- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 25th July.

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 27th-30th July; Assam & Meghalaya during 27th-30th July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 25th-30th July.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 25th-26th July; Assam & Meghalaya during 25th-28th July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 27th-30th July; Assam & Meghalaya during 25th-29th July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 25th-30th July.

West India:

- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 25th-27th July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa during 26th-27th July and during 29th-30th July; Madhya Maharashtra on 27th July; Gujarat Region on 25th July; Saurashtra & Kutch on 25th July and on 27th July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Konkan & Goa on 25th July; Madhya Maharashtra during 25th-26th July; Gujarat Region during 26th-27th July; Saurashtra & Kutch on 26th July.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 25th-30th July; South Interior Karnataka during 26th-30th July.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 25th-30th July; South Interior Karnataka on 25th July.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 25th-26th July; North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema and South Interior Karnataka during 25th-28th July, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Coastal Karnataka and Telangana during 25th-28th July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 25th-30th July; Coastal Karnataka during 25th-28th July and on 30th July; North Interior Karnataka during 27th-30th July; South Interior Karnataka on 25th July and during 28th-30th July.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 25th-26th July; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 25th-28th July.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Gujarat Region, Bihar, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha and Coastal Karnataka; **at many places** over Assam & Meghalaya, East Rajasthan, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, West Rajasthan, West Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Rayalaseema, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.

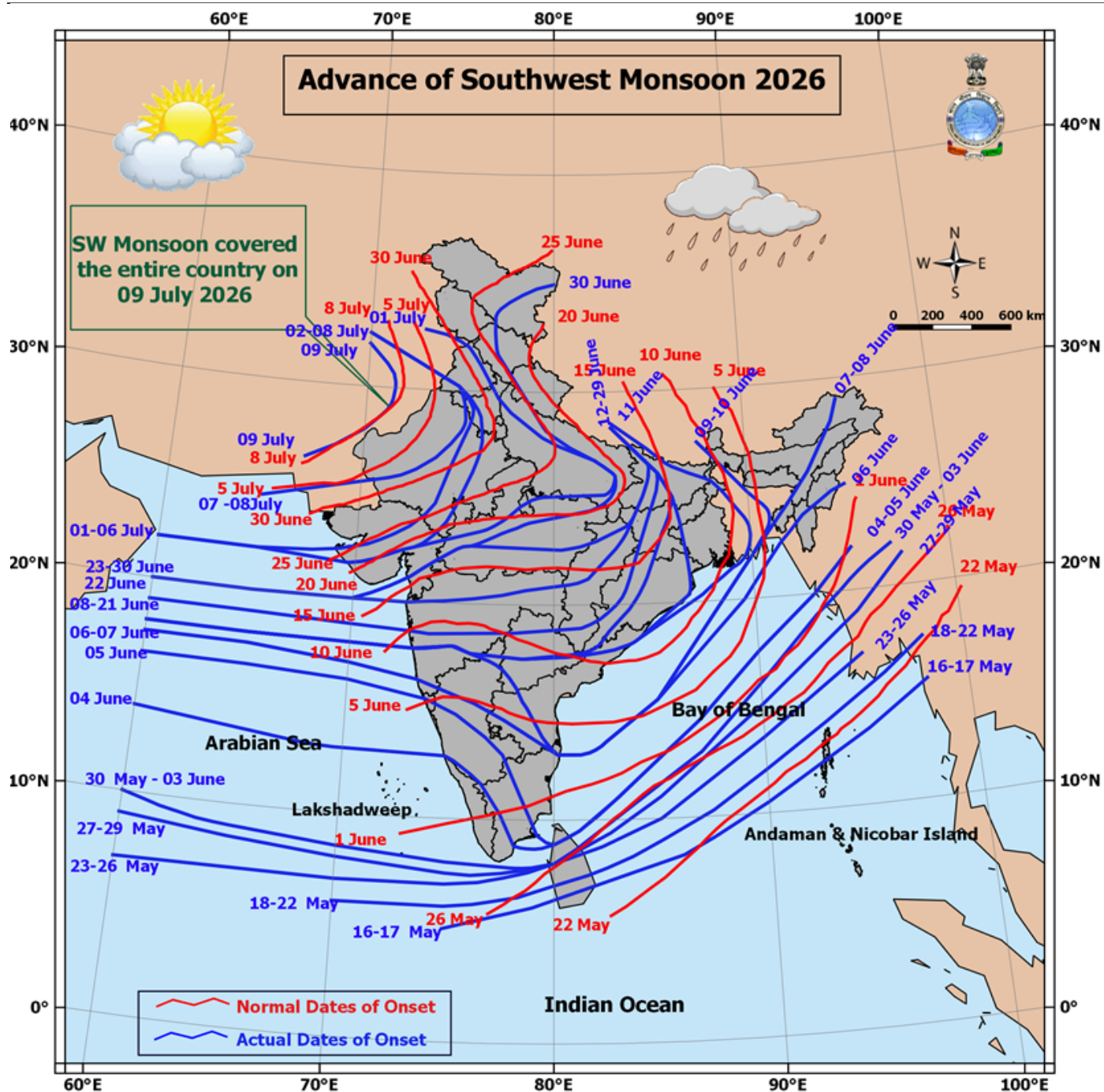
❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 24-07-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Lakshadweep; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Odisha, Uttarakhand, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Telangana and Rayalaseema. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at most places over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Punjab, East Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Lakshadweep. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.0°C was reported at YEOTMAL (MAHARASHTRA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 24-07-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at few places over Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Himachal Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Vidarbha and South Interior Karnataka; at most places over Lakshadweep; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Punjab, Marathwada and Coastal Karnataka; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Madhya Pradesh, Telangana and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh and Rayalaseema; at most places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Madhya Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, East Rajasthan and Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and West Rajasthan. **The highest maximum temperature** of 41.0°C was reported at MADURAI (A) (TAMIL NADU).



Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low-Pressure area** over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood persisted over same region at 0530 Hrs IST of today, 25th July, 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 9.4 km above mean sea level tilting south-westwards with height.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level continue to pass through Jaisalmer, centre of **low-pressure area** over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood, Kota, Guna, Sidhi, Daltonganj & thence southeastwards towards Northeast Bay of Bengal.
- Under the influence of cyclonic circulation over South West Bengal & adjoining Bangladesh, a **Low Pressure Area** has formed over Northwest Bay of Bengal and adjoining Gangetic West Bengal-North Odisha coasts. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level. It's likely to become more marked during next 2 days.
- The **trough** from cyclonic circulation associated with the **Low-Pressure area** over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood to Jammu division across West Rajasthan, Punjab between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle & upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 30°N persists.
- The **off-shore trough** at the mean sea level from Gujarat to Karnataka coast persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.

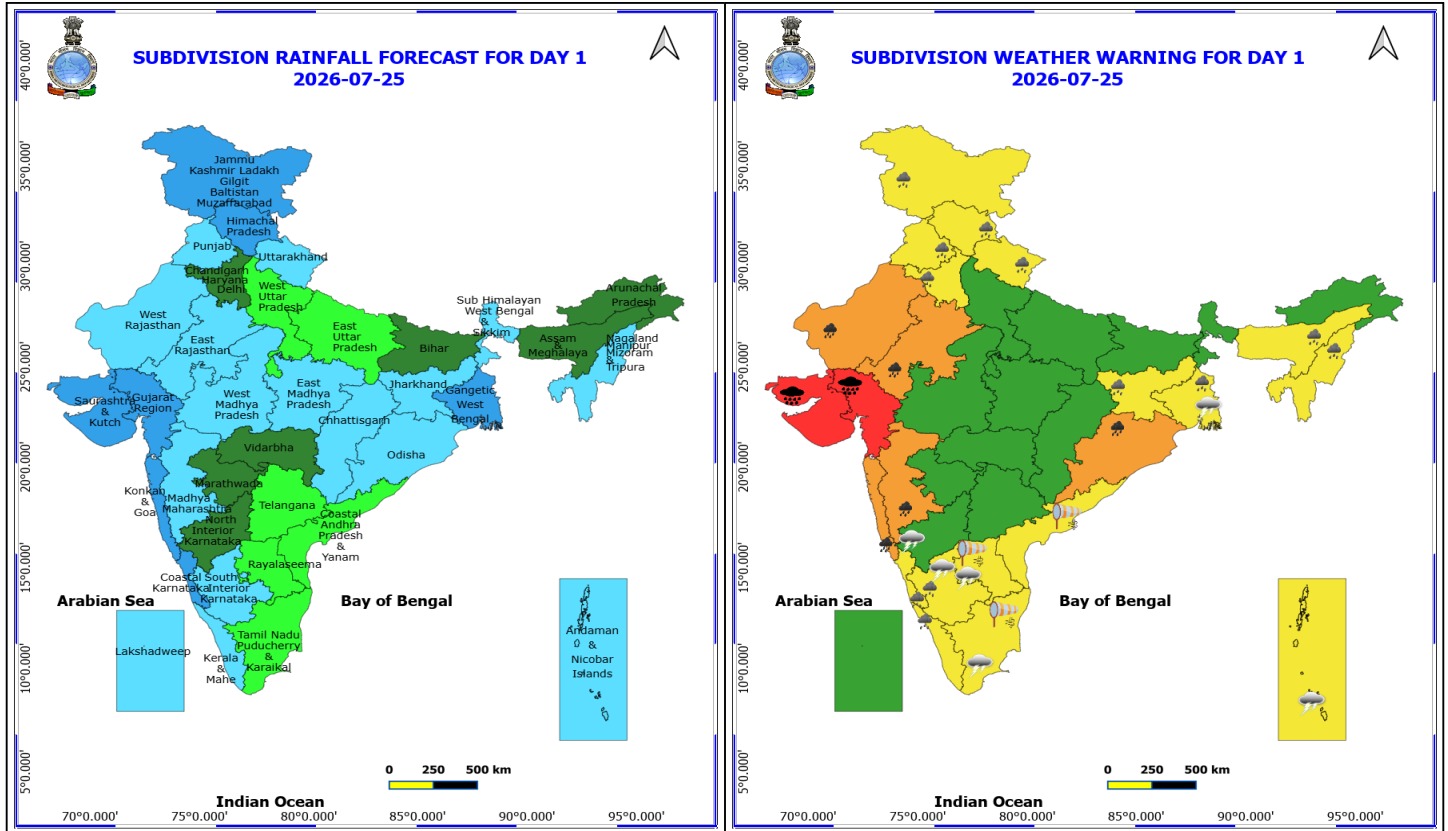

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Himachal Pradesh, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttarakhand and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over most parts of

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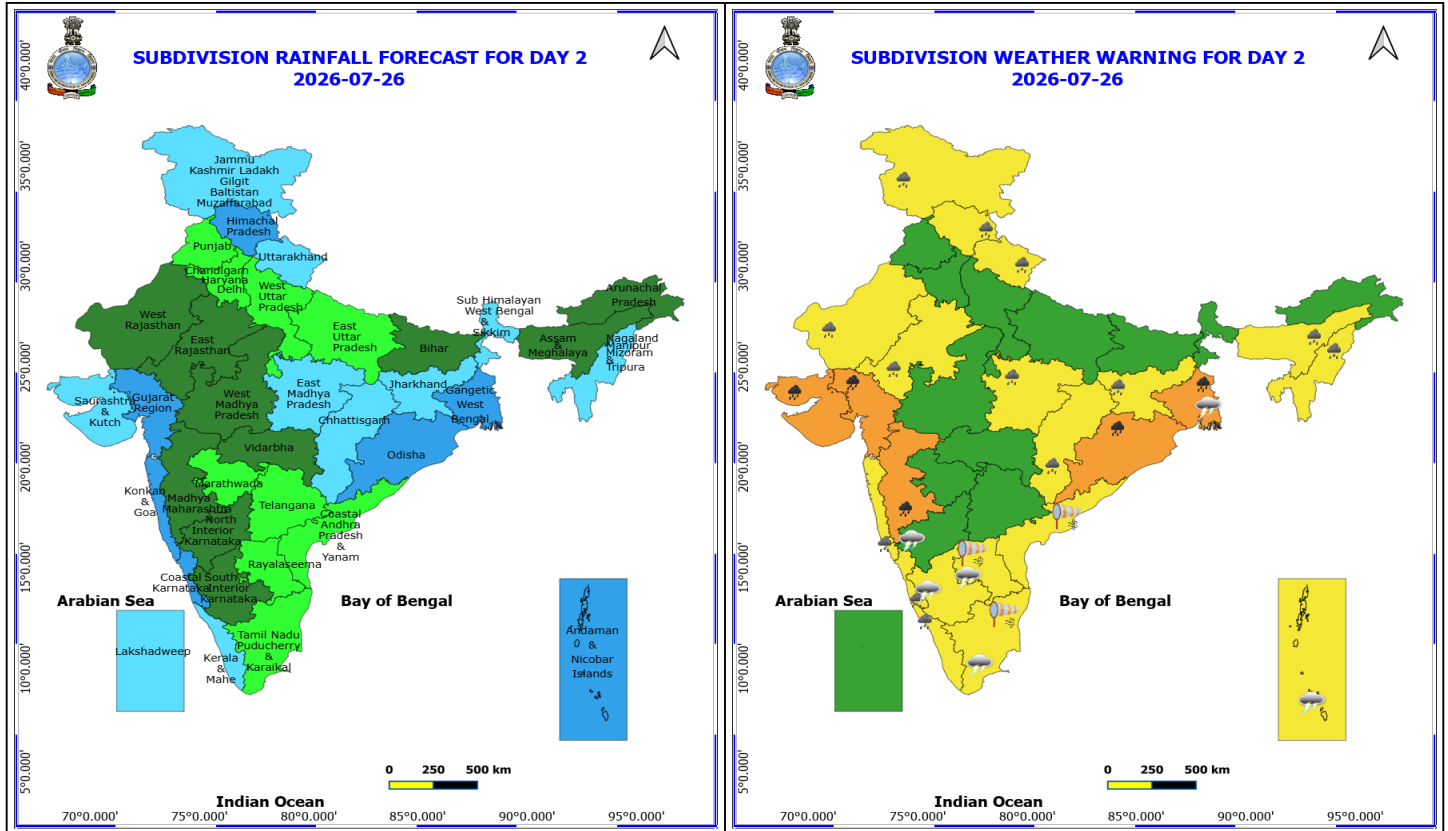
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westcentral adjoining some parts of east central, few parts of north and some parts of southwest Arabian Sea and along and off Somalia and Oman Coasts.

❖ **Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** is likely to prevail over Gujarat, north Maharashtra coasts adjoining northeast & eastcentral Arabian Sea.

❖ **Bay of Bengal: Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off West Bengal and North Odisha Coast and some parts north Bay of Bengal.

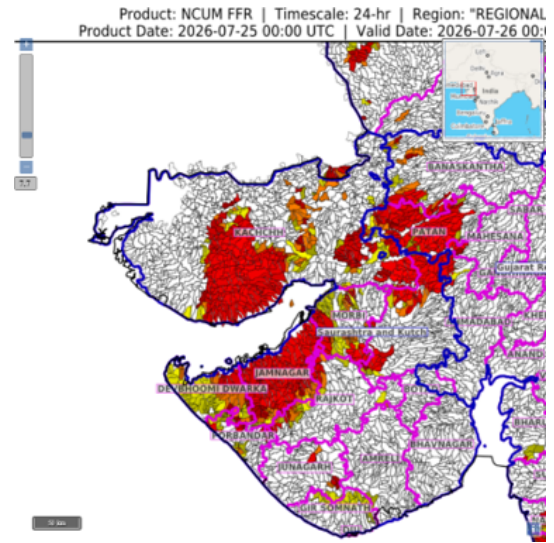

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-24

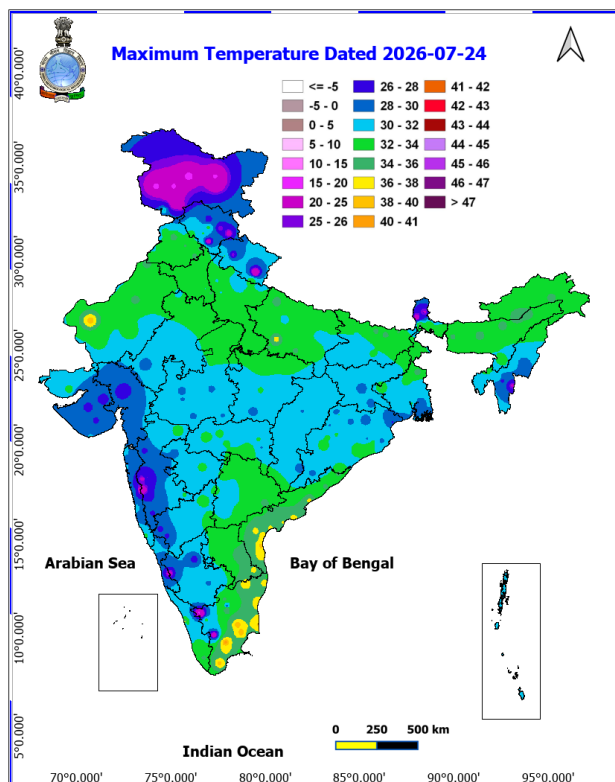


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-24

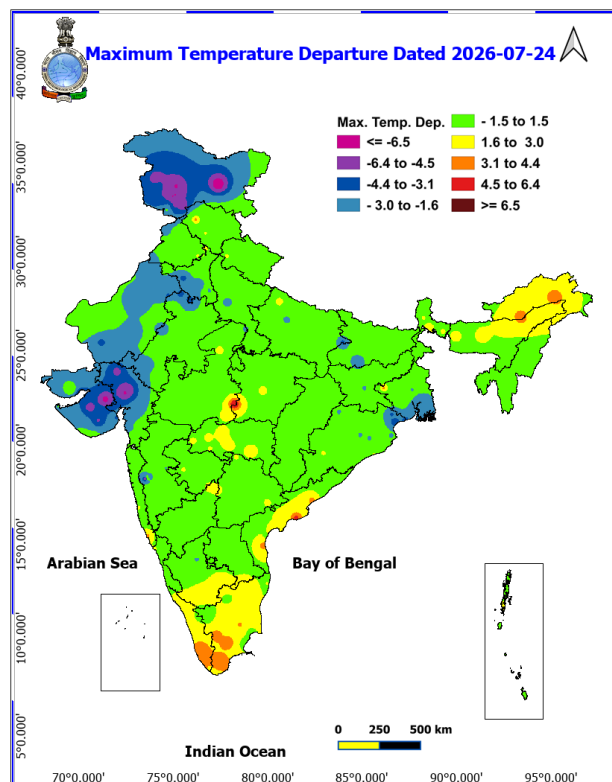


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-24

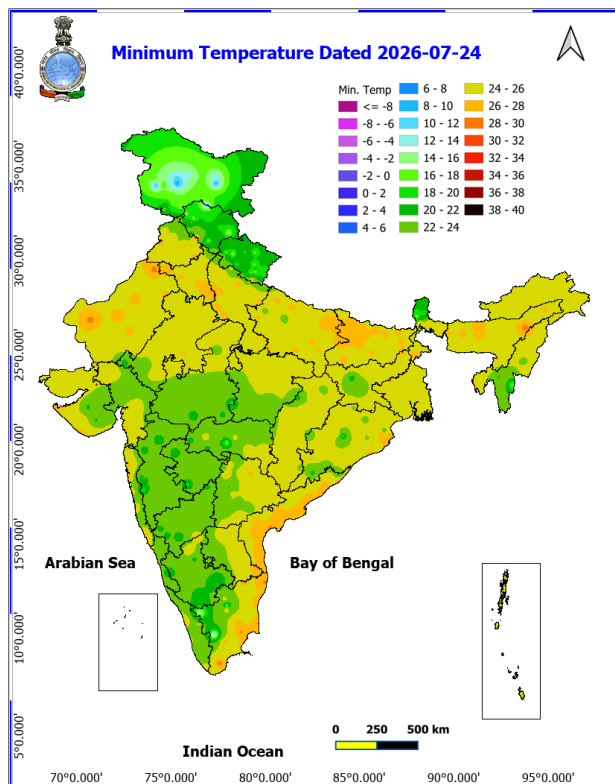
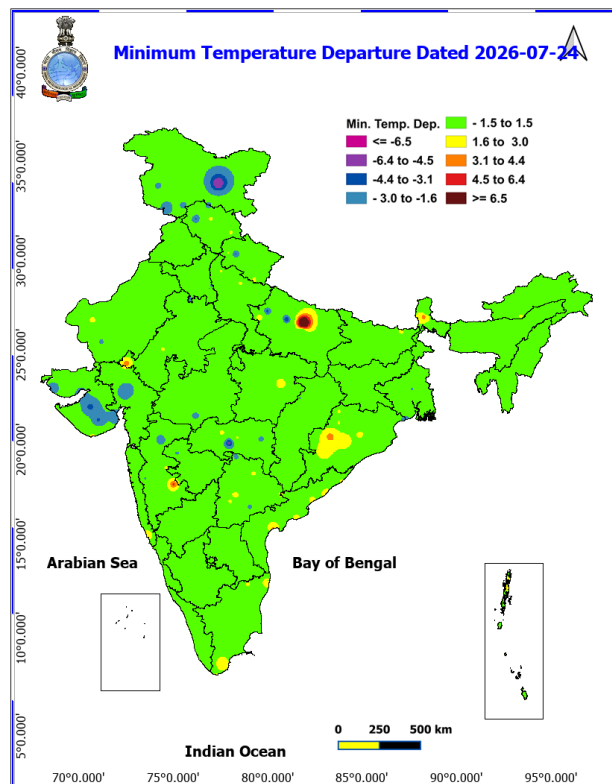
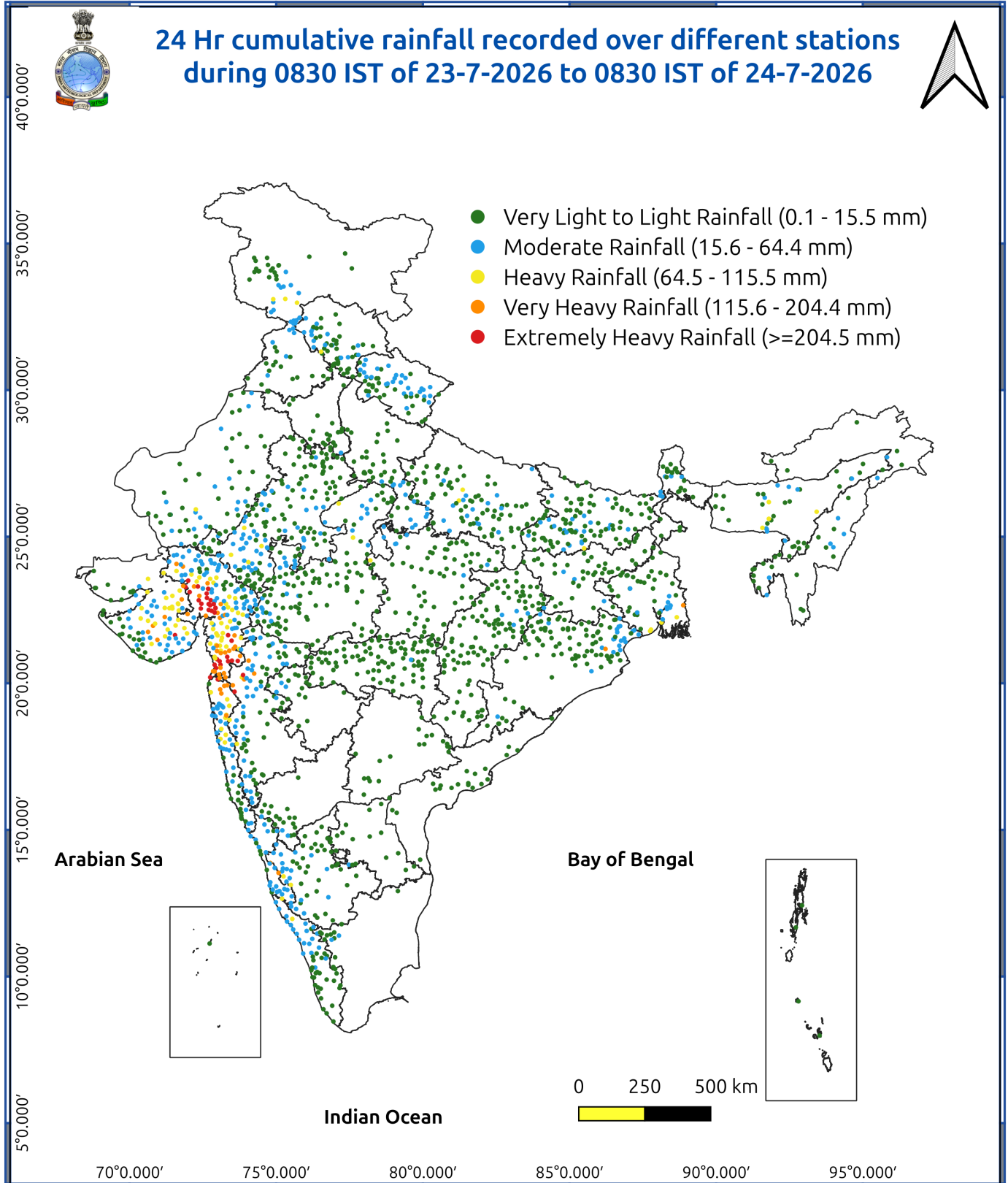


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-24





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall with exceptionally heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Gujarat State on 25th July.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

In **Assam**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries, jute, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide staking or support to banana, vegetables and other vulnerable crops against strong winds.

In **Meghalaya**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Strengthen nursery bunds and keep drainage channels free from obstruction.

In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure continuous and effective drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.

In **Gangatic West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.

In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.

In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

In **Odisha**, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear in rice, maize, pulses, oilseed and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Strengthen support for banana and postpone sowing or transplanting until field conditions improve.

In **Gujarat** maintain uninterrupted drainage and keep field channels clear in rice, cotton, pearl millet, maize, groundnut and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Remove excess rainwater from low-lying crop fields and postpone transplanting and all field operations until field conditions improve.

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In **Konkan & Goa**, maintain uninterrupted drainage in rice nurseries, rice and vegetable fields, and continuously remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Undertake gap filling and transplanting only where field conditions permit.

In **Madhya Maharashtra**, maintain uninterrupted drainage in standing crops and continuously remove excess rainwater from crop fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

In **Himachal Pradesh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, tomato, brinjal, capsicum, chilli and cucumber fields and apple and pear orchards for quick removal of excess rainwater. Harvest mature fruits wherever field conditions permit.

In **Uttarakhand**, maintain effective drainage in rice, black gram, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and chilli fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato wherever field conditions permit, and postpone sowing until field conditions improve.

In **Punjab and Haryana**, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, soybean, pigeon pea and groundnut fields and fruit orchards to prevent waterlogging. Postpone sowing of green gram until field conditions improve.

In **Jammu and Kashmir**, postpone sowing of kharif pulses until field conditions improve. Maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, green gram and black gram fields to prevent waterlogging.

In **Southern part of Rajasthan**, maintain continuous drainage and remove excess rainwater from low-lying soybean, maize, groundnut, cotton and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

In **Karnataka**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain continuous drainage in paddy fields, orchards and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone field operations until field conditions become suitable.

In **Keralam**, maintain effective drainage in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

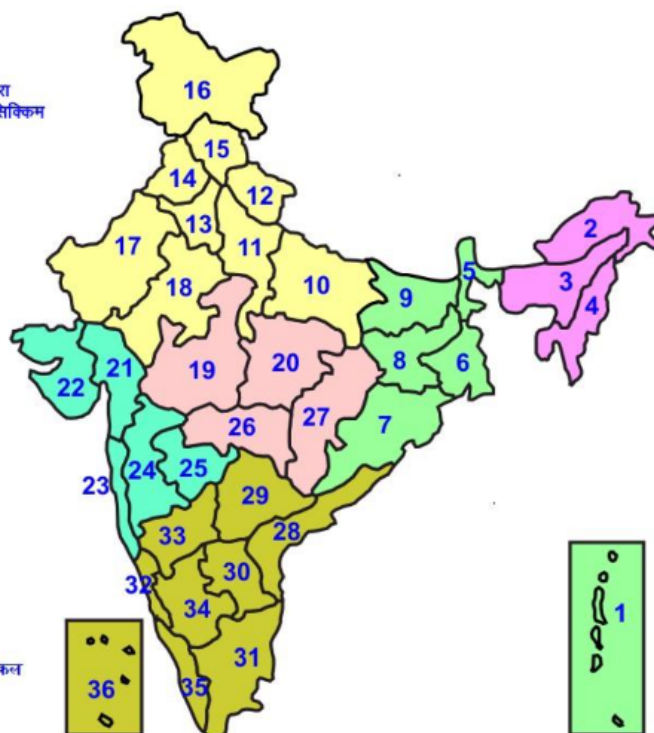
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
