- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 17th-22nd July.

- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 17th-18th July; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 17th-20th July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 20th-22nd July; Assam & Meghalaya during 20th-22nd July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 17th-22nd July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 17th-19th July; Assam & Meghalaya during 17th-19th July.

- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 17th July; Marathawada during 17th-18th July.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 17th-22nd July; Kerala & Mahe on 22nd July; Lakshadweep on 17th July and on 22nd July.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe during 17th-21st July; Lakshadweep during 18th-21st July; Coastal Karnataka during 17th-22nd July.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Rayalaseema on 17th July; Telangana during 17th-18th July, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 17th-20th July; Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 19th July; Rayalaseema during 18th-20th July; Telangana during 19th-20th July.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand, Gangetic West Bengal, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Odisha, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Karnataka and Telangana; **at many places** over Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Saurashtra & Kutch, Vidarbha, Kerala & Mahe, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Gujarat Region and South Interior Karnataka; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 16-07-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Punjab and Telangana; at most places over Lakshadweep; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Telangana and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Punjab, East Madhya Pradesh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.0°C was reported at JEUR (MAHARASHTRA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 16-07-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Vidarbha; at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Punjab, Marathwada and Telangana; at most places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi; at few places over West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra and Kerala & Mahe. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over Lakshadweep; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, West Rajasthan and Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Odisha. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 42.0°C was reported at BHIWANI (HARYANA).

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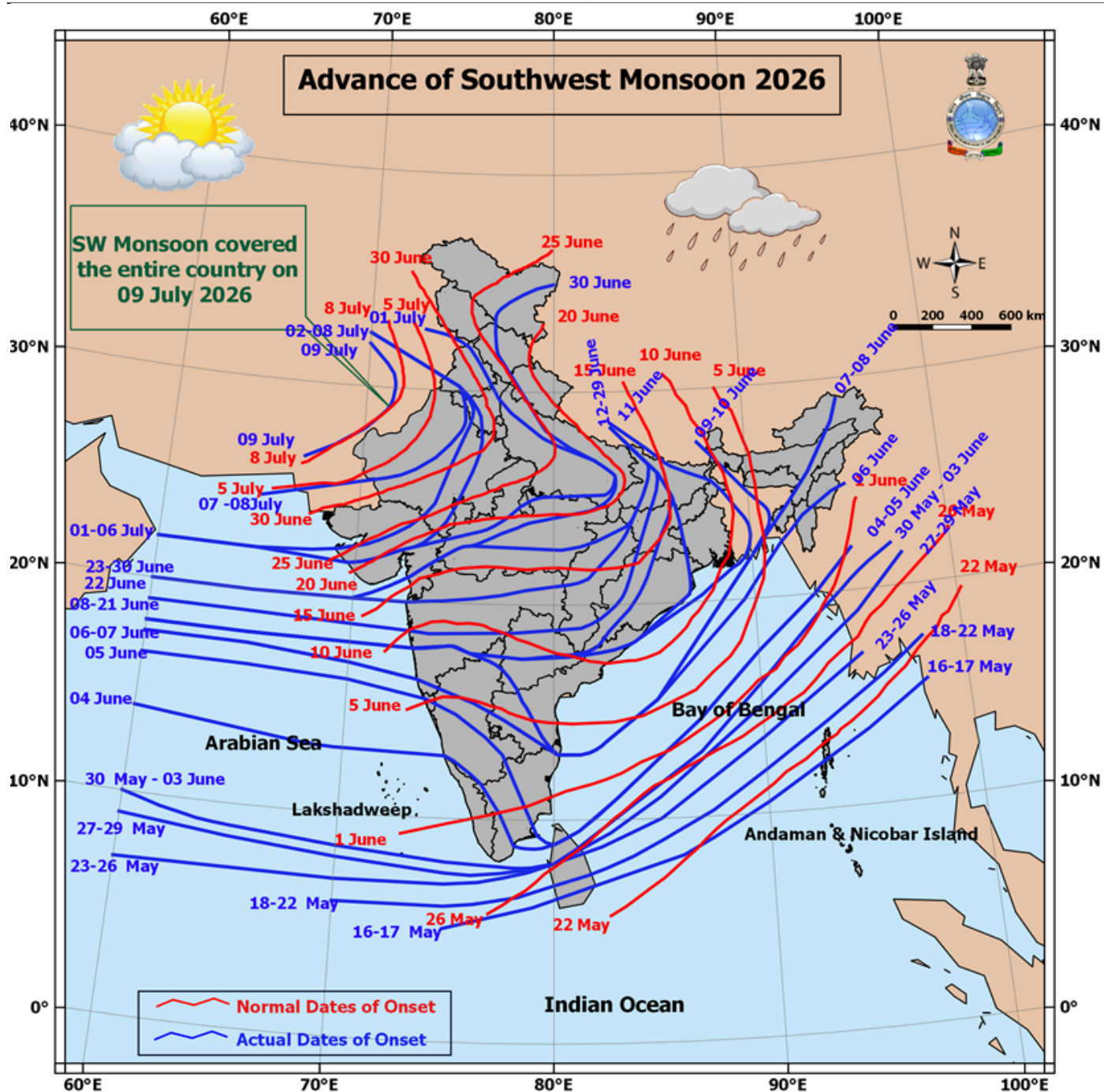
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Well-marked low pressure area** over North Odisha and adjoining Jharkhand & Gangetic West Bengal weakened into Low Pressure area over the same region at 0530 hrs IST of today, 17th July, 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height. It is very likely to weaken gradually during next 24 hrs.
- The **trough** now runs from the above cyclonic circulation associated the **Low Pressure area** over North Odisha and adjoining Jharkhand & Gangetic West Bengal to Eastcentral Arabian Sea across Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha, Madhya Maharashtra, south Gujarat State between 5.8 & 7.6 km above mean sea level.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level continues to pass through Jammu, Bareilly, Basti, Daltonganj, centre of Low Pressure area over North Odisha and adjoining Jharkhand & Gangetic West Bengal and thence east-southeastwards towards Northeast Bay of Bengal.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over Jammu division & neighbourhood between 4.5 & 5.8 km above mean sea level with the trough aloft with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 75°E to the north of Lat. 30°N persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Haryana & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Uttar Pradesh & adjoining Bihar and extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood at 3.1km above mean sea level persists.
- A fresh **Western Disturbance** is likely to affect Northwest India from 19th July, 2026.

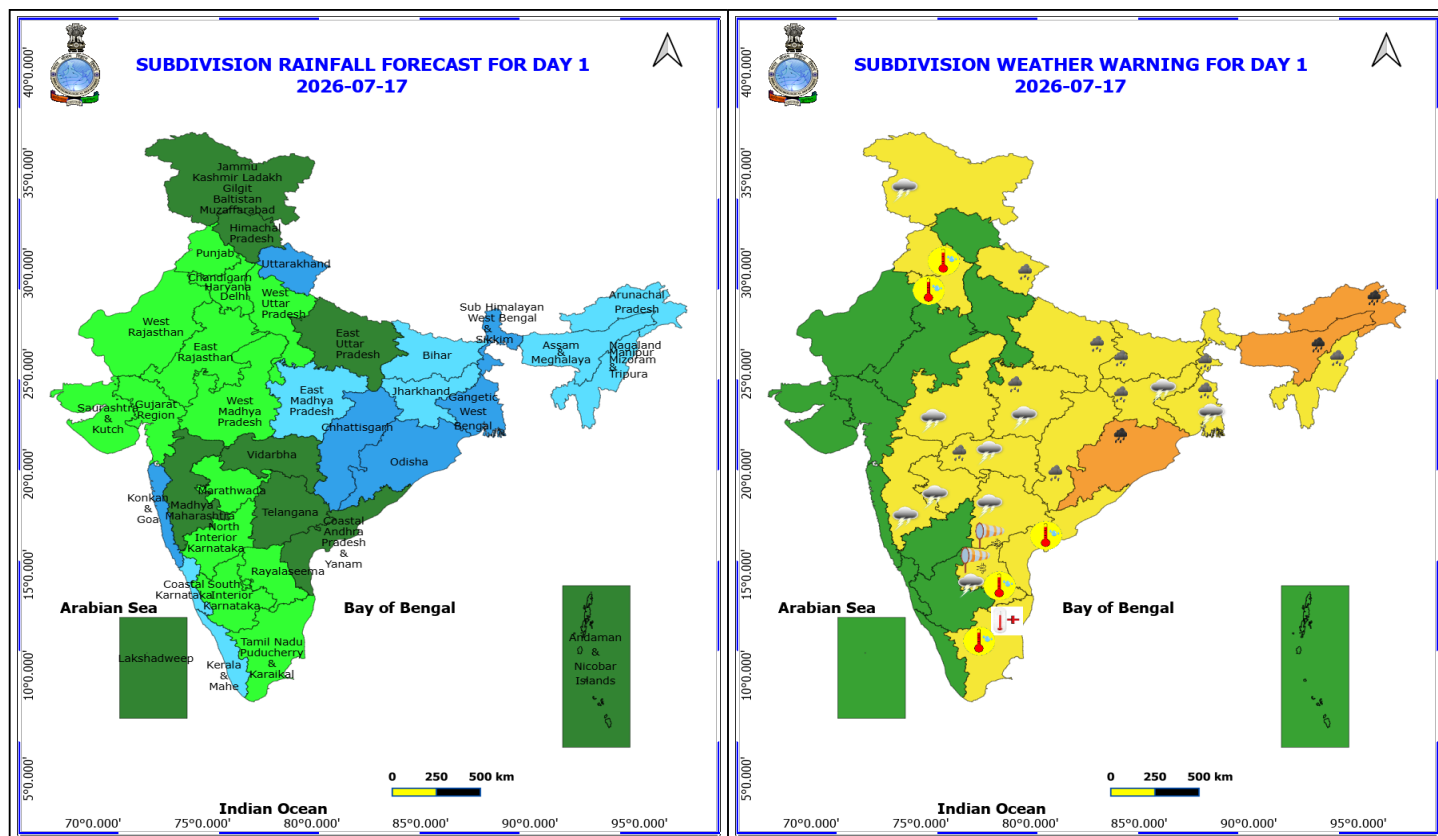

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, East Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Kerala & Mahe, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, North Interior Karnataka, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Rayalaseema and Telangana.
- ❖ **Heat Wave conditions** very likely at isolated places over Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over most parts of

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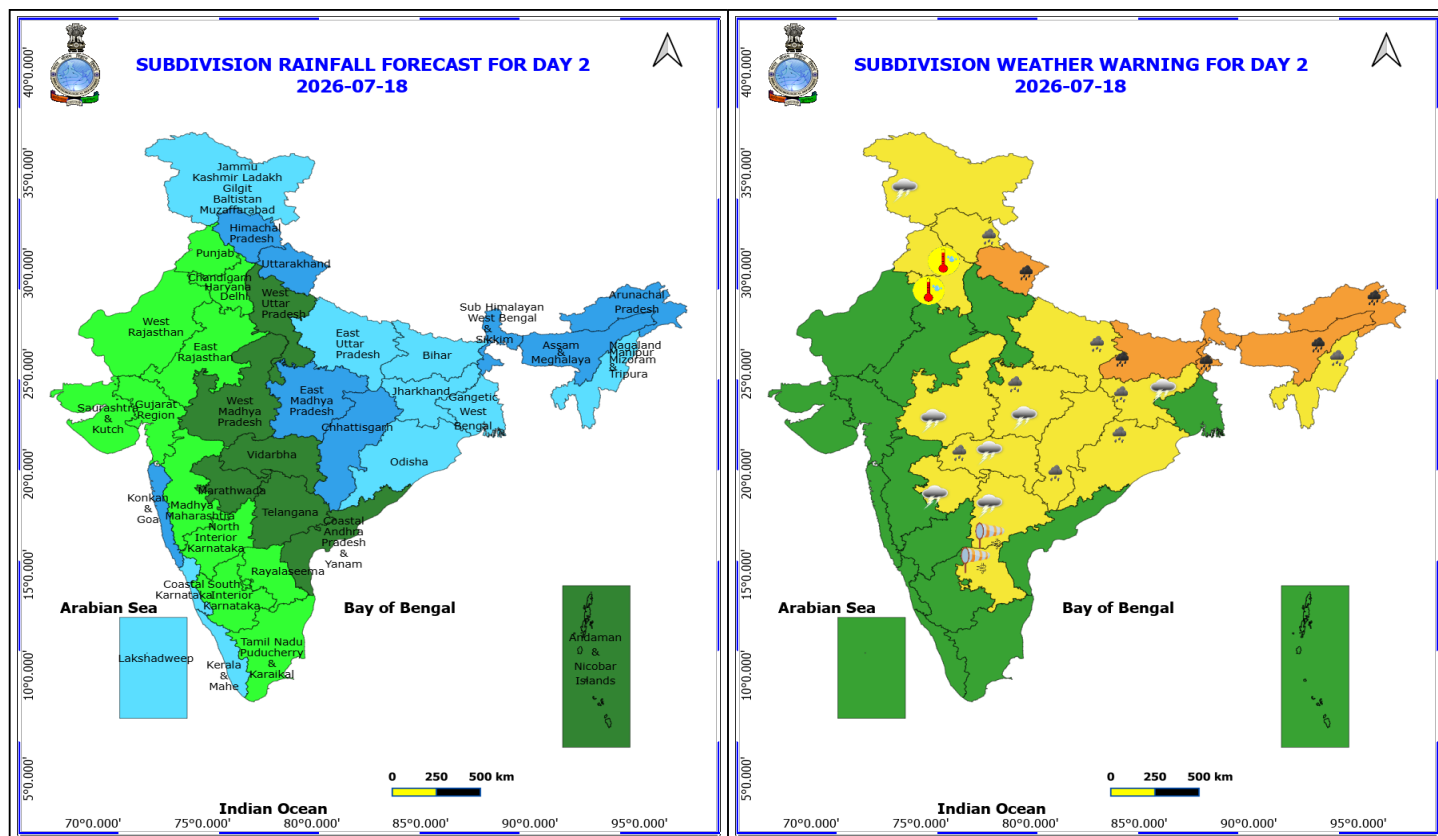
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west central adjoining few parts of northwest, and some parts of south west Arabian Sea, along and off Somalia, and Oman coasts.

❖ **Bay of Bengal: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over some parts of south Bay of Bengal.

❖ **Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal adjoining many parts of north and some parts of Central Bay of Bengal.

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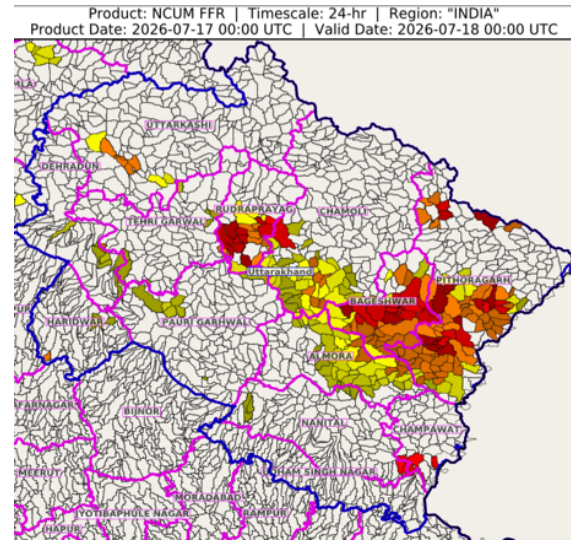

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-16

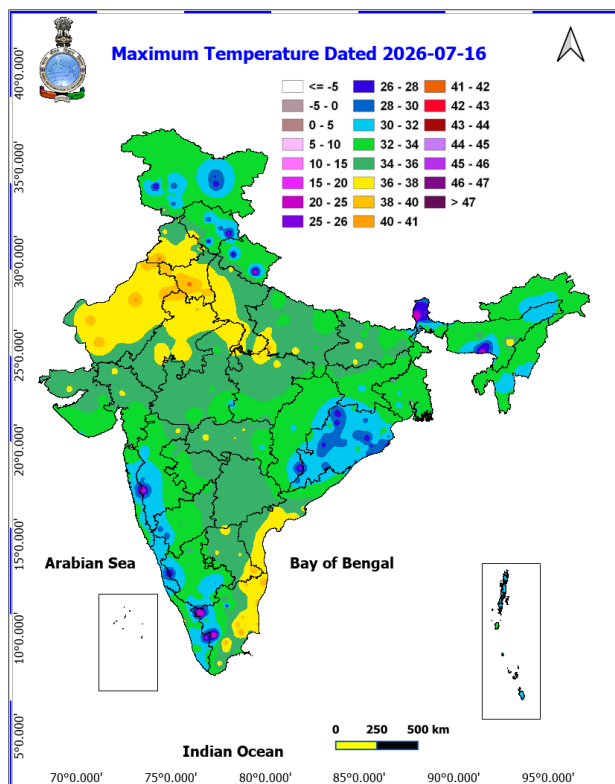


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-16

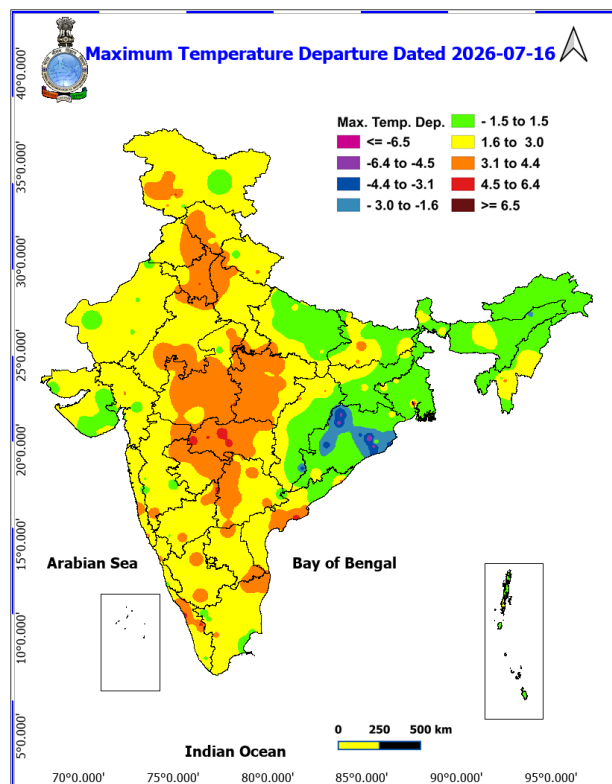


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-16

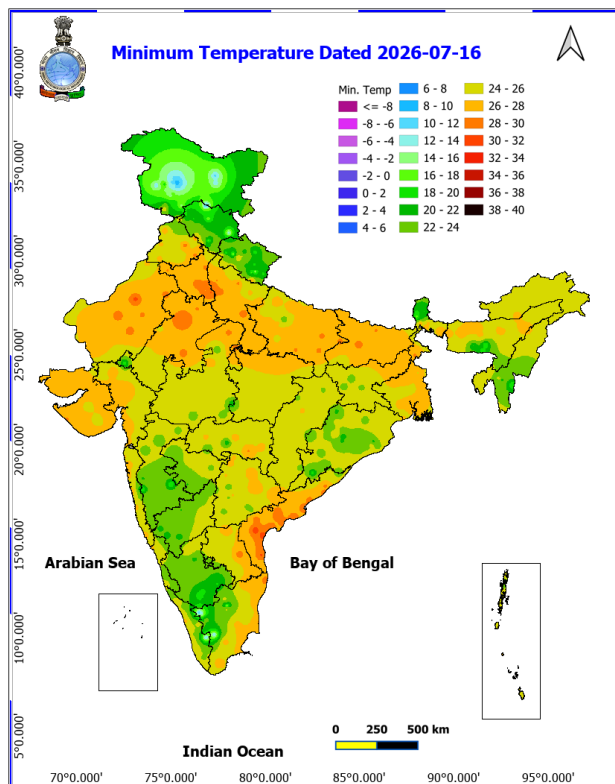
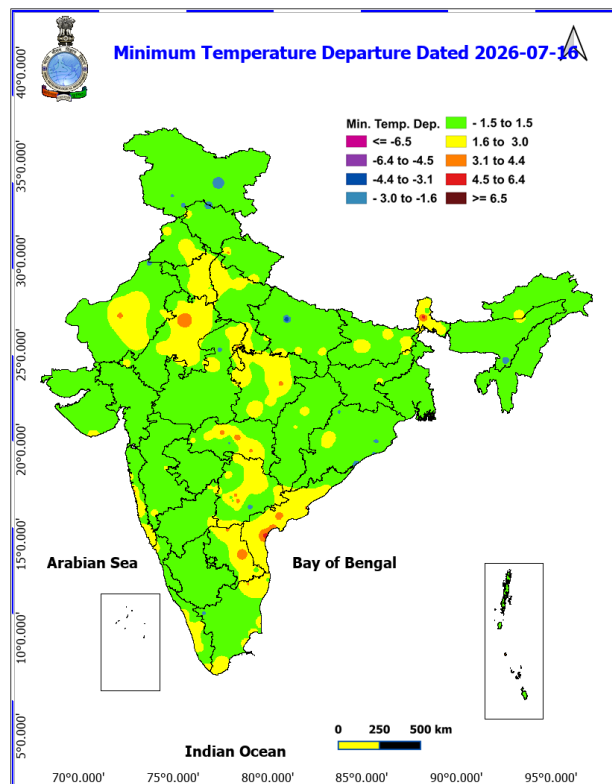
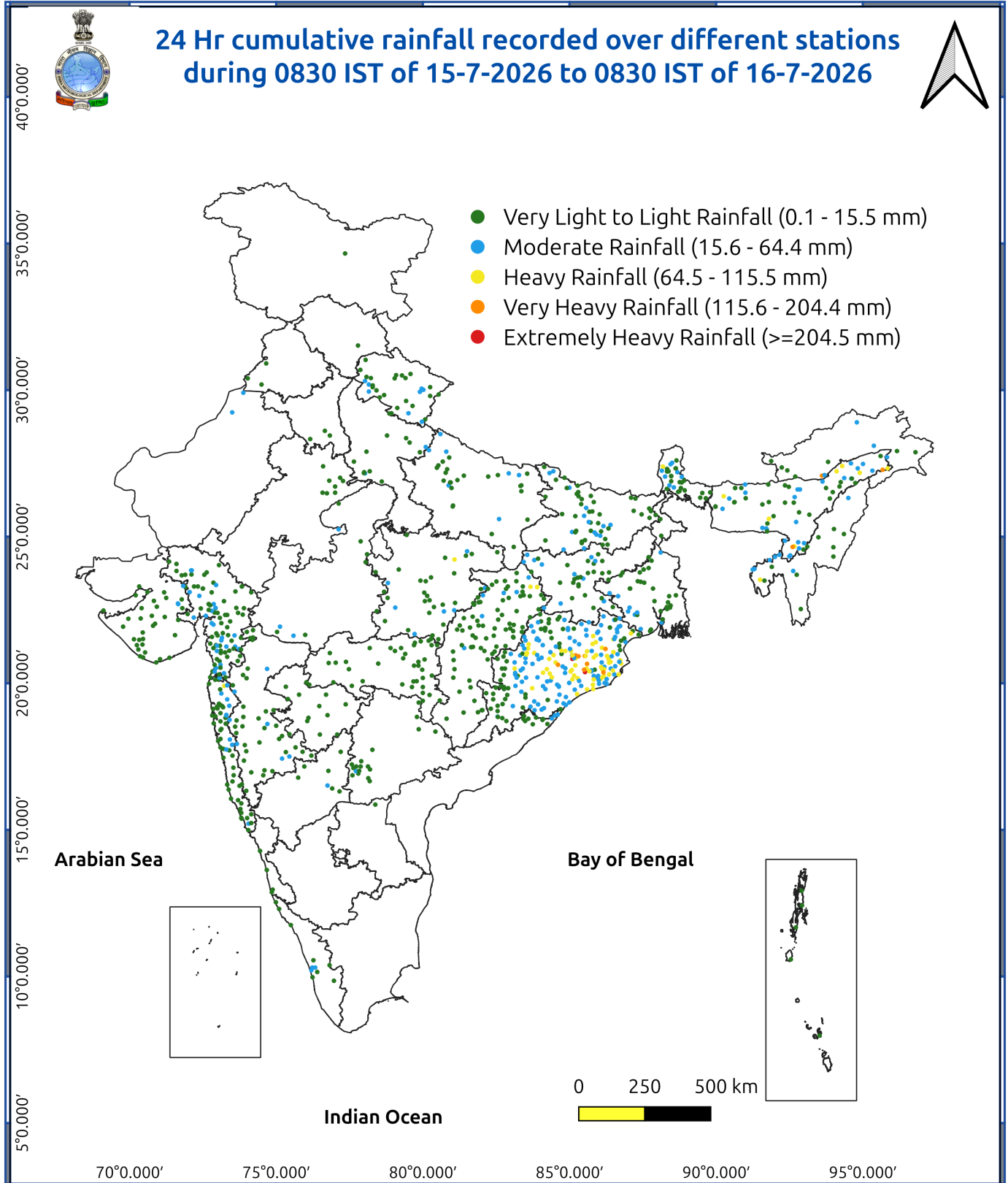


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-16





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall

❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Odisha.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Impact expected and action suggested due to Heat wave conditions:

- **Heat wave** conditions very likely in isolated pockets over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 17th July.

Alert Areas

- High temperature & increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are either exposed to sun for a prolonged period or doing heavy work.
- High health concern for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- Avoid heat exposure— keep cool. Avoid dehydration.
- Drink sufficient water- even if not thirsty.
- Use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. to keep yourself hydrated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

In **Odisha**, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear to prevent prolonged waterlogging in rice, maize, pulses, oilseed and vegetable fields. Strengthen field bunds and postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions become suitable.

In **Assam**, maintain continuous and effective drainage of excess rainwater from sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame fields and fruit orchards to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.

In **Meghalaya**, maintain effective drainage in rice nursery beds and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger.

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Strengthen nursery bunds and field channels to prevent runoff, seedling washout and waterlogging.

In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries and standing fields of maize, soybean, pigeon pea and minor millets to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure continuous drainage of excess rainwater from rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure continuous and effective drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.

In **Sikkim**, ensure proper drainage in rice nurseries and standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.

In **West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.

In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

In **Uttarakhand**, postpone sowing of groundnut, soybean and maize. Ensure proper drainage in rice, tomato and chilli fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato only during rain-free periods and continue rice transplanting wherever field conditions permit.

In **Himachal Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in maize, finger millet, cucurbit, tomato and capsicum fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.

In **West Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of High temperatures/ Heat Waves

In **Tamil Nadu, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Rayalaseema**, maintain adequate soil moisture in standing crops through light and need-based irrigation to reduce the adverse effects of heat wave and hot & humid conditions.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

In **Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Sikkim, West Bengal, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Coastal Andhra Pradesh** post-pone fertilizer application and other field activities.

In **Telengana and Rayalaseema and Coastal Andhra Pradesh** provide staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.

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Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.

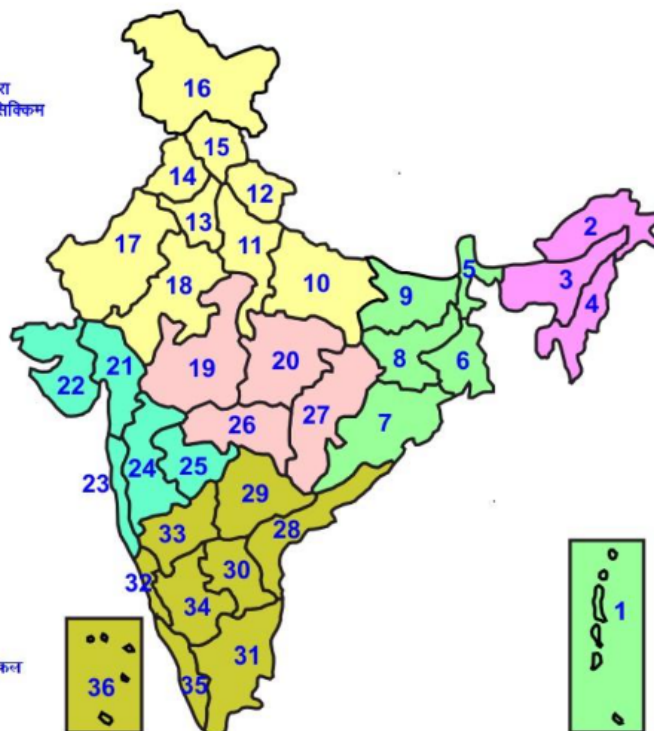
Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.

Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
