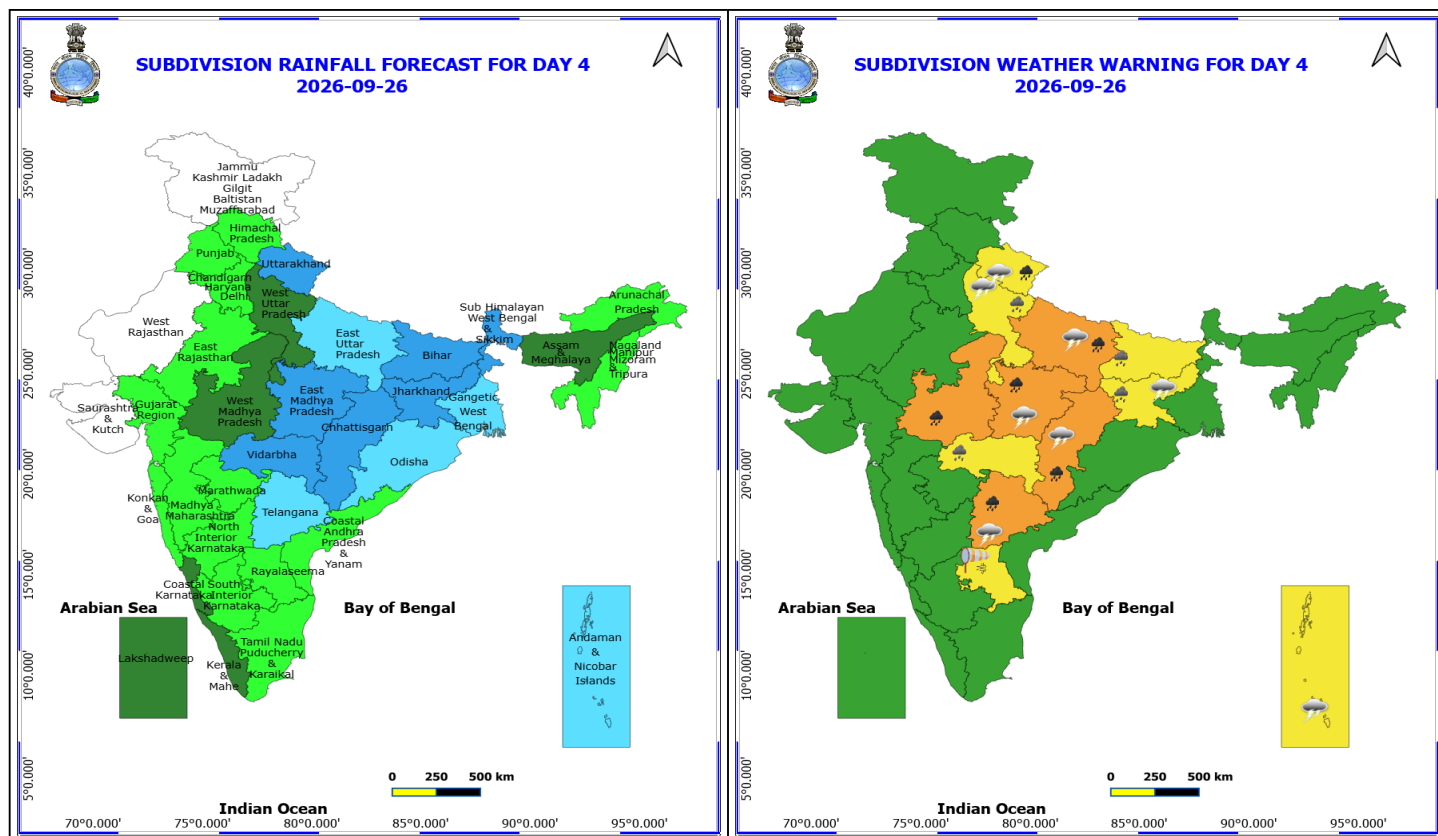
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south Andhra Pradesh, north Tamil Nadu, north Sri Lanka coasts, and over many parts of Bay of Bengal.

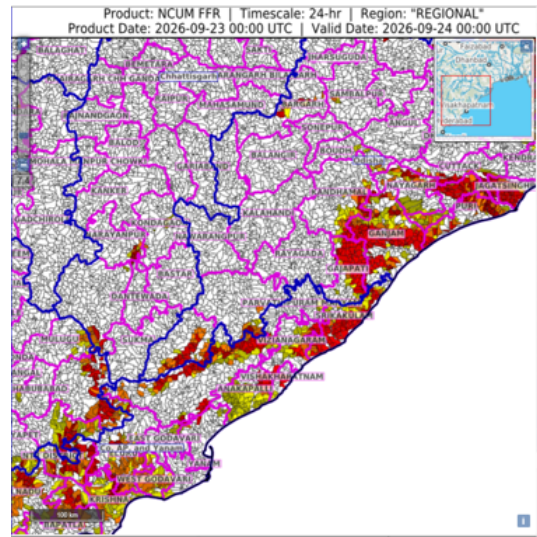

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-22

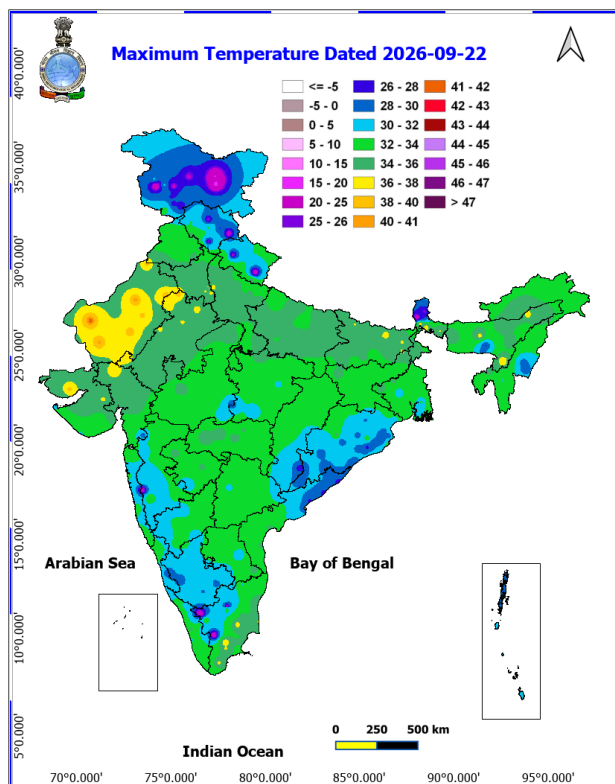


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-22

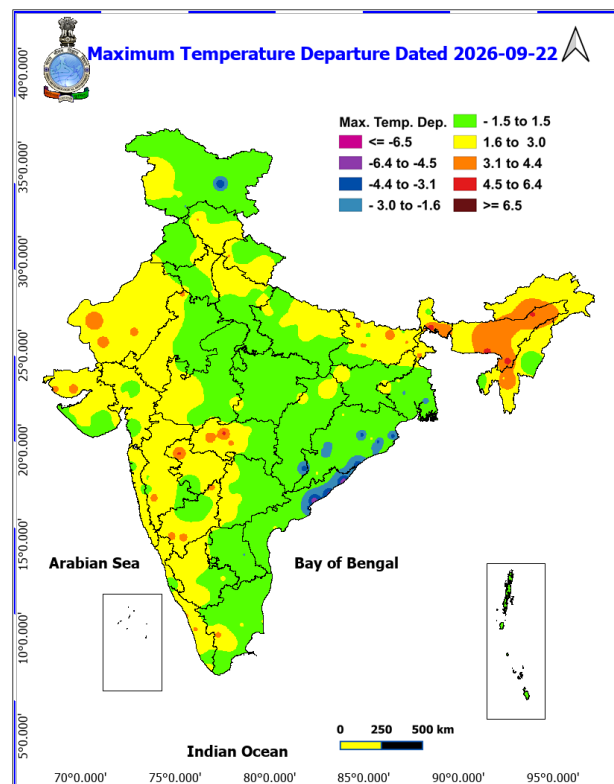


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-22

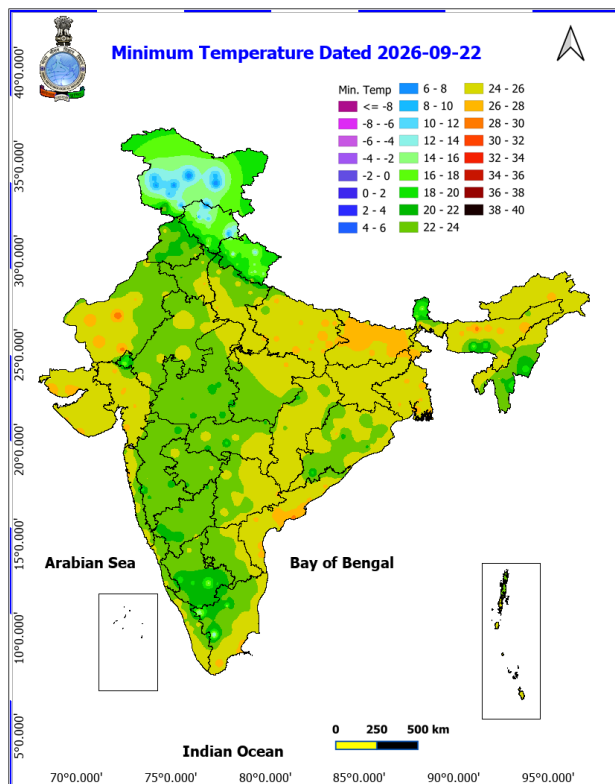
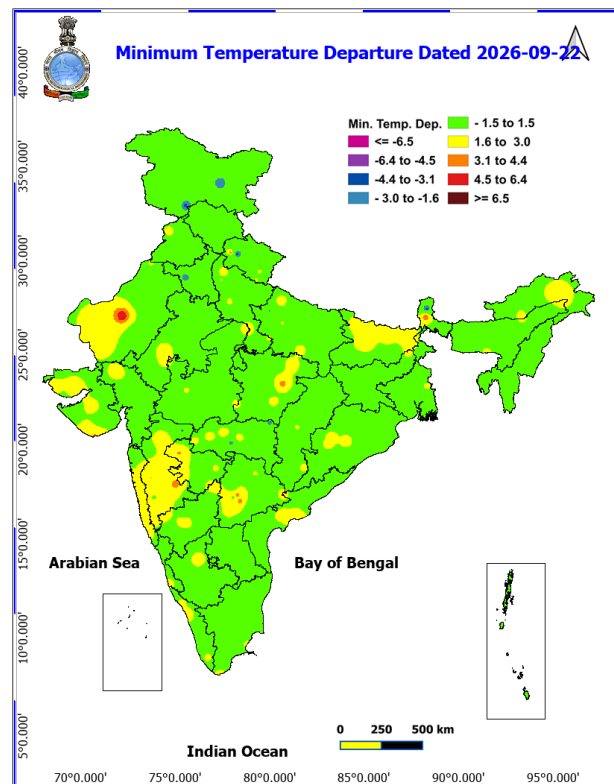
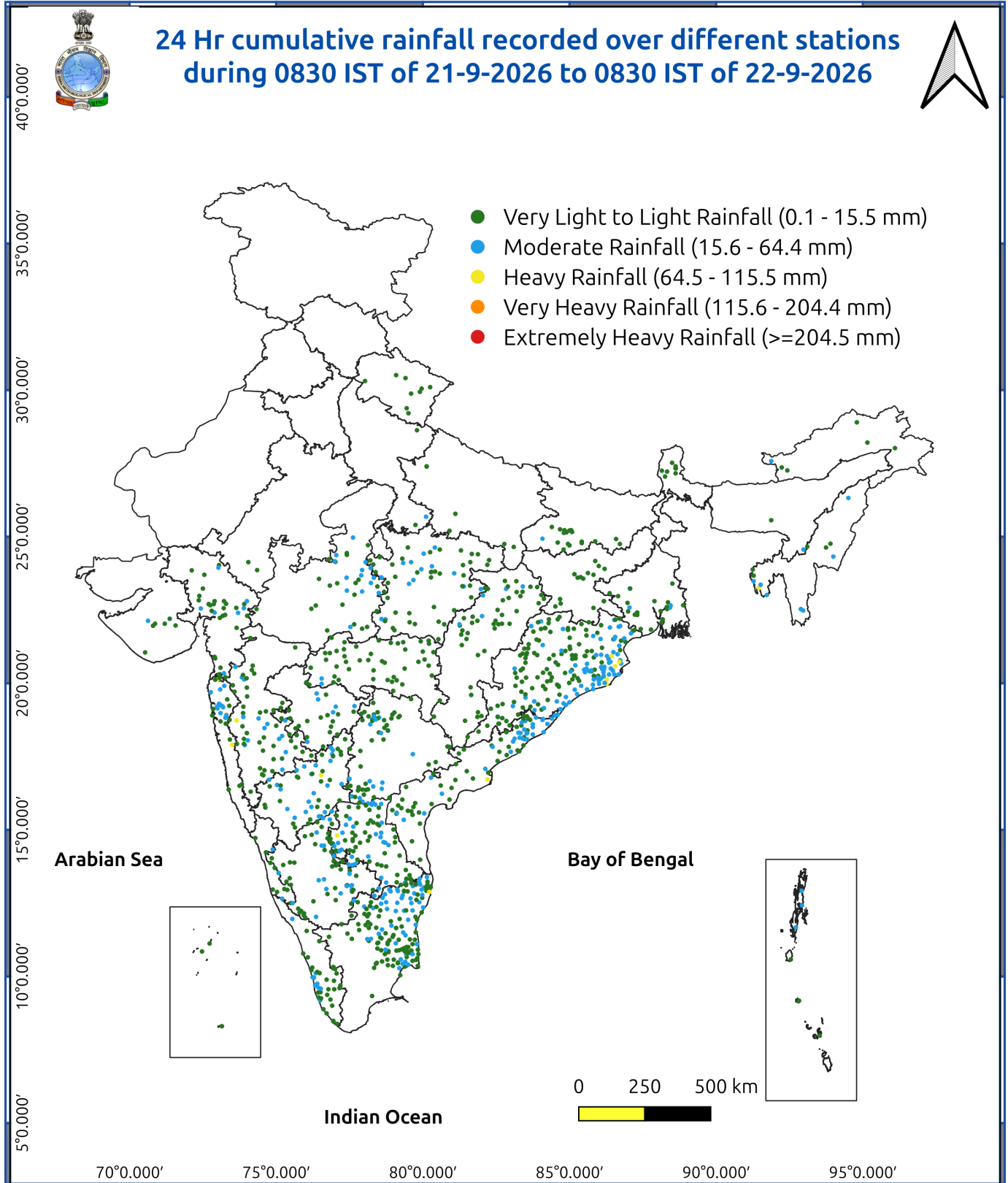


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-22





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated extremely heavy rainfall** likely over Chhattisgarh and Telangana on 23rd & 24th; Odisha during 23rd-24th; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 23rd September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Odisha**, ensure effective and continuous drainage of excess water from rice, maize, millets, ginger, turmeric, vegetables, pulses and orchards. Keep drainage channels clear, protect vegetable nurseries and provide staking to vegetables and newly planted banana to prevent lodging.
- In **Coastal Andhra Pradesh**, clear drainage channels and remove excess water from rice, maize, ragi, groundnut, red gram, sugarcane, vegetables and orchards. Harvest mature maize and keep it in a safe, dry place, while providing strong support to fruit-bearing banana plants and propping sugarcane.
- In **Gangetic West Bengal**, maintain proper drainage in rice and other crop fields to prevent water stagnation. Keep field channels clear, strengthen drainage in areas prone to water accumulation and harvest mature crops during suitable dry intervals, storing the produce in a dry, safe place.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetables. Keep drainage channels clear, particularly in low-lying maize, ginger and turmeric fields, remove stagnant water promptly and provide support to vulnerable vegetable crops.
- In **Telangana**, ensure adequate drainage in rice, cotton, green gram, black gram, red gram, vegetables and orchards to prevent water stagnation. Provide staking/support to vulnerable crops and postpone fertilizer and plant-protection operations until weather conditions become suitable. Harvest mature produce and keep it in a safe dry place.
- In **Rayalaseema**, maintain adequate drainage in standing crop fields and remove excess water promptly to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer and plant-protection applications until the fields are sufficiently dry and workable.

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- In **Karnataka**, maintain drainage in standing crop fields and postpone intercultural, fertilizer and plant-protection operations during wet conditions. Harvest mature green gram, black gram and soybean wherever conditions permit, secure harvested produce in covered storage and provide staking/propping support to vulnerable crops.
- In **Vidarbha**, Avoid field operations during wet conditions. Postpone irrigation in rice, soybean, cotton, pigeon pea, sorghum and maize. Harvest mature produce and keep it in a safe dry place.
- In **Konkan and Goa**, drain excess water from standing crops, vegetables and orchards and keep field drainage channels functional. Maintain adequate water level in rice and provide staking/support to young plants and vegetables; undertake propping in sugarcane to minimise lodging.
- In **Madhya Maharashtra**, ensure drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer and plant-protection measures during wet conditions. Harvest mature green gram and black gram wherever possible and keep the harvested produce in safe, dry places.
- In **Marathwada**, ensure drainage in standing crop fields and postpone field operations during excessive wetness. Harvest mature maize, green gram and black gram during suitable weather and keep the harvested produce in safe, dry places.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, drain excess water from standing crops and harvest mature upland/Jhum rice, finger millet, soybean and vegetables during dry intervals, immediately moving the produce to safe, covered storage. Continue harvesting mature tomato and chilli during rain-free periods.
- In **Assam and Meghalaya**, maintain effective drainage in rice, sesame, ginger, green gram, black gram and other crops, keeping field channels open to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature jute, banana and bottle gourd during suitable dry intervals and keep harvested produce safe and dry
- In **Kerala**, ensure effective drainage in banana, black pepper, coconut, ginger and turmeric fields following the recent rainfall and provide strong support to banana plants and trellis-grown crops. Postpone all field operations until rainfall ceases and soil conditions become suitable.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

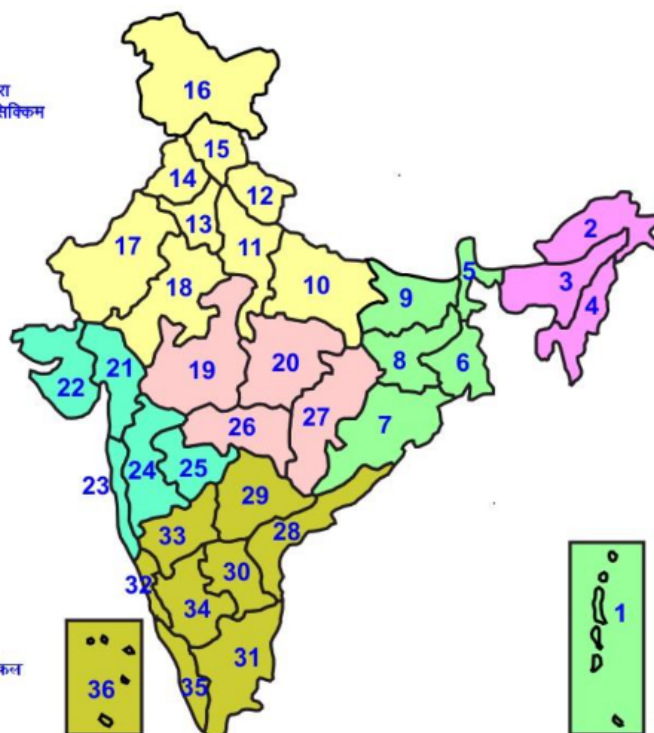
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
