ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Systems and Warnings:

Northwest India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm lightning likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad on 29th September and during 2nd-4th October; Himachal Pradesh on 29th September; Uttarakhand during 29th September-4th October.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm lightning likely over East Rajasthan, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab and West Uttar Pradesh on 29th September.
- Mainly dry weather likely to prevail over many parts of Northwest India from 30th September, 2026.

Central India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 29th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 29th September-2nd October; Vidarbha during 29th-30th September; Chhattisgarh during 29th September-4th October.
- **East India:**
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 29th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 30th September-4th October; Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 29th September-4th October; Bihar during 29th September-1st October.

Northeast India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 29th September-4th October.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 29th-30th September.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 3rd-4th October; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 29th-30th September.

West India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra during 29th September-4th October; Marathwada on 29th September; Gujarat Region during 29th September-1st October; Saurashtra & Kutch during 30th September-1st October.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 29th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Konkan & Goa on 29th September; Madhya Maharashtra on 30th September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Lakshadweep, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 29th September-4th October; Kerala & Mahe during 29th-30th September; Coastal Karnataka during 29th-30th September and during 3rd-4th October; South Interior Karnataka during 2nd-4th October; Telangana on 29th September and during 2nd-3rd October.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe during 1st-4th October; Coastal Karnataka during 1st-2nd October; South Interior Karnataka during 29th September-1st October.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely

over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 29th September-2nd October; Kerala & Mahe during 30th September-2nd October, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe on 29th September; North Interior Karnataka during 29th-30th September; South Interior Karnataka during 29th September-1st October; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 29th September-2nd October.

- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 29th September-1st October; Kerala & Mahe during 30th September-3rd October; South Interior Karnataka during 29th September-2nd October.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 29th September-2nd October.

Wind warning:

- Squally weather with wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is prevailing over Andaman Sea, along & off Myanmar coast and Andaman Islands. It is very likely to increase becoming 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph by afternoon of today India Meteorological Department (Ministry of Earth Sciences) and 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph from evening of today, the 29th September. It is likely to decrease thereafter.
- Squally weather with wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is prevailing over along & off Myanmar and adjoining areas of Eastcentral Bay of Bengal and likely to increase becoming 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph from evening of today, the 29th September. It is likely to decrease becoming 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph from 29th night till 30th evening and gradually decrease thereafter.
- Squally weather with wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph over northeast Bay of Bengal and along & off Bangladesh coasts during 29th September to 1st October, 2026.

Sea condition

- Rough to very Rough Sea condition is very likely over Andaman Sea & adjoining areas of Eastcentral Bay of Bengal and along & off Myanmar coast till 29th September evening. Thereafter, rough to very rough sea condition is likely over costal Myanmar and adjoining areas of Eastcentral till 30th September evening.
- Rough to very Rough Sea Condition is likely along & off Myanmar - Bangladesh coasts & adjoining areas of northeast Bay of Bengal during 29th September to 1st October, 2026.

Fishermen warnings:

- Fishermen are advised not to venture into Andaman Sea & adjoining areas of southeast Bay of Bengal and along & off Myanmar coast till 28th September evening and along & off Myanmar coast and adjoining areas of Eastcentral Bay of Bengal from 29th evening to 30th September evening and along & off Bangladesh coast & adjoining areas of northeast Bay of Bengal during 29th September to 1st October, 2026.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh; **at many places** over Assam & Meghalaya, South Interior Karnataka, Odisha, West Rajasthan, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Bihar, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, East Rajasthan, North Interior Karnataka, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Rayalaseema and Madhya Maharashtra ; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **South Interior Karnataka**: Bangaluru HAL (dist) 7; **Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam**: Vishakhapatnam (dist Visakhapatnam) 4; **East Rajasthan**: Jaipur (dist Jaipur) 3.

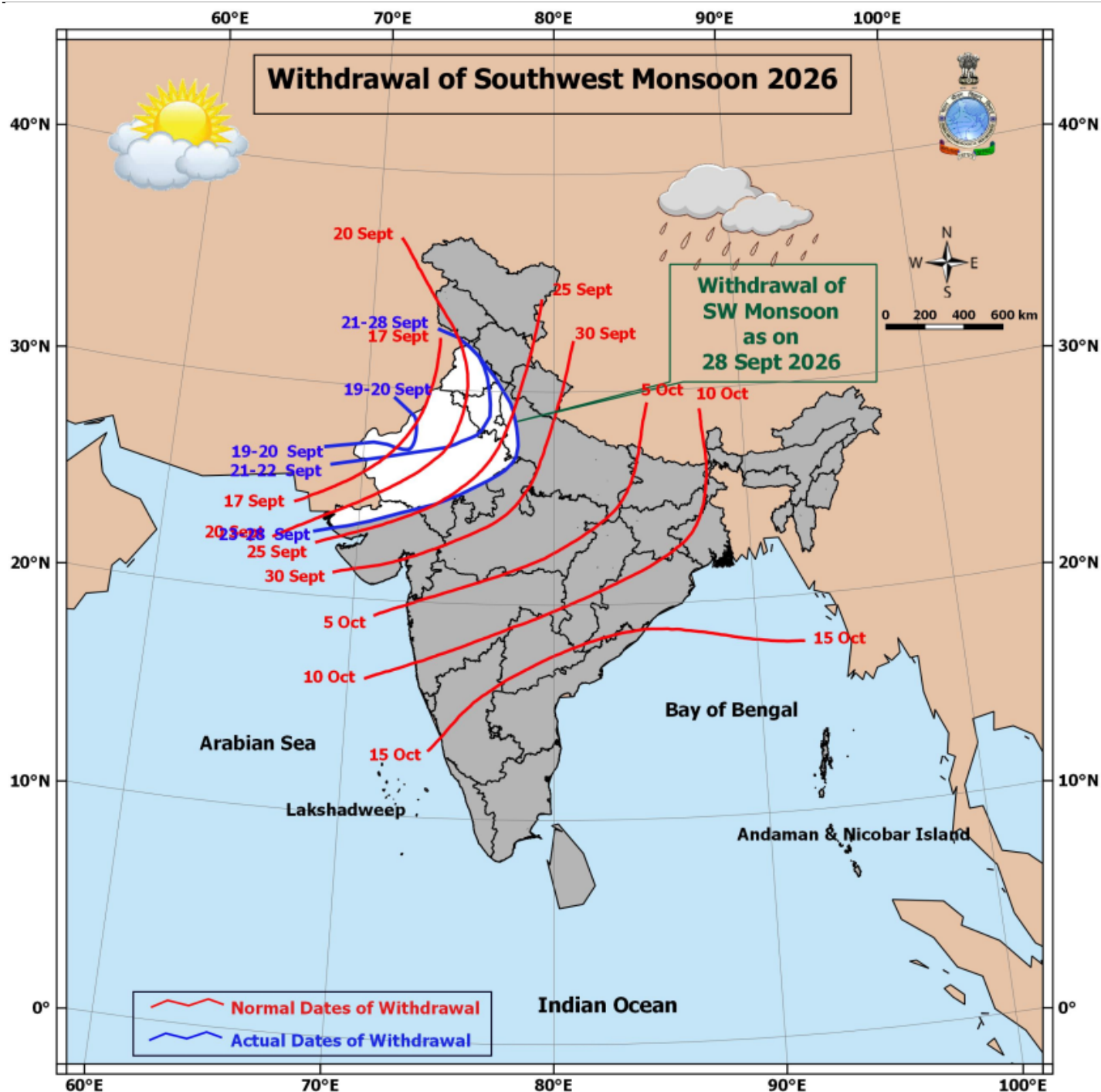
❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Heavy rain** at a few places over South Interior Karnataka

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 28-09-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Assam & Meghalaya; at isolated places over Bihar and East Uttar Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at most places over Himachal Pradesh; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Assam & Meghalaya; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Saurashtra & Kutch; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, West Rajasthan and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at most places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Gujarat Region, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and South Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Assam & Meghalaya. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 14.9°C was reported at DEHRA DUN-MOKAMPUR (UTTARAKHAND) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 28-09-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Rayalaseema; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura; at most places over Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Konkan & Goa, Telangana and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha and Saurashtra & Kutch. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Jharkhand, Bihar, East Rajasthan and East Madhya Pradesh; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and Chhattisgarh; at few places over East Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat Region; at isolated places over West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and West Rajasthan. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.4°C was reported at PHALODI-OBS (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Deep Depression** over coastal Myanmar moved north-northwestwards with a speed of 28 kmph during past 6 hours, weakened into a **Depression** and lay centred at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 29th September 2026 over Myanmar and adjoining Eastcentral & Northeast Bay of Bengal near latitude 18.9°N and longitude 96.0°E, about 50 km west of Toungoo (Myanmar), 80 km east of Pyay (Myanmar), 180 km north-northwest of Bago (Myanmar), 210 km north-northwest of Kyaikto (Myanmar) and 240 km northeast of Yangon (Myanmar). It is very likely to move further north-northwestwards and weaken into a well-marked low pressure area over Myanmar and adjoining southeast Bangladesh & Northeast Bay of Bengal around evening of today, the 29th September. Thereafter, it is very likely to continue to move further north-northwestwards towards southeast Bangladesh & adjoining areas of Myanmar, Mizoram, Tripura & Northeast Bay of Bengal and weaken gradually during subsequent 24 hours.
- The **line of withdrawal of Southwest Monsoon** continues to pass through 32.5°N/72.5°E, Gurdaspur, Chandigarh, Muzaffarnagar, Aligarh, Dholpur, Udaipur, Deesa, Naliya and 23.0°N/67.8°E.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation now lies over south Rajasthan & neighbourhood between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level with a trough aloft in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level runs roughly along Long. 72°E to the north of Lat. 25°N.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Uttar Pradesh between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northwest Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 3.1km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northwest & adjoining Westcentral Bay of Bengal between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from North Interior Karnataka to Tamil Nadu across South Interior Karnataka at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Eastcentral Arabian sea between 1.5 & 4.5 km above mean sea level persists.

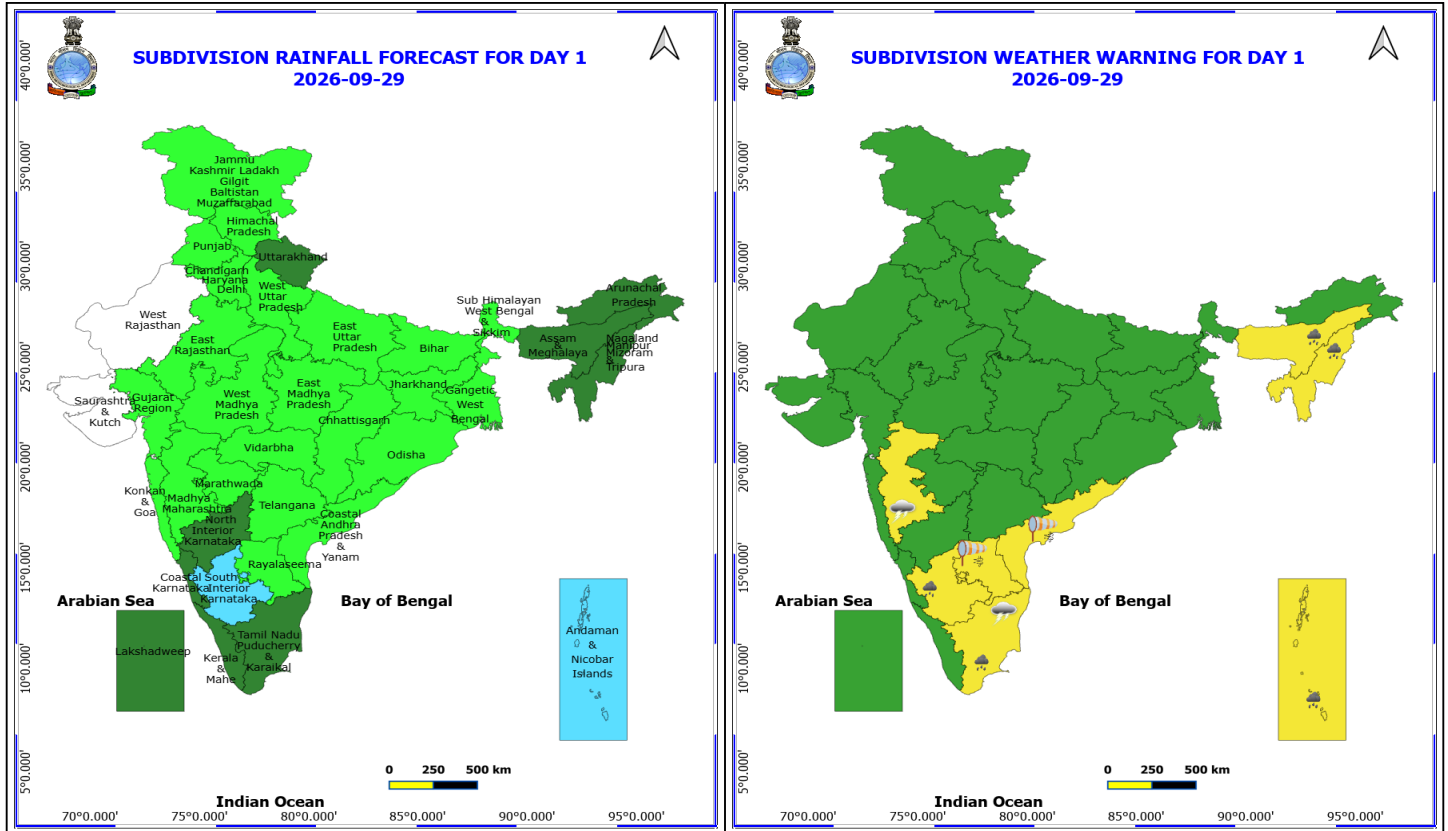

Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-28

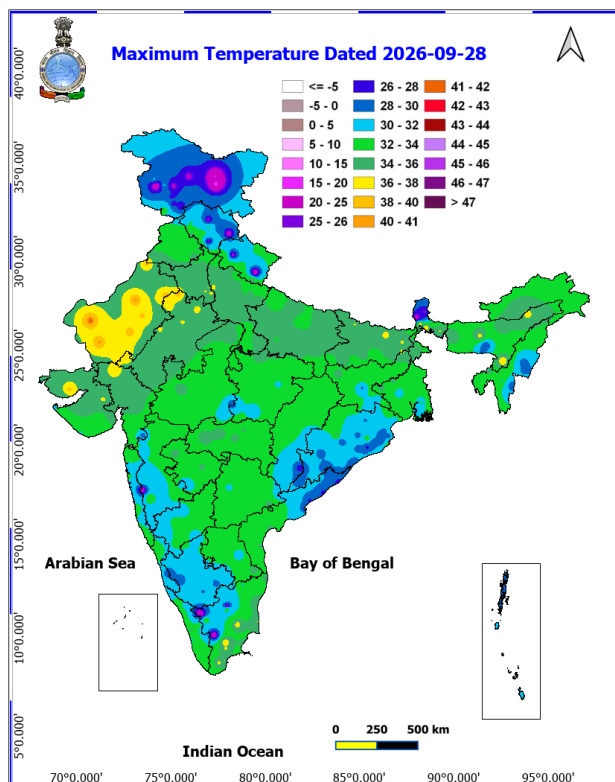


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-28

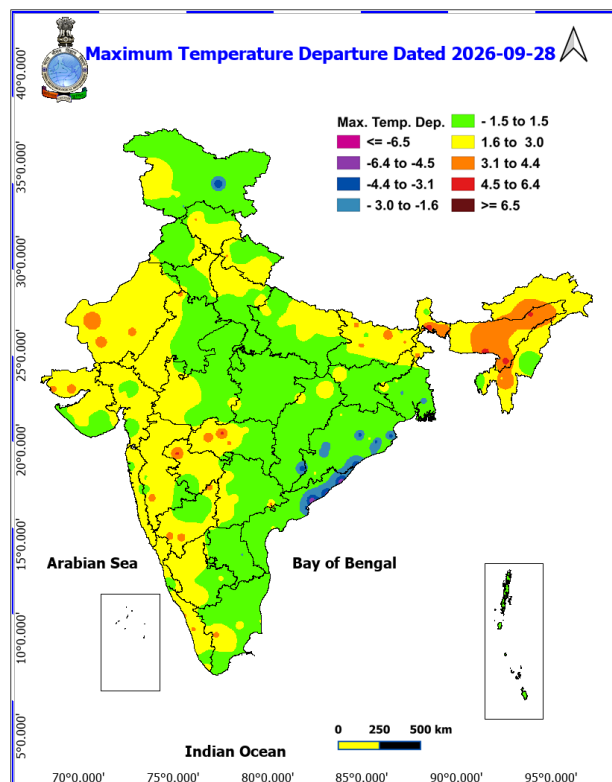


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-28

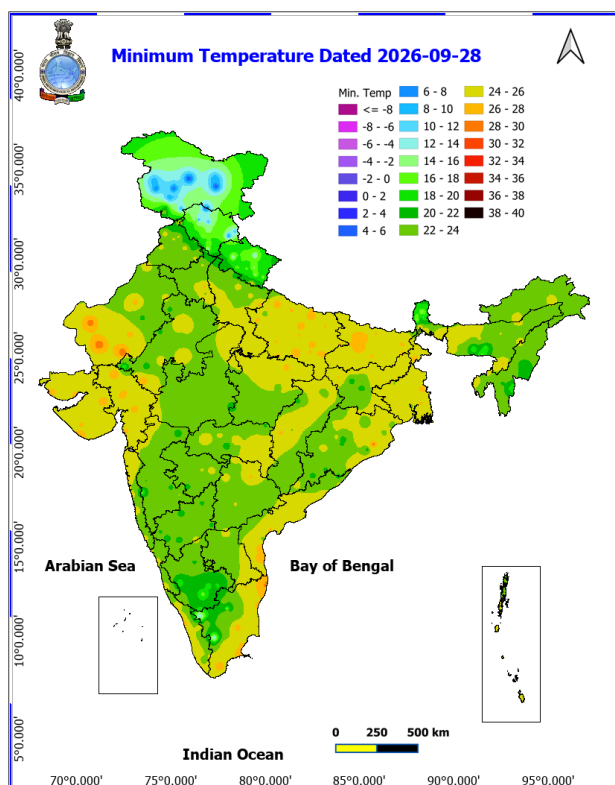
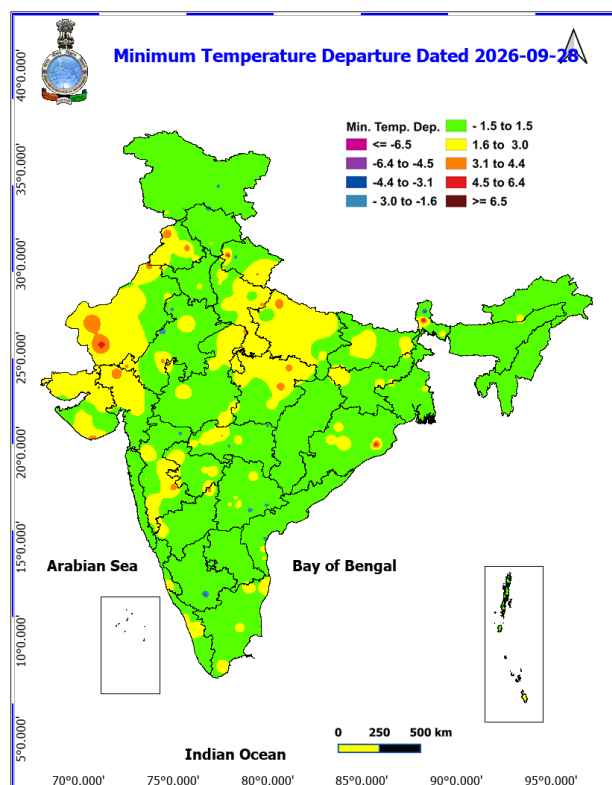
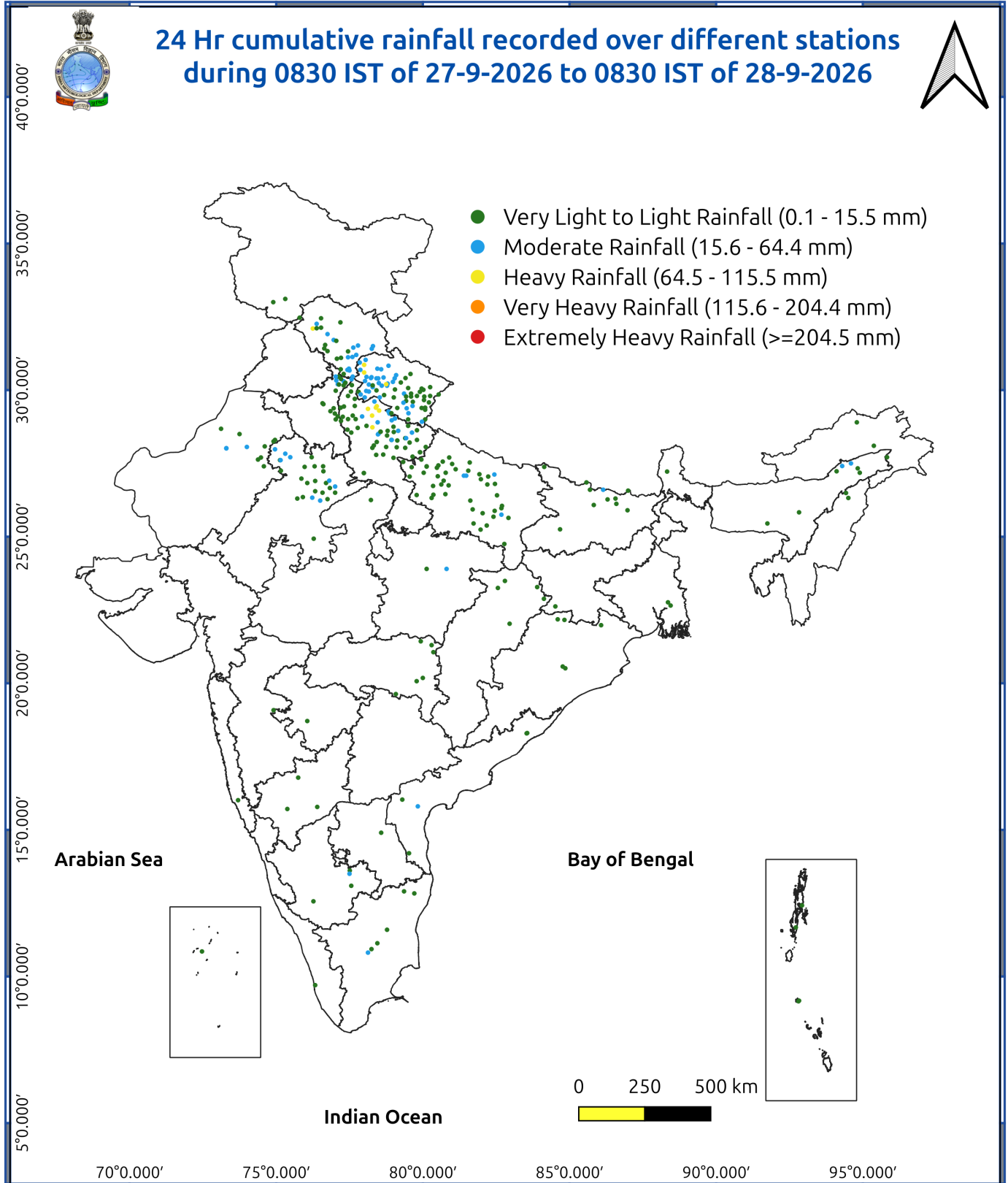


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-28

Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall

- **Isolated heavy rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, South Interior Karnataka and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal. today, the 29th September, 2026.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Tamil Nadu**, drain excess water from standing crop fields and avoid fertilizer and pesticide applications during rainfall, particularly where heavy rainfall was received yesterday. Provide support to banana plants and prop sugarcane against lodging.
- In **South Interior Karnataka**, Protect harvested produce by keeping it in safe, covered storage, and secure farm structures and equipment. Postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and application of plant protection measures & fertilizers to the standing crops. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- In **Andaman & Nicobar**, provide mechanical support to banana & papaya plantations and staking to young plants and vegetables. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging.
- In **Assam & Meghalaya**, drain excess water from maize, black gram, green gram and sesame fields and keep drainage channels clear. Maintain suitable water levels in rice, support papaya, banana and weak-stemmed crops, and harvest pumpkins and bottle gourd before the rains wherever possible.
- In **Nagaland**, maintain 3-5 cm water level in wet rice fields and harvest mature maize cobs during suitable weather.
- In **Manipur**, harvest colocasia and mature ginger during rain-free periods and ensure proper drainage in ginger fields.
- In **Mizoram**, prepare fields for sowing black gram, green gram, soybean, sesame and lentil after maize harvest. Ensure drainage in ginger fields and prevent water stagnation to minimise soft-rot and rhizome-rot incidence.

- In **Tripura**, maintain adequate soil moisture in Aus rice during panicle initiation and booting, while ensuring drainage in low-lying groundnut fields to prevent stagnation
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and application of plant protection measures & fertilizers to the standing crops. Provide adequate drainage in standing crop fields to avoid waterlogging

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

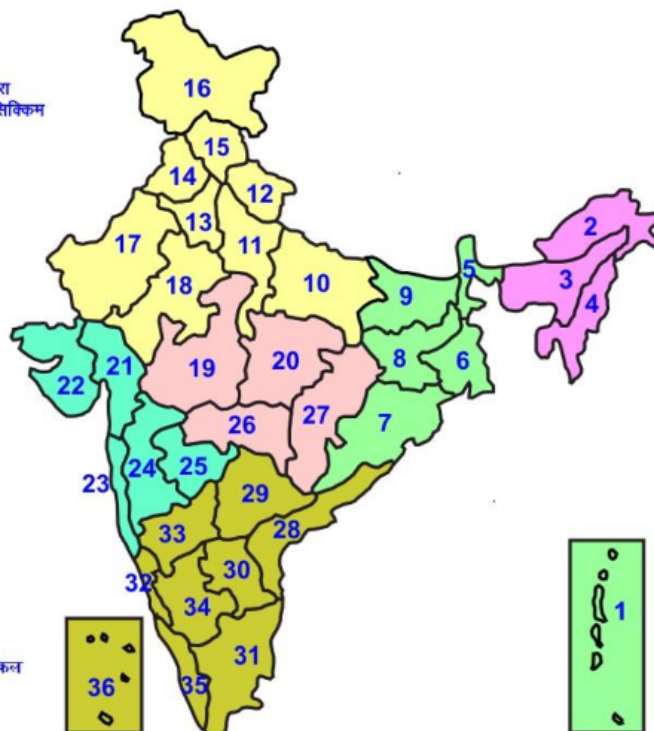
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Agromet advisory for likely impact of heavy rainfall on Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)

Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)

Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)

Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
