Significant Weather Features

Weather Warning and Forecast

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 15th-17th September.

- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 14th September.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 16th-20th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 14th-20th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 16th-20th September; Bihar during 16th-17th September; Odisha on 14th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Gangetic West Bengal during 14th-15th September; Jharkhand during 14th-20th September; Bihar during 14th-15th September and during 18th-20th September; Odisha during 15th-20th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 16th-20th September; Bihar during 15th-17th September; Odisha during 14th-17th September.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 14th-17th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 18th-20th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 14th-17th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 14th-16th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 14th-17th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 14th-16th September.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Saurashtra & Kutch during 14th-15th September.

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- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Saurashtra & Kutch during 16th-20th September; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 14th-20th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 14th-15th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 14th September; Saurashtra & Kutch on 15th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Konkan & Goa, Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch on 14th September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 14th-20th September; Kerala & Mahe during 16th-20th September; Coastal Karnataka on 15th September; North Interior Karnataka on 14th September and during 17th-20th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana during 14th-20th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe during 14th-15th September; Lakshadweep during 14th-20th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 14th-17th September; South Interior Karnataka during 14th-16th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 14th-15th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 14th-16th September; Telangana during 14th-15th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Telangana on 14th September; Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe during 14th-16th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 14th-15th September.

Fishermen Warning:

- **Arabian Sea:** Along and off Gujarat coasts adjoining northeast Arabian Sea till 16th September; along and off Somalia coasts, few parts of southwest adjoining westcentral Arabian Sea till 18th September;
- **Bay of Bengal:** Over few parts of south Bay of Bengal on 15th September; over some parts of southeast adjoining southwest Bay of Bengal and over Andaman Sea during 16th to 18th September.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Telangana, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, West Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Gujarat Region, Uttarakhand, Chhattisgarh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Marathwada and Andaman & Nicobar Islands; **at many places** over East Uttar Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, East Rajasthan, Arunachal Pradesh, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Bihar, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, East Madhya Pradesh, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Telangana:** Hyderabad (dist Hyderabad) 9; **Konkan & Goa:** Mumbai (santacruz) AP (dist) 9; **Gujarat Region:** Ahmedabad (dist Ahmedabad) 6; **Uttarakhand:** Dehra Dun-mokampur (dist Dehradun) 5.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Heavy rain** at a few places over Konkan & Goa and Telangana.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 13-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, East Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan and Rayalaseema. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.5°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 13-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Coastal Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Punjab and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch and Telangana. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Jharkhand; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal and East Rajasthan; at few places over West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Konkan & Goa; at isolated places over Vidarbha. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.9°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN).

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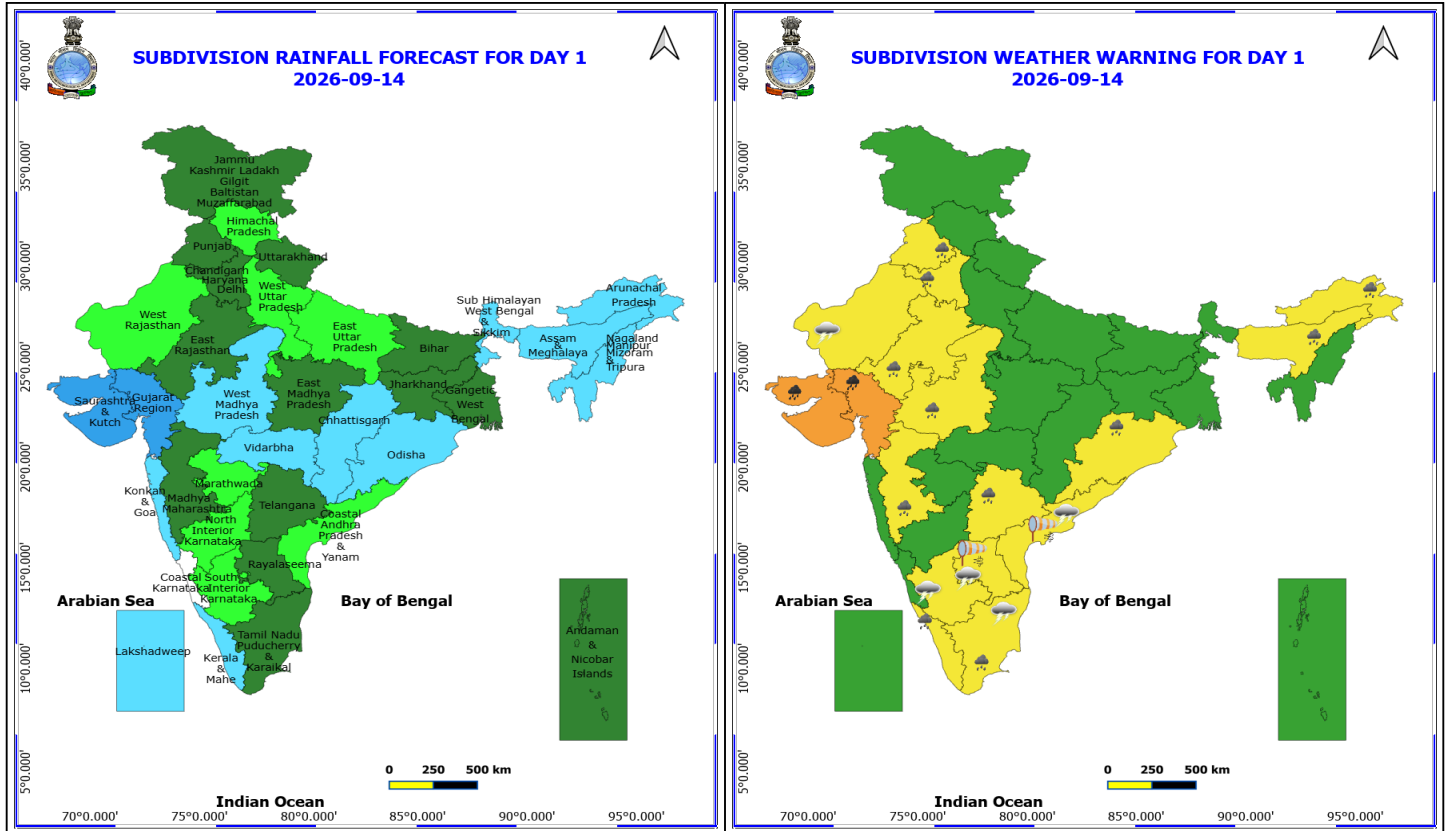
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low Pressure Area** over Southwest Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood lay over Southeast Rajasthan and adjoining Gujarat Region & Southwest Madhya Pradesh at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 14th September 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extending up to 5.8 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height. It is likely to move west-northwestwards across South Rajasthan & North Gujarat during next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Deesha, centre of **Low Pressure Area** over Southeast Rajasthan and adjoining Gujarat Region & Southwest Madhya Pradesh, Bhopal, Jabalpur, Daltonganj, Digha and thence southeastwards to Northeast Bay of Bengal.
- The **trough** now runs from Eastcentral Arabian Sea to Bihar across Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, north Chhattisgarh & Jharkhand and extends upto 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- A **trough** runs from the cyclonic circulation associated with the **Low Pressure area** over Southeast Rajasthan and adjoining Gujarat Region & Southwest Madhya Pradesh to Westcentral Bay of Bengal across Southwest Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Telangana, South Coastal Andhra Pradesh at 4.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & neighbourhood persists and now seen at 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** south Tamil Nadu coast & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Konkan adjoining Eastcentral Arabian sea at 7.6 km above mean sea level has merged with the cyclonic circulation associated with the Low Pressure area over Southeast Rajasthan and adjoining Gujarat Region & Southwest Madhya Pradesh.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 75°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Northwest Bay of Bengal & neighbourhood between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level.

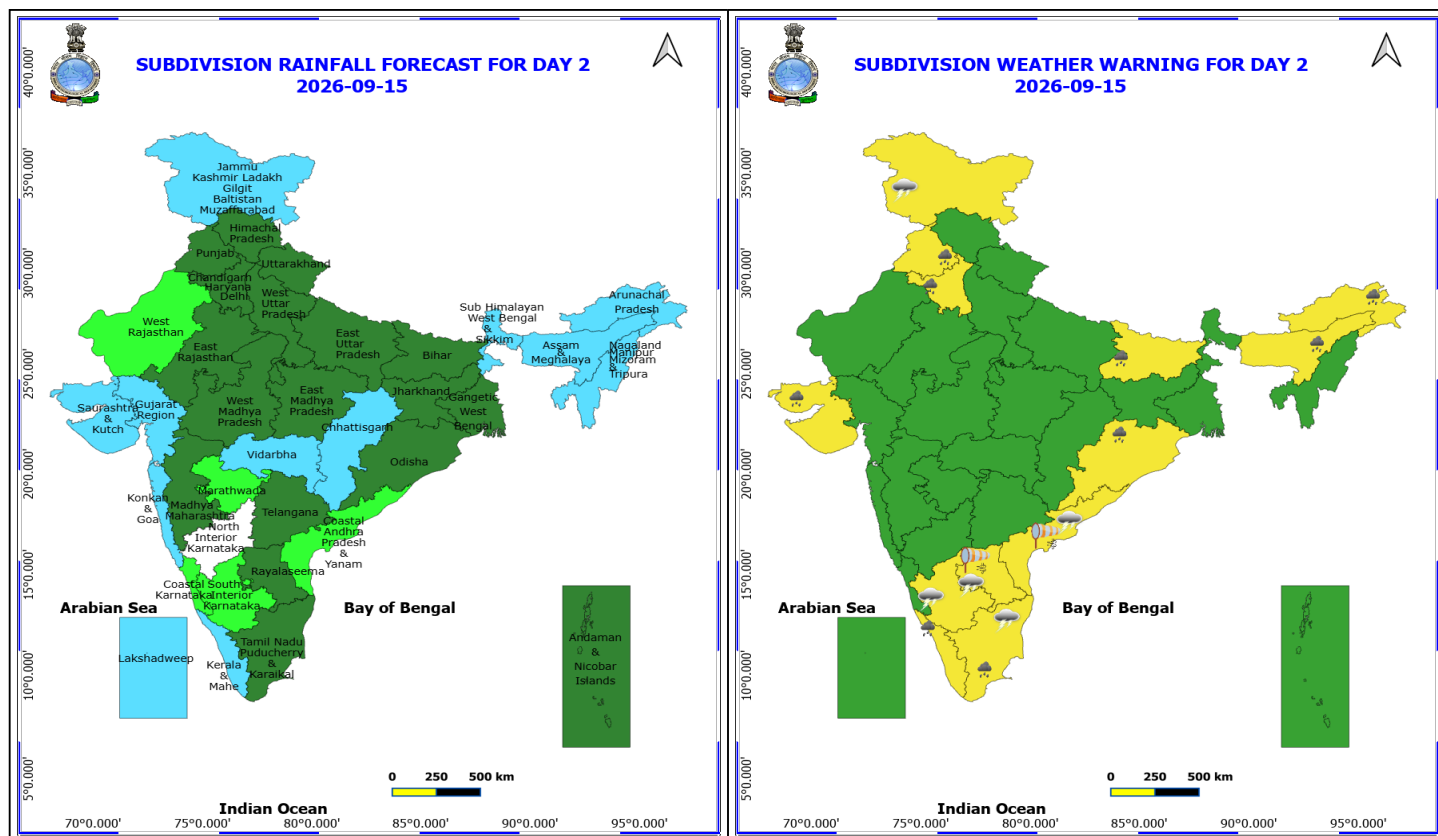

- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia coasts adjoining few parts of southwest Arabian Sea.
- ❖ **Squally weather** with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Gujarat coasts adjoining northeast Arabian Sea and north Maharashtra coasts adjoining eastcentral Arabian sea.

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-13

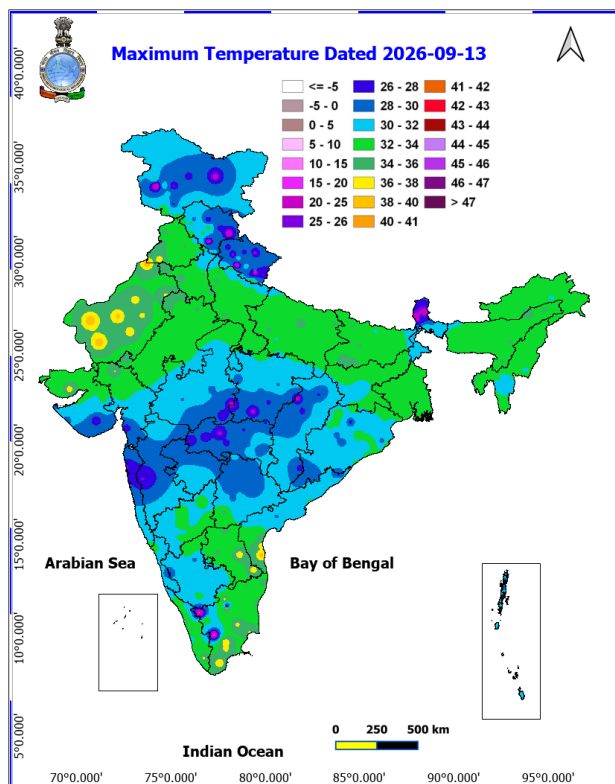


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-13

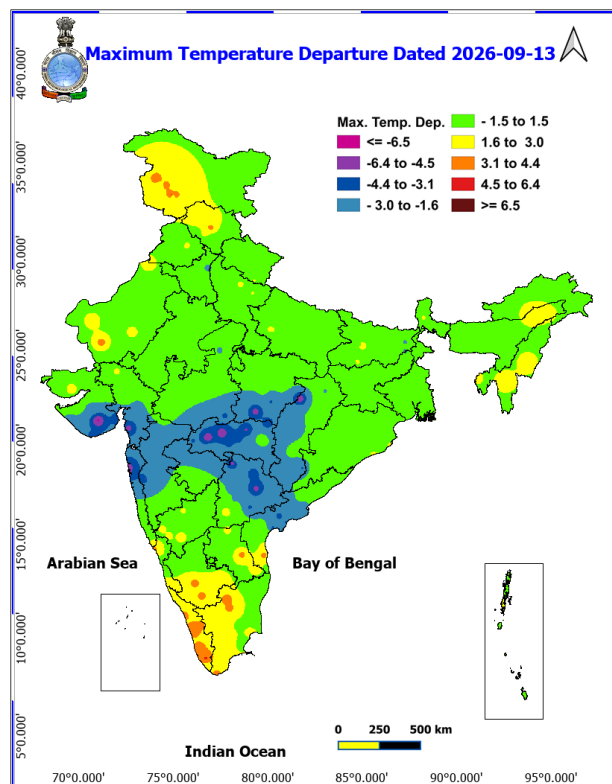


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-13

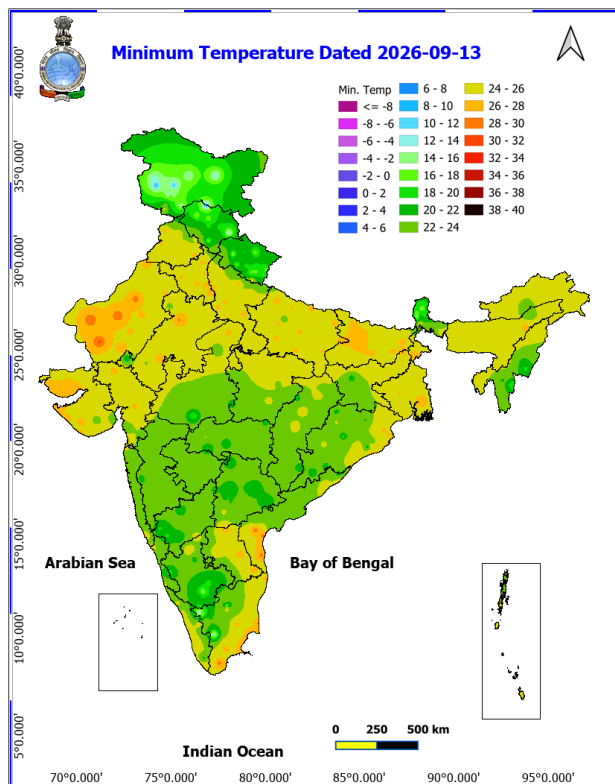
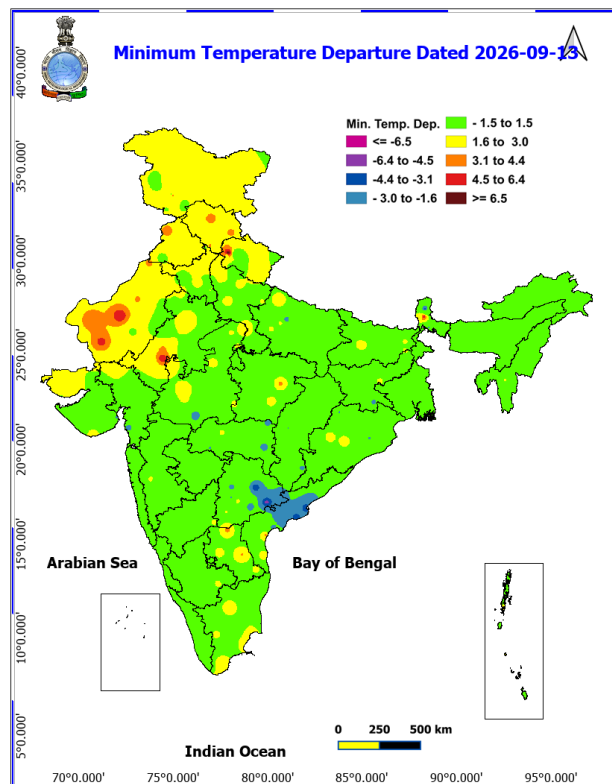
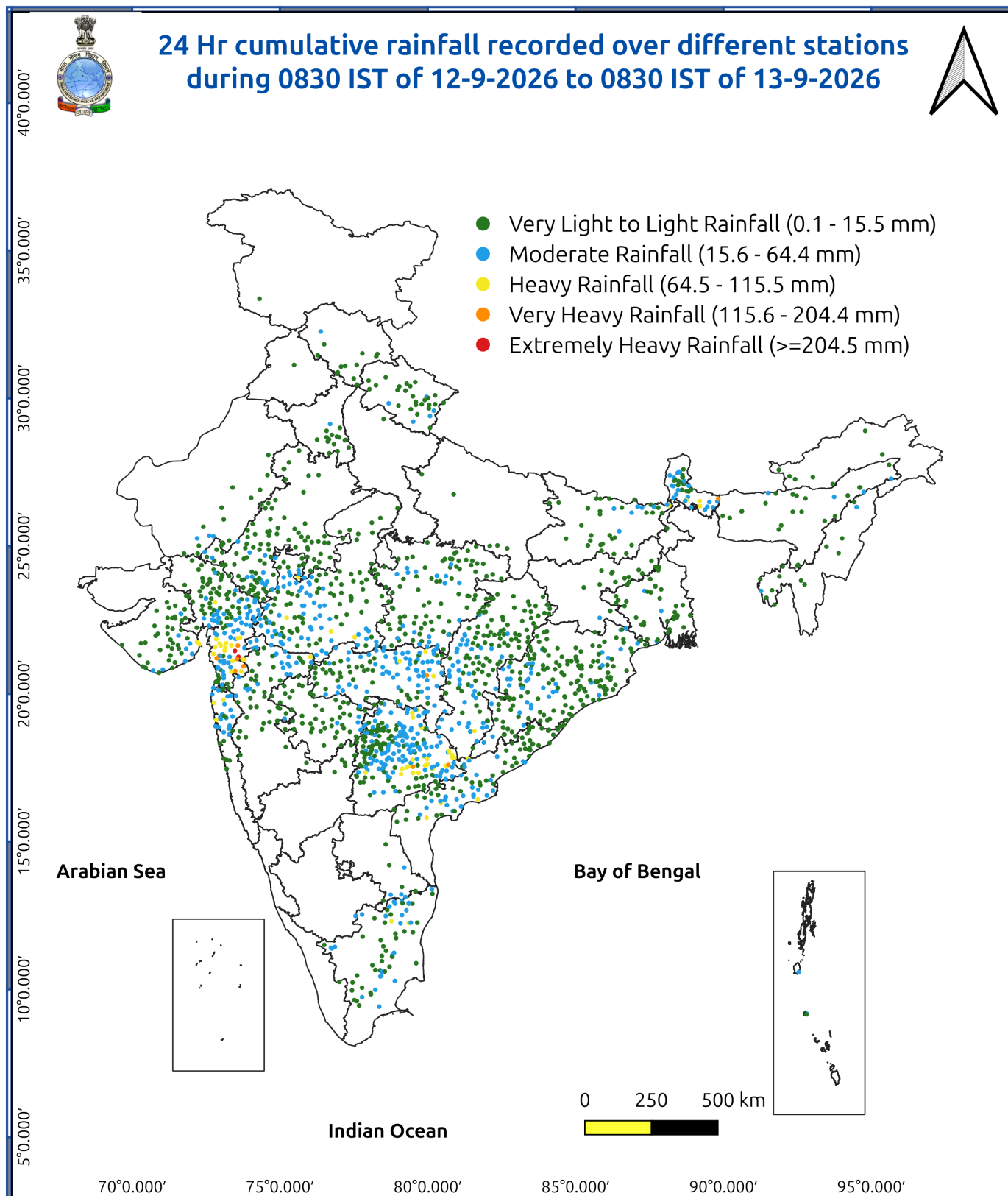


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-13





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- Isolated very heavy rainfall likely over Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch on 14th September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Gujarat**, ensure continuous and effective drainage to remove excess water from sugarcane, cotton, rice, pigeon pea, castor, sorghum, maize and groundnut fields. Prevent lodging of tall sugarcane by tying canes with dry leaves or bamboo sticks, and postpone irrigation, fertilizer application and plant-protection operations during wet conditions.
- In **West Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Konkan and Goa**, drain out excess rainwater from rice, finger millet, turmeric, groundnut, vegetables and orchards and keep drainage channels clear. Manage rice at the panicle initiation/flowering stage by preventing prolonged water stagnation and postpone field operations during wet conditions.
- In **Madhya Maharashtra**, harvest matured green gram and black gram and keep the produce at safer places. Drain excess water from finger millet, groundnut, vegetables and orchards and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and fertilizer or plant-protection applications in saturated fields.
- In **Saurashtra and Kutch**, ensure adequate drainage in standing kharif crops to prevent waterlogging and avoid irrigation and fertilizer application during wet conditions. Monitor major kharif crops for pest and disease incidence and undertake plant-protection measures only during a sufficiently rain-free period.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, harvest mature upland/Jhum rice, soybean and vegetables and immediately shift the produce to safe, covered shelters. Maintain drainage in millet fields and strengthen trellises and supports for cucumber and other gourds to minimise damage from heavy rain.
- In **Assam and Meghalaya**, drain excess water from maize, black gram, green gram and sesame fields and maintain proper water levels in rice. Provide support to papaya, banana and weak-stemmed crops; harvest

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pumpkins and bottle gourd before rainfall where possible and maintain proper drainage in rice, maize and vegetable fields.

- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal** and **Sikkim**, maintain safe water levels in rice and keep drainage channels clear in rice and green gram fields to prevent waterlogging. Protect pointed gourd and other vulnerable vegetables from heavy rain and monitor tomato, chilli, ginger and cucurbits for disease under prolonged humid conditions.
- In **Punjab**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and fertilizer or plant-protection applications during wet conditions. Protect cotton during the flowering and fruiting stages from prolonged waterlogging and harvest mature pearl millet wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Haryana**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and fertilizer or plant-protection applications during wet conditions..
- In **East Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, maize, pulses and vegetable fields and avoid unnecessary irrigation during wet conditions. In soybean at pod-forming stage and maize at silking/flowering stage, postpone plant-protection and fertilizer operations until clear, dry conditions; undertake earthing-up in maize where field conditions permit.
- In **Marathwada**, harvest matured maize, green gram and black gram and keep the produce at safer places. Drain excess water from kharif crops, orchards, vegetables and floricultural crops.
- In **Vidarbha**, harvest matured green gram and black gram as early as possible and keep the produce at safer places. Drain excess water from rice, soybean, cotton, pigeon pea, maize, vegetable fields and orchards; protect newly planted orchards and vegetables with mechanical support.
- In **Odisha**, drain out excess rainwater immediately from rice, maize, millets, ginger, turmeric, vegetables, pulses and orchards and keep drainage channels clear. Cover vegetable nurseries, undertake earthing-up in newly planted banana and provide staking to vegetables; continue field operations only after rainfall stops and the soil becomes workable.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Keep rice bunds intact while providing outlets for excess water, support vulnerable crops, and harvest matured Naga chillies and Aus rice wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Coastal Andhra Pradesh**, drain excess water from rice, groundnut, maize, kodo millet, turmeric, coffee plantations, orchards and vegetables and avoid field operations when the soil is sticky. Provide bamboo props or ties to banana plants to prevent lodging and pseudostem snapping during strong winds and rain.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

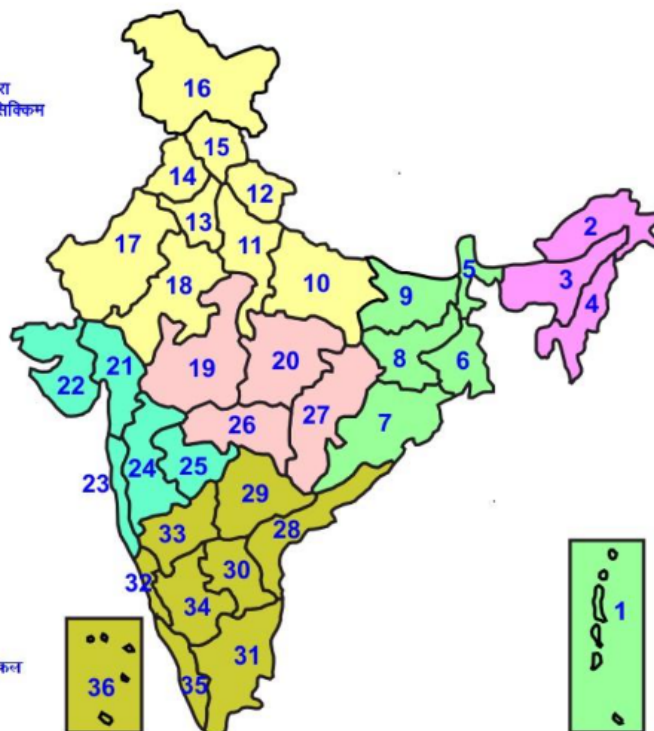
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
