- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Madhya Maharashtra during 25th-26th August.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 25th-30th August; Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 29th-31st August; North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 25th-31st August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 25th-28th August; Coastal Karnataka during 25th-31st August.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 25th-26th August; Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 25th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 25th-28th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep on 26th August.

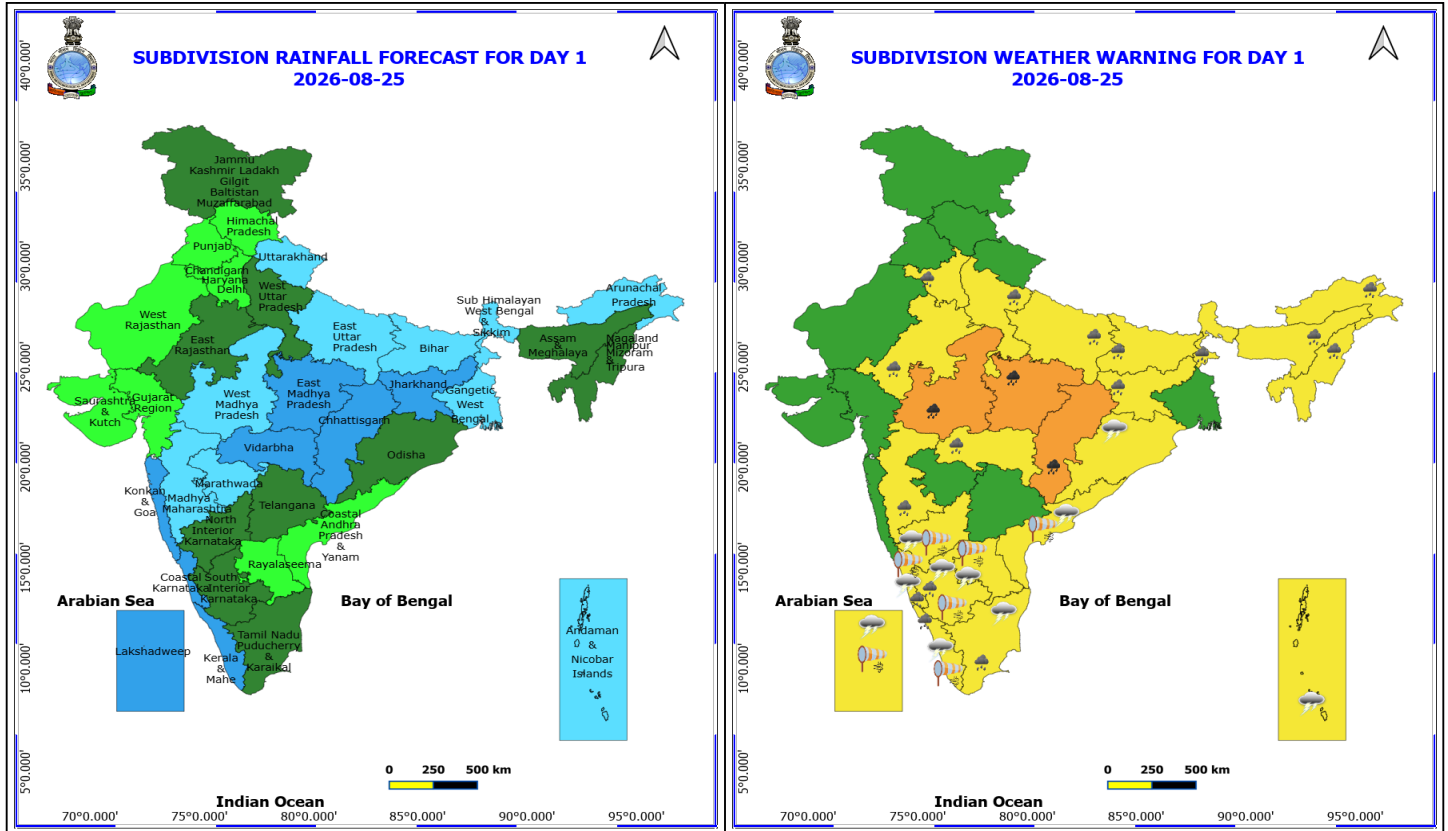

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 24-08-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch and Madhya Maharashtra. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Gujarat Region, Vidarbha and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Vidarbha, Telangana and Lakshadweep; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttarakhand, Punjab, East Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat Region. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.0°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 24-08-2026)**: **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Himachal Pradesh and Vidarbha. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over East Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa and Coastal Karnataka; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Gujarat Region and Marathwada; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Rayalaseema; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Lakshadweep; at few places over Jharkhand, East Madhya Pradesh and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Telangana. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.2°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low-Pressure Area** over north Odisha & adjoining Jharkhand and Gangetic West Bengal lay over Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining areas of Jharkhand and North Odisha at 0530 Hrs IST of today, the 25th August 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation now extends upto 5.8 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height. The system is likely to move nearly north-westwards across Jharkhand & north Odisha during the next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Jammu, Dehradun, Sultanpur, Daltonganj, centre of **Low Pressure Area** over Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining areas of Jharkhand and North Odisha, Digha and thence southeastwards to Northeast Bay of Bengal.
- The **trough** now runs from the cyclonic circulation associated with low pressure area over Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining areas of Jharkhand and North Odisha to Southwest Uttar Pradesh across north Chhattisgarh and northeast Madhya Pradesh persists and now extends upto 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over southwest Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough now lies in upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 28°N.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over North Haryana & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Madhya Pradesh between 5.8 and 7.6 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northeast Assam & neighbourhood persists and now extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over East Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-24

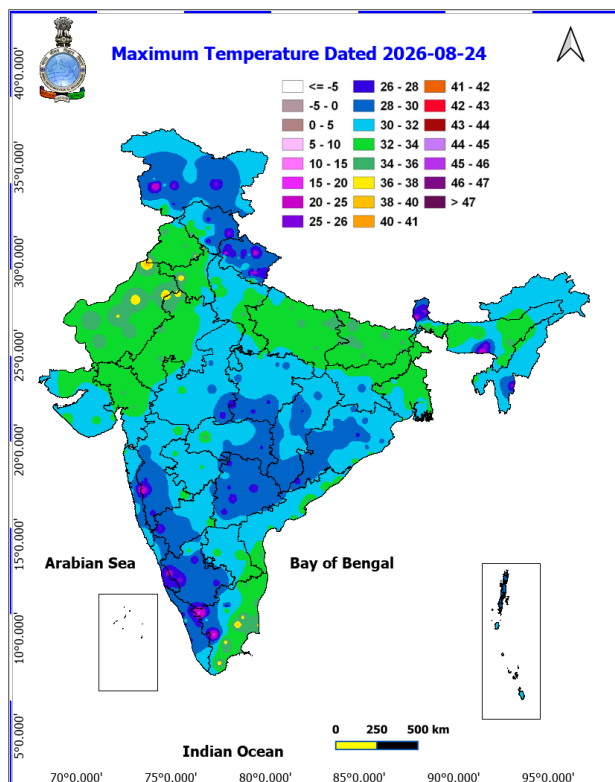


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-24

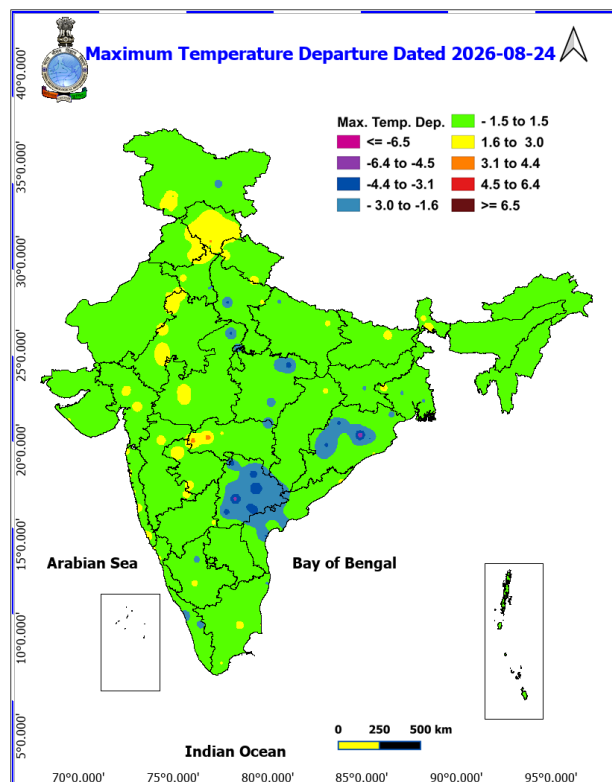


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-24

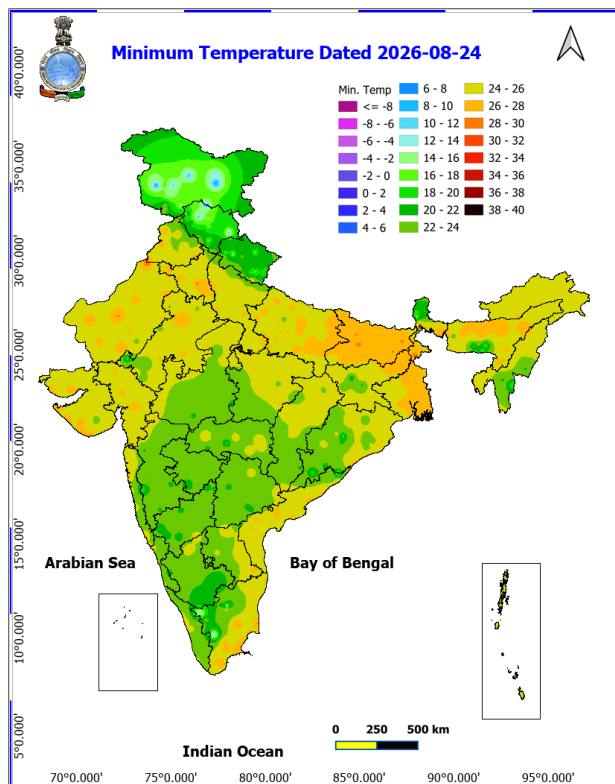
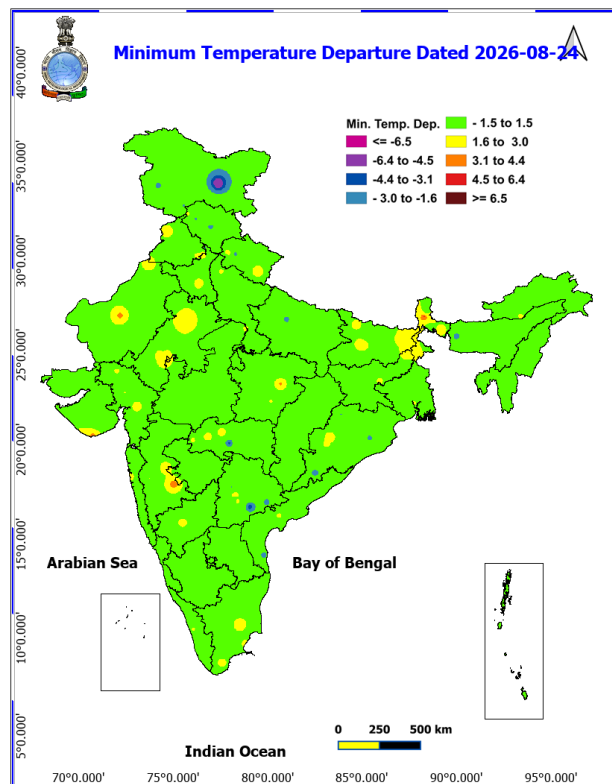
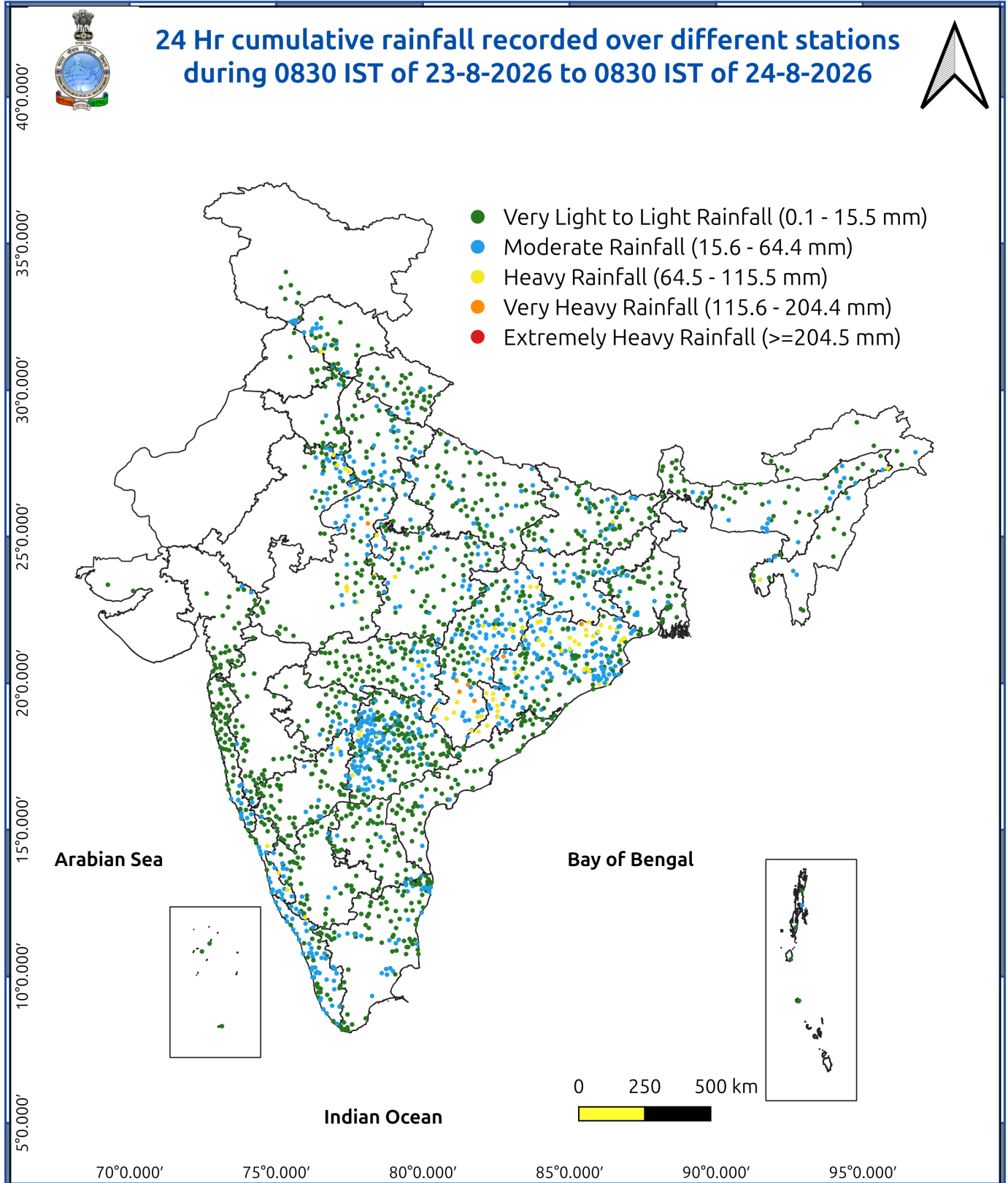


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-24





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall likely over Chhattisgarh on 25th and over Madhya Pradesh during 25th to 26th August.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Jharkhand**, maintain proper drainage and prevent waterlogging in all standing crops, particularly maize and red gram. Keep harvested produce in safe, dry places and protect vegetable seedlings. Postpone fertilizer and plant protection operations until rainfall subsides and field conditions become suitable.
- In **Odisha**, ensure continuous and effective drainage of excess water from kharif rice, maize, pulses, cotton, pigeon pea, banana, vegetable fields and nursery beds. Keep field drains, outlets and bunds clear and functional. In waterlogged areas, postpone sowing/re-sowing of maize and green gram and prevent water stagnation in pearl millet. Provide staking/support to vegetables, banana, papaya and new horticultural plants.
- In **Madhya Pradesh**, maintain effective drainage in maize, soybean, sugarcane, cotton, vegetable, pulse and oilseed fields and promptly remove excess water. Postpone fertilizer application and intercultural operations until the soil becomes workable. Provide staking/support to young vegetable plants and propping to sugarcane to minimize lodging.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Clean drainage channels in low-lying maize, ginger, turmeric and vegetable fields and provide staking/support to cucurbits, tomato and capsicum.
- In **Vidarbha**, maintain proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and other standing crop fields and remove excess rainwater promptly. Postpone fertilizer, plant protection and intercultural operations until the soil becomes workable and provide support to young vegetables and other vulnerable crops against lodging.
- In **Keralam**, ensure drainage around paddy, nutmeg, coconut and other plantation crops and promptly remove excess water from areas prone to waterlogging. Maintain good drainage around palms and ginger fields and

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avoid excessive nitrogen application in paddy during wet conditions.

- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetable fields and orchards to remove excess water and prevent waterlogging. Keep millet fields well-drained during panicle initiation and flowering stages and maintain proper spacing and field sanitation.
- In **Assam and Meghalaya**, maintain proper drainage in rice, sugarcane, pigeon pea, green gram, sesame, jute and vegetable fields and keep field channels clear. Harvest jute at the appropriate stage wherever field conditions permit and postpone fertilizer and plant protection operations during rainfall. In Meghalaya, remove excess water from maize, cowpea, okra and ginger fields and maintain rice bunds properly.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops, vegetables and groundnut fields to prevent water stagnation. Harvest mature maize cobs and ginger wherever field conditions permit and postpone plant protection operations until a suitable rain-free period.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal and Sikkim**, clear drainage channels in vegetable fields, orchards, rice and finger millet nurseries to prevent waterlogging. Maintain proper drainage in rice and vegetable fields, protect chilli seedlings from heavy rain and support okra and bitter gourd plants against lodging and water stagnation.
- In **Uttarakhand**, ensure proper drainage of excess rainwater from rice, sugarcane, maize, barnyard millet, kidney bean, finger millet, ginger and tomato fields. Clear terrace outlets and strengthen bunds to reduce erosion, waterlogging and lodging, and secure stakes and trellises in tomato and other vegetables.
- In **Tamil Nadu**, provide proper drainage to rice nurseries and standing rice fields and continue rice transplanting only where field conditions permit. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations during wet conditions and provide support to vulnerable young plants and vegetables.
- In **Karnataka**, ensure proper drainage in maize and ginger fields and remove excess water promptly. In coastal areas, provide drainage to black pepper, arecanut and coconut plantations and provide support to banana, papaya and young plants; undertake paddy transplanting only where suitable field conditions permit.
- In **Telangana**, postpone fertilizer and other field operations during wet conditions and resume them after rainfall when soil conditions become suitable. Undertake sesame sowing only where field conditions permit and provide adequate drainage in standing crops, particularly in areas that have received rainfall.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

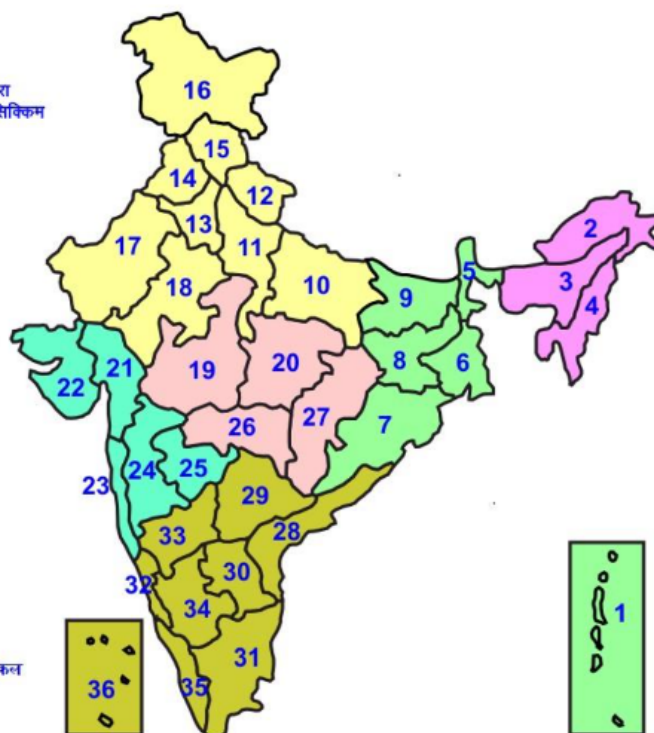
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
