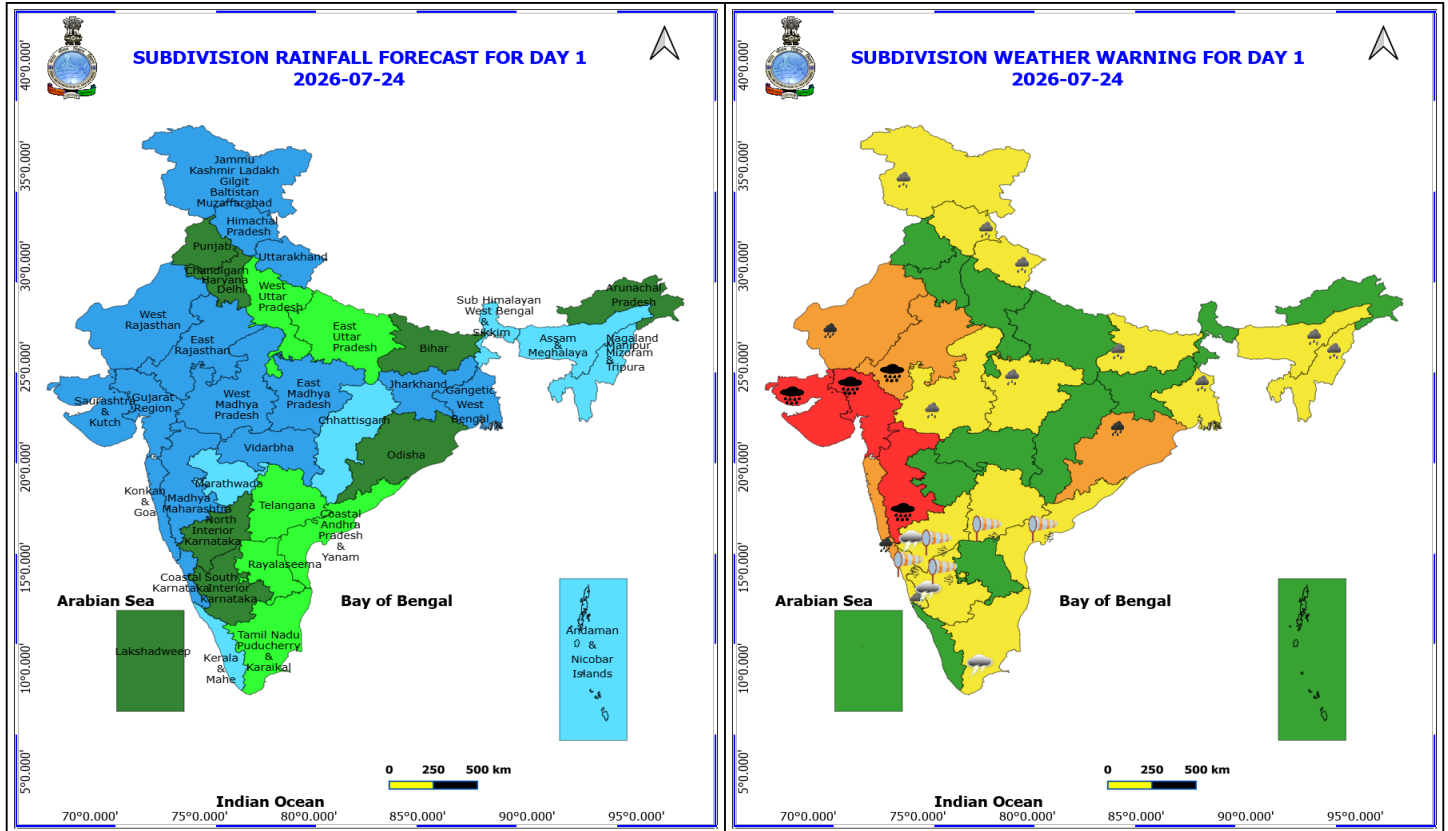

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 23-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Madhya Maharashtra. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands; at few places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Odisha, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha and Telangana. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.3°C was reported at BOUDH (ORISSA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 22-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya and Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, West Rajasthan and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Uttarakhand, Punjab and Lakshadweep; at most places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and Coastal Karnataka; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Rayalaseema and Kerala & Mahe. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.4°C was reported at MADURAI (A) (TAMIL NADU).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low-Pressure area** oversoutheast Rajasthan & adjoining Madhya Pradesh persisted over the same region at 0530 Hrs IST of today, 24th July, 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting south-westwards with height.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Deesa, centre of Low-Pressure area over southeast Rajasthan & adjoining Madhya Pradesh, Satna, Ranchi, Digha & thence Southeastwards towards Northeast Bay of Bengal and extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northwest Bay of Bengal & neighbourhood between 5.8 & 9.6 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **east-west shear zone** roughly along 23°N Lat. between 4.5 & 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height persists.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Northern parts of Gangetic West Bengal between 3.1 & 4.5km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over Jammu & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level persists however the trough aloft in middle & upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttarakhand and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over most parts of central adjoining some parts of north and southwest Arabian Sea, along and off Somalia, Oman coasts, Gujarat and north Maharashtra coasts.

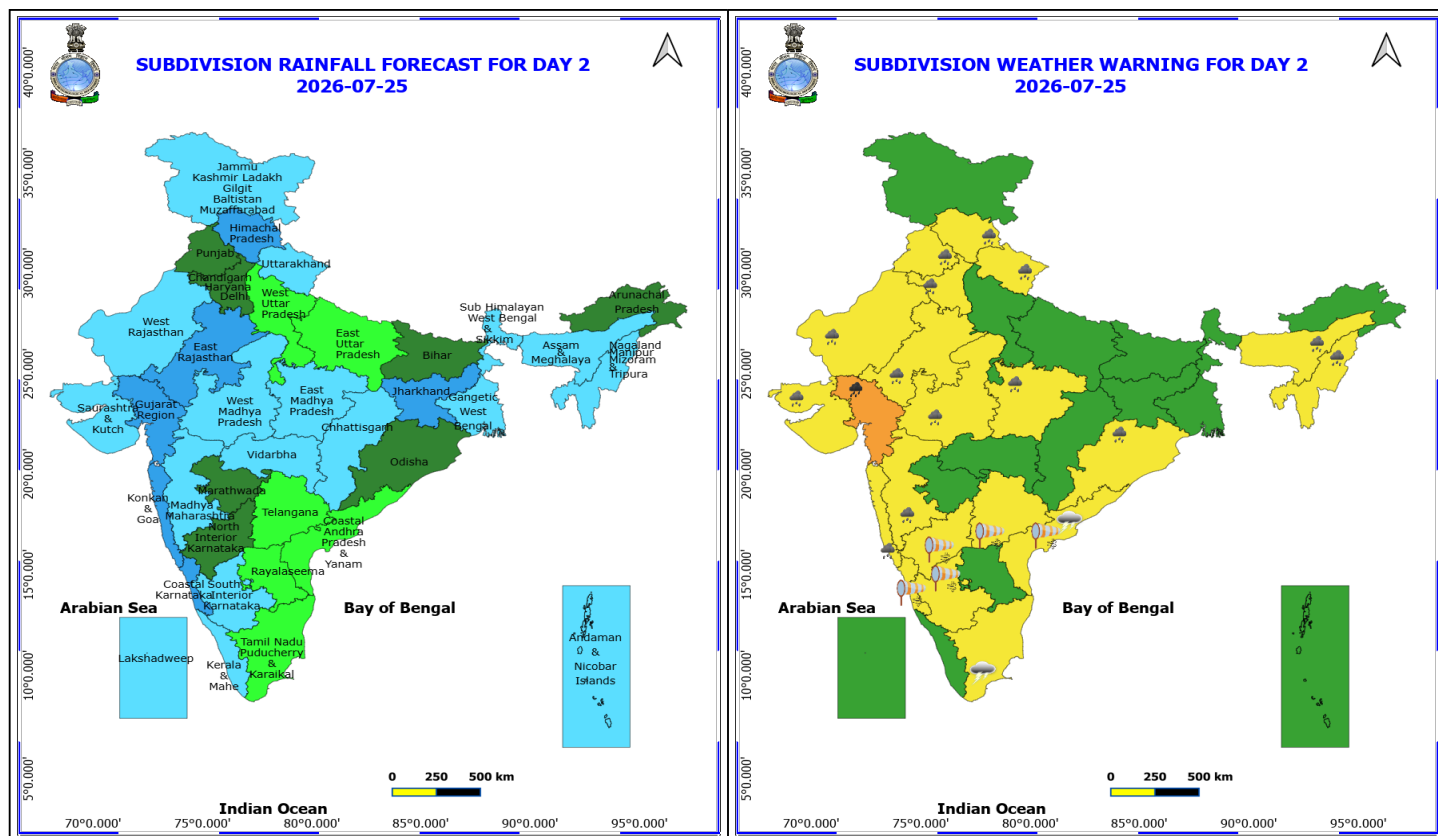

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Jharkhand, Odisha and Telangana.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** likely at isolated places over Rajasthan, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** likely at isolated places over Telangana.

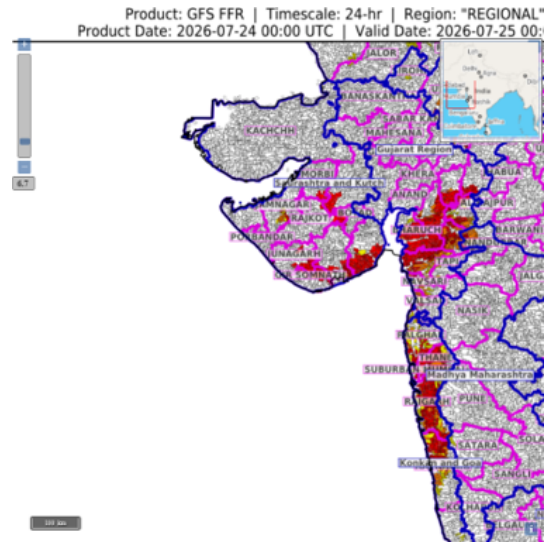

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-23

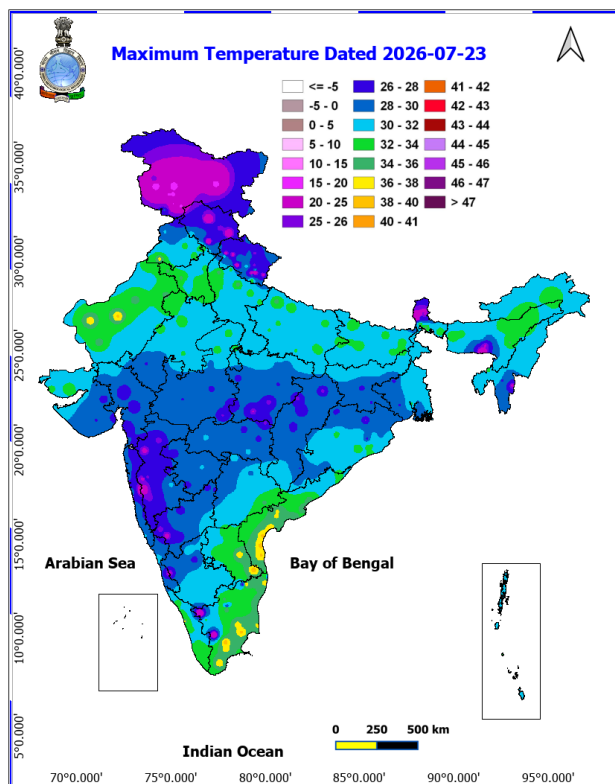


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-23

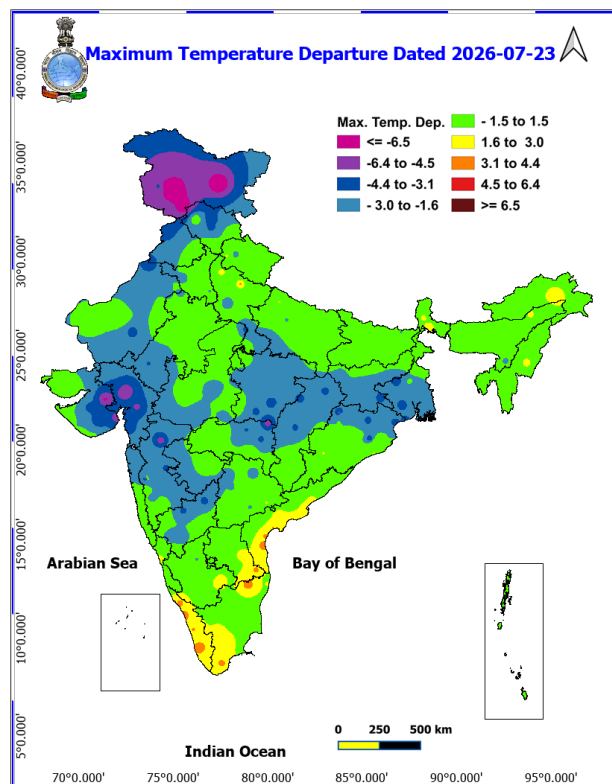


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-23

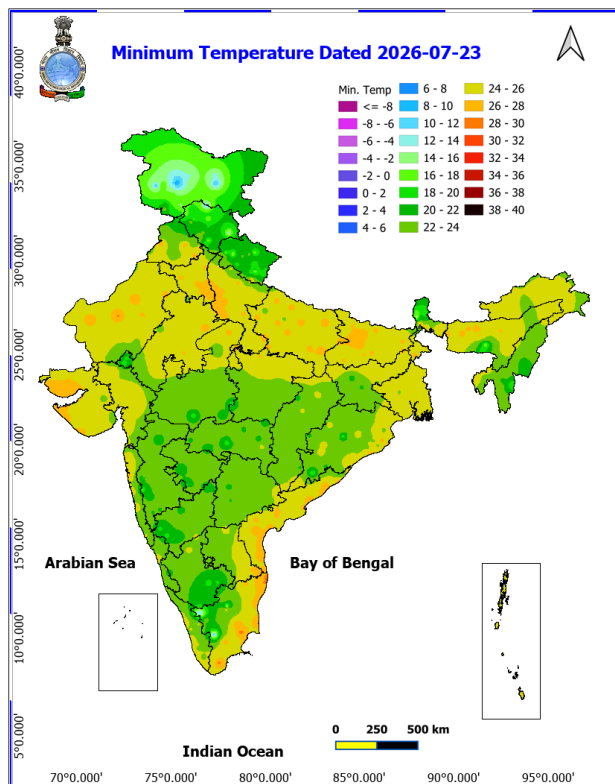
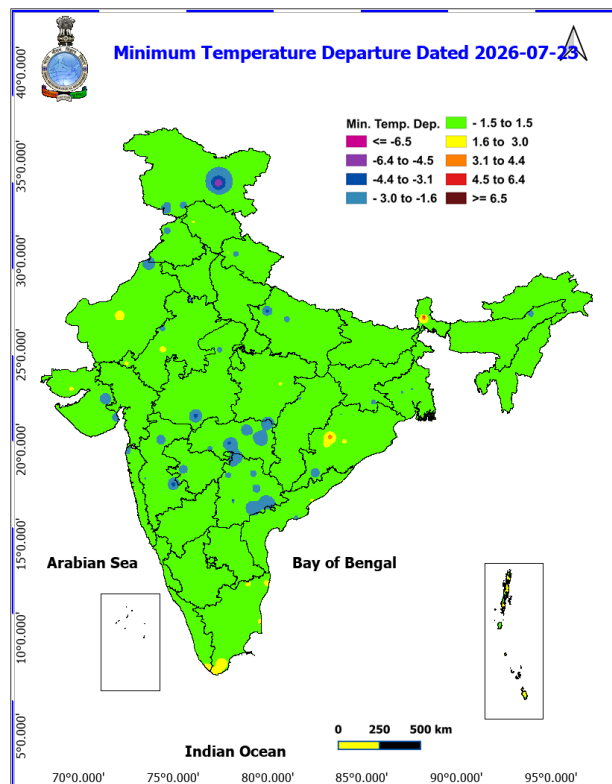
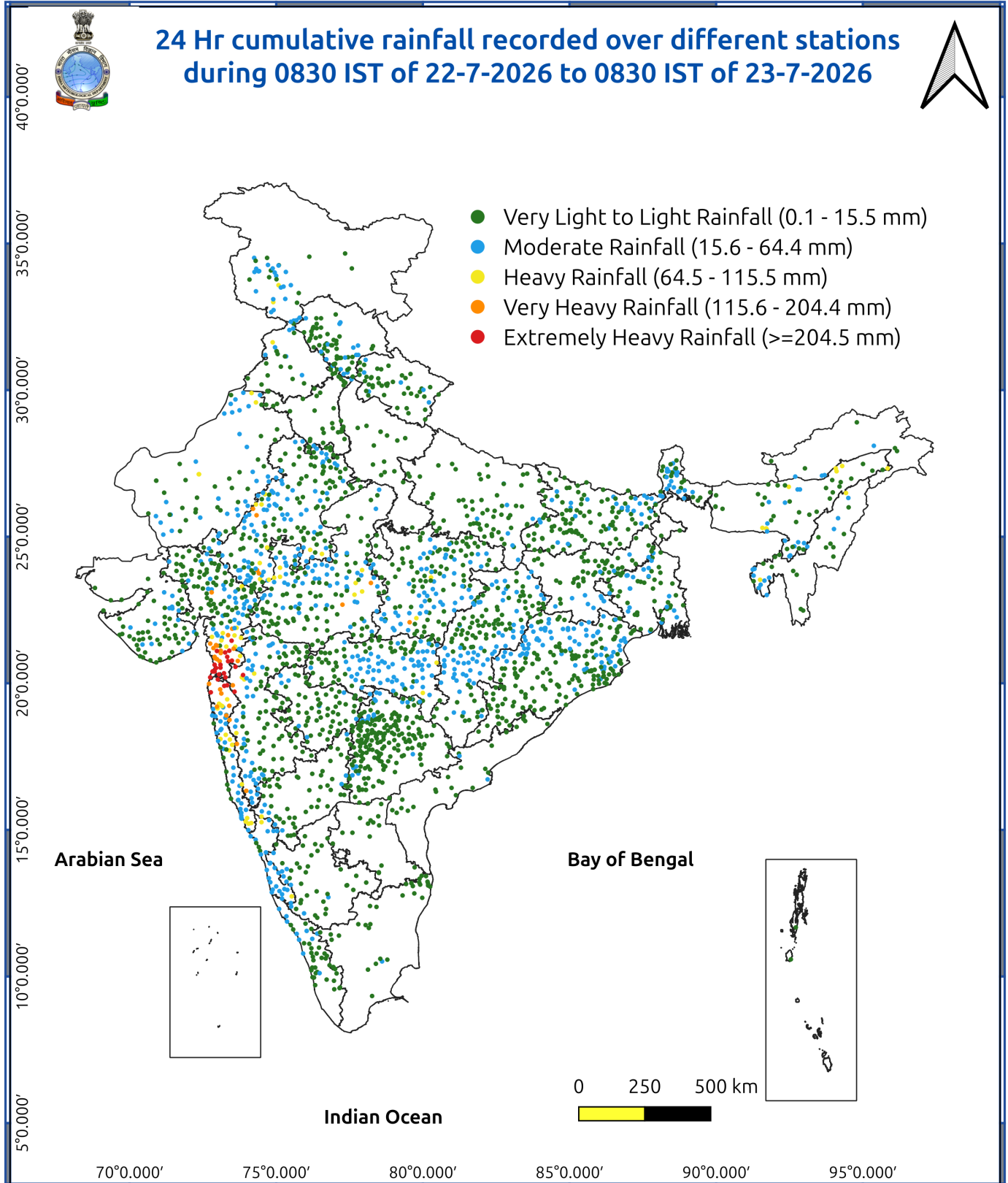


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-23





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over over East Rajasthan, Madhya Maharashtra, Gujarat state and Odisha on 24th July.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Gujarat, Saurashtra & Kutch**, maintain uninterrupted drainage and keep field channels clear in rice, cotton, pearl millet, maize, groundnut and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Remove excess rainwater from low-lying crop fields and postpone transplanting and all field operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Konkan & Goa**, maintain uninterrupted drainage in rice nurseries, rice and vegetable fields, and continuously remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Undertake gap filling and transplanting only where field conditions permit.
- In **Madhya Maharashtra**, maintain uninterrupted drainage in standing crops and continuously remove excess rainwater from crop fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **West Rajasthan**, maintain effective drainage and remove excess rainwater from low-lying pearl millet, maize, cotton and pulse fields to prevent temporary waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **East Rajasthan**, maintain continuous drainage and remove excess rainwater from low-lying soybean, maize, groundnut, cotton and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **West Madhya Pradesh**, maintain effective drainage in soybean, maize, black gram, green gram, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone sowing, irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Coastal Karnataka**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage in paddy fields, orchards and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone field operations until field conditions become suitable.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, tomato, brinjal, capsicum, chilli and cucumber fields and apple and pear orchards for quick removal of excess rainwater. Harvest mature fruits wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Assam**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries, jute,

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sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide staking or support to banana, vegetables and other vulnerable crops against strong winds.

- In **Meghalaya**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Strengthen nursery bunds and keep drainage channels free from obstruction.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure continuous and effective drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.
- In **West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain effective drainage in rice, black gram, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and chilli fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato wherever field conditions permit, and postpone sowing until field conditions improve.
- In Punjab and Haryana, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, soybean, pigeon pea and groundnut fields and fruit orchards to prevent waterlogging. Postpone sowing of green gram until field conditions improve.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields, orchards and low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Jammu and Kashmir**, postpone sowing of kharif pulses until field conditions improve. Maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, green gram and black gram fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **East Rajasthan**, maintain continuous drainage and remove excess rainwater from low-lying soybean, maize, groundnut, cotton and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Madhya Pradesh**, maintain effective drainage in soybean, maize, black gram, green gram, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Karnataka**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage in paddy fields, orchards and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone field operations until field conditions become suitable.
- In **Keralam**, maintain effective drainage in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

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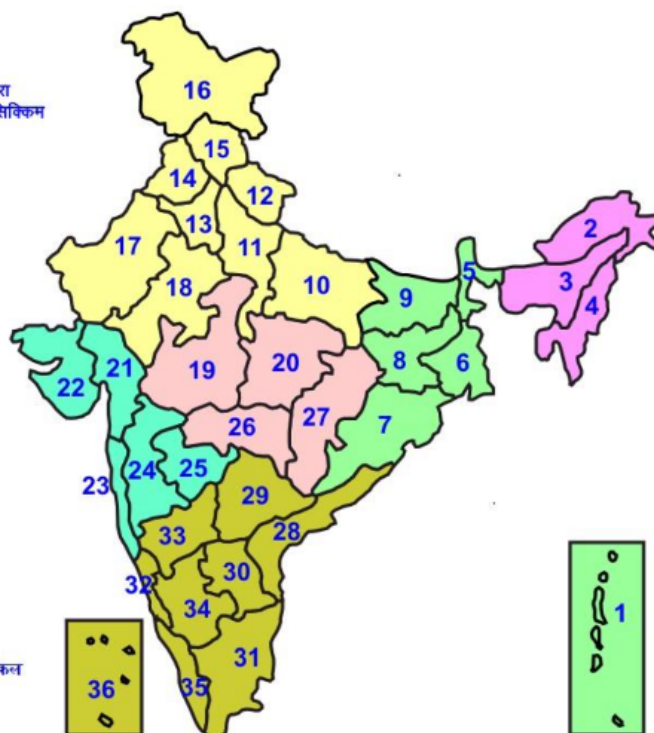
