Significant Weather Features

Weather Warning and Forecast

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Himachal Pradesh on 5th September; Uttarakhand during 5th-10th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over East Rajasthan and Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi on 5th September; West Uttar Pradesh during 5th-6th September; East Uttar Pradesh during 6th-8th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over rest parts of northwest India.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Himachal Pradesh on 5th September; Uttarakhand during 5th-10th September; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab and West Uttar Pradesh during 5th-6th September; East Uttar Pradesh during 6th-8th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over East Rajasthan on 5th September.

Central India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 5th-6th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 5th-8th September; Chhattisgarh during 8th-10th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 7th-10th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 9th-10th September; Vidarbha during 5th-10th September; Chhattisgarh during 5th-7th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 6th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 5th-8th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 5th September.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 5th-10th September; Gangetic West Bengal on 5th September and during 7th-10th September; Jharkhand during 8th-10th September; Bihar during 5th-6th September and on 10th September; Odisha on 10th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 6th September; Jharkhand during 5th-7th September; Bihar during 7th-9th September; Odisha during 5th-9th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 5th-8th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 8th-9th September; Jharkhand on 9th September; Bihar during 5th-8th September; Odisha during 9th-10th September.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 5th-8th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 5th-8th September and on 10th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 5th-10th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 9th-10th September; Assam & Meghalaya on 9th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 5th-10th September.

West India:

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- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** likely over Konkan & Goa during 5th-10th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and Saurashtra & Kutch during 5th-10th September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 5th-10th September; Lakshadweep during 5th-8th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Lakshadweep during 9th-10th September; Coastal Karnataka during 5th-10th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 5th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 5th-6th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 6th-8th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 5th-6th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 5th-8th September.

- Arabian Sea: Along and off Somalia coast, over few parts of westcentral & southwest Arabian Sea till 09th September, along and off few parts of Oman coasts adjoining northwest during 06th to 09th September.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Chhattisgarh, Assam & Meghalaya, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Konkan & Goa, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Uttar Pradesh, Marathwada, Vidarbha, West Madhya Pradesh and South Interior Karnataka; **at many places** over East Uttar Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Gujarat Region, Jharkhand, Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, East Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Lakshadweep; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi: New Delhi (palam) AP (dist South West Delhi) 7, New Delhi (safdarjung) (dist South West Delhi) 4; **West Madhya Pradesh**: Bhopal-arera Hills (dist Bhopal) 5, Guna (dist Guna) 4; Jammu & Kashmir And Ladakh: Katra (dist Reasi) 4; **Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal**: Madurai AP (dist Madurai) 4; **West Uttar Pradesh**: Bareilly (dist Bareilly) 3; **Assam & Meghalaya**: Cherrapunji (dist East Khasi Hills) 3.

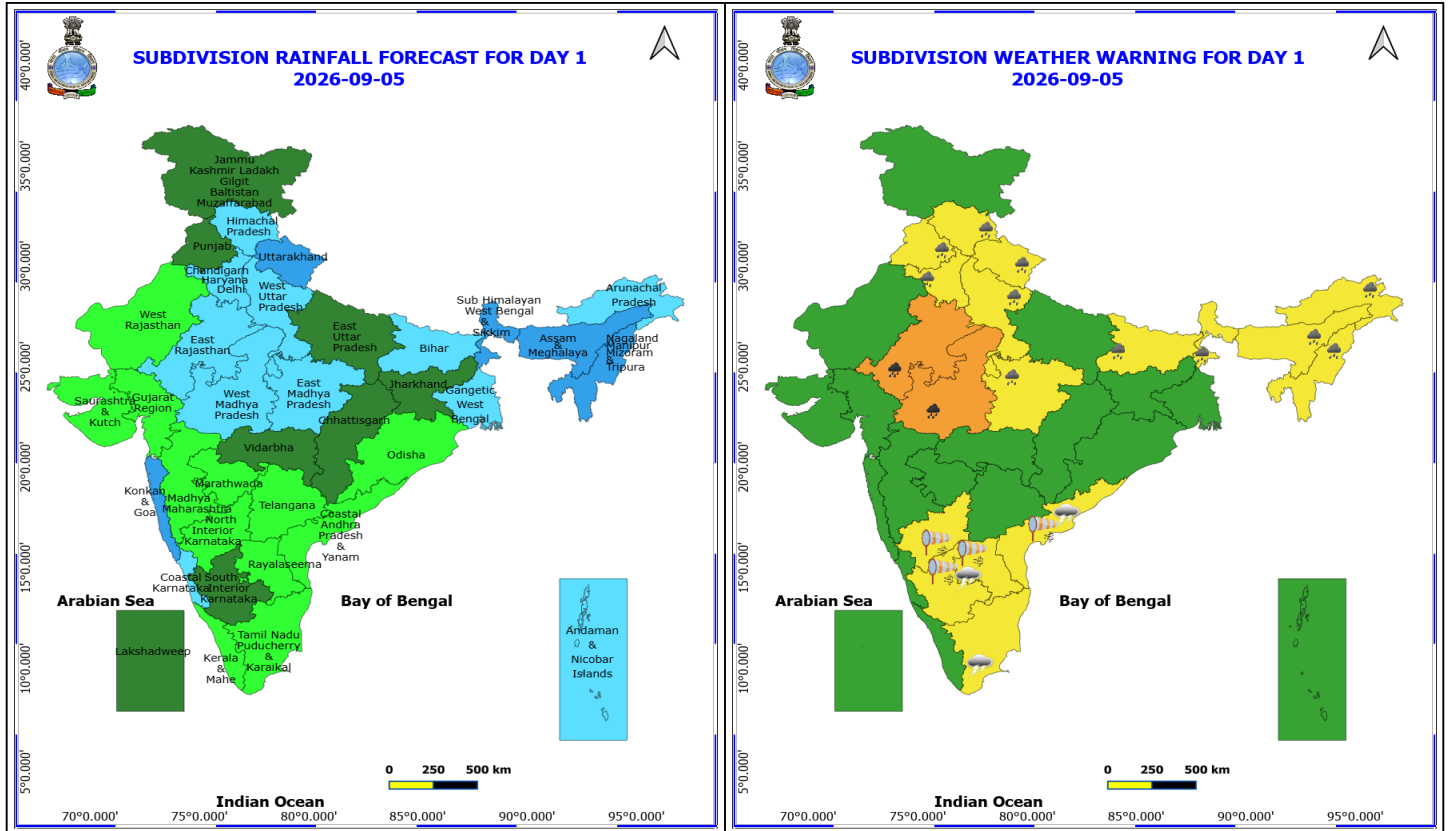

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 04-09-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Rajasthan and Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Uttarakhand, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and East Rajasthan; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and East Rajasthan. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 16.5°C was reported at YEOTMAL (MAHARASHTRA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 04-09-2026): appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Rayalaseema, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, West Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa, Coastal Karnataka and North Interior Karnataka; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Gujarat Region and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, Bihar, Marathwada and Chhattisgarh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab and Vidarbha; at most places over Gangetic West Bengal; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and East Rajasthan; at isolated places over Jharkhand and West Madhya Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.2°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Well Marked low pressure** area over central parts of northern Madhya Pradesh & adjoining south Uttar Pradesh lay over northwest Madhya Pradesh & adjoining southwest Uttar Pradesh at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 05th September 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height. It is likely to be quasi-stationary over the same region during next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Sri Ganganagar, Churu, centre of **Well Marked low pressure area** over northwest Madhya Pradesh & adjoining southwest Uttar Pradesh, Daltonganj, Bankura and thence eastwards towards Tripura.
- The **trough** from Northeast Rajasthan to Manipur across the cyclonic circulation associated with **Well Marked low pressure area** over northwest Madhya Pradesh & adjoining southwest Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, north Jharkhand, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, south Assam extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from south Gujrat to Jharkhand across cyclonic circulation associated with **Well Marked low pressure area** over northwest Madhya Pradesh & adjoining southwest Uttar Pradesh and north Chhattisgarh between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 68°E to the north of Lat. 32°N.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over coastal Tamil Nadu & adjoining Southwest Bay of Bengal at 7.6 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from South Interior Karnataka to Gulf of Munnar across Tamil Nadu at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.

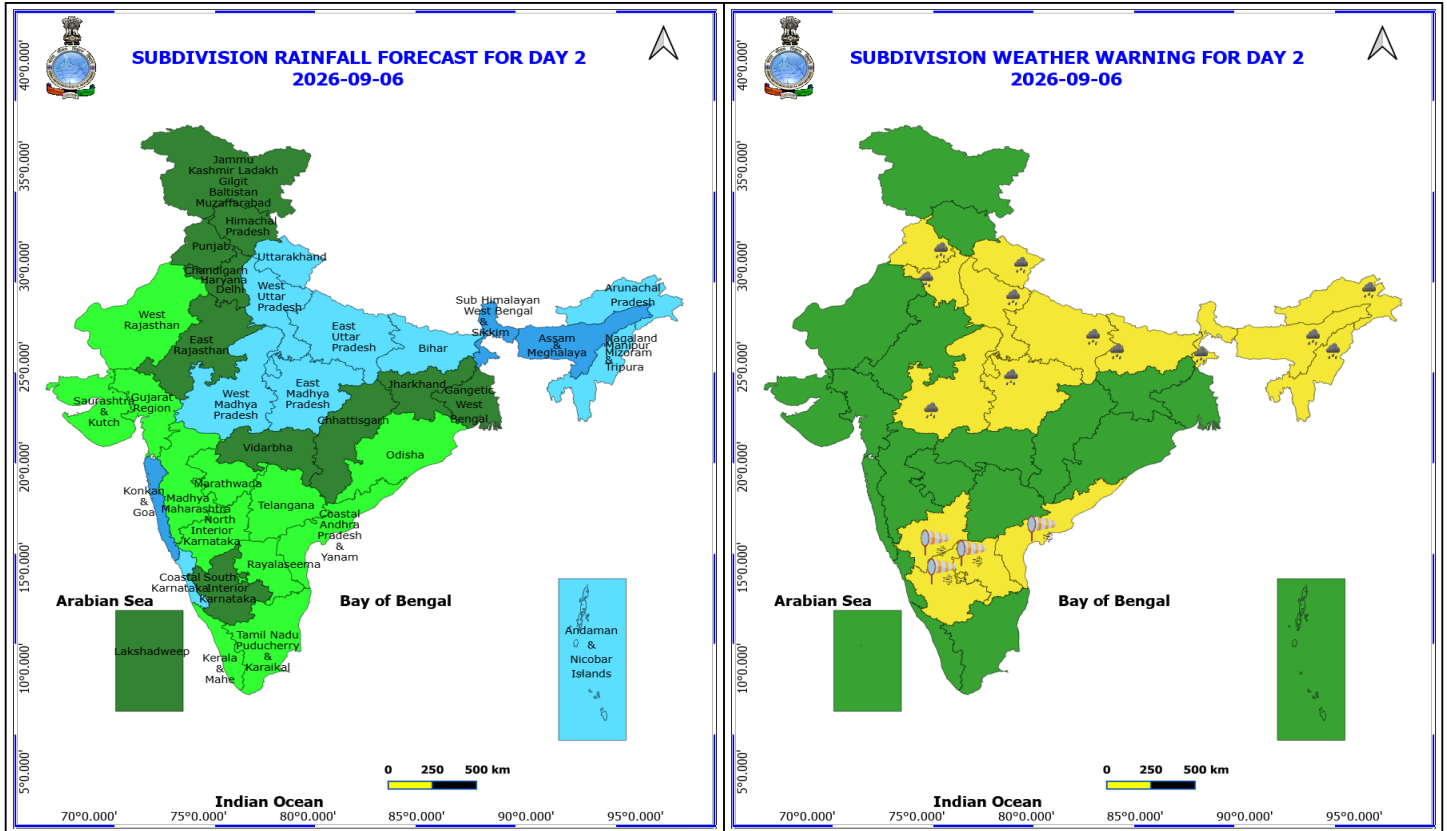

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh and Interior Karnataka.

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-04

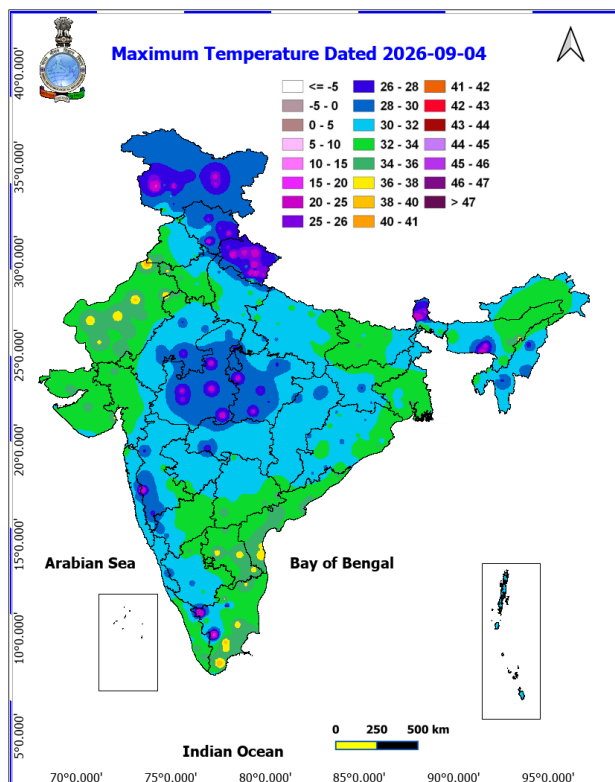


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-04

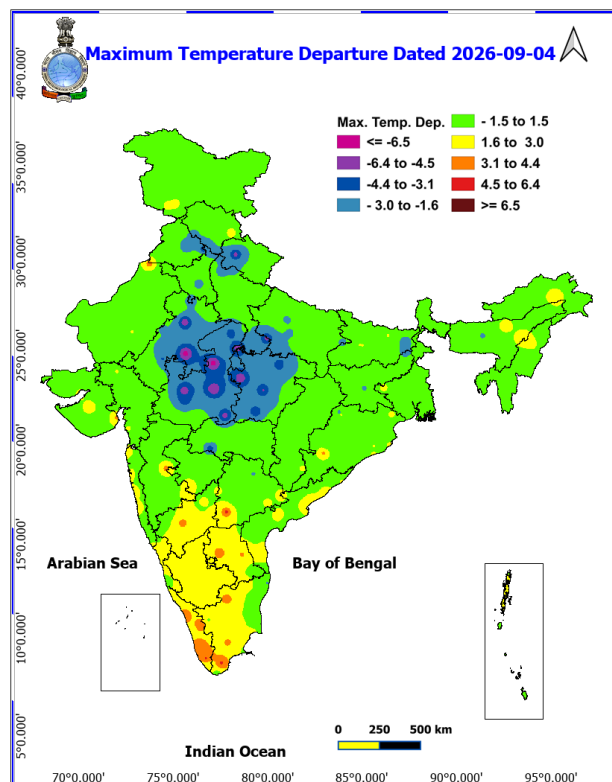


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-04

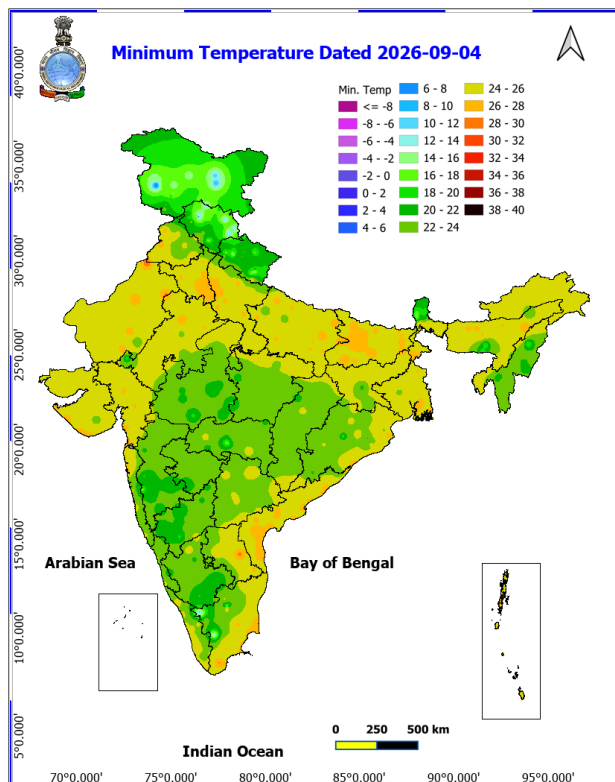
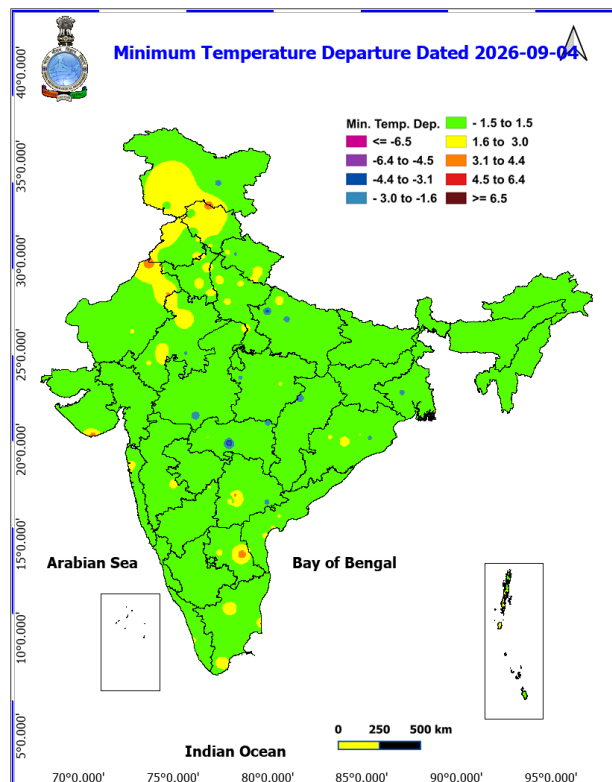
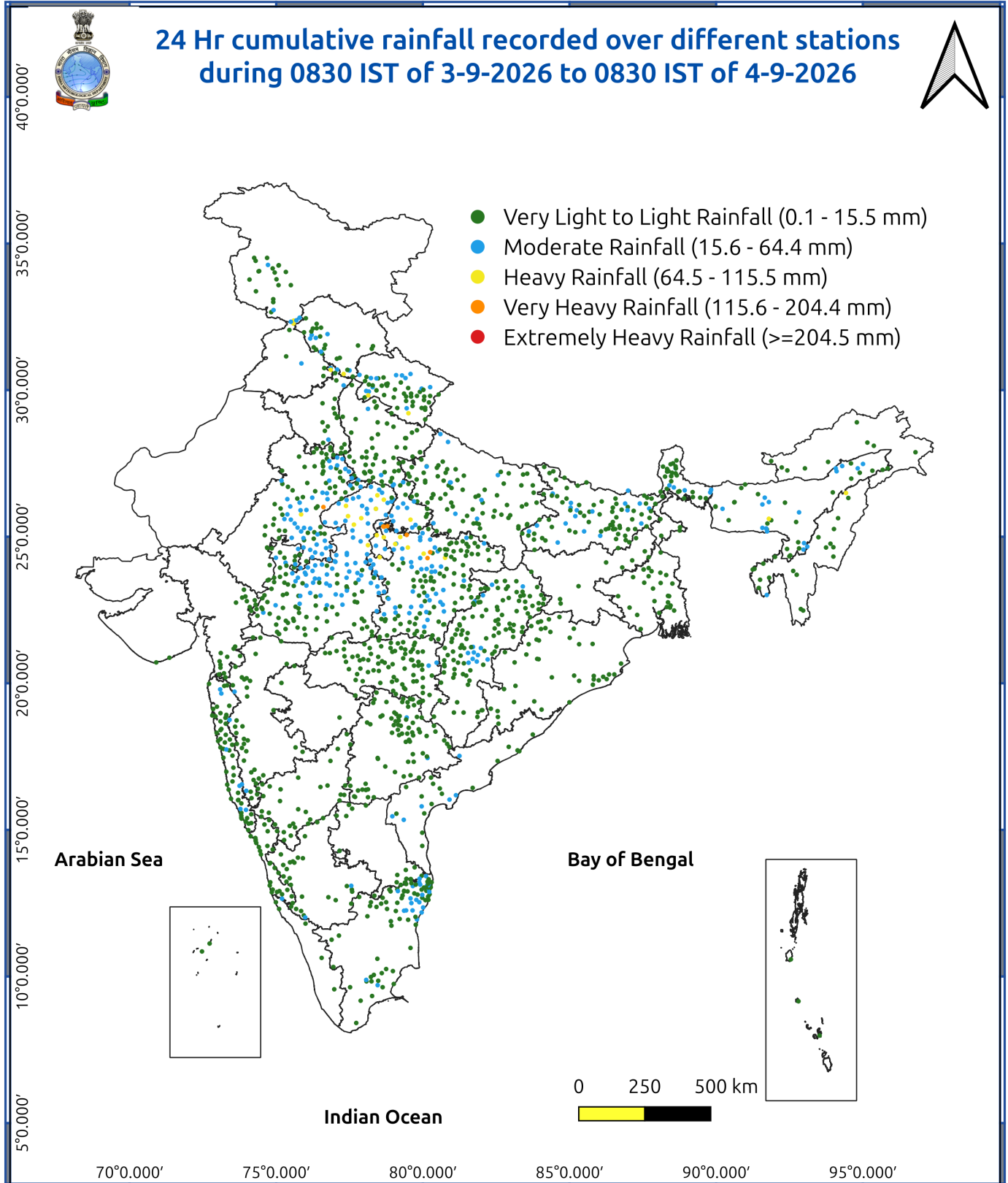


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-04





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall** very likely over East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh on 05th September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging. Avoid transplanting during wet conditions, provide support to vulnerable plants and undertake propping in tall sugarcane to minimise lodging.
- In **East Rajasthan** harvest ripe and marketable fruits of tomato, chilli and brinjal and maintain proper drainage in fields to avoid water logging. Keep harvested produce in safe and dry places.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetables and orchards and remove excess water promptly. Keep millet fields well drained during panicle initiation and flowering. Postpone fertilizer and plant-protection operations during rainfall
- In **Assam** and **Meghalaya**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame and vegetable fields and keep drainage channels clear. Postpone fertilizer and plant-protection operations during rainfall and harvest jute at the small-pod stage wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram** and **Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Harvest mature maize, colocasia and ginger wherever field conditions permit and avoid field operations during excessively wet conditions. Keep harvested produce in safe and dry places.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal** and **Sikkim**, keep drainage channels clear in rice, vegetable fields, orchards and nursery beds to prevent waterlogging. Protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rain, improve drainage around cucurbits and avoid nitrogen application during wet conditions.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain effective drainage in sugarcane, soybean, kidney bean, green gram, black gram,

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other standing crops and vegetable fields. Keep drainage channels clear and provide support to tall crops and vegetables to prevent lodging.

- In **Bihar**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, sesame, pigeon pea and other standing crop fields and avoid prolonged water stagnation. Postpone field operations, fertilizer and plant-protection applications in excessively wet fields until suitable conditions prevail.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage of excess rainwater from standing crop fields, particularly low-lying areas prone to waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer application and plant-protection operations in saturated.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

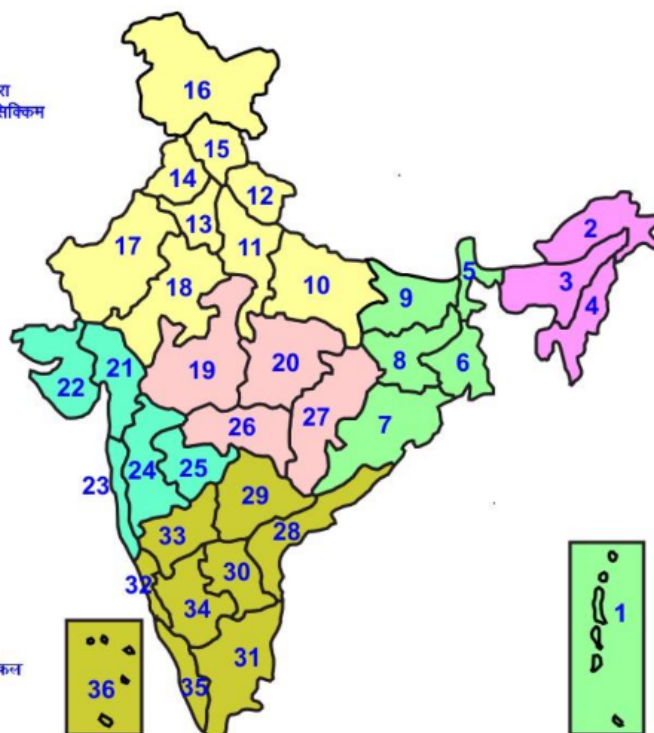
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
