ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Forecast and warning:

- **Thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** over Uttarakhand on 28th January. **Thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph** over East Uttar Pradesh on 28th; **with thunderstorm, lightning** over Chhattisgarh on 28th January.
- Isolated light/moderate rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching 30-40 kmph very likely over Bihar on 28th and **isolated Hailstorm activity also likely over Sikkim on 28th January.**
- A fresh **western disturbance** is likely to affect northwest India from the night of 30th January 2026. Under its influence, scattered to fairly widespread rainfall/snowfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching 30-40 kmph** likely over Western Himalayan region and adjoining plains of Northwest India on 01st & 02nd February.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

- Gradual fall in minimum temperatures by 3-5°C likely over Northwest India during next 2 days; gradual rise by 3-5°C thereafter.
- Gradual fall in minimum temperatures by 2-4°C likely over Central India during next 2 days; no significant change during next 24 hours and gradual rise by 2-4°C during subsequent 4 days.
- Gradual fall in minimum temperatures by 2-3°C likely over north Maharashtra during next 2 days; gradual rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 3 days and no significant change thereafter.
- Gradual fall in minimum temperatures by 3-5°C likely over Gujarat during next 24 hours; gradual rise by 2-4°C during subsequent 3 days and no significant change thereafter.
- No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

Dense Fog, Cold wave & Cold day Warnings:

- **Dense fog** conditions also likely during morning/night hours in isolated pockets over Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 28th-30th; Uttarakhand on 29th & 30th; Uttar Pradesh, North Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Bihar on 28th & 29th January.
- **Cold wave** conditions likely in isolated pockets over Himachal Pradesh during 29th-31st; Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh during 28th-31st January.

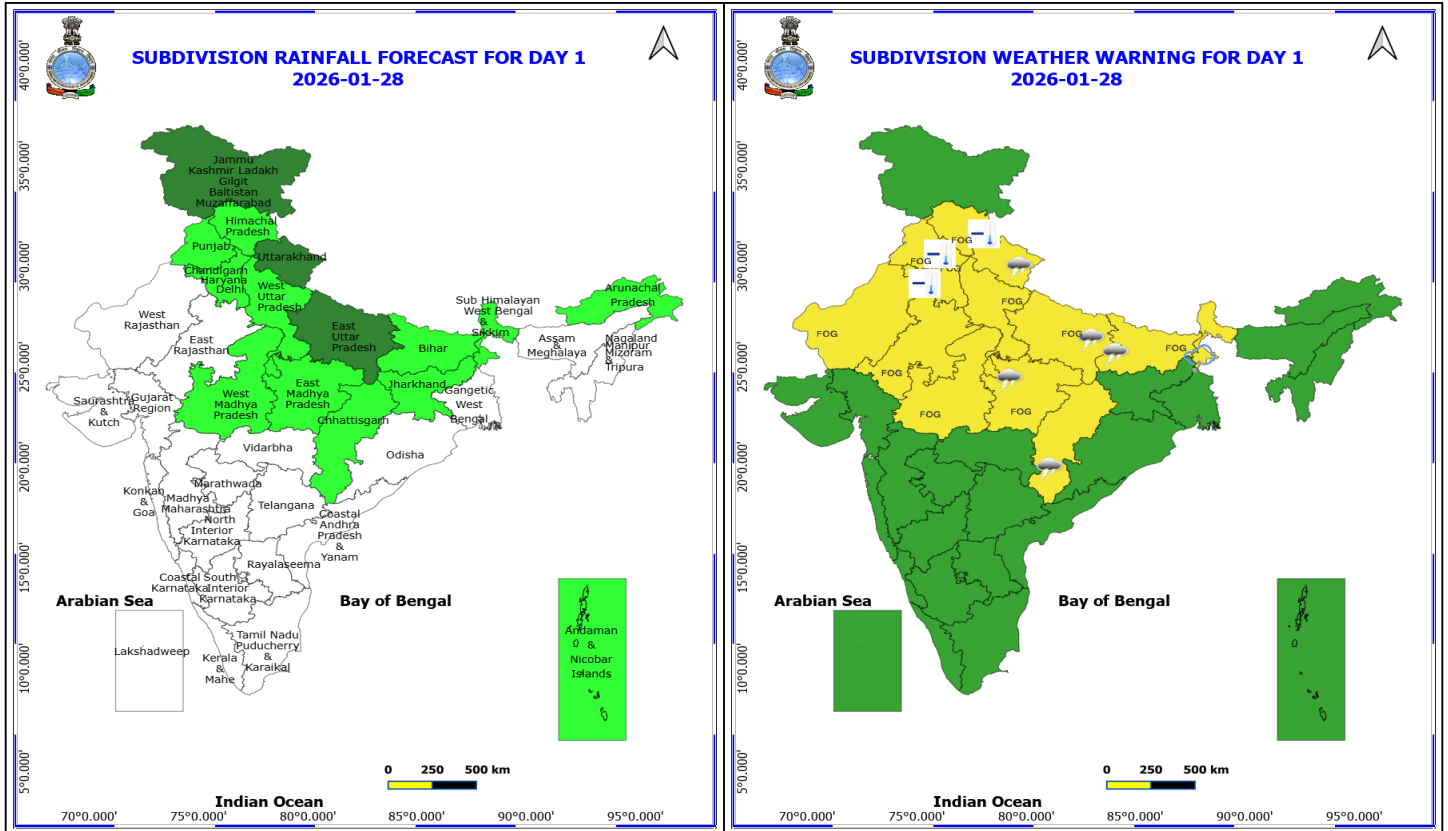
- ❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Uttarakhand; **at many places** over West Madhya Pradesh, East Rajasthan, East Uttar Pradesh and Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi; **Dry** over rest of the country.

- ❖ **Fog Condition Observed (at 0530 hours of today):** **Very dense fog conditions:** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam **Moderate fog conditions:** at isolated places over Odisha and Bihar **Shallow fog conditions:** at many places over Punjab, at a few places over Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh, at isolated places over Odisha and Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh
- ❖ **Visibility reported (at 0530 hours of today):** Assam & Meghalaya: Barapani/shillong (dist East Khasi Hills) 0.0; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam: Vijayawada-gannavaram (dist Krishna) 0.0; Odisha: Paradip Port (dist Jagatsinghapur) 200.0; Bihar: Gaya (dist Gaya) 200.0;.
- ❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 27-01-2026):** **below normal(-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** at few places over Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **appreciably below normal(-5.0°C to -3.1°C)** at isolated places over West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and South Interior Karnataka. **markedly below normal(< -5.0°C)** at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, West Madhya Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 4.5°C was reported at ALWAR (RAJASTHAN) over the Plains of India.
- ❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 27-01-2026):** **below normal(-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** at isolated places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad. **appreciably below normal(-5.0°C to -3.1°C)** at many places over Punjab. **The highest maximum temperature** of 36.0°C was reported at KOTTAYAM (KERALA).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Western Disturbance** as a **cyclonic circulation** over north Pakistan & neighbourhood now lies over Jammu & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level with the trough aloft in middle & upper troposphere westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 74°E to the north of Lat. 22°N.
- The **trough from** northeast Arabian sea to north Punjab now runs from Vidarbha to Northeast Uttar Pradesh across East Madhya Pradesh at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 130 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level prevails over North India.
- A fresh **western disturbance** is likely to affect northwest India from the night of 30th January 2026.
- The induced **cyclonic circulation** over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

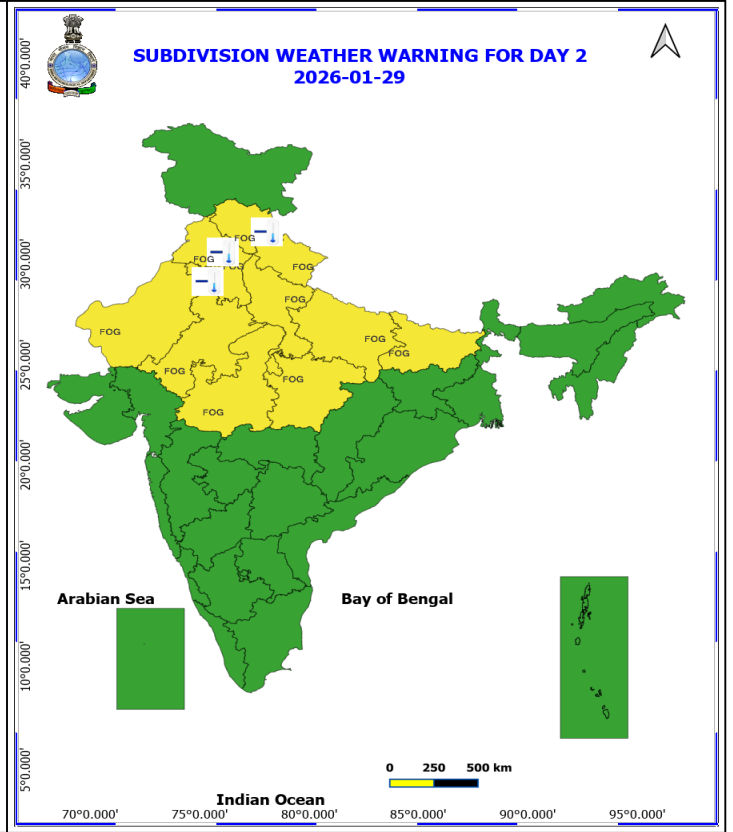
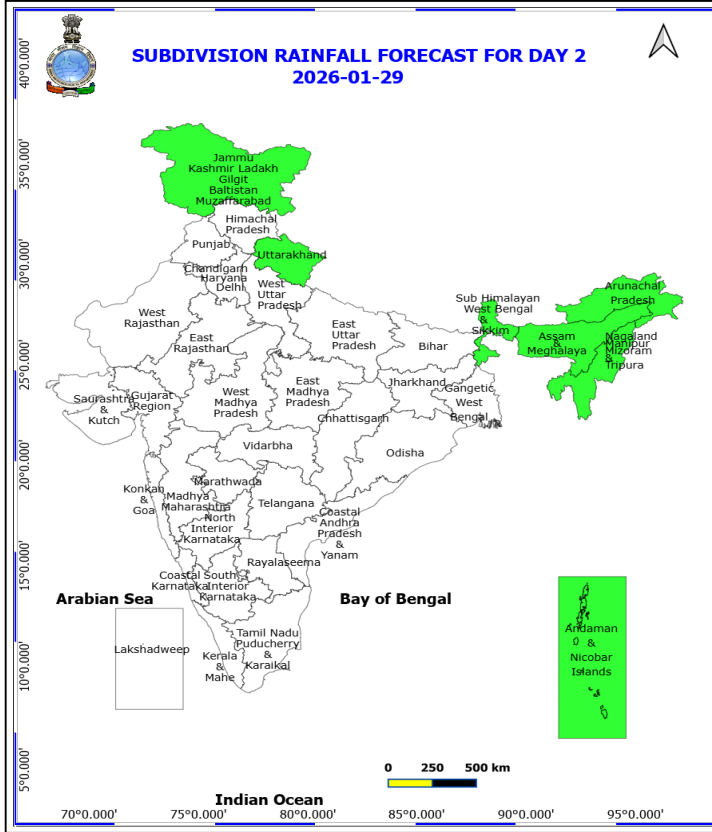
- Isolated/Scattered rainfall/snowfall activity likely over Western Himalayan Region.

Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-01-27

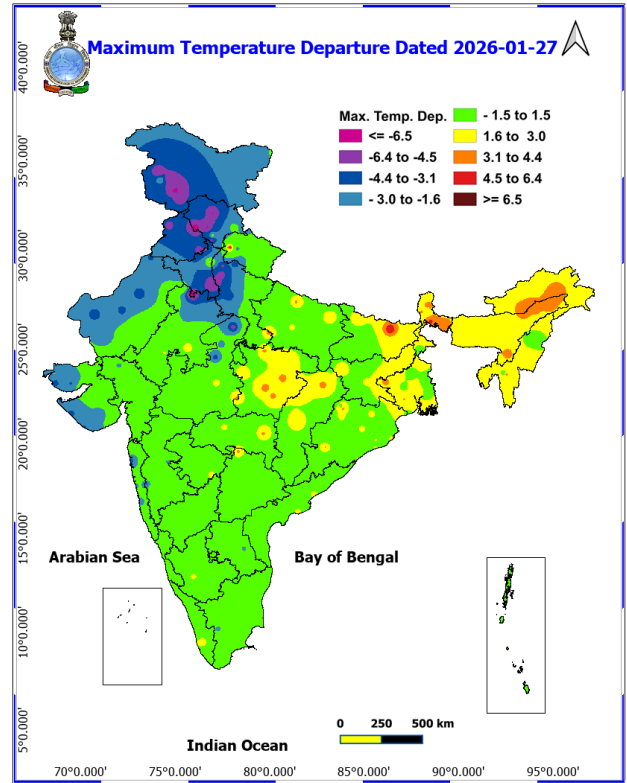
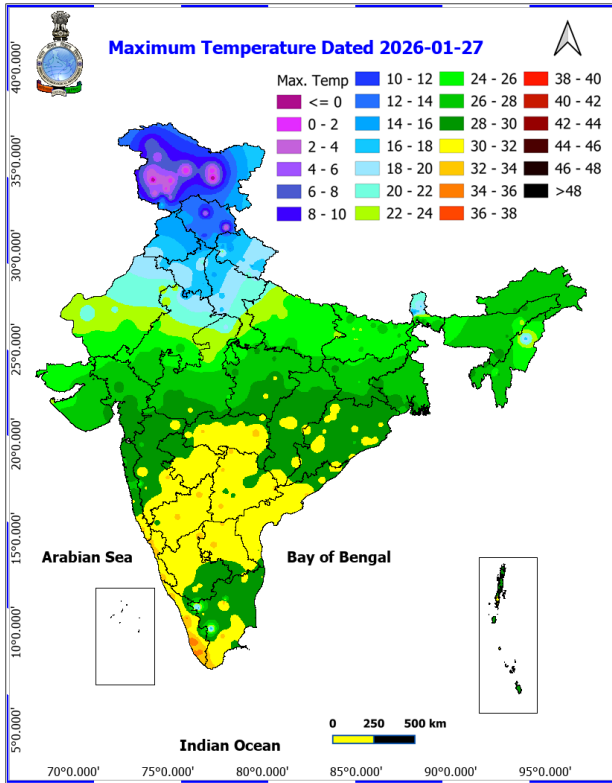
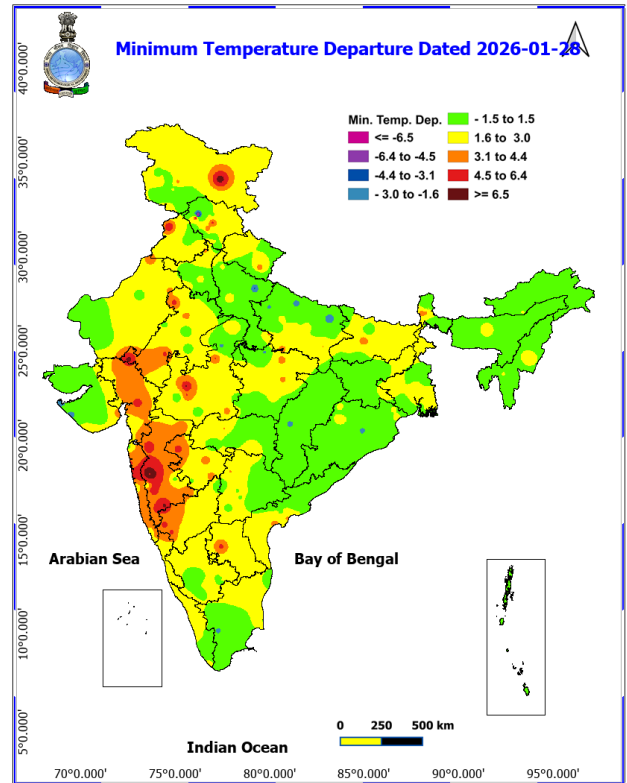
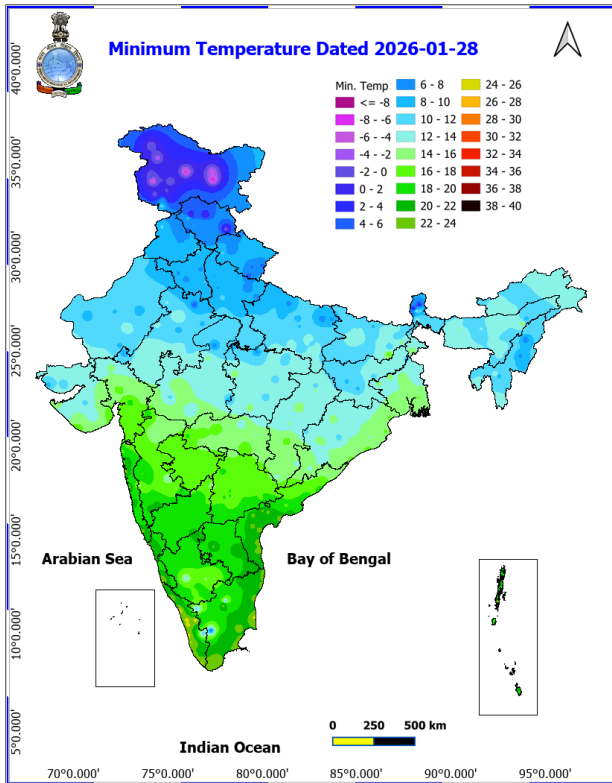


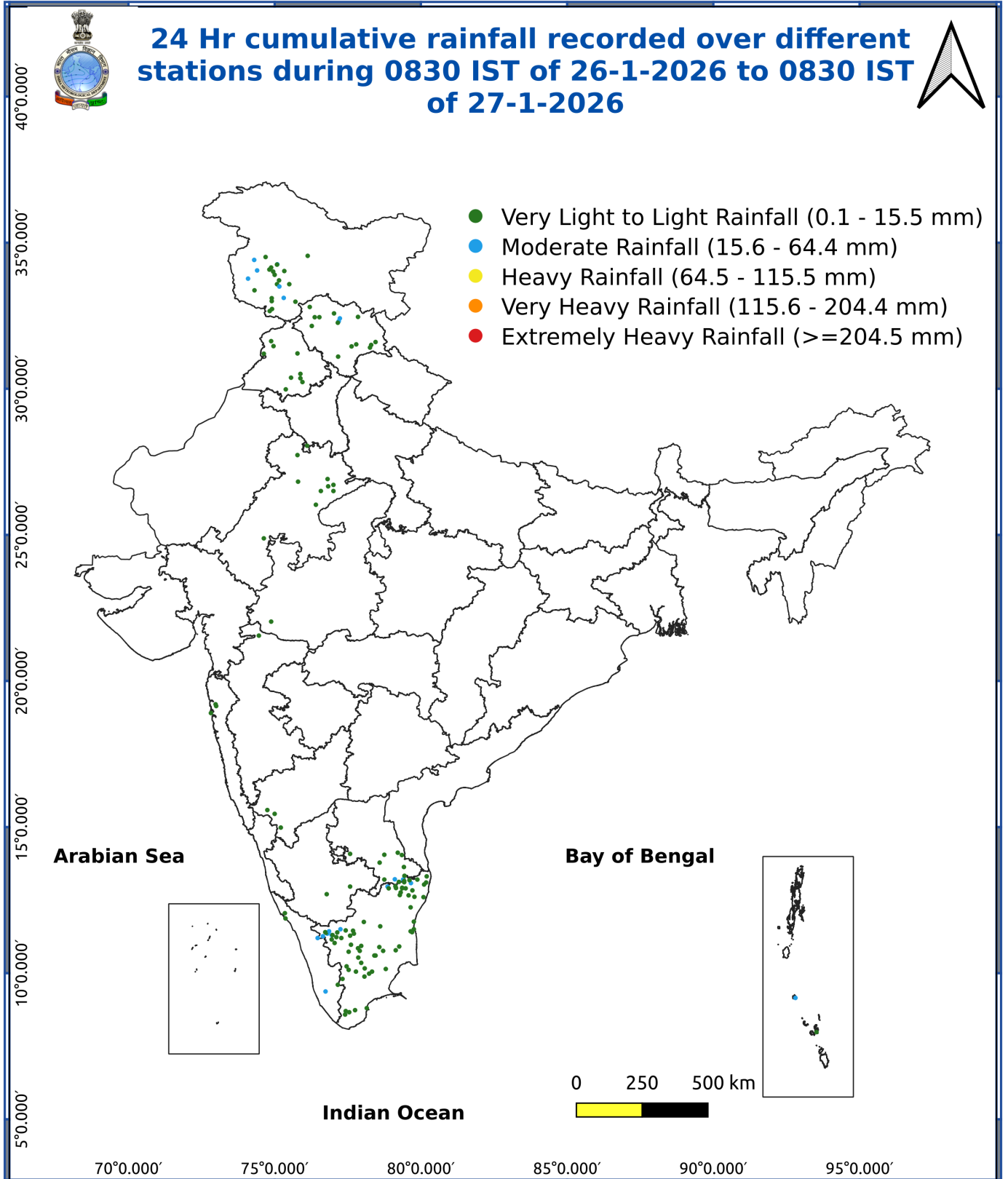
Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-01-27

Impact and Actions

Impact expected due to dense/very dense fog in the morning hours:

- **Dense fog** conditions also likely during morning/night hours in isolated pockets over Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 28th-30th; Uttarakhand on 29th & 30th; Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan and Bihar on 28th & 29th January.

Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

Action suggested:

Transport and Aviation:

- Be careful while driving or outing through any transport.
- Use fog lights during driving.
- Be in touch with airlines, railways and state transport for schedule of your journey.
- Power Sector:
 - To keep ready Maintenance Team.
- Human Health: To avoid outing until unless emergency and to cover the face.

Impact expected due to Cold Wave/Severe Cold wave conditions:

Cold wave conditions likely in isolated pockets over Himachal Pradesh during 29th-31st; Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh during 28th-31st January.

- An increased likelihood of various illnesses like flu, running/ stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold.
- Do not ignore shivering. It is the first sign that the body is losing heat. Get Indoors.
- Frostbite can occur due to prolonged exposure to cold. The skin turns pale, hard and numb and eventually black blisters appear on exposed body parts such as fingers, toes, nose and or earlobes. Severe frostbite needs immediate medical attention and treatment.

- Impact on agriculture, crop, livestock, water supply, transport and power sector at some places.

Action suggested:

- Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing.
- Cover your head, neck, hands and toes adequately as majority of heat loss occurs through these body parts. Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing rather than one layer of heavy cloth.
- Eat vitamin-C rich fruits & vegetable and drink sufficient fluids preferably warm fluids to maintain adequate immunity.
- Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.
- Protect livestock from cold weather

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

In **Jammu & Kashmir**, ensure proper drainage to drain out excess water from wheat, mustard, chickpea, pea and vegetables fields.

In **Himachal Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage to drain out excessrainwater from the fields of wheat, barley, onion, garden pea, potato, garlic, spinach, radish, turnip, coriander, cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli and fruit orchards.

In **Uttarakhand**, ensure proper drainage to drain out excess water from the fields of wheat, barley, lentil, chickpea, mustard, rapeseed, vegetable and plantations crops.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Hailstorm

Use hail nets to protect orchards and vegetable plants in Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Cold Waves / Low Temperatures

In **Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and Haryana**, apply light and frequent irrigation to the standing crops in the evening hours to protect crops from low temperature stress. Use mulching and cover the vegetable nurseries and young fruit plants with straw / polythene sheets to maintain optimum soil temperature.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall/ Hailstorm period and provide them balanced feed. Store feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- To protect from cold, keep cattle inside the sheds during night and provide dry bedding. Also keep the chicks warm by providing artificial light in the poultry sheds.

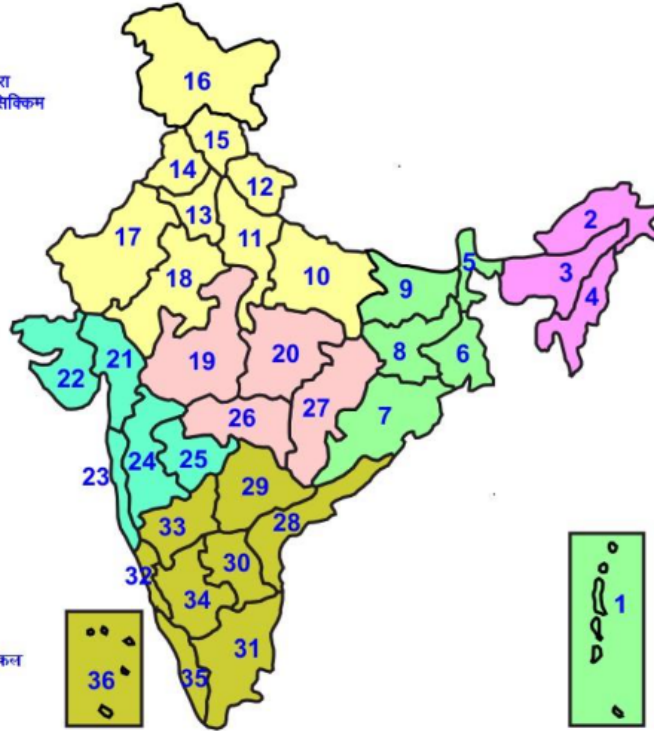

Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave : When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .

Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)
Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
