- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 24th-29th August; Gangetic West Bengal and Odisha on 24th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 24th-25th August; Gangetic West Bengal during 25th-26th August; Jharkhand during 24th-27th August; Bihar during 24th-29th August; Odisha on 25th August.

- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Assam & Meghalaya during 24th-27th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 24th-25th August.

- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 24th-25th August; Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and South Interior Karnataka during 24th-25th August; Telangana on 24th August.

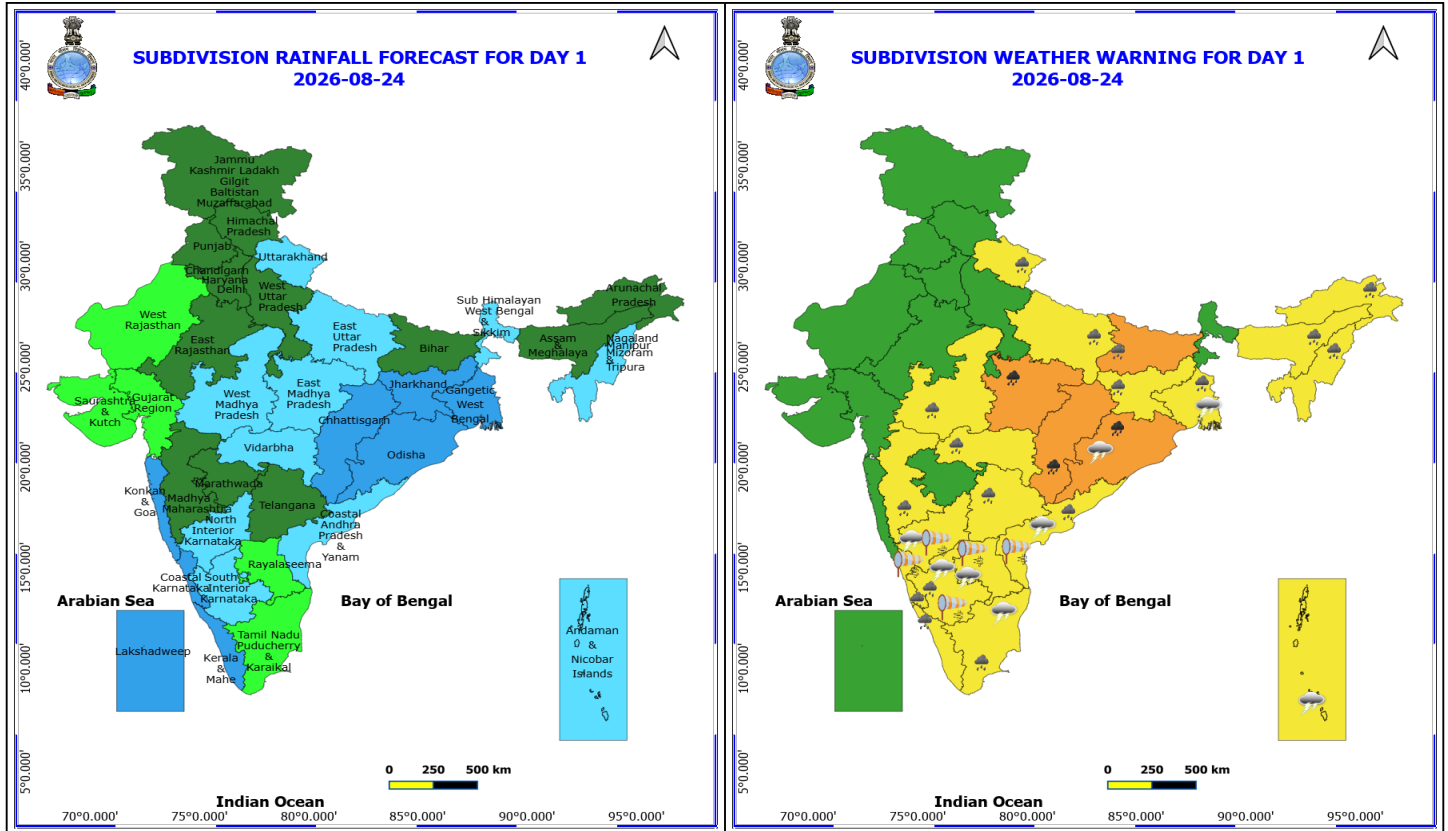

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 23-08-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Saurashtra & Kutch and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Gangetic West Bengal; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa and Vidarbha; at most places over Jharkhand, West Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, East Madhya Pradesh and Lakshadweep. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.2°C was reported at PARALAKHEMUNDI-OBS (ORISSA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 23-08-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya and Himachal Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at few places over Jharkhand; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over East Rajasthan, Rayalaseema and Lakshadweep; at most places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Coastal Karnataka; at isolated places over Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Telangana and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Uttar Pradesh and Gujarat Region; at most places over Punjab and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over West Rajasthan. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.1°C was reported at TIRUCHIRAPALLI (A) (TAMIL NADU).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low-Pressure Area** over North Coastal Odisha & adjoining areas of Gangetic West Bengal and the Northwest Bay of Bengal lay over Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining areas of north Odisha, Jharkhand & the Northwest Bay of Bengal at 0530 Hrs IST of today, the 24th August 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height. The system is likely to move nearly north-westwards across Gangetic West Bengal and adjoining north Odisha & Jharkhand during the next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Amritsar, Bareilly, Lucknow, Daltonganj, Jamshedpur, centre of Low Pressure Area over Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining areas of north Odisha, Jharkhand & the Northwest Bay of Bengal and thence southeastwards to eastcentral Bay of Bengal.
- The **trough** now runs from cyclonic circulation associated with low pressure area over Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining areas of north Odisha, Jharkhand & the Northwest Bay of Bengal to Northwest Uttar Pradesh across Jharkhand, north Chhattisgarh & East Uttar Pradesh and extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle & upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 67°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.
- The **shear zone** roughly along 22°N over central India between 4.5 & 5.8 above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Haryana & neighbourhood persists and now extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northeast Assam & neighbourhood persists and extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over North Keralam & neighbourhood at 7.6 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **cyclonic circulation** over East Uttar Pradesh extending upto 3.1 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-23

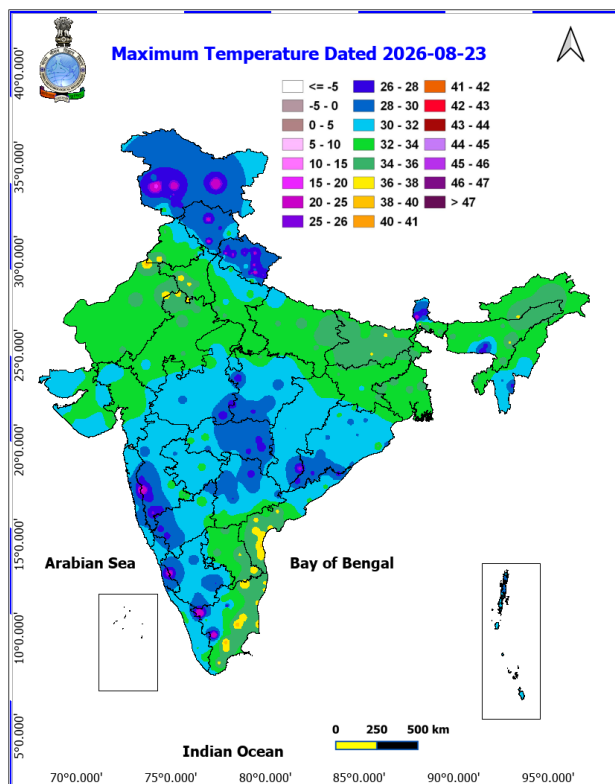


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-23

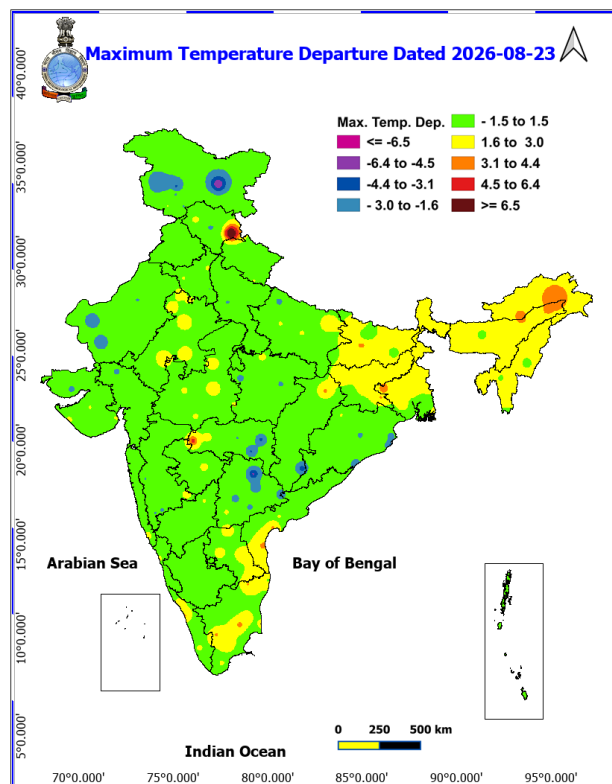


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-23

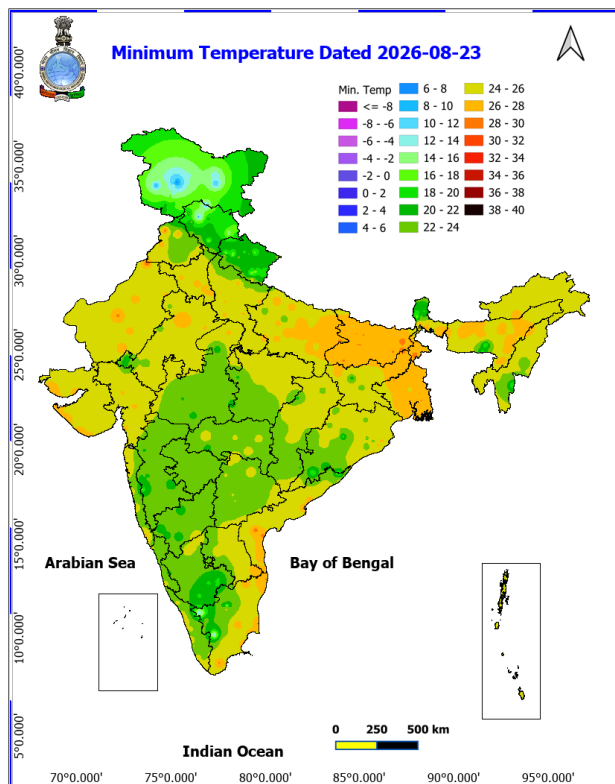
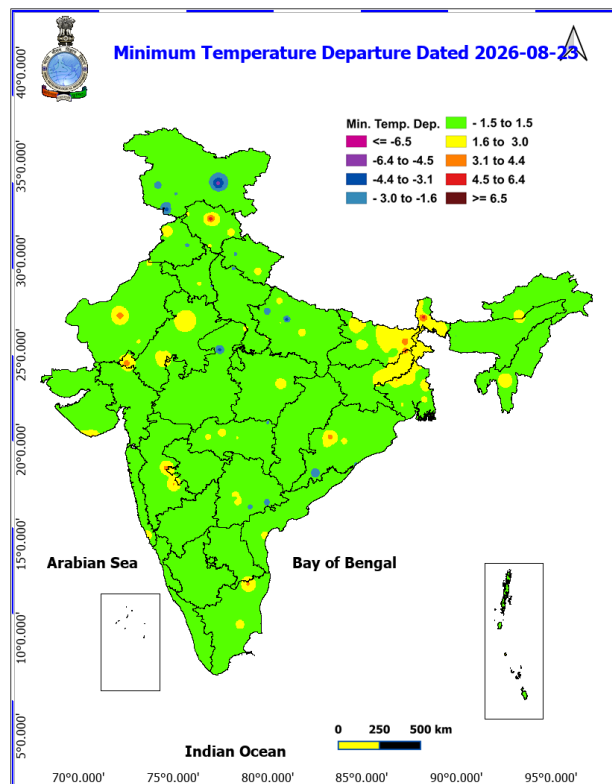
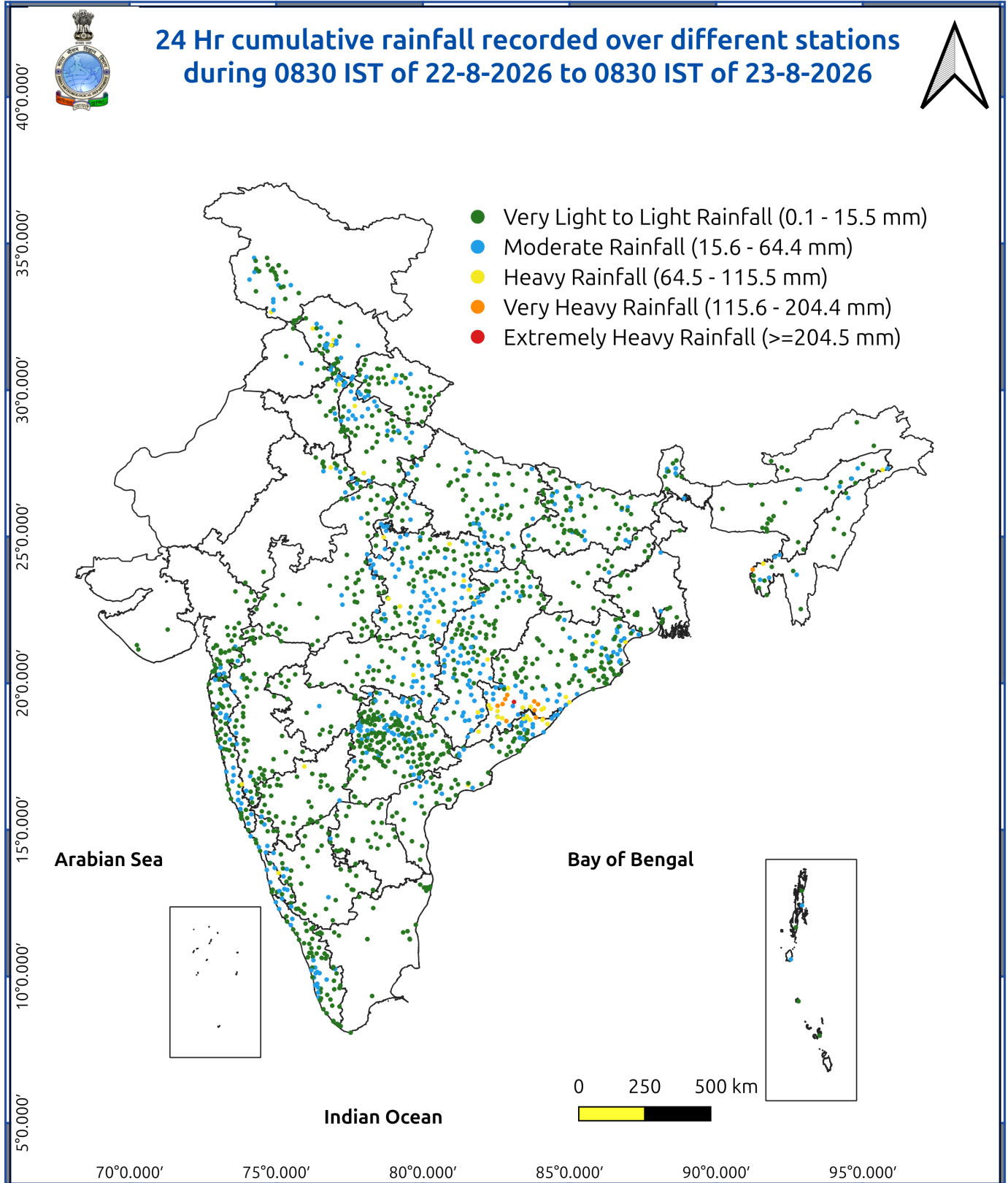


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-23





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- **Moderate to severe lightning** activity over Bihar on 24th August.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Odisha**, drain out excess rain water from *kharif* rice, maize, pulses, cotton, pigeon pea, banana, vegetable fields and nursery beds. Keep field drains, outlets and bunds clear and functional. In waterlogged areas, postpone sowing/re-sowing of maize and green gram and prevent water stagnation in pearl millet. Provide staking/support to vegetables, banana, papaya and young horticultural plants. Protect tomato, chilli and brinjal nurseries with polythene sheets and postpone rice and horticultural crop transplanting in waterlogged fields until suitable soil conditions are restored.
- In **East Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging. Provide support to young fruit plants. Postpone planting of new saplings. Postpone field operations, fertilizer application and plant protection measures in waterlogged fields and provide staking/support to vegetables and tall crops to minimize lodging.
- In **Vidarbha**, ensure proper drainage in the fields of soybean, cotton, pigeon pea, sorghum, maize, green gram and black gram.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain effective drainage from rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets and pulses fields.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, maintain effective drainage in paddy, pigeon pea, pulses, oilseeds and vegetable fields, particularly in low-lying areas, and promptly remove excess rainwater.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, keep drainage channels in ginger and turmeric fields clear and functional and ensure prompt removal of excess rainwater from maize fields. Harvest mature vegetables such as cucumber, bottle gourd, bitter gourd, snake gourd, ridge gourd, sponge gourd and keep harvested produce in a safe place.
- In **Coastal Andhra Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in paddy and other standing crop fields and remove excess water from low-lying areas. Provide support to banana, papaya and vegetable crops against lodging.

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- In **Telangana** withhold irrigation in standing crops and ensure proper drainage to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.
- In **Karnataka**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain proper drainage to drain out excess rainwater from paddy, maize, millets, vegetables, arecanut plantations and fruit orchards to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide mechanical support to banana and tomato crops. Keep the harvested produce of green gram at safe place.
- In **Keralam**, maintain effective drainage to remove excess rain water around palm and from other standing crop fields.
- In **Ghat** areas of **Madhya Maharashtra**, drain out excess water from rice, groundnut, vegetable and other standing crop fields and keep drainage channels clear. Postpone fertilizer and plant protection operations during rainfall and resume field operations only when soil conditions become suitable.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain proper and effective drainage in rice, soybean, maize, red gram, ginger, garlic, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and other standing crop fields. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato and keep the produce in a safe, dry place.
- In **Haryana**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and promptly remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas.
- In **Gangetic West Bengal**, prepare broad bed and furrow systems to improve drainage and aeration for groundnut in areas prone to water accumulation. Harvest matured crops promptly when conditions permit and store in a dry, safe place.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in maize, pigeon pea and other standing crops and remove excess rainwater. Avoid fertilizer and plant protection operations during wet conditions.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetable fields and orchards to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Assam**, maintain proper drainage and keep field channels clear in rice, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame and vegetable fields and orchards. Remove excess water promptly from low-lying fields and prevent water stagnation in sugarcane.
- In **Meghalaya**, maintain continuous drainage in maize, cowpea, okra and ginger and keep drainage channels free from obstruction. Provide staking or trellising to cowpea and support other vulnerable horticultural crops to prevent lodging.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops and vegetable fields and prevent water stagnation.
- In **Bihar**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess rainwater from rice, maize, pulses and other standing crop fields, particularly in low-lying areas.
- In **West Madhya Pradesh**, make necessary arrangements for effective drainage in soybean, maize, cotton, sugarcane and vegetable fields.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

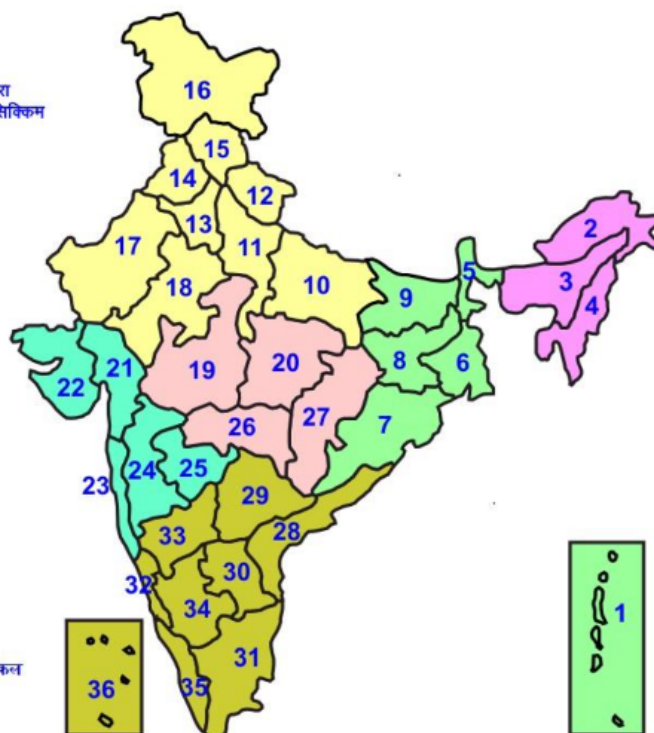
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
