Significant Weather Features

Weather Forecast and Warnings :

Northwest India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm lightning likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 23rd-24th September; Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand during 19th-24th September.

- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh & East Madhya Pradesh on 24th September; Chhattisgarh during 22nd-24th September.

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 19th-24th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 19th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 19th-20th September and during 23rd-24th September; Jharkhand on 24th September; Odisha during 22nd-24th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm lightning likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 20th-24th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 21st-22nd September; Jharkhand during 19th-23rd September; Bihar during 19th-24th September; Odisha during 19th-21st September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 20th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 19th September and on 24th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 23rd-24th September; Odisha on 19th September and on 22nd September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 19th September; Odisha during 23rd-24th September.

Northeast India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 19th-23rd September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 19th September and during 21st-23rd September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya on 24th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 20th September and on 24th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 19th-20th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 19th-20th September.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 21st-24th September; Madhya Maharashtra during 21st-22nd September; Gujarat Region on 19th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 19th-20th September; Madhya Maharashtra

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during 19th-20th September and during 23rd-24th September; Marathwada during 19th-24th September; Gujarat Region during 20th-24th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 19th-23rd September.

- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Konkan & Goa during 21st-22nd September; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada during 20th-22nd September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Konkan & Goa during 19th-20th September; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada on 19th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Gujarat Region during 19th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa during 21st-22nd September; Madhya Maharashtra during 20th-22nd September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 19th-24th September; Coastal Karnataka on 19th September; North Interior Karnataka, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 19th-22nd September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 19th-24th September; Coastal Karnataka during 20th-24th September; North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 19th-24th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 23rd-24th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 19th-22nd September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 20th-22nd September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Coastal Karnataka during 21st-22nd September; North Interior Karnataka during 20th-22nd September; South Interior Karnataka during 19th-22nd September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema on 19th September; Telangana during 19th-22nd September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 19th-20th September; Lakshadweep and North Interior Karnataka on 19th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 19th-22nd September; Kerala & Mahe during 19th-20th September and on 24th September; Coastal Karnataka and North Interior Karnataka during 20th-24th September; South Interior Karnataka during 19th-24th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 19th-20th September and during 23rd-24th September; Rayalaseema on 19th September; Telangana during 19th-24th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 19th-22nd September.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Vidarbha, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Chhattisgarh, North Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; **at many places** over Assam & Meghalaya, East Rajasthan, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, West Rajasthan, West Uttar Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Madhya Maharashtra, East Madhya Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, South Interior Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Gujarat Region; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Vidarbha:** Nagpur-sonagaon Airport (dist Nagpur) 6; **Andaman & Nicobar Islands:** Port Blair (dist South Andaman) 6.

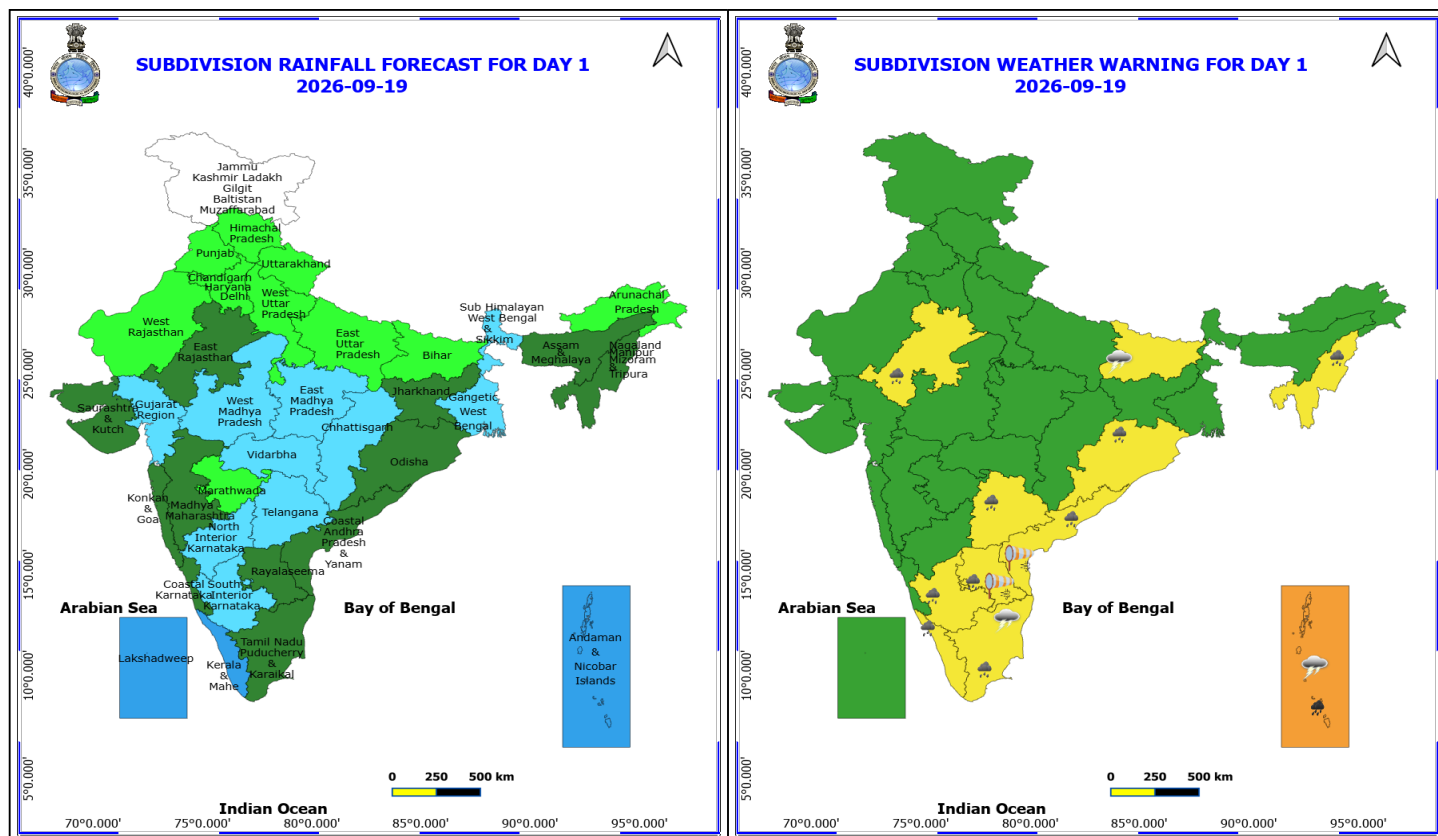
❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 18-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Lakshadweep; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Uttarakhand, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka and North Interior Karnataka; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, Bihar, Punjab, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Uttarakhand. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 16.6°C was reported at MANDI (HIMACHAL PRADESH) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 18-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Uttarakhand, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Jharkhand, Konkan & Goa and Coastal Karnataka; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura; at isolated places over Bihar, Himachal Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and West Rajasthan; at few places over West Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Gujarat Region. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.1°C was reported at PALAYAMKOTTAI (TAMIL NADU).



Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- Conditions are becoming favourable for **withdrawal of Southwest Monsoon** from some parts of West Rajasthan today, the 19th September, 2026.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Gujarat & neighbourhood now lies over West Madhya Pradesh and adjoining Gujarat region between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper-air cyclonic circulation** over north Andaman Sea & neighbourhood persists over the same region and now extends upto 5.8 km above mean sea level at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 19th September, 2026. Under its influence, a **Low Pressure** area is likely to form over the same region around the evening of today, the 19th September, 2026. Thereafter, it is likely to intensify gradually and move west-northwestwards towards south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh coasts during subsequent 3-4 days.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 78°E to the north of Lat. 26°N.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Bangladesh & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from Marathwada to Southeast Arabian Sea across Interior Karnataka and Kerala at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over central parts of Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over southern parts of Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining parts of north Odisha at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** from Sikkim to North Bay of Bengal across Bangladesh at 1.5 km mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Sikkim & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over North Interior Tamil Nadu & neighbourhood at 4.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-18

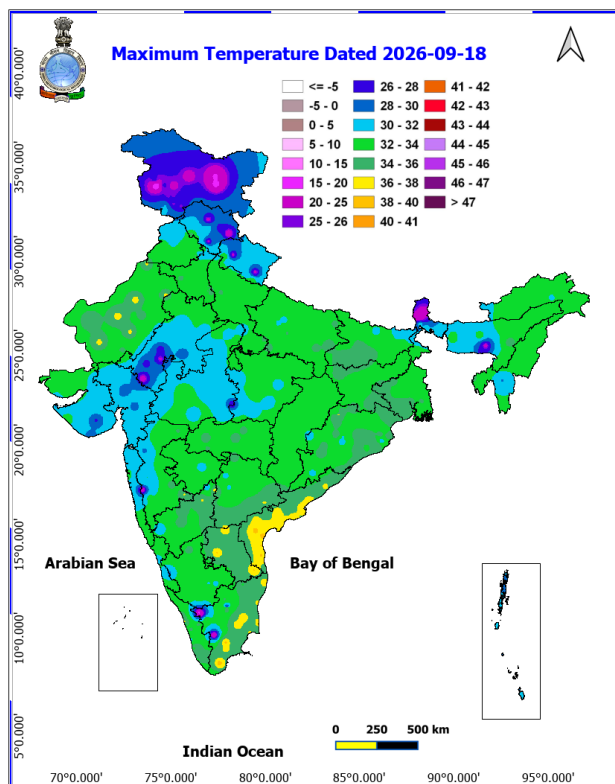


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-18

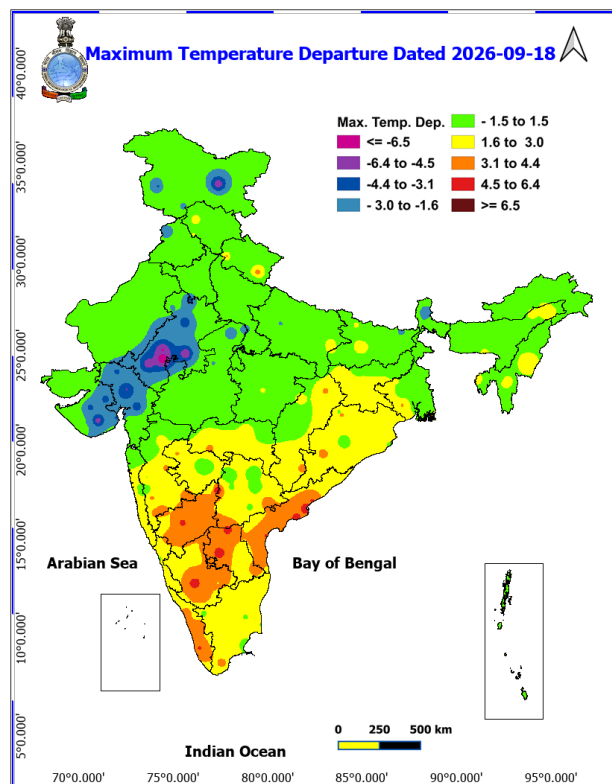


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-18

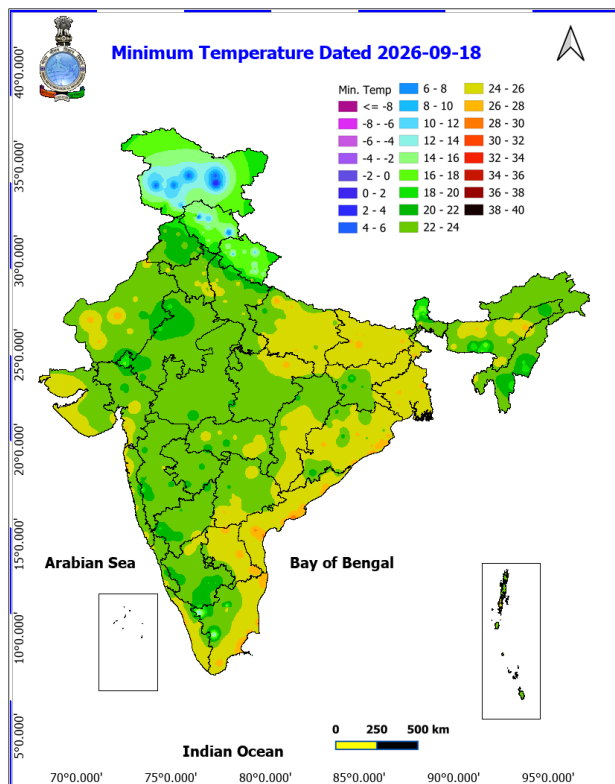
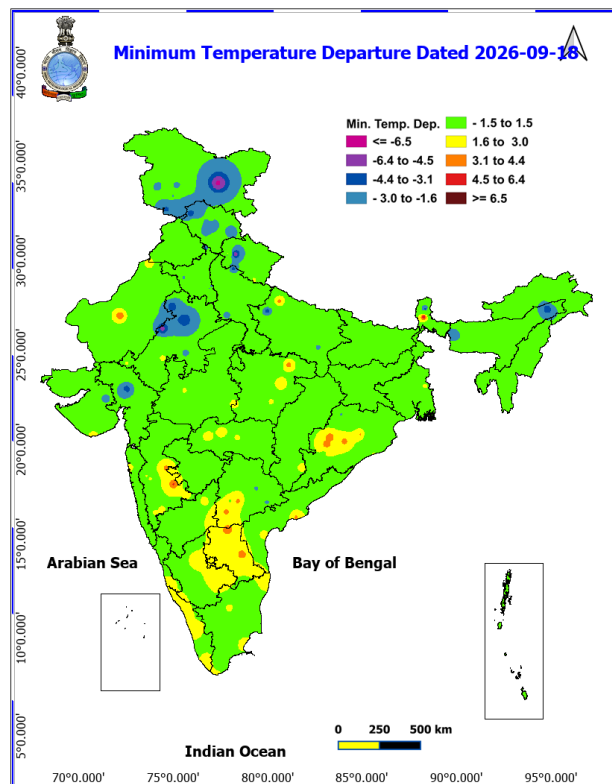


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-18

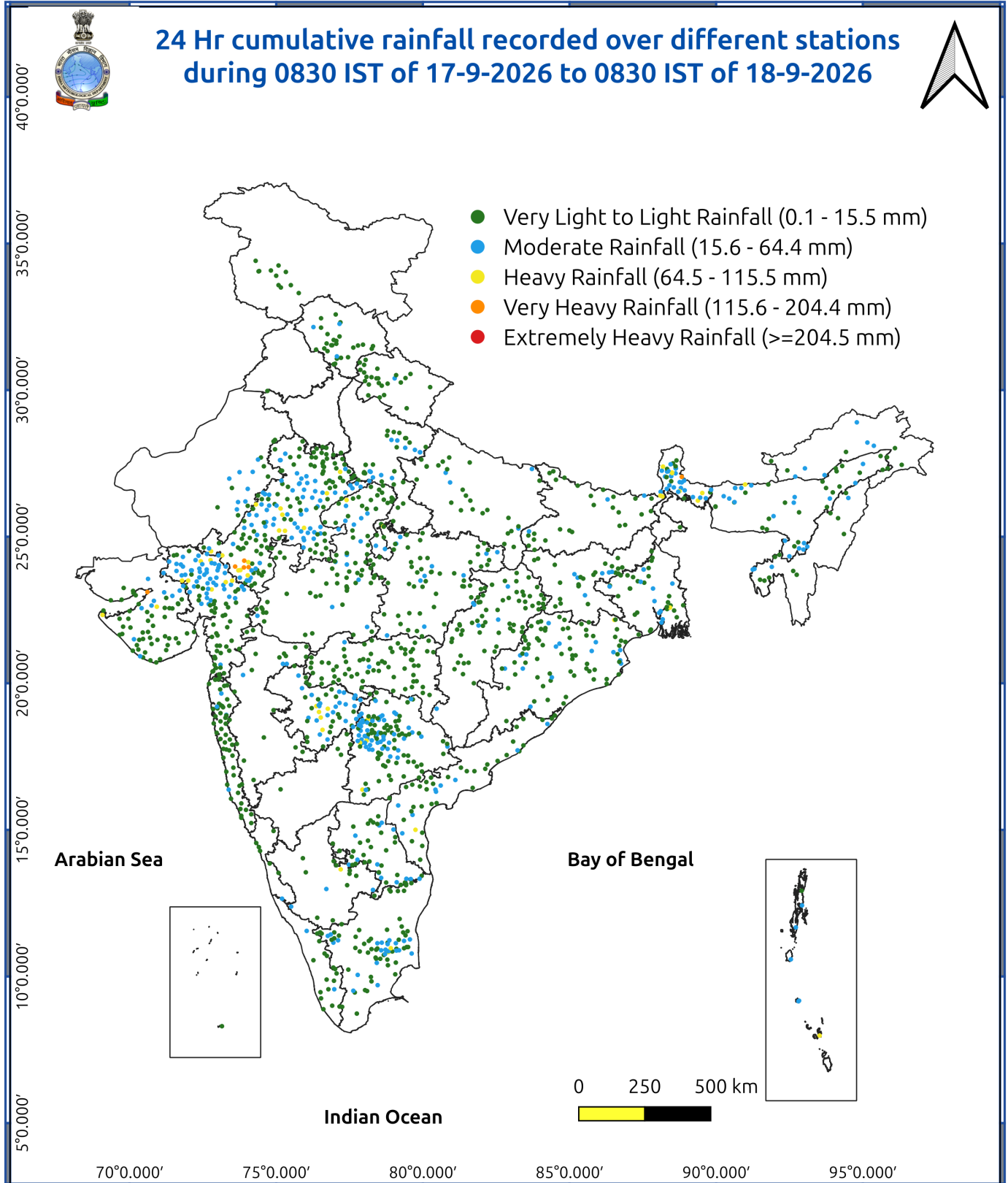


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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- Isolated very heavy rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 19th September; Odisha during 23rd-24th September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall:

- In **Andaman & Nicobar**, provide mechanical support to banana & papaya plantations and staking to young plants and vegetables. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- In **Assam & Meghalaya**, drain excess water from maize, black gram, green gram and sesame fields and keep drainage channels clear. Maintain suitable water levels in rice, support papaya, banana and weak-stemmed crops, and harvest pumpkins and bottle gourd before the rains wherever possible.
- In **Mizoram**, prepare fields for sowing black gram, green gram, soybean, sesame and lentil after maize harvest. Ensure drainage in ginger fields and prevent water stagnation to minimise soft-rot and rhizome-rot incidence.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim**, maintain safe water levels in rice and clear drainage channels in rice and green gram fields. Drain excess water from rice fields, protect pointed gourd.
- In **Odisha**, make immediate arrangements to drain excess water from rice, maize, millets, ginger, turmeric, vegetables, pulses and orchards. Protect vegetable nurseries, provide staking to vegetables and undertake earthing-up around newly planted banana saplings; postpone field operations until rainfall ceases and soil conditions become suitable.
- In **Telangana, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Rayalseema** provide mechanical support to banana & papaya plantations and staking to young plants and vegetables. Undertake propping in sugarcane. Postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and application of plant protection measures & fertilizers to the standing crops. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- West Madhya Pradesh** - Ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging. Provide support to vulnerable plants and undertake propping in tall sugarcane to minimize

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lodging.

- In **East Rajasthan**, provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging. provide mechanical support to banana & papaya plantations and staking to young plants and vegetables. Undertake propping in sugarcane.
- In **Madhya Maharashtra**, postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and application of plant protection measures & fertilizers to the standing crops. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- In **Gujarat**, avoid irrigation, fertilizer/top dressing and interculturing during wet conditions and ensure proper drainage. Undertake plant-protection operations only after rainfall ceases and a sufficiently rain-free, calm window is available WMP
- In **Bihar**, avoid pesticide/fungicide spraying during rainy conditions and undertake plant-protection measures only during a clear, dry spell.
- In **South Interior Karnataka**, Protect harvested produce by keeping it in safe, covered storage, and secure farm structures and equipment. Postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and application of plant protection measures & fertilizers to the standing crops. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- In **Tamil Nadu**, drain excess water from standing crop fields and avoid fertilizer and pesticide applications during rainfall, particularly where heavy rainfall was received yesterday. Provide support to banana plants and prop sugarcane against lodging.
- In **Kerala**, ensure effective drainage in banana, black pepper, coconut, ginger and turmeric fields following the recent rainfall and provide strong support to banana plants and trellis-grown crops. Postpone all field operations until rainfall ceases and soil conditions become suitable.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

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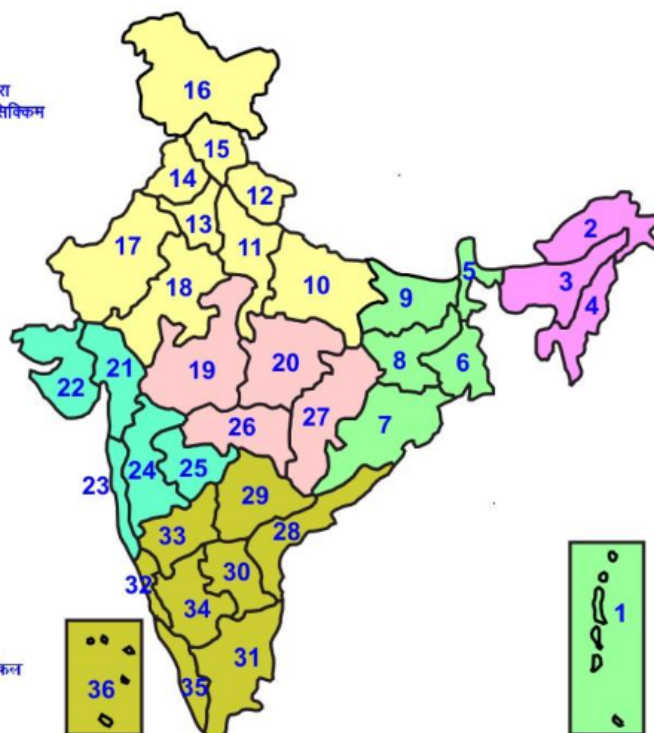
