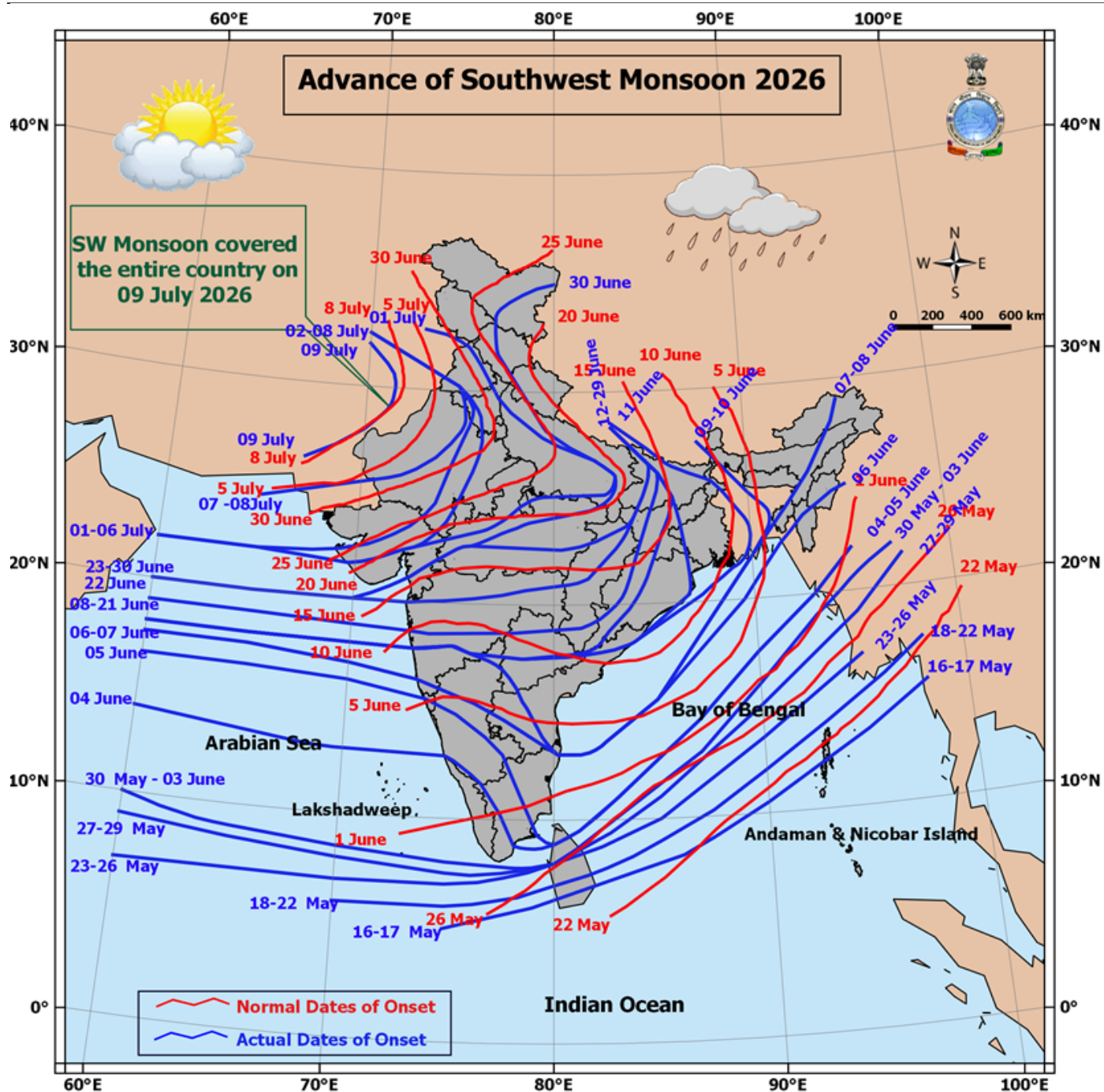

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 22-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region and Madhya Maharashtra. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Rajasthan, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.2°C was reported at YEOTMAL (MAHARASHTRA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 22-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep; at few places over West Rajasthan; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and Punjab; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Odisha and Madhya Maharashtra. **The highest maximum temperature** of 41.5°C was reported at MADURAI (A) (TAMIL NADU).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Jaisalmer, Kota, Guna, Sagar, Daltonganj, Digha and thence southeastwards towards Northeast Bay of Bengal extending upto 3.1 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height.
- The **east-west shear zone** roughly along 23°N Lat. between 3.1 & 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height across north peninsular India persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over Jammu & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level with a trough aloft in middle & upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 72°E to the north of Lat. 30°N persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northwest Bay of Bengal & adjoining north Odisha coast between 5.8 and 7.6 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.

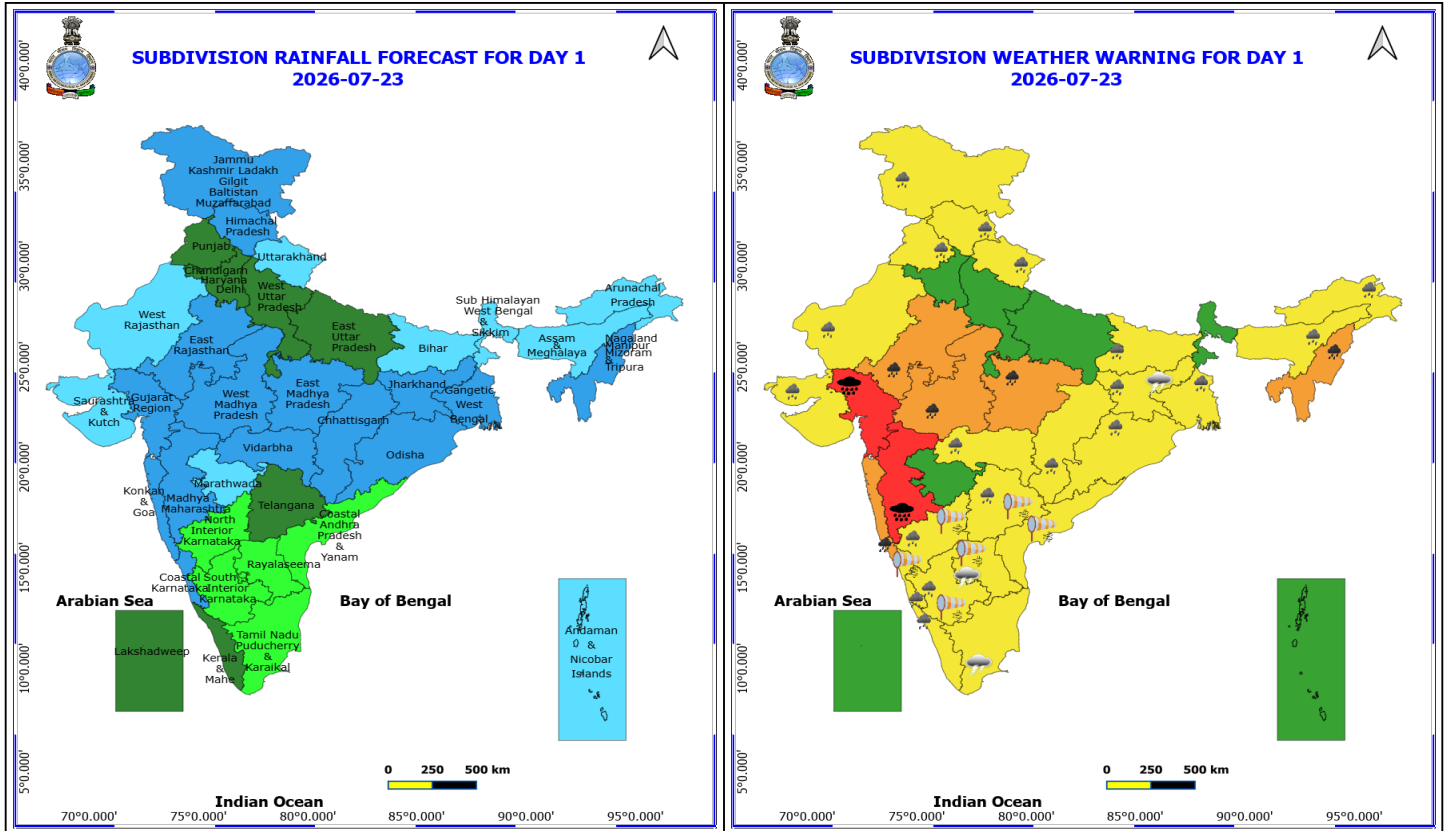

Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-22

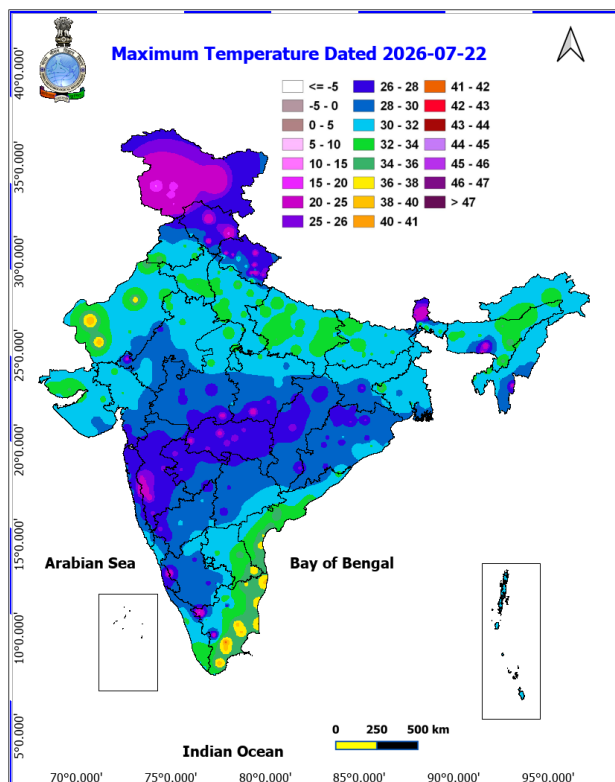


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-22

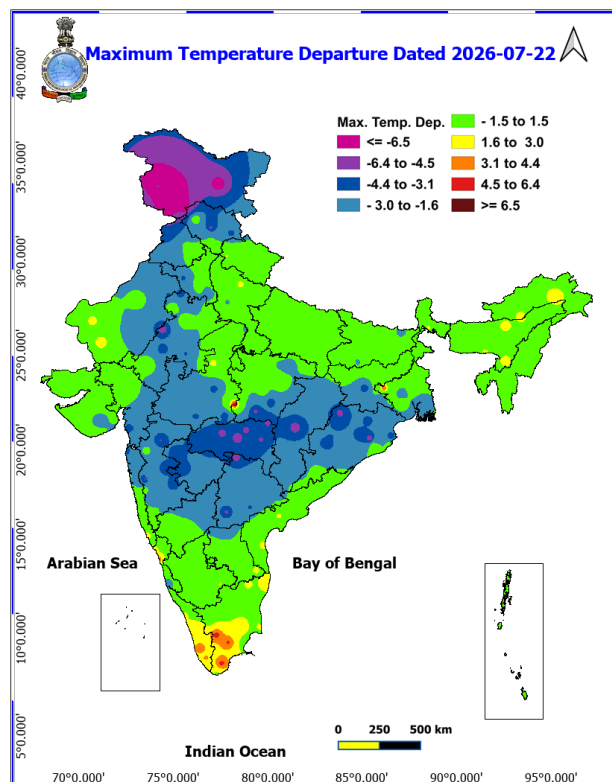


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-22

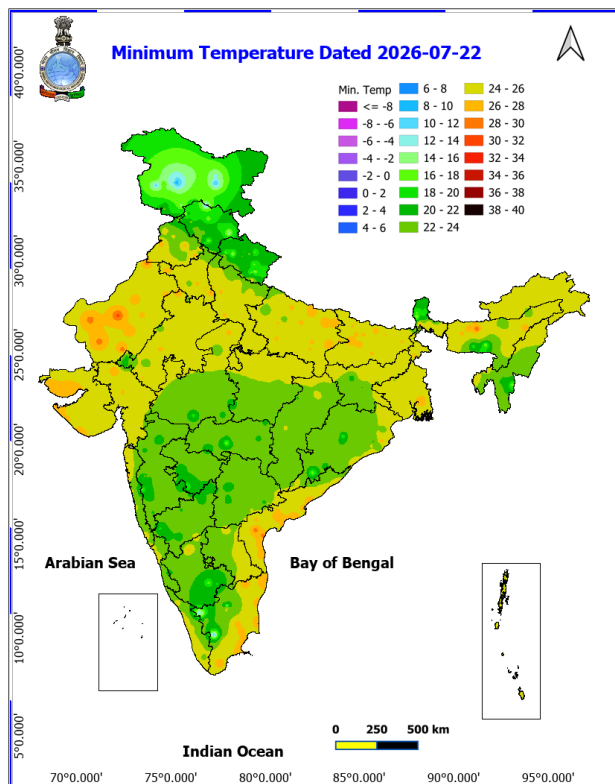
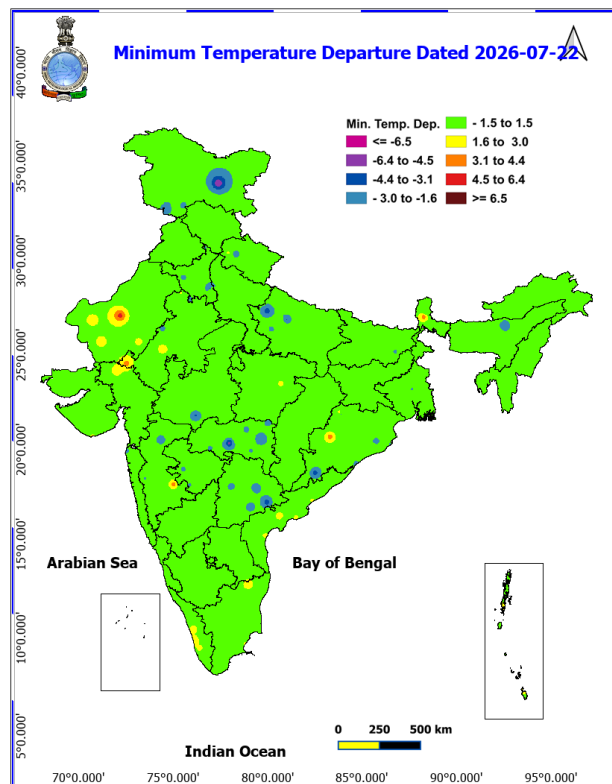
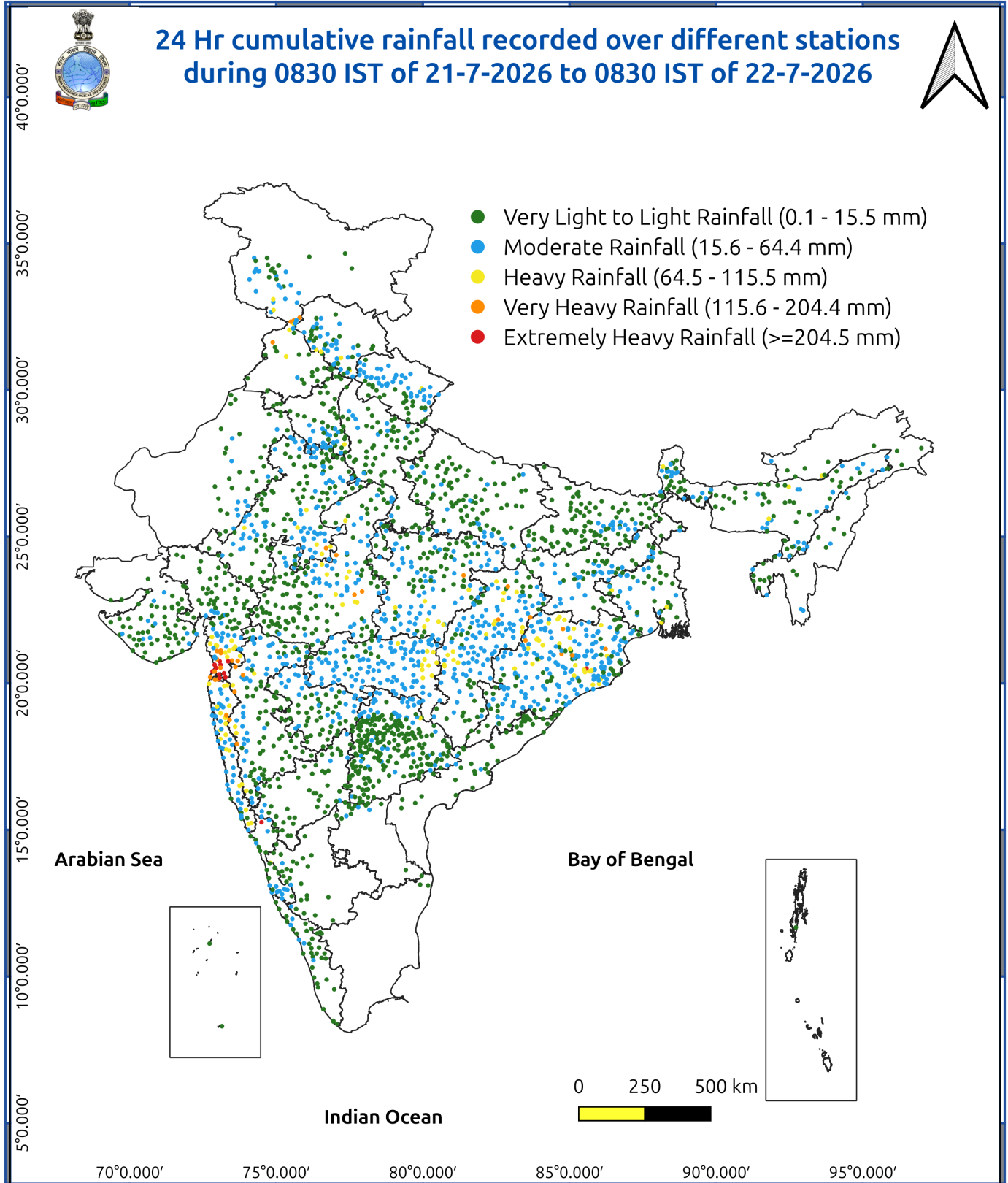


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-22

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall** likely at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra on 23rd and Gujarat Region during 23rd -24th July.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Gujarat**, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear in rice, cotton, pearl millet, maize, groundnut and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Avoid transplanting and other field operations in waterlogged fields until conditions improve.
- In **Konkan & Goa**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries, rice and vegetable fields and remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Undertake gap filling and transplanting only where field conditions permit.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields, orchards and low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Assam**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries, jute, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide staking or support to banana, vegetables and other vulnerable crops against strong winds.
- In **Meghalaya**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Jammu and Kashmir**, postpone sowing of kharif pulses until field conditions improve. Maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, green gram and black gram fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, tomato, brinjal, capsicum, chilli and cucumber fields and apple and pear orchards to facilitate quick removal of excess rainwater. Harvest mature fruits wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure continuous and effective drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain effective drainage in rice, black gram, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and chilli fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato wherever field conditions permit, and postpone sowing until field conditions improve.
- In **Punjab and Haryana**, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, soybean, pigeon pea and groundnut fields and fruit orchards to prevent waterlogging. Postpone sowing of green gram until field conditions improve.

- In **East Rajasthan**, maintain continuous drainage and remove excess rainwater from low-lying soybean, maize, groundnut, cotton and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Odisha**, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear in rice, maize, pulses, oilseed and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Strengthen support for banana and postpone sowing or transplanting until field conditions improve.
- In **Madhya Maharashtra** maintain continuous drainage in standing crops, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.
- In **Madhya Pradesh**, maintain effective drainage in soybean, maize, black gram, green gram, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Coastal Karnataka**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage in paddy fields, orchards and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone field operations until field conditions become suitable.
- In **Keralam**, maintain effective drainage in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Telangana**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, cotton, red gram, soybean and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

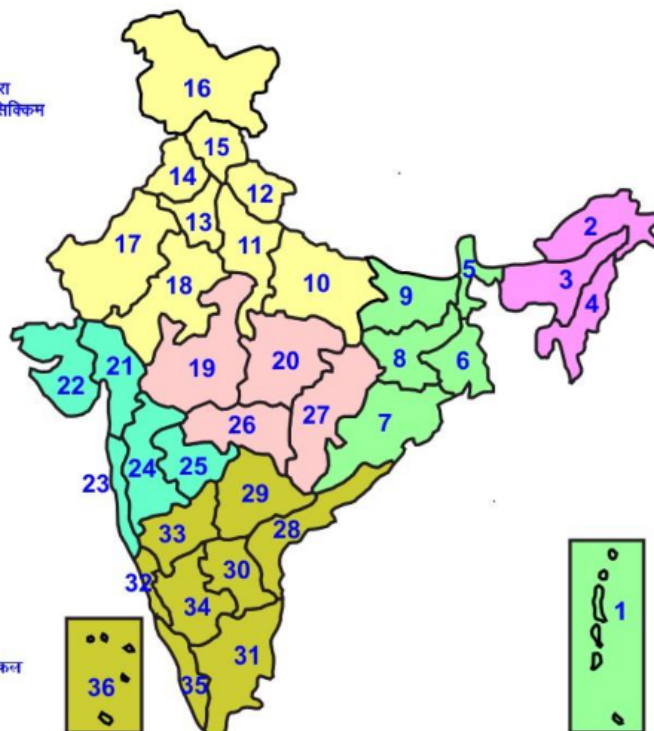
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50-200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
