ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather System:

The **Depression** over western Vidarbha and adjoining south Madhya Pradesh moved west-northwestwards with a speed of 17 kmph during past 6 hours, and lay centred at 1130 hrs IST of today, the 31st July 2026, over the same region near latitude 21.3°N and longitude 77.8°E, 40 km north of Amravati (Maharashtra), 60 km south-southwest of Betul (Madhya Pradesh), 160 km east-southeast of Khandwa (Madhya Pradesh), 230 km east-southeast of Khargone (Madhya Pradesh) and 260 km southeast of Indore (Madhya Pradesh). It is very likely to move nearly west-northwestwards across west Madhya Pradesh & adjoining Madhya Maharashtra and weaken into a well-marked low pressure area during next 24 hours.

Weather forecast and Warnings:

Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph) likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Uttarakhand during 1st August-7th August.

Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph) likely over East Uttar Pradesh during 1st-2nd August.

Isolated heavy rainfall likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 1st August-4th August; Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand during 1st August-7th August; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab during 1st August-5th August; West Uttar Pradesh during 3rd-5th August; East Uttar Pradesh during 2nd-7th August; West Rajasthan during 1st-2nd August; East Rajasthan on 2nd August.

Central India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 1st August; Chhattisgarh and East Madhya Pradesh during 3rd-7th August; Vidarbha on 1st August and on 7th August.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 2nd-7th August; Chhattisgarh and East Madhya Pradesh during 1st-2nd August; Vidarbha during 2nd-5th August.

Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph) likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 1st August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 2nd-4th August; East Madhya Pradesh during 1st August-4th August.

Isolated thunderstorm & lightning likely over Vidarbha during 1st-4th August; Chhattisgarh during 1st August-4th August.

Isolated heavy rainfall likely over Chhattisgarh during 3rd-7th August.

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East India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 1st August-7th August; Bihar during 1st-5th August; Odisha during 2nd-5th August.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall likely over Bihar on 7th August; Odisha on 1st August and on 7th August.

Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 1st August-7th August; Jharkhand during 1st August-4th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Bihar during 1st August-7th August; Odisha during 1st August-2nd August.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Bihar during 1st-7th August; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 1st August and on 7th August; Gangetic West Bengal during 4th-7th August; Odisha during 2nd-7th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 2nd-5th August.

Northeast India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 1st August-2nd August; Assam & Meghalaya during 1st August-5th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 1st August-7th August.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 3rd-7th August; Assam & Meghalaya on 7th August.

Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 1st August; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 1st August-4th August.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 1st-7th August; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 1st August-7th August.

West India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 1st August-7th August; Madhya Maharashtra on 1st August; Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 1st August-2nd August.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall likely over Madhya Maharashtra during 2nd-7th August; Marathwada during 1st-7th August; Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 3rd-7th August.

Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 1st August-2nd August.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra during 2nd-3rd August; Gujarat Region on 1st August; Saurashtra & Kutch during 1st August-2nd August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra on 1st August; Gujarat Region on 2nd August.

Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Saurashtra & Kutch on 01st August.

Extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Gujarat Region on 01st August.

South Peninsular India:

Isolated to Scattered rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 1st August-7th August; Lakshadweep during 5th-7th August; North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 1st-7th August.

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Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall likely over Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe during 1st August-7th August; Lakshadweep during 1st August-4th August.

Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, South Interior Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 1st August; North Interior Karnataka during 2nd-4th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 1st August-2nd August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep on 2nd August; Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 2nd-4th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 3rd-4th August; Telangana during 1st August-4th August.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 1st August; Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and South Interior Karnataka on 2nd August; Lakshadweep and North Interior Karnataka on 1st August; Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and South Interior Karnataka on 1st August.

Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph) likely over North Interior Karnataka on 1st August.

Strong Surface Winds likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 1st August-2nd August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 1st August-4th August.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Kerala & Mahe, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Assam & Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Lakshadweep, Gujarat Region, South Interior Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, Coastal Karnataka, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha, Marathwada, Madhya Maharashtra, Konkan & Goa, Saurashtra & Kutch, Telangana and West Madhya Pradesh; **at many places** over East Rajasthan, Odisha, Jharkhand, West Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Punjab, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal and Rayalaseema; **Dry** over rest of the country.

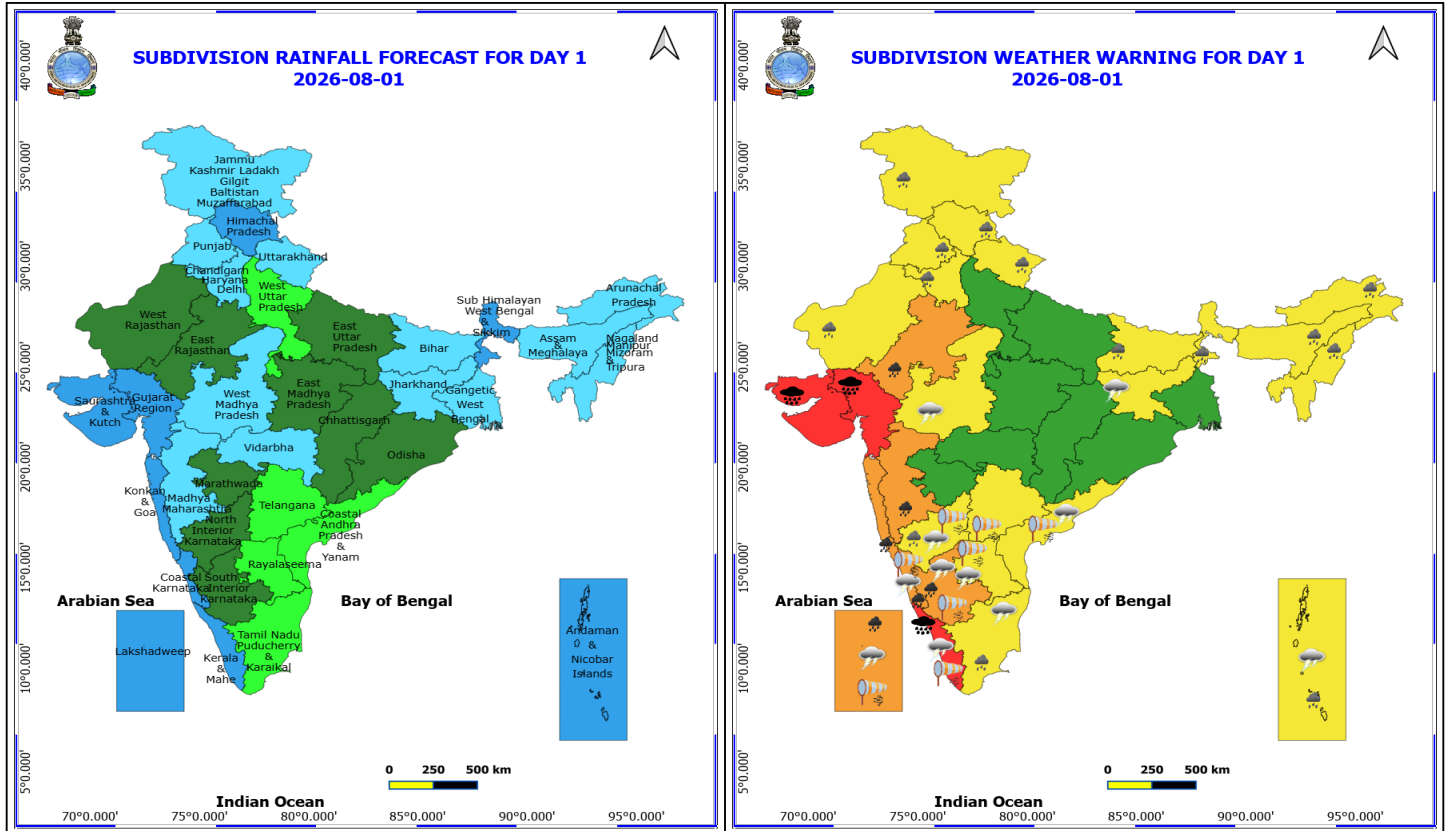
❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Heavy rain** at a few places over Gujarat Region, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 31-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Vidarbha. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat Region; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep; at few places over Odisha, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan and Coastal Karnataka; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Telangana, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Punjab, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.0°C was reported at BOUDH (ORISSA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 31-07-2026)**: **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Gujarat Region. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Chhattisgarh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Punjab, Telangana and North Interior Karnataka; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Konkan & Goa and Lakshadweep; at few places over Vidarbha; at isolated places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada. **The highest maximum temperature** of 41.8°C was reported at JAISALMER (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Depression** over southwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining East Rajasthan & Gujarat Region moved nearly west-northwestwards and weakened into a **Well-Marked Low Pressure** Area over Southeast Rajasthan & Neighbourhood at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 01st August, 2026. It is very likely to move west-northwestwards across South Rajasthan and weaken further into a Low Pressure Area during next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now pass through Deesa, centre of **Well-Marked Low Pressure** over southeast Rajasthan and neighbourhood, Bhopal, Raipur, Gopalpur thence southeastwards towards Central Bay of Bengal and extends upto 1.5km above mean sea level.
- An east-west shear zone runs roughly along latitude 22°N across central & adjoining north peninsular India between 3.1 & 5.8 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height.
- The **Western Disturbance** now seen as a **cyclonic circulation** over Himachal Pradesh & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- The trough from Northeast Arabian sea to cyclonic circulation associated with **Depression** over western Vidarbha and adjoining south Madhya Pradesh merged with the above shear zone.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central Assam now seen over Northeast Assam & neighbourhood and extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **off-Shore trough** at mean sea level from South Gujarat to North Kerala persists.



1 August (Day 1)

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, North Interior Karnataka, Punjab, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Uttarakhand and West Rajasthan.
- ❖ **Thundersquall with wind speed reaching(50-60kmph)** very likely at isolated places over North Interior Karnataka.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Coastal Karnataka, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh, East Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Odisha, Telangana and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe,

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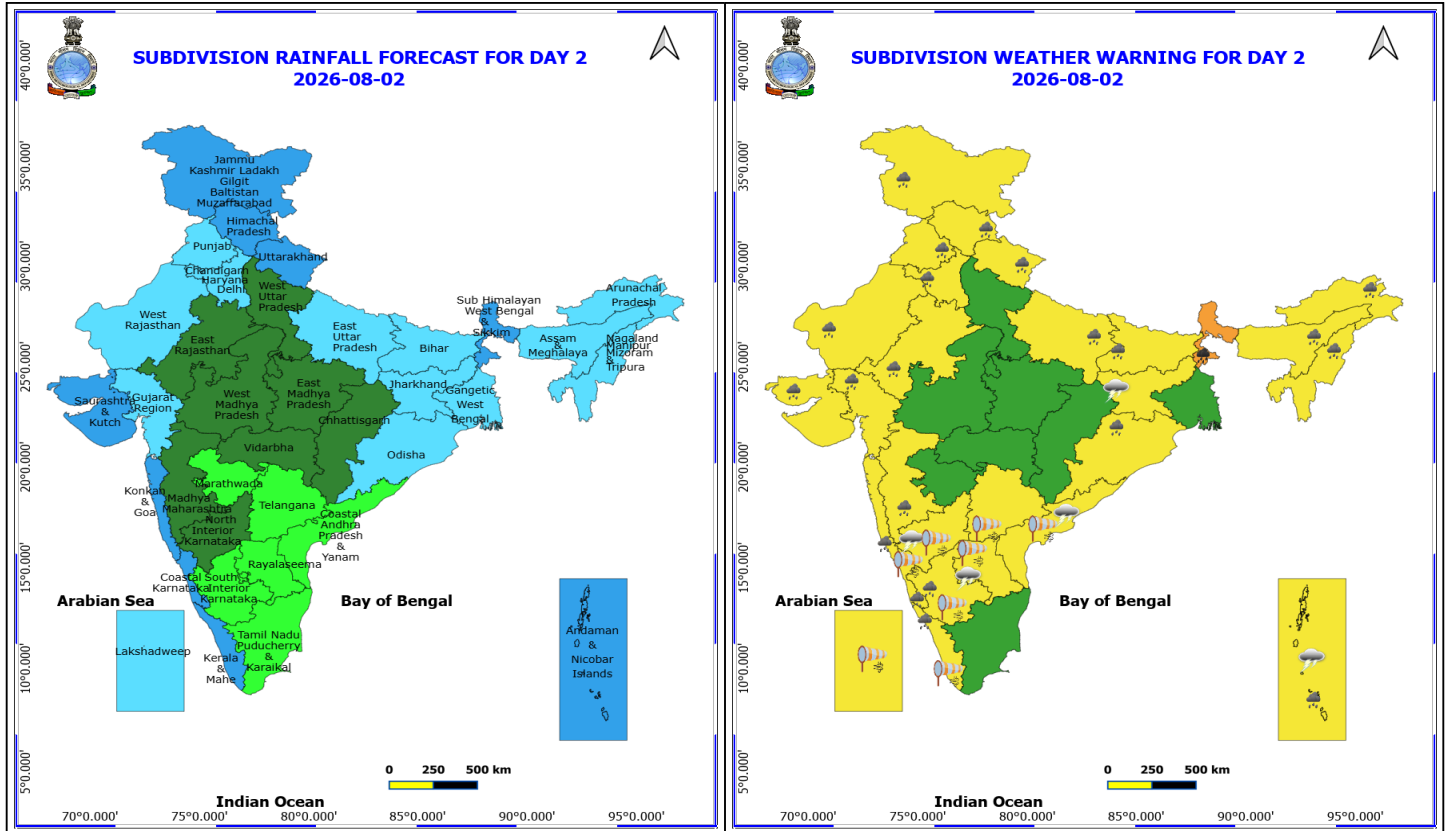
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Lakshadweep and Telangana.

- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally weather with wind speed 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph is likely to prevail along and off south Gujarat, north Maharashtra and adjoining northeast & eastcentral Arabian Sea, some parts of southwest & westcentral Arabian Sea adjoining Somalia coasts. Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coasts, over most parts of central adjoining some parts of southwest, few parts of southeast & northwest Arabian Sea. Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off south Maharashtra & Goa, Karnataka, Kerala coasts, Lakshadweep area & adjoining sea areas.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over few parts of Gulf of Mannar, southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining south Sri Lanka coasts.



2 August (Day 2)

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Coastal Karnataka, East Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat State, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Kerala & Mahe, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, South Interior Karnataka and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Jharkhand and North Interior Karnataka.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Coastal Karnataka, East Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, South Interior Karnataka, Telangana and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coasts, over most parts of central adjoining some parts of southwest and few parts of north Arabian Sea and Squally weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over Comorin area and south Sri Lanka coasts adjoining sea areas. Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala coasts, Lakshadweep area, Comorin area and adjoining sea areas.

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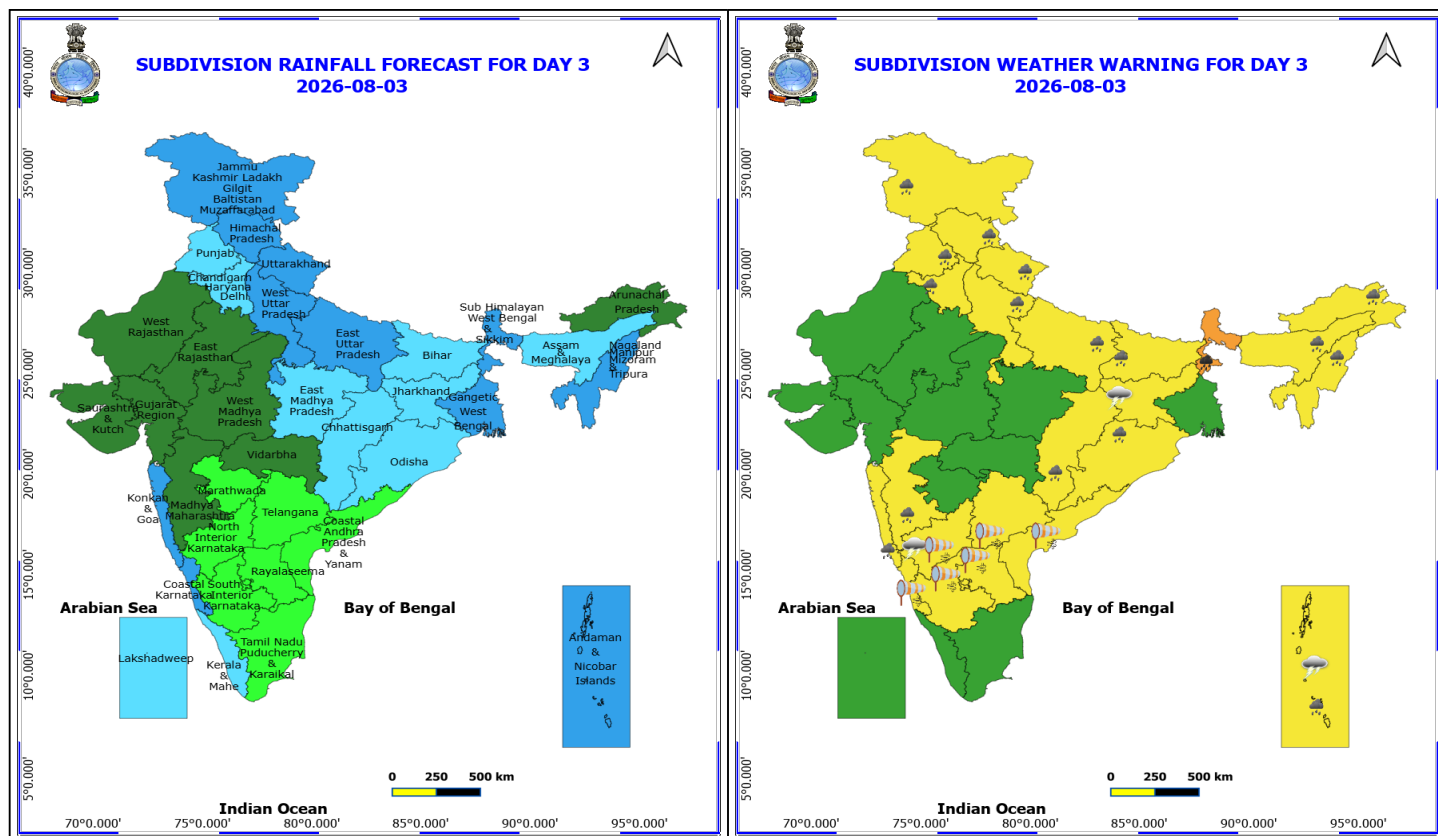
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❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along & off south Sri Lanka coast adjoining few parts of southwest Bay of Bengal and over Gulf of Mannar.

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Coastal Karnataka, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Madhya Pradesh, South Interior Karnataka, Telangana and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coasts, over most parts of westcentral adjoining some parts of eastcentral, southwest & north Arabian Sea. Squally weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Gujarat coasts adjoining northeast Arabian Sea, Comorin area. Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Karnataka, Kerala coasts, Lakshadweep area, Comorin area and adjoining sea areas.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over Gulf of

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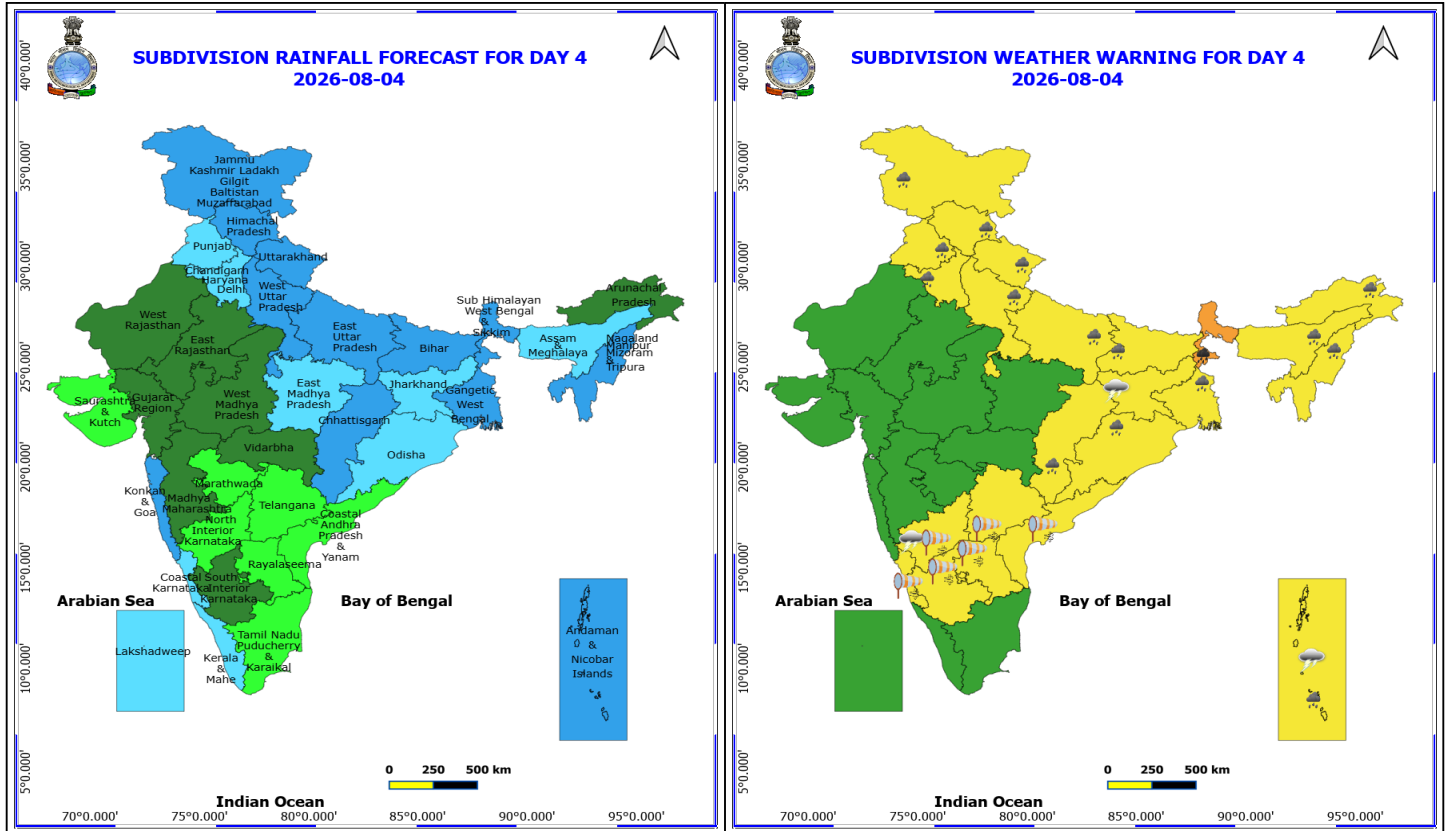
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Mannar adjoining South Sri Lanka coasts.

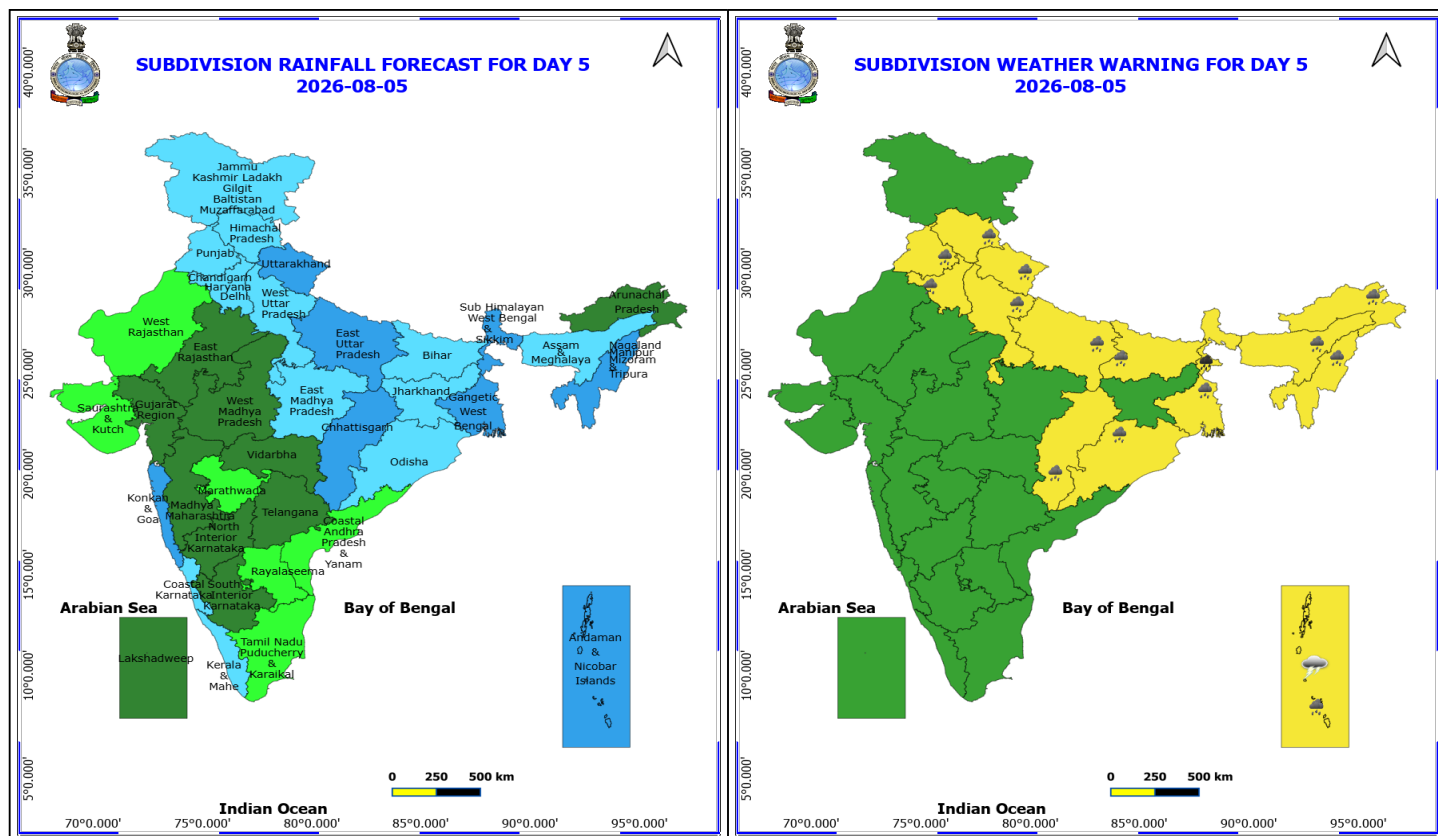

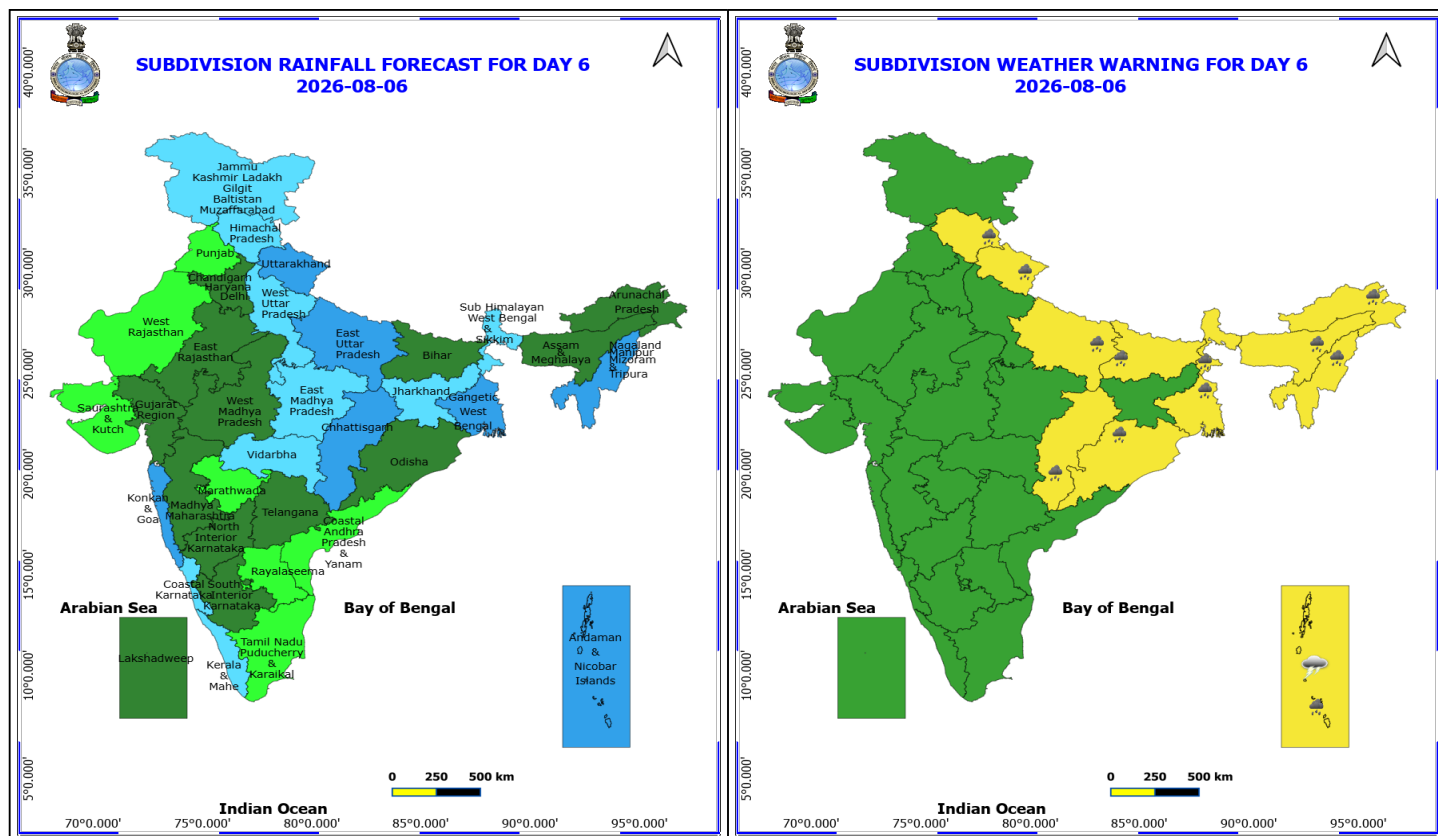

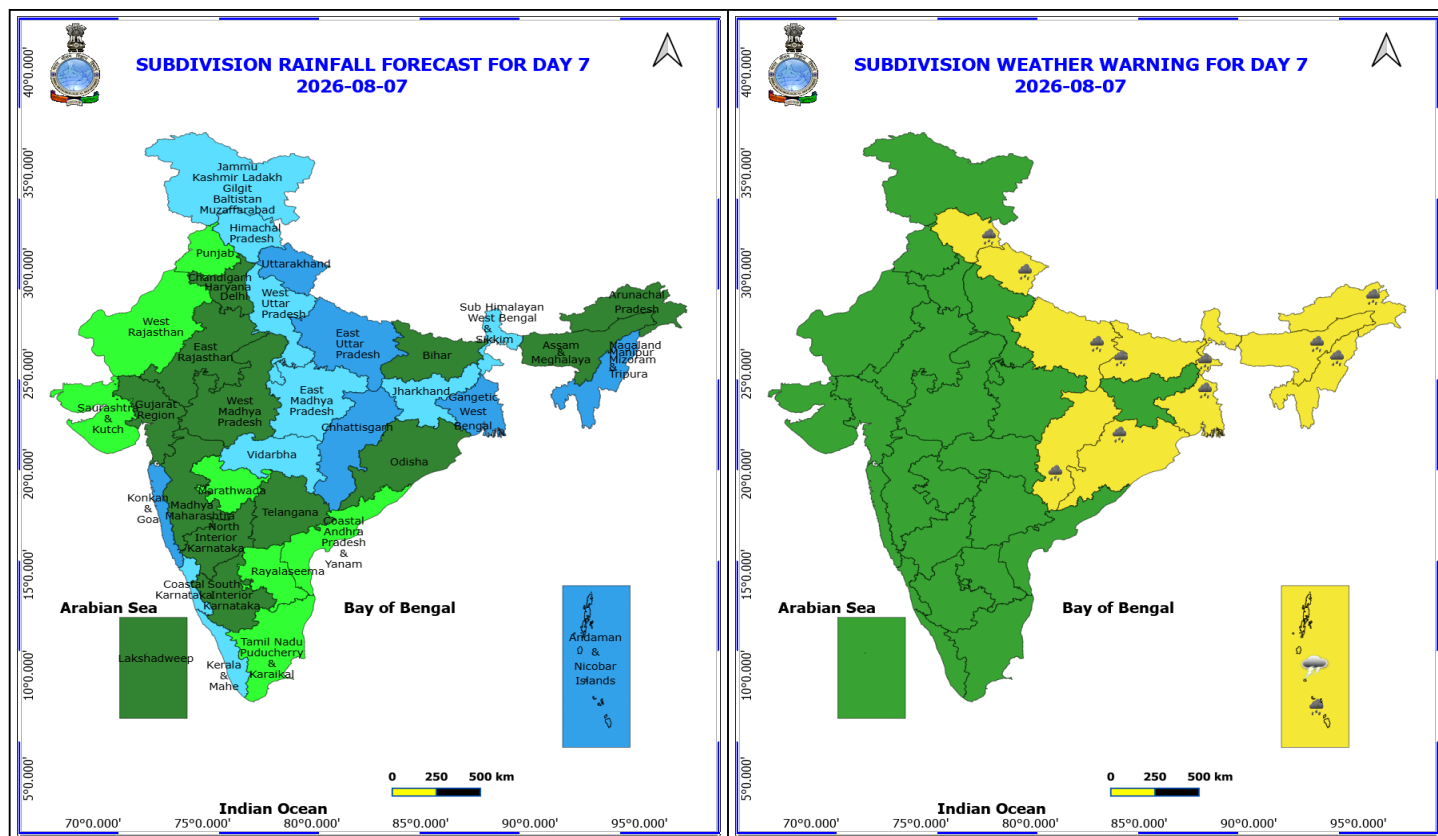

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-31

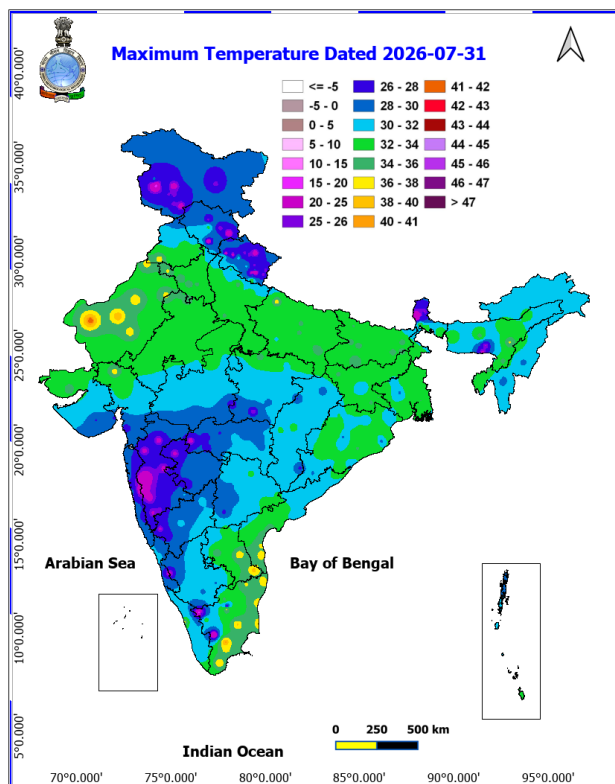


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-31

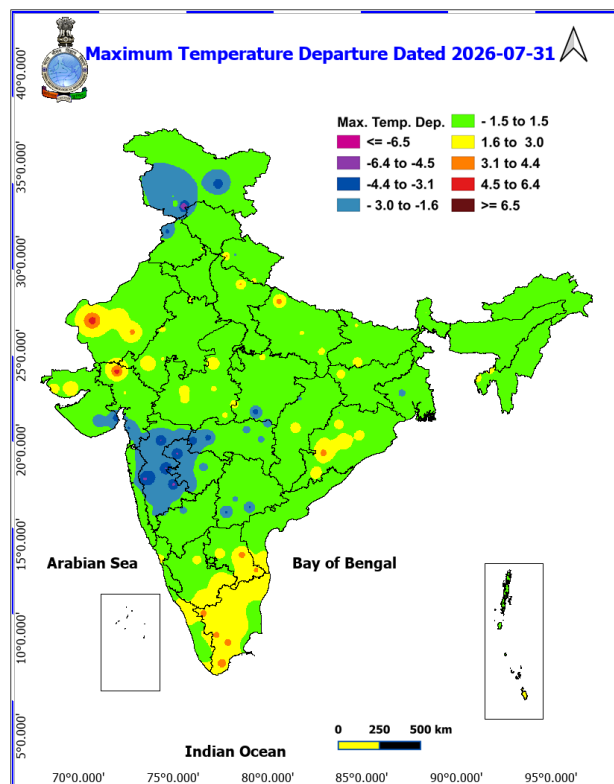


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-31

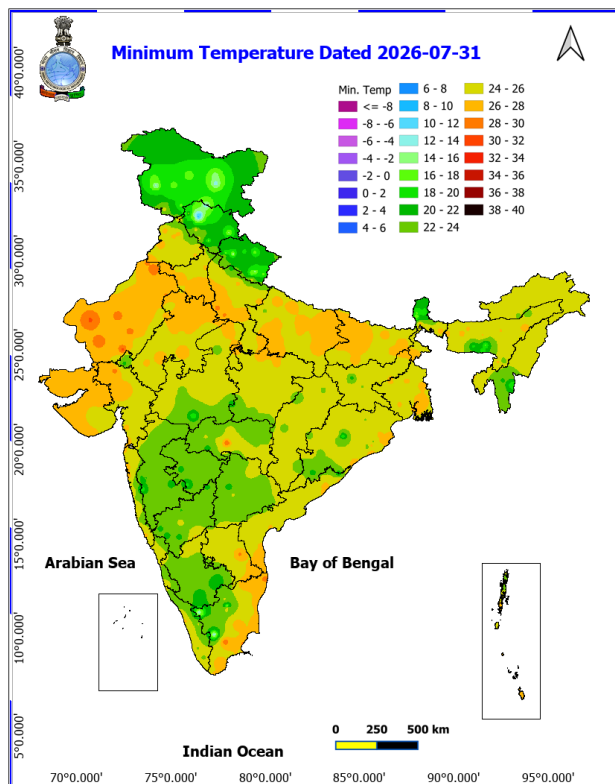
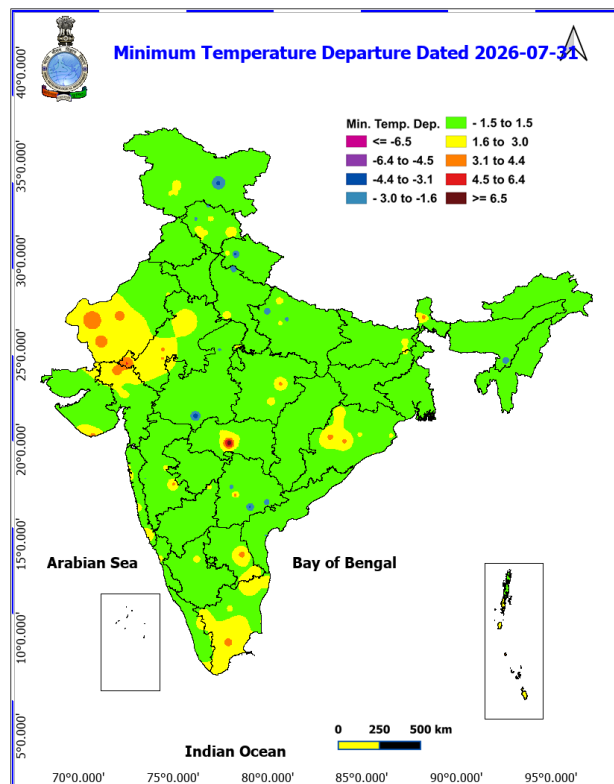
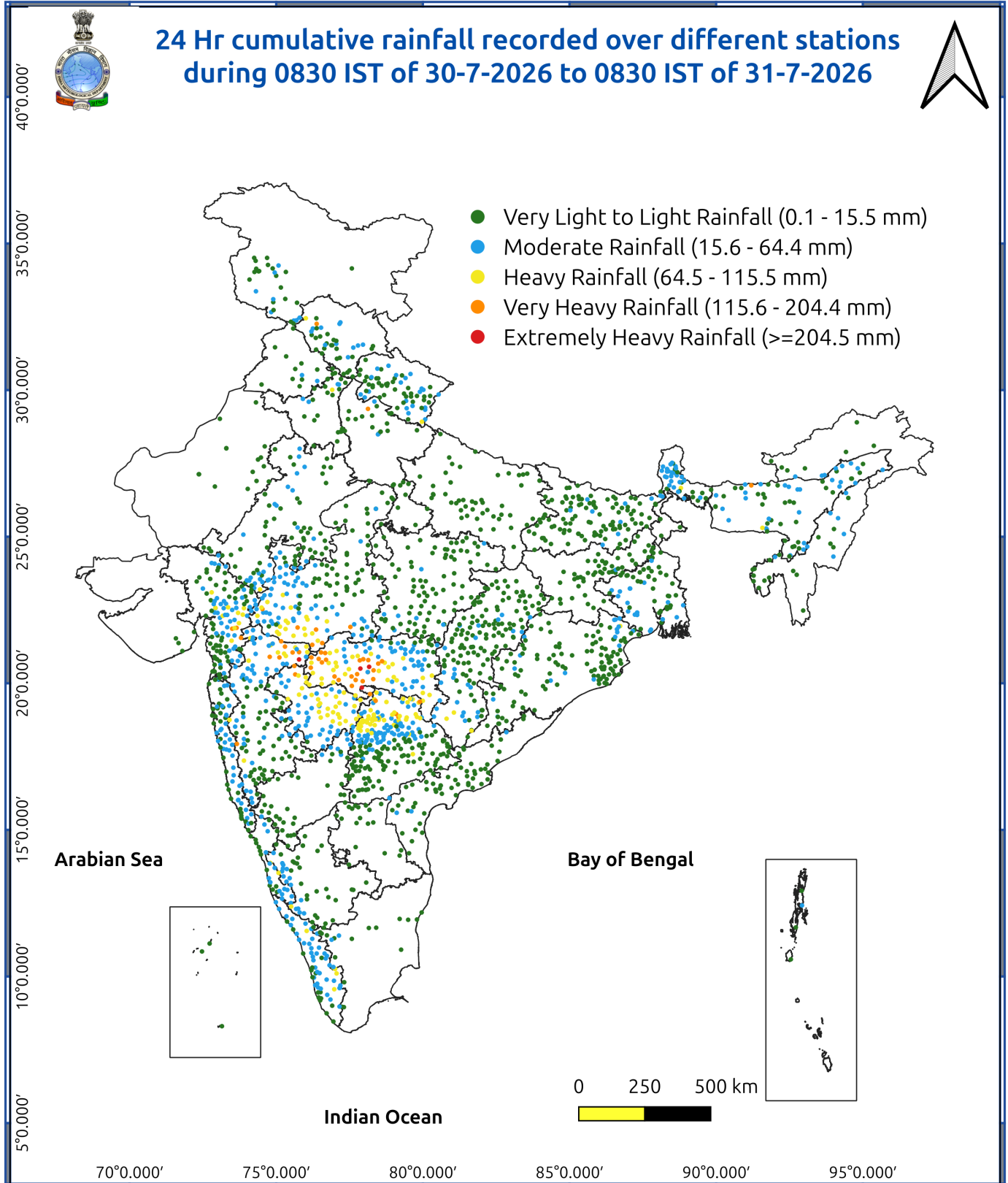


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-31





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- **Extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Gujarat Region on 01st August.**

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall:

In **Gujarat**, maintain proper drainage to drain out excess rainwater from the field of rice, cotton, pearl millet, soybean, Pigeon pea, green gram, black gram, maize, groundnut and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide strong bamboo staking to tall crops (banana, papaya, sugarcane).

In **Konkan**, ensure proper drainage in turmeric, groundnut, transplanted rice and finger millet, porso millet, vegetable fields and orchards. Remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

In **Madhya Maharashtra**, drain out excess water from rice nurseries and *kharif* crops like maize, cotton, pigeon pea, groundnut, green gram and black gram.

In **Marathwada**, drain out excess water from *kharif* crops like cotton, pigeon pea, green gram, black gram and groundnut. Postpone fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

In **Vidarbha**, drain out excess water from *kharif* crops like maize, cotton, pigeon pea, soybean, orchards and vegetable nurseries.

In **Tamil Nadu**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess rain water from standing crops, vegetable fields and orchards. Keep the harvested produce at safer place.

In **Keralam**, ensure proper drainage in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.

In **Karnataka**, keep field drainage channels clear and ensure proper drainage in paddy fields, orchards and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

In **Telangana**, drain out excess rainwater from rice, maize, cotton, red gram, soybean and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.

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In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal**, ensure proper drainage in the fields of rice, jute, ginger and vegetable to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

In **Jammu and Kashmir**, maintain proper drainage in fields of maize, green gram, black gram and vegetables to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation in transplanted rice.

In **Himachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, tomato, brinjal, capsicum, chilli and cucumber fields and apple and pear orchards for quick removal of excess rainwater. Harvest mature fruits wherever field conditions permit.

In **Uttarakhand**, maintain effective drainage in rice, black gram, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and chilli fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato wherever field conditions permit.

In **Punjab and Haryana**, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, cotton, soybean, pigeon pea and groundnut fields and fruit orchards to prevent waterlogging.

In **East Rajasthan**, maintain proper drainage to remove excess rainwater from low-lying soybean, maize, groundnut, cotton and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

In **West Rajasthan**, make necessary arrangements for drainage from the fields of already sown pearl millet, green gram, sesame, moth bean, cluster bean, other standing crops and vegetables.

In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields, orchards and low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.

In **Assam**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain proper drainage in rice nurseries, jute, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide staking or support to banana, vegetables and other vulnerable crops against strong winds.

In **Meghalaya**, ensure proper drainage from rice nurseries and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Strengthen nursery bunds and keep drainage channels free from obstruction.

In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, ensure proper drainage from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.

Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

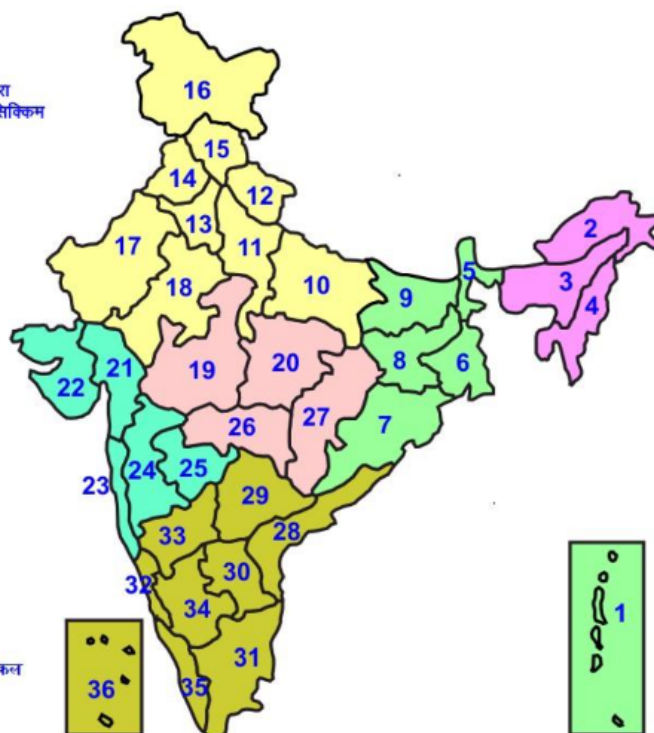
Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.

Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
