Significant Weather Features

- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 3rd August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 3rd August; Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand during 3rd-5th August; Bihar during 3rd-8th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Jharkhand during 3rd-6th August; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 6th August; Gangetic West Bengal during 5th-7th August; Bihar during 4th-5th August; Odisha during 3rd-8th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 3rd-5th August; Bihar on 3rd August.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 4th-8th August.
- **Moderate to intense lightning activity likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar & Jharkhand on 03rd August and Gangetic West Bengal during 3rd -05th August.**

Northeast India:

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- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 5th August; Assam & Meghalaya during 3rd-5th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 3rd-8th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 3rd-4th August and during 6th-8th August; Assam & Meghalaya during 6th-8th August..
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 3rd-4th August; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 3rd-6th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 5th-7th August; Assam & Meghalaya on 3rd August, during 5th-6th August and on 8th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 3rd August and during 5th-8th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 3rd-4th August; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 4th August.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 3rd-8th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada during 3rd-8th August; Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 3rd-8th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra on 3rd August; Gujarat Region.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 3rd-8th August; Lakshadweep during 6th-8th August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe during 3rd-8th August; Lakshadweep during 3rd-5th August.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, North Interior Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 3rd August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 3rd-4th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Coastal Karnataka and Telangana during 3rd-6th August; South Interior Karnataka on 3rd August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 5th-6th August.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Rayalaseema on 3rd August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 3rd August; Kerala & Mahe on 3rd August and during 6th-8th August; Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 3rd August.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 3rd August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka and Telangana during 3rd-6th August.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Uttarakhand, Arunachal Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Kerala & Mahe, Konkan & Goa, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Karnataka, Gujarat Region, South Interior Karnataka, Marathwada and North Interior Karnataka; **at many places** over East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, West Uttar Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, East Madhya Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Rayalaseema, West Rajasthan, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Telangana, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Maharashtra and Lakshadweep; **Dry** over rest of the country.

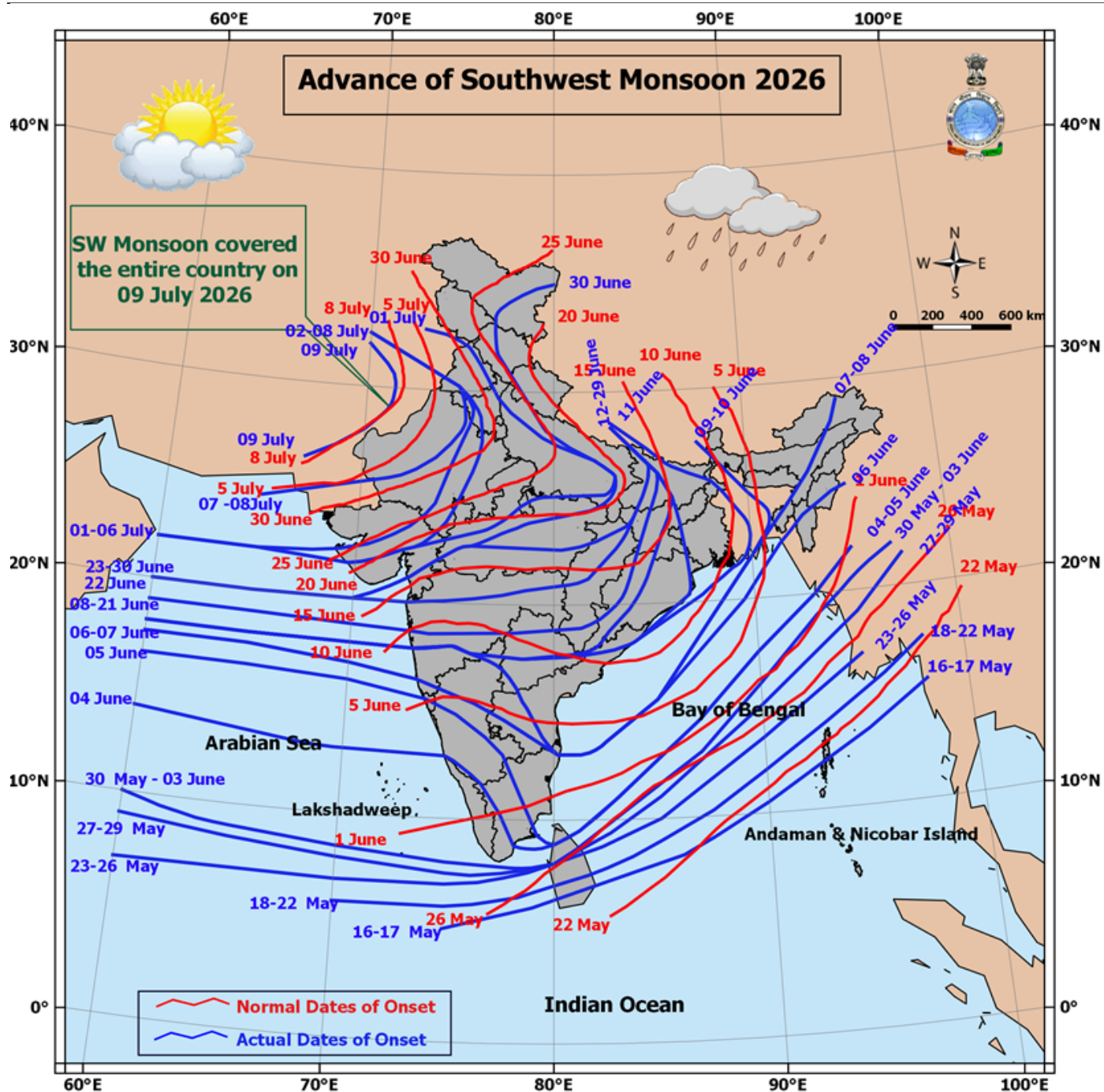

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 02-08-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Madhya Maharashtra. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Madhya Maharashtra. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Konkan & Goa. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.8°C was reported at KHARGONE-OBS (MADHYA PRADESH) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 02-08-2026)**: **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Chhattisgarh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Telangana, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Punjab and Coastal Karnataka; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, North Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttarakhand and Marathwada. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over East Rajasthan and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Gujarat Region. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.0°C was reported at KOVILANGULAM (TAMIL NADU).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Low Pressure area** over Southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood has become less marked at 0530 hrs IST of today 03rd August, 2026, however, the associated cyclonic circulation lay over central parts of Rajasthan between 1.5 & 4.5 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Sri Ganganagar, Hisar, Bareilly, Sultanpur, Patna and thence eastwards towards Manipur and extends upto 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim & neighbourhood between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over central parts of south Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over north Pakistan & neighbourhood lay over Jammu division & neighbourhood between 5.8 & 7.6 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** from Southwest Rajasthan to Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim across centre of Low Pressure over southwest Rajasthan and neighbourhood, northern parts of Madhya Pradesh, southeast Uttar Pradesh and Bihar at 0.9 km above mean sea level has merged with the monsoon trough.
- A fresh **Western Disturbance** is likely to affect Northwest India from 4th August, 2026.
- The **trough** from North Interior Karnataka to Comorin area across South Interior Karnataka, Kerala and Tamilnadu at 5.8 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **off-Shore trough** at mean sea level from South Gujarat to north Kerala has become less marked.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Uttarakhand & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northwest Bangladesh and adjoining Sub-Himalayan West Bengal at 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

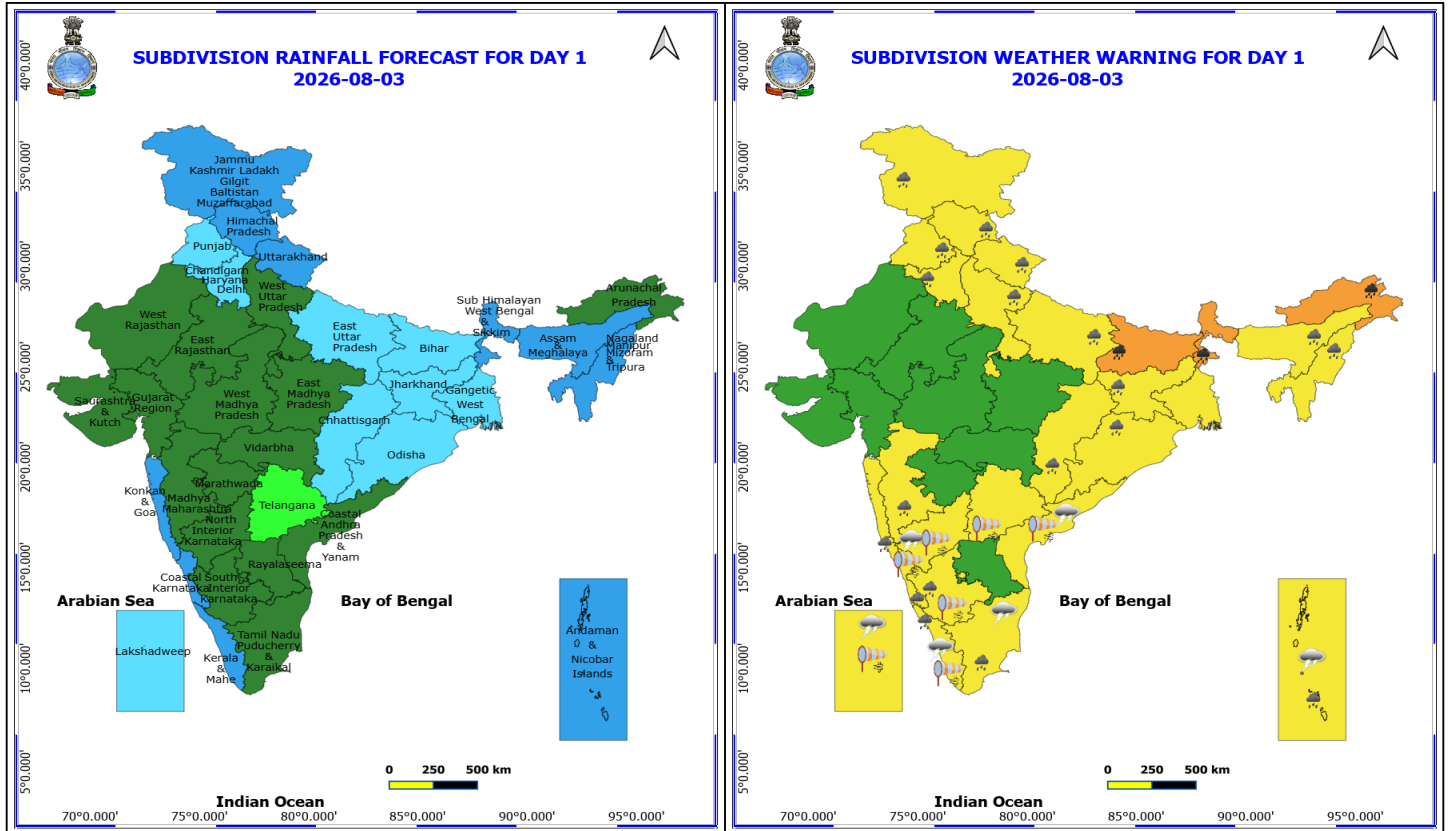

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Coastal Karnataka, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, South Interior Karnataka, Telangana and West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Rayalaseema, Uttarakhand and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coasts, over most parts of westcentral adjoining some parts of southwest and few parts of eastcentral Arabian Sea.

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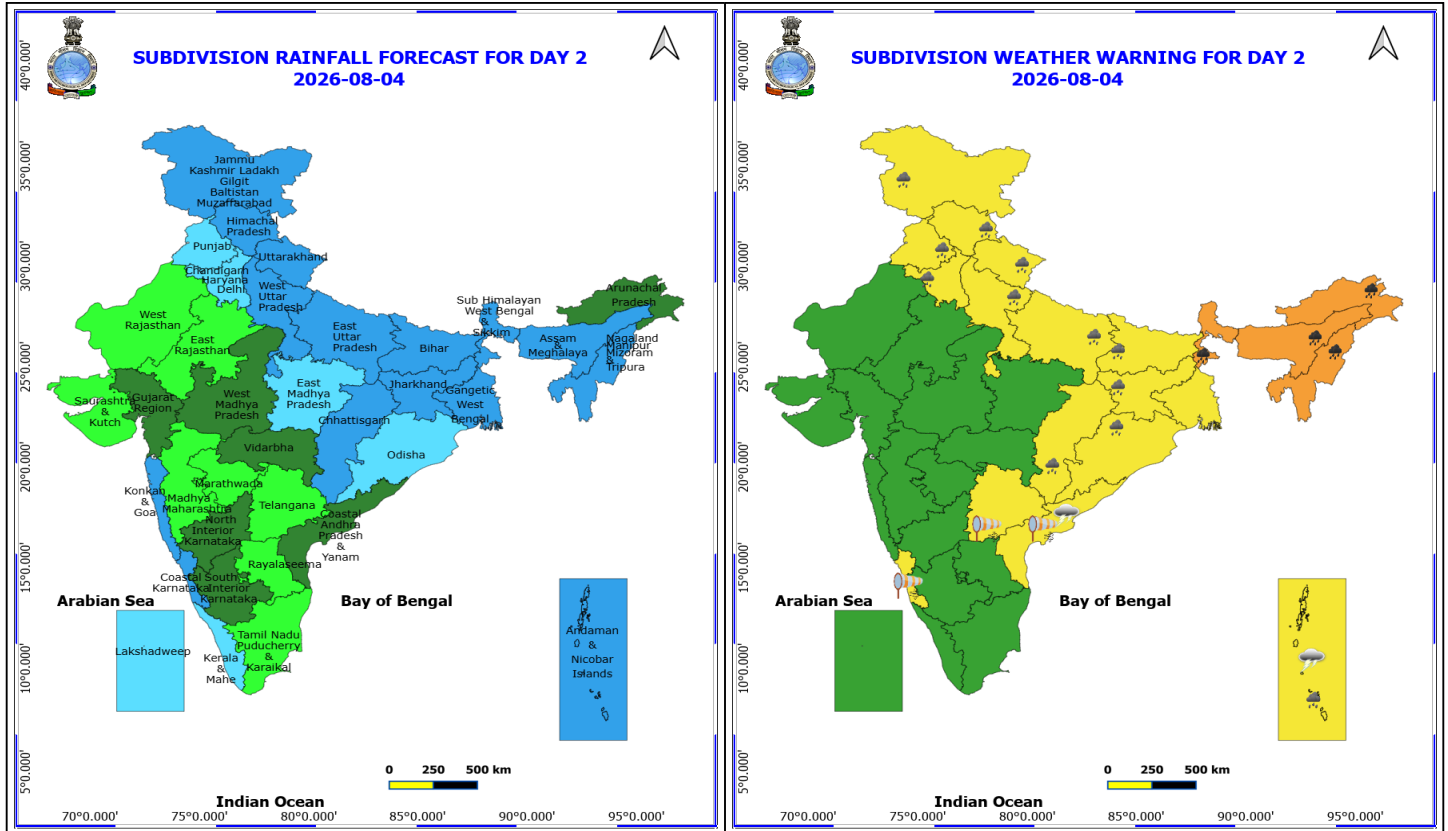

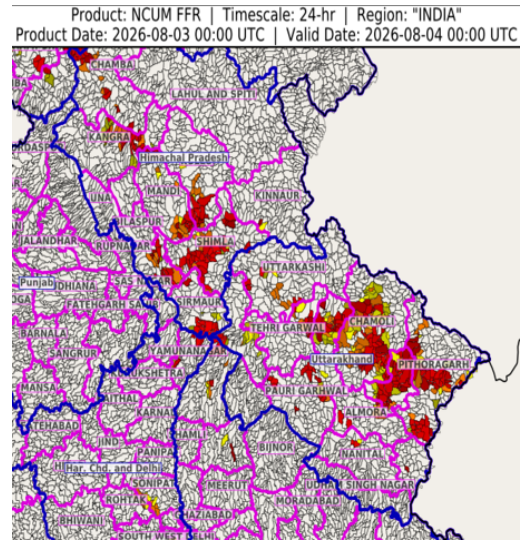

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-02

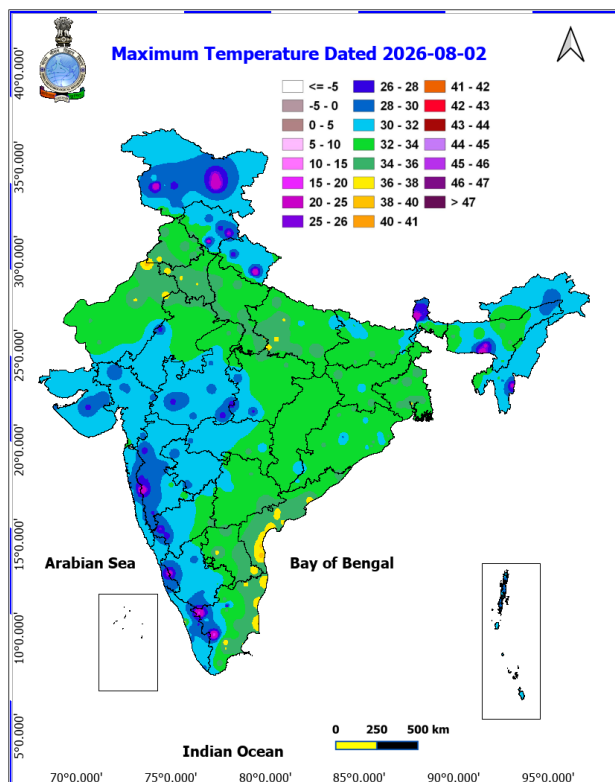


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-02

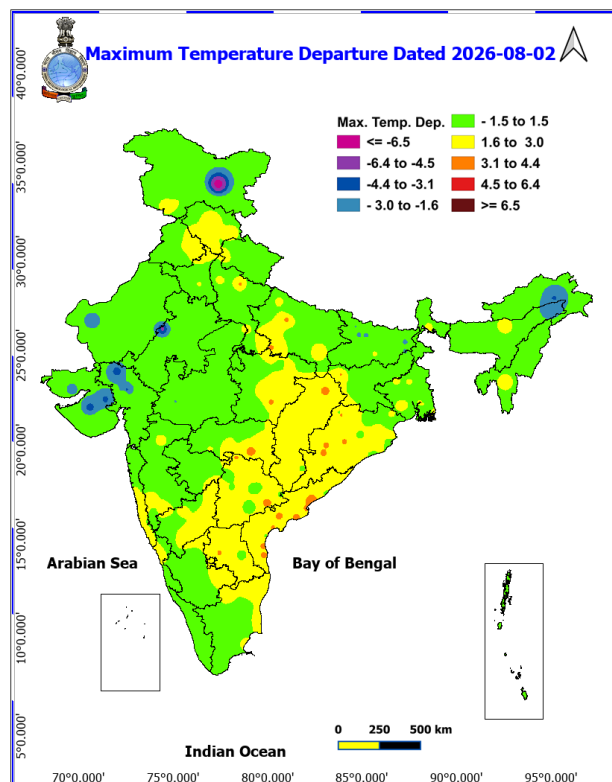


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-02

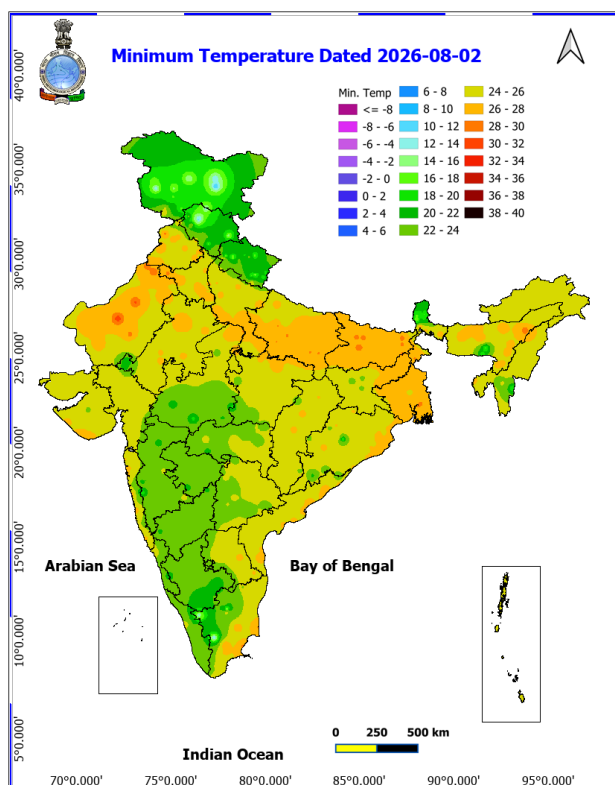
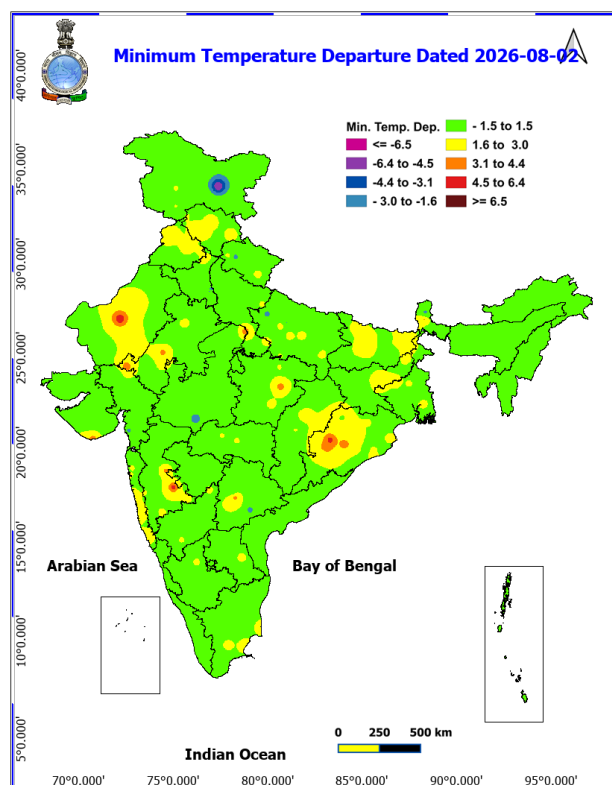
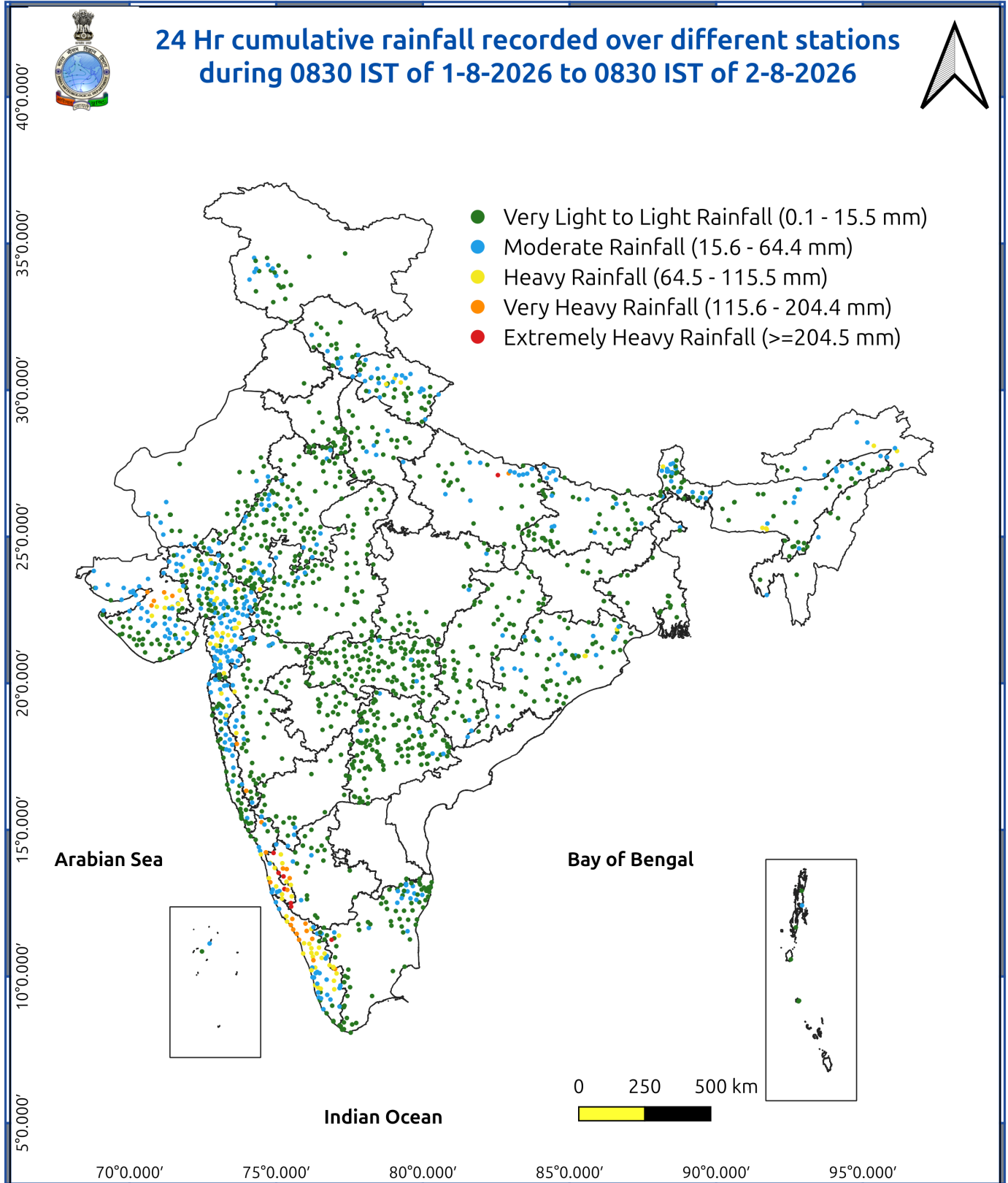


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-02





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated very heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 3rd-4th August; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 4th August.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslides/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In *ghat* areas of **Madhya Maharashtra**, drain out excess water from rice nurseries and *kharif* crops like maize, cotton, pigeon pea, groundnut, green gram and black gram.
- In **Konkan**, ensure proper drainage in turmeric, groundnut, transplanted rice and finger millet, porso millet, vegetable fields and orchards. Remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Gujarat**, drain out excess rainwater from the field of rice, cotton, pearl millet, soybean, Pigeon pea, green gram, black gram, maize, groundnut and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide strong bamboo staking to tall crops (banana, papaya, sugarcane).
- In **Tamil Nadu**, drain out excess rain water from standing crops, vegetable fields and orchards. Keep the harvested produce at safer place.
- In **Keralam**, drain out excess rain water in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Karnataka**, keep field drainage channels clear and drain out excess rain water from paddy fields, orchards and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal**, ensure proper drainage in the fields of rice, jute, ginger and vegetable to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields, orchards and low-lying areas to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest all mature cucumbers, bottle gourds and other cucurbits immediately and store in safe place. Secure vines firmly to bamboo stakes or trellises to prevent lodging.
- In **Assam**, keep field drainage channels clear and maintain proper drainage in rice nurseries, jute, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, sesame and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Provide staking or support to banana, vegetables and other vulnerable crops against strong winds.
- In **Meghalaya**, ensure proper drainage from rice nurseries and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Strengthen nursery bunds and keep drainage channels free from obstruction.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, ensure proper drainage from soybean, black gram, ginger,

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turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.

- In **Odisha**, maintain effective drainage from nursery beds, fields of *kharif* crops such as maize, pulses (green gram, black gram, pigeon pea etc.), oilseeds (groundnut, sesame etc.), cotton, vegetables and fruit orchards to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Bihar**, make proper arrangements for drainage of excess rainwater from crop fields and postpone the application of fertilizers and pesticides.
- In **Jammu and Kashmir**, maintain proper drainage in fields of maize, green gram, black gram and vegetables to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation in transplanted rice.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, tomato, brinjal, capsicum, chilli and cucumber fields and apple and pear orchards for quick removal of excess rainwater. Harvest mature fruits wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain effective drainage in rice, black gram, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and chilli fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage to drain out excess rainwater from pigeon pea, other standing crop and vegetable fields, particularly from low-lying areas prone to waterlogging.
- In **West Rajasthan**, make necessary arrangements for drainage from the fields of already sown pearl millet, green gram, sesame, moth bean, cluster bean, other standing crops and vegetables.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

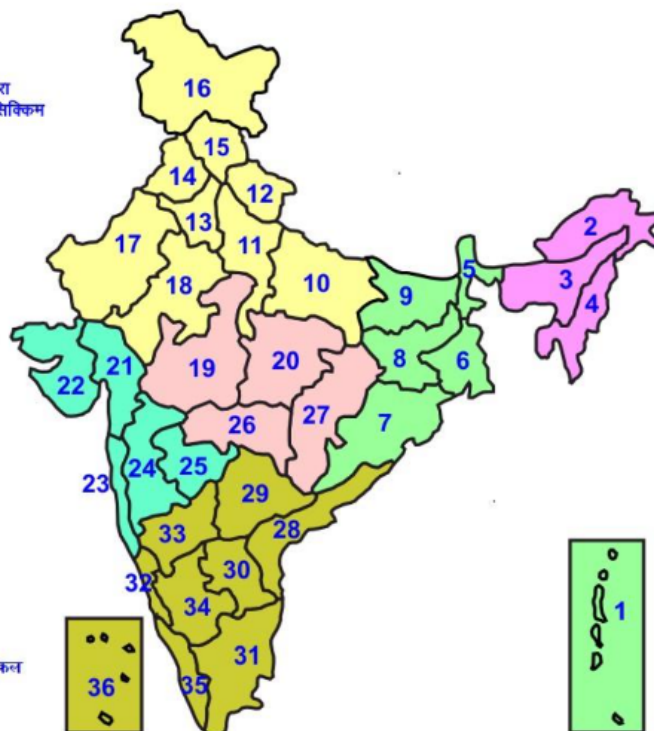
- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
